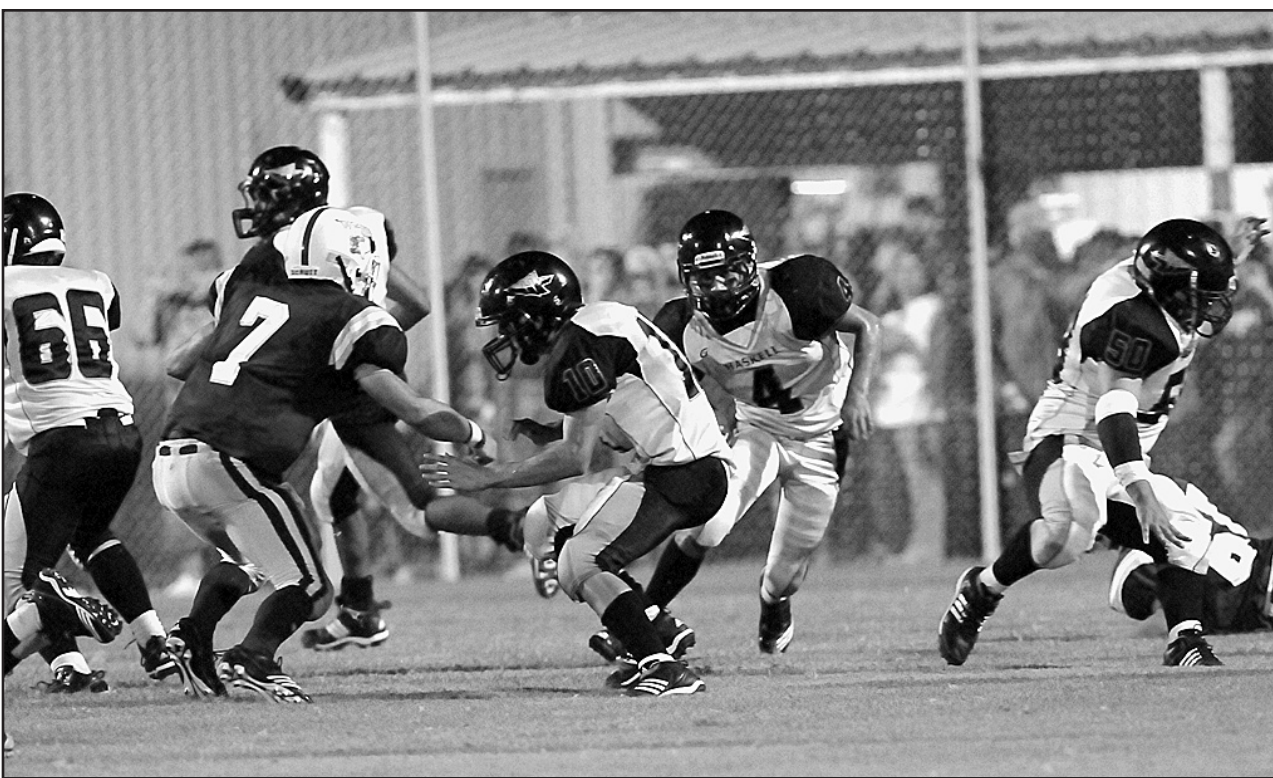
Indians lose to Moguls, 18-42

Both Haskell and Munday had the pigskin twice in the first quarter. On their second possession, Munday was stopped on the five yard line of Haskell. The Indians then moved the ball some 95 yards in 16 plays to run their possessions into the second quarter and was the first team to cross the goal line. This action took place at the 9:16 mark of the second quarter. The PAT kick by Tyrone Neskorik failed, but Haskell had the lead 6 to 0.

Three rushes later by the Moguls, Haskell's linebacker Neskorik intercepted a Munday pass and raced 45 yards to pay dirt. The two point conversion try failed. At the 7:43 mark in the second quarter, the score was Haskell 12, Munday 0.

The Moguls would use the air ways to get back in to the ball game scoring on a 22 yard pass play and tacking on the PAT kick to close the gap within five points. With only 29 seconds left in the first half, Munday would score the go ahead points on another pass and successful PAT kick. At intermission, the score was Haskell 12, Munday 14.

The third quarter action continued on a high note like the first half of football had, with Munday adding a touchdown and extra point at the 5:10 mark in the third. The Moguls lead 21 to 12. The Indians rallied at the 4:44 mark in the third on a 38 yard run by fullback Neskorik. Again, the two point conversion try failed. The Indians had pulled to within three points, Haskell 18, Munday 21. Munday, at the 2:04 mark of the third, would use a 56 yard touchdown run and again nail the point after to increase the score to 18 to 28. Haskell would limit their opportunity to score in the fourth quarter because of two turn-overs while Munday used two good runs and two PAT kicks

to increase the lead to 18 to 42, which is how this non-district game ended, Haskell 18-Munday 42. Haskell moves its season record to 2 and 2 while Munday moved to 3 and 1.

