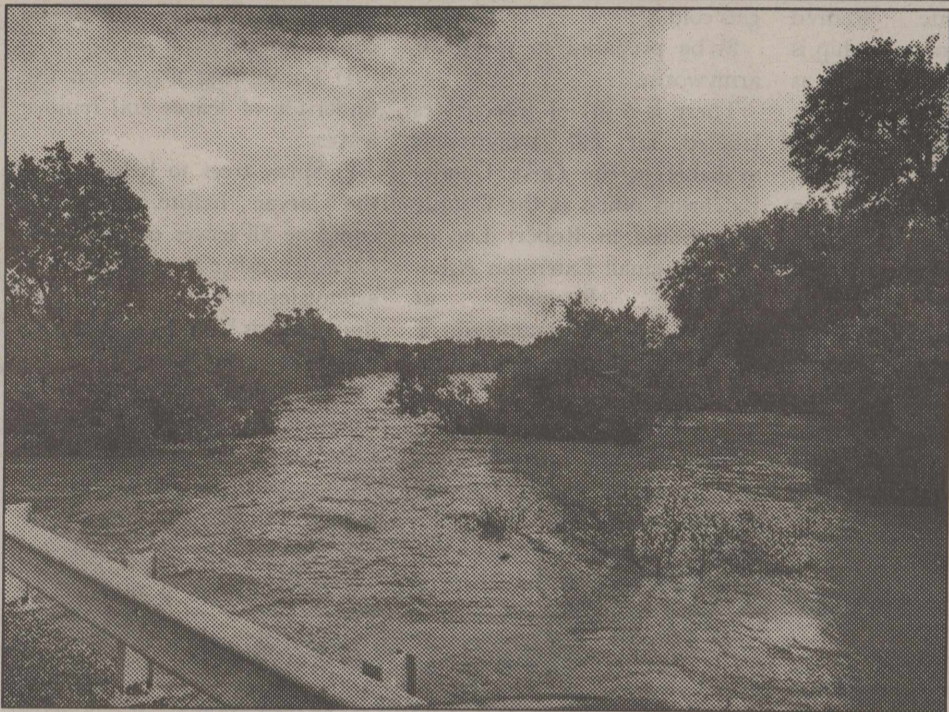

Fall Armyworms

The recent rains, although needed, have brought on a new challenge for bermudagrass, winter wheat, and sorghum. Fall armyworms have started to show up around Coke County. The Larvae of the fall armyworms are green, brown or black with white to yellowish lines running from head to tail. A distinctive white line between the eyes forms an inverted "Y" pattern on the face and four black spots aligned in a square on the top of the segmented near the back end of the caterpillar are also

characteristics of the Armyworm. The armyworms start out very small (1/8 inch) and usually go unnoticed but the larvae can feed for 2-3 weeks and full grown larvae are about 1 to 1 1/2 inches in length and can have an immense appetite that will damage entire fields.

There are three types of management practices that can be utilized during this critical time:

- 1) Delay planting of winter wheat until we have a freeze.
- 2) Scout fields carefully early in the morning or late evening for damage until the weather gets cold.
- 3) be prepared to spray for armyworms.

Pecan Tree Pests

The Walnut Caterpillar has shown itself following those well needed late summer/early fall rains we have received. You may have noticed that there is

damage starting to show on the pecan trees around the county. As long as the trees are in good health prior to defoliation this should not cause any lasting damage to the trees. However these caterpillars can consume a lot of leaf mass due to them feeding for about 25 days before crawling down the tree to pupate in the soil. These caterpillars are reddish brown with yellow lines running the length of their body when young and mature larvae are about 2 inches long, black with grayish lines, and covered with long, soft, gray hairs.

There are a couple of ways that these caterpillars can be controlled:

- 1) Locate egg masses on the underside of leaves and remove leaves.
- 2) Spray trees to help control the larvae before they can consume all leaves on the trees. Consider using insecticides with esfenvalerate, Bacillus thuringiensis (B.t.) or spinosad to control infestations.

