Winners named for County Junior Livestock Show

The 75th edition of the Coke County Junior Livestock Show was held this past weekend at the Sterling Lindsey Memorial Exhibition Building in Robert Lee. This year's show featured animals in the Market Lamb, Market Goat, Market Swine and Market Steer shows, but more importantly, many young exhibitors from around the county.

The show began Friday with the Market Lamb Show. Rachel Everheart showed lambs to both Grand Champion Lamb and Reserve Grand Champion Lamb honors.

In Friday evening's Market Goat Show, Rachel Everheart also swept both titles taking Grand Champion Goat and Reserve Champion Goat.

On Saturday morning, Kaci Queen exhibited the Grand Champion Hog in this year's Market Swine Show. The Reserve Grand Champion Hog was shown by Moriah Royall.

In the final division of competition, the Market Steer Show, James Roberts exhibited the Grand Champion Steer. The Reserve Grand Champion Steer was exhibited by Carson Kelso.

A delicious barbecue lunch was held at 12 noon, followed by the awards presentation and the Premium Sale.

Winning the Lamb Showmanship award was Carson Kelso. Katlyn Reeves took home the Goat Showmanship award, with Kassie O'Dell earning the Swine Showmanship award.

Rachel Everheart earned the Ralph Walker Memorial Top Hand Award and the Frank Percifull Overall Showmanship award.

James Roberts was honored with the Clay Antilley Memorial Steer Showmanship award. He also was named McCutchen Ranch Top Hand. This award (formerly the Alderman-Cave Top Hand) is presented to a Junior or Senior exhibitor, alternating between Bronte and Robert Lee students, who have assisted with the show and exhibited an exceptional work ethic. The winner is chosen this year by the two ag teachers.

Move to make liquor sales legal begins in Bronte

Jennifer Addona has begun the legal process to allow Bronte voters to cast ballots for or against liquor sales within the city limits of Bronte. Many will

know Jennifer from her management of Bronte Hometown Hardware.

The process begins with delivering copies of the public notice posted on page 7 of last week's *Observer/Enterprise* to Bronte City Hall, along with a petition containing signatures in support by 10 registered voters who reside within the Bronte city limits. Addona completed this

part of the process earlier this week. According to Bronte's City Secretary Pat Martindale, the signatures should be verified and the petition issued today. The petition is for voters to sign in favor of placing this initiative on the May 10, 2014, local election ballot. The number of signatures required for placement on the ballot can be determined by voter turnout in the most recent gubernatorial election in 2010. The number of signatures must be equal to or greater than 35% of the turnout of those living within the city limits who cast votes for any candidate for governor in that election. After the petition is issued, it must be returned for verification within sixty days.

Bronte has allowed beer and wine sales for off premises consumption for several years. At the time that option was in question, many had predicted dire consequences if it passed. These consequences included a measurable increase in minor alcohol possession and consumption citations, driving while intoxicated citations and public intoxication citations and arrests. According to law enforcement since that election and passage, there has not been an increase in citations or arrests in any of these areas.

The passage of the beer and wine sales option has helped the City of Bronte's bottom line, increasing the amount of the

sales tax revenue the City receives.

If this proposal reaches the ballot and is passed, Addona plans to open a liquor store on US Highway 277. Addona included her plans and arguments for this passage in an advertisement in last week's issue of *The Observer/Enterprise*. These paragraphs are included on page 3.

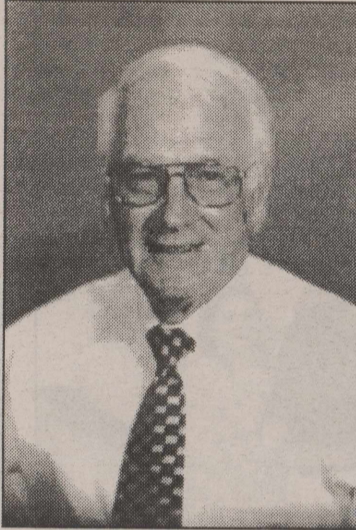

After his initial diagnosis, through prayer and the skills of the staff at M D Anderson and College Station Cancer Center, he had an astounding recovery that allowed friends and family to enjoy more wonderful time with Eddie.

A memorial service was held at 2:00 p.m. Monday, January 20, 2014, at Christ United Methodist Church.

Eddie was born October 12, 1935, to George and Oleta Vosburg Braswell now deceased, in Bronte, Coke County Texas, the oldest of two sons. Eddie is survived by three children, Ginger and husband Matt Williams of The Woodlands, Van Braswell and wife Elissa of Crowley and Gentry Braswell of Mesa Arizona.

He is survived by seven grandchildren, 1st Lt. Hunter Williams of Ft. Commissioners Court minutes posted

The Coke County Commissioners Court met in special session January 10, 2014, at the courthouse in Robert Lee. Members of the court present included County Judge, Roy Blair, Commissioner, Pct. #1 Troy Montgomery, Commissioner, Pct. #2 Wendell Lee, Commissioner, Pct. #4 Bobby Blaylock. Clerk Mary Grim was also in attendance.

The meeting opened with prayer given by Commissioner Lee and pledge to the flag was recited.

Judge Blair opened the public hearing at 9 am to receive public comments on whether or not to create one or more County Energy Transportation Reinvestment Zone (CETRZ), as authorized by law, to promote one or more

infrastructure projects to be located within the County to be funded by the CERTZ. Judge Blair presented the application process requirements.

The Commissioners Court may, 30 days after closing the public hearing, take appropriate action on the matter, as the Commissioners Court may in its discretion determine to be in the best interest of the County.

Judge Blair closed the public meeting at 9:30 am.

"I hope to open a liquor store in the city on Highway 277 within the next year or so. It will not be just your traditional liquor store; I would add my own personal touch! I plan on becoming a member of the Go Texan program and carry Texas made products such as boxed chocolates, specialty breads, gourmet foods like cheeses, nuts, salsa's, meats, sausage and jerky; the possibilities are endless and I really haven't quite made up my mind on the inventory yet. I know I would like to carry a line of Bronte sports and visitor shirts & caps, and have an area in the store for tables and chairs where shoppers can stop and relax for a bit.

I want to make this store an attraction not only for our residents, but for the residents from surrounding cities, the many travelers and tourists that drive through our welcoming city, and for the Hunters who

faithfully visit our city; of whom I know many and can tell you from talking to them that they are in favor of seeing a liquor store in the city. Over the years, I've constantly heard them ask "where is the closest liquor store?", and "how much further do we have to drive?"

Presently those that want to purchase alcohol go out of town. Why not support this legalization and keep the money in the city? This would generate increased tax revenue for the city, and keep those from shopping the bigger towns for an item not supplied in town. I know there are those that are against this legalization, and that's alright. But by not selling liquor in town does not mean that no one will consume it or


that it will stay out of the city. On the contrary, it will still be bought and the money will continue to be spent out of the city. I have the passion to try to obtain this approval; not only for myself, but for those that share my same view."