The Indians had 53 rushes for 340 yards. Quarterback Isaiah Llewellyn had 16 carries for 105 yards and one touchdown. Running back Kelson Aguero got 101 yards on 19 carries. Fullback Neskorik had 124 yards on 16 rushes and a 45 yard touchdown interception. Neskorik had two touchdowns in all. Running back Kiefer McNelly got 10 yards on two carries. Haskell had 33 yards via the air with receiver Austin Nanny getting one catch for these 33 yards.

This Friday evening at 7:30 p.m. on Indian Field, Haskell will host the Quannah Indians—two tribes, fierce battle looms.

The 7th and 8th grade Warriors will play in Quannah as well as the Indian JV. All games are in Quannah, Thursday evening, with starting time at 4 p.m.

Suspects arrested for drugs Sept. 17

On Sept. 17, officers from Rule Police Department, Rochester Police Department, Haskell Police Department, Parks and Wildlife, and Haskell County Sheriff's Office executed a search at a residence on South 8th Street in Haskell.

Upon entry to the residence, two suspects ran out the back door and tried to escape down the alley, but they didn't make it out of the backyard before officers took them down.

Six more suspects were detained inside the residence before a search of the residence for illegal drugs and other contraband was made.

During the search of the residence, powder cocaine, crack cocaine, crystal meth and marijuana were found

in several rooms of the residence, along with crack pipes, marijuana pipes and electric scales. Also found in the living room were two semi-auto pistols. One appeared to have the serial number altered and might be a gun stolen in past break ins of Sport-About in Haskell.

A total of eight people one female and seven males, were arrested and transported to Haskell County Jail. Two males were from the Fort Worth area, the rest were from Haskell. They were all charged with manufacture of a controlled substance with intent to deliver, a first degree felony. Other charges may follow.

The Haskell County Commissioners' Court met in a regular meeting Sept. 13 with all members of the court present.

Motions to pay the bills and accept the County Treasurer's monthly report were approved.

Angel Johnson has been hired as part time dispatcher at the jail.

The burn ban has been lifted.

The appointment of election judges was tabled.

Perry Rogers of Kinder Morgan met with the court to explain the carbon dioxide injection project.

A motion authorizing the County Judge to execute grant management and housing provider contracts for the HOME program passed. The motions to pass the Resolutions for Administration Services and the Housing Provider for the HOME program passed.

The Emergency Notification System Interlocal Agreement with WCTCOG resolution was approved.

A motion to use the Buy Board to purchase a John Deere motor grader model 672G for Precinct 3 from Yellow House Machinery of Abilene passed.

A motion for District Attorney Mike Fouts to use Forfeiture Funds to give Luke Griffin a step raise was approved.

A motion to purchase a new phone system from Santa Rosa Telephone Company in the amount of \$10,611.86 passed.

The Senior Citizens Nutrition Budget was amended in the amount of \$6,706.89 for grant funding.

City Council report

The Haskell City Council met in a regular meeting Mon., Sept. 13 with Mayor John Gannaway, Mayor Pro Tem Randy Bowers, Councilmen Chan Guess, Sue Medford, Dan Hoover and Jason Hall in attendance.

Invocation was given by Hall.

A public hearing on the proposed tax rate and proposed budget was conducted by Mayor Gannaway. No public comment was heard.

In the regular meeting, action concerning the proposed budget for 2010-11 was tabled until a later date.

Budget amendments were approved as presented.

A \$250 bid from David Davis for the Haskell Co. Appraisal District property R12184, Brown & Roberts Addition Haskell, Block 29, Lot-West 41/by 300' of 1-4, property site address North 7th was accepted.

A negotiated resolution between the Atmos Steering Committee and Atmos Energy represented by Mike Schweikhard was approved. Schweikhard gave an update and answered questions.

The model staff report in support of ordinance #09132010 was approved.

In the August police chief report, Steven Grand noted:

•42 traffic citations, two citations for dogs running at large, two stray dogs picked up and taken to Stamford pound and nine arrests.

•Officer Roy Squyres gave a two weeks' notice of resignation. Sept. 16 will be his last day of employment with the City.

•Three new applications for police officers have been received. The three have

been interviewed. All three applicants are newly out of the police academy. It is hoped that someone will be hired by Oct. 16.

In the City Administrator's report, Brandon Anderson stated:

•The City of Haskell and Haskell Police Department thanked Susie Jean with Best M Police Dog Protection Inc. for securing the grant funds to purchase a bulletproof vest for Loca, the City's drug dog.

•Money is being set aside for the designated street projects spent prior to the end of this fiscal year.

•The old Rice Springs Nursing Home has been purchased by a doctor from Florida and a new facility named Memory Lane will open around the first of the year. It will consist of part assisted living and secure Alzheimer's unit.

•At the next meeting, it will be decided which projects to do under the SECO grant money.

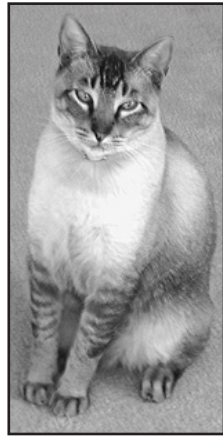
•The entire Development Corporation Board has committed to attend the TMCN annual meeting and Council members were encouraged to attend as well. Others interested in attending should RSVP Anderson by Oct. 8.