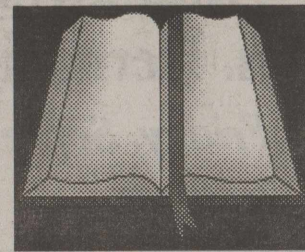

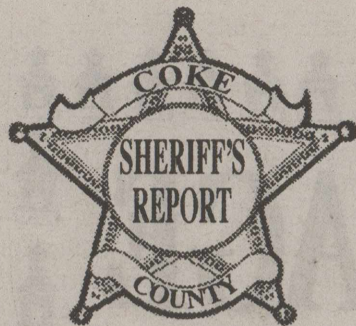

She began in the rain Friday morning, September 21, 2018, from Bronte High School, the last place CJ was. She will walk to the home in Odessa where she and her husband, Willie, brought their brand new daughter after her birth.*

Carrissa Joy "CJ" was born January 24, 1986, to Kim and Willie Macon. After living in Odessa and Houston, the family moved to Coke County and enrolled CJ at Bronte ISD. CJ excelled at Bronte was active in many extracurricular activities. On May 26, 2004, just days before graduation, CJ was killed in a car accident.

In the time following, her family searched for a way to keep CJ's memory alive. They decided upon a scholarship fund

for Bronte graduates. In the years since the CJ Macon Memorial Scholarship fund's inception, over \$300,000 has been awarded. The main fundraisers include a golf tournament each year in Houston and an annual skeet shoot in Orange Grove.

In her walk to remember CJ, Kim passed through Robert Lee, Sterling City and Garden City en route to Odessa. She urges people to donate to the scholarship fund. 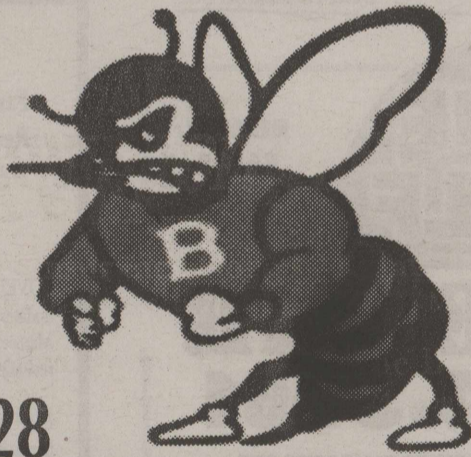

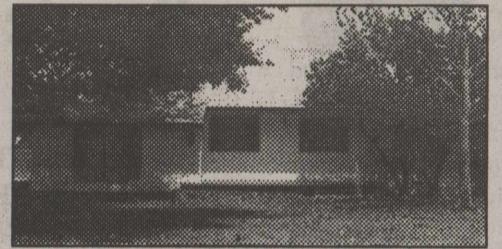

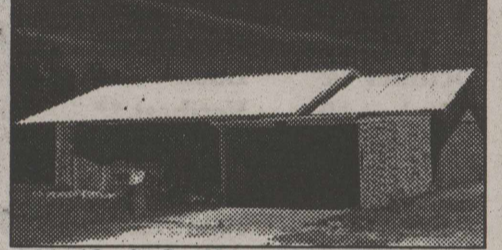

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by those in attendance and prayer was offered by Mayor Pro Tem David Bedford.

The City Council exited into Executive Session at 6:32 pm to discuss with the attorney the pending litigation styled as Ronny Loyd vs City of Bronte. The Council returned from Executive Session at 7:08 pm and Mayor Gohman reported that no action was taken from the Executive Session.

Paul Knight addressed the Council regarding the lease deal with Ronny Loyd, no transparency and no discussion in public. Addressing the Mayor, Knight asked about the promise of transparency. Attorney Hogg answered Mr. Knight by saying that the Executive Session was to update the Council on the active litigation against the City. All discussions are attorney/client privilege and discussion in public could give away his strategic defense and he advised the Council not to discuss in

public about the case. Knight asked how Councilmember Lee Wommack is able to go into Executive Session since he represented Ronny Loyd previously and this is a possible conflict of interest. Lee Wommack commented and said that he is not representing Loyd. Attorney Hogg stated that no public comment can be made since no agenda item of discussion/action was on the agenda.

