Early voting ends today in November 6 General Election

Early voting in the General election ends today, Friday, November 2, and voting on Election Day, Tuesday, November 6, will be held from 7 am until 7 pm. Voters in Precincts 1 and 3 will vote at the County Courthouse in Robert Lee and Precincts 2 and 4 will cast their ballot in the fellowship hall at First Baptist Church in Bronte.

As is often the case, all of the local races were decided in the March primary election. However this year's general election may be one of the most important elections yet on the national level. Each vote matters and this year's election seems to be a team sport with party - either Republican or Democrat -

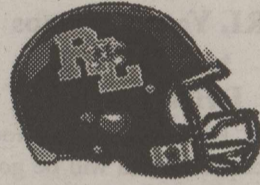
making more of a difference than in years past.

In the race for United States Senator, El Paso's US Representative Robert "Beto" O'Rourke, Democrat, is challenging incumbent Ted Cruz, Republican. Also on the ballot is the Libertarian candidate, Neal M. Dikeman.

In the US Representative Congressional District 11 election, Republican incumbent Mike Conaway is being challenged by Democrat JennieLou Leeder and Libertarian Rhett Rosenquest Smith.

Republican incumbent Greg Abbott is facing off against former Dallas County Sheriff Lupe Valdez, Democrat, and

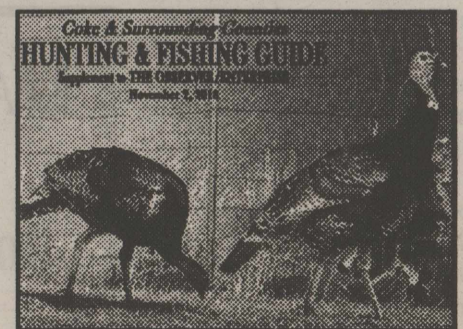

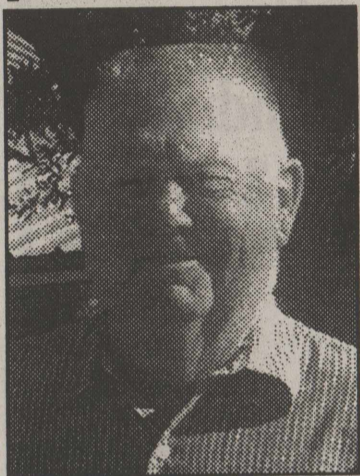

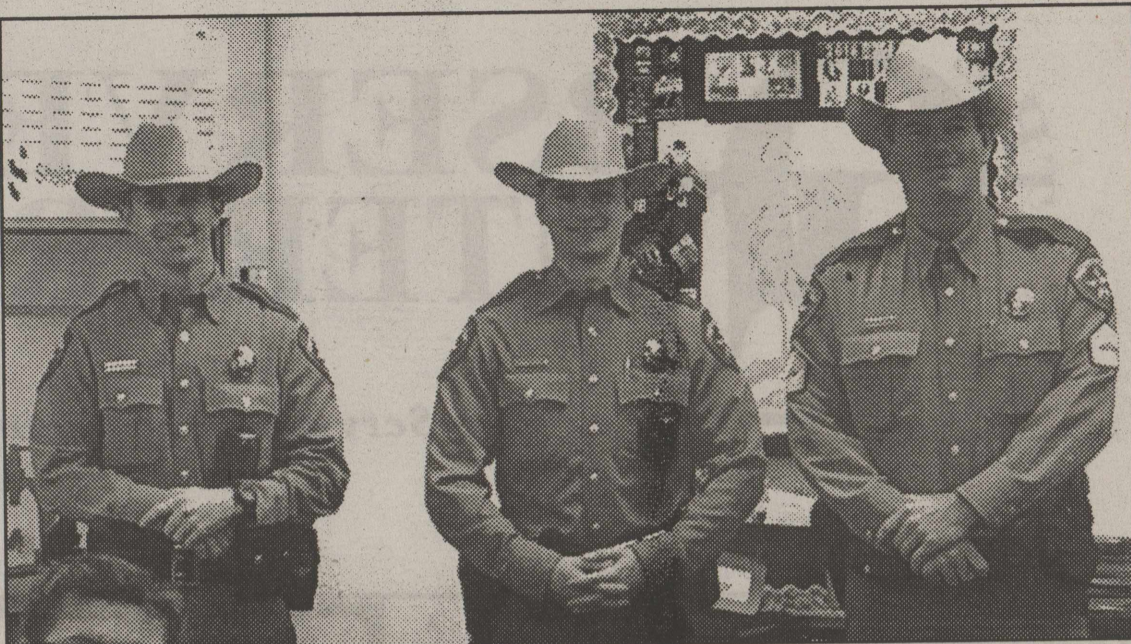
few. They will also have dessert, tea, coffee, and water.