•After a rough year for all communities on sales tax and with an ambitious budget to attain, Anderson reported that for the fiscal year the City will only be short \$12,000 from the budget projection of \$300,000 for the city's portion, this year in sales tax.

•The next City Council meeting will be Tues., Sept. 28.

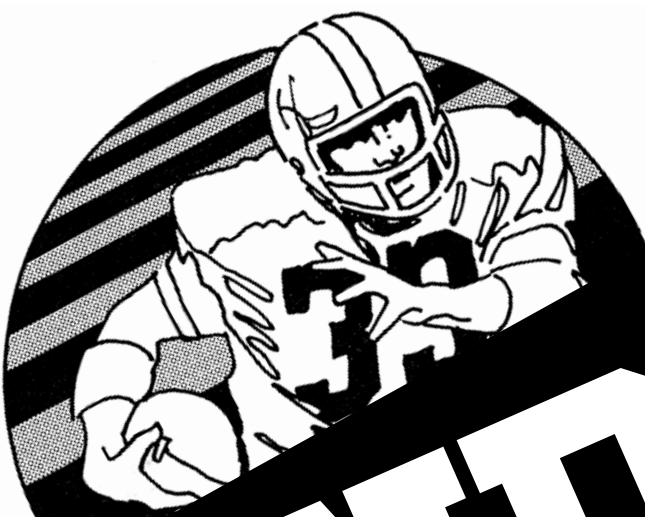

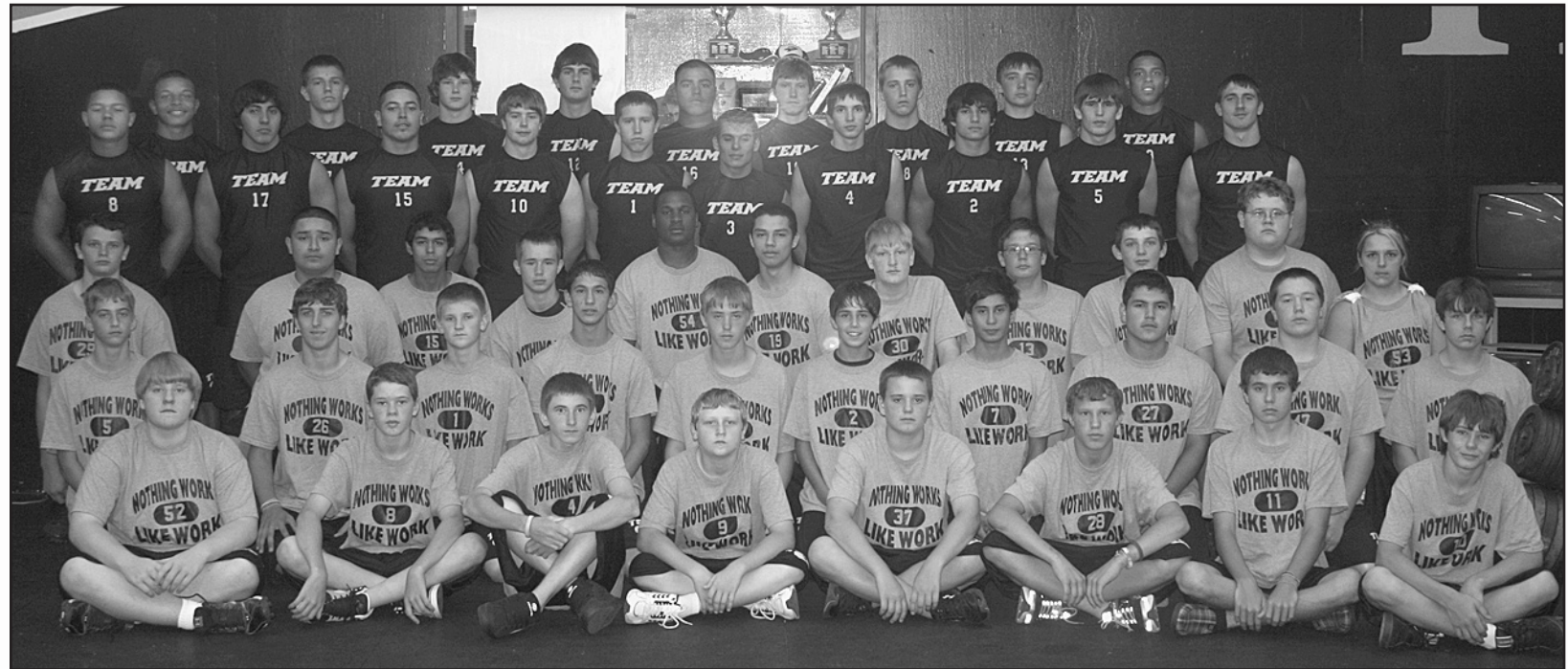

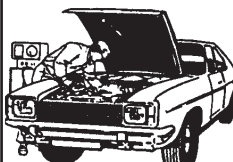