Marlene Vaughn addressed the Council with a comment about a house on the corner of Barclay and SW Railroad streets. Vaughn stated that Felma Evans' house is going to be put up for sale and the lot next door is ridiculous. It needs to be cleaned up or something done to it. Vaughn does not know who the owners are but possibly the Council can get this information from the courthouse in Robert Lee. Vaughn expressed her opinion that the lot has not been touched and it is an eye sore. Paul Knight said that it is possibly owned by Rob Trussel.

Chief DeLaGarza presented the Fire Department Report. Three more applicants have asked to join the Volunteer Fire Department since the house fire. Materials are being bought to start the offices inside the station. This new station is not just for the VFD but for the community and the community is welcome to use it. Chief DeLaGarza received a call from a retired firefighter from Kansas and offered free training. Training will be held in September. Additional training will be done for the younger firefighters in San Angelo for 2 days in October, and then the second part of training will be done in November. Chief DeLaGarza expressed his excitement that the VFD received a grant for bunker gear for 10 firefighters and received \$4000 from United Way for wild land gear to fight grass fires. The spray foam insulation is doing great and is a lifesaver. Chief DeLaGarza added a thank you to the community for the overwhelming support.

Mayor Gohman commented on how much the fire department has evolved over the last several years, amazing and accomplishing so much. With a community of this size, it is such a miracle and he gave his appreciation.

Bruce Vaughn commented that the fire department did an excellent job on the house fire, the fire could have easily spread and the VFD got there quick. He expressed that Bronte is a small town and we all have to do what we have to do to save the community and save the people. The citizens in attendance applauded his words.

City Secretary Teresa Ballard presented the July Code Enforcement Report as follows:

Calls for Ordinance Enforcements - 5

Officer Ordinance Notifications from City Hall - 2
Ordinance Warning Issued - Verbal - 5

Ordinance Citation Issued - 0

City Secretary Teresa Ballard presented the Animal Services Report as follows:

Cats - 3
Skunks - 1

Mayor Gohman reported on somewhat of an issue, when citizens surrender a dog, it costs the City a lot of money to take animals to Brownwood. Teresa Ballard reported that the cost is \$25 to surrender a dog and the mileage is \$100. Mayor Gohman reports that the City is looking at the procedures.

There were no Livestock Permits this month.

Donna Hall has resubmitted for a Building Permit at 121 W. Main for a small storage building. Ricky Royall reported to the Council that this was discussed last month and now she has moved the small building to the other side of the carport and away from the other building where it was sitting at. Royall sees no issues with this. Councilman Stormy Vaughn asked if this was a permanent permit or a permit for 6 months for a portable building and it was established that this is a permanent permit. Vaughn expressed concern about how many people are going to start moving into their business. She posed the question of saying if we have all of the living quarters or portable buildings behind the business on Main Street, when we are trying to re-do Main Street and say everyone decides to live in the business on Main Street, what do we do for business? Is there a business district and a residential district? Ricky Royall reports that the only district there is is the fire zone area in downtown, that anyone can have a business in town anywhere they want to, and anyone can just about live wherever they want to. Stormy Vaughn reports that if there isn't anything in place that she would like to see this permit as not a permanent permit but only for 6 months until this can be looked in to further. She expressed that

she does not want to see this turn into a loft project, when it is being attempted to attract businesses downtown. She also expressed that it is okay to help someone get on their feet but she doesn't see this as a permanent thing. Councilman Santiago Rodriguez reports that San Angelo has an ordinance that so many buildings per square footage per property and if this is something that could be looked in to. Mayor Gohman agreed that it could be looked in to. Stormy Vaughn said that the square footage in the back of the building is not very big in the first place and showed concern that if the Council lets Donna Hall do it, then all would have to be able to do it.

Ricky Royall's recommendation is to do a six month permit and re-look at the issue then. As of right now, there is no ordinance to keep someone from living in their business. In a fire zone they have to abide by certain things but it doesn't keep them from living there.

Councilman Lee Wommack said that it isn't a bad looking building and Stormy Vaughn said that if you give it to one, you have to give it to another and the next one may not be as nice as Donna Hall's.

Stormy Vaughn recommends a temporary permit for a portable building for 6 months. Stormy Vaughn made a motion to extend a six month permit on the small storage building at 121 W. Main and was seconded by David Bedford. The motion carried with a 5 - 0.

Kendall Denton has applied for a house permit at 310 Kickapoo Rd and Ricky Royall reported no issues for a new house being built. A motion was made by Stormy Vaughn, and seconded by Santiago Rodriguez, to approve building a new house at 310 Kickapoo. The motion carried with a vote of 5 - 0.

Amber Robertson applied for a permit to build a pergola in the backyard at 201 E. McCaulley and Ricky Royall reported no issues. A motion was made by Santiago Rodriguez to approve the pergola at 201 W. McCaulley and was seconded by David Bedford. The motion carried with a vote of 5 - 0.

Teresa Ballard would like the Council to consider approving individual line items and/or tabling items #10 (July Balance Sheet), #11 (August Balance Sheet), #13 (July Revenues and Expenditures), #14 August Revenues and Expenditures), due to new information received from the meeting with Pam Venable with Business Solution last night.

A motion was made by Santiago Rodriguez, seconded by David Bedford, to approve the July 19, 2018 minutes and striking Jim from item #4. The motion carried with a vote of 5 - 0.

Discussion was held by Santiago Rodriguez questioning whether the Council is off on

Social Security taxes on the July Balance Sheet. Teresa Ballard will check in to payroll and bring it back to the table. Ballard explained to the Council problems with reconciling in the past and is working on a solution with Strategic Business Solutions.

Stormy Vaughn discussed that she would like seeing the payables before mailing out Accounts Payables. A motion was made by Stormy Vaughn to approve the bills paid and was seconded by Lee Wommack. The motion carried with a vote of 5 - 0.

A motion was made by Stormy Vaughn and seconded by David Bedford to table items #10, #11, #13, #14. The motion carried with a vote of 5 - 0.

Susan Williams, president of Economic Development 4B, updated the Council regarding the following items:

Half percent sales tax dollars being used to retain/create jobs
Prison Property - Can marketing be done in the Permian Basin area?
The County Commissioners want a written, detailed plan. A realtor reported that many buyers ask where Bronte is and their response is that Bronte is many miles from where they need to be. Secondly a buyer needs full industrial development set aside and economic incentive.

The EDC now has a low interest account set up for loaning to a business.

It appears that is going to cost \$1500 to revamp the City website. It was questioned as to whether there is a City logo and more information will be available at a later date.

The EDC is monitoring businesses that have received grant money and posed that this is something to consider when thinking about how to handle people living in the business district.

Discussion was held considering an ordinance amending the Fiscal Year 2018 Adopted Budget for municipal purposes respecting the General, Water, Sewer, and Sanitation Fund to transfer budget expenses. A motion was made by David Bedford, seconded by Lee Wommack, to approve the Finance Ordinance 2nd reading Exhibit B. The motion carried with a vote of 5 - 0.

Mayor Gohman reports that load limit signs are up as of today and permission was granted to trim trees on southbound 277 in front of the signs to make them more visible. There is still talk about lighting up the intersection at 277 and 158. With the rain, it was necessary to use inmates to mow and now it is pot holes to keep plugging along. The Mayor passed around a possible suggestion for a landfill for demoing homes site map. The site is over 5 acres and next to a road but it has a locked gate.

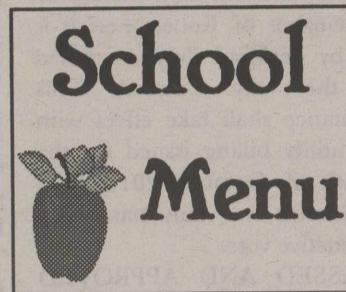
