



The City of Robert Lee has two bonds in the amount \$758,000.00 and \$67,000.00 through the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB). \$750,000.00 was returned to the TWDB. According to the paperwork, neither bond can be paid off until 2022. The previous mayor sent a letter on May 7, 2018, releasing the unused portion of \$700,000 back to TWDB. Since the funds were returned, the City can't use itto look for water or anything else. Since the bonds can't be paid off until 2022, we must continue making scheduled payments. Mayor Crenshaw expressed concern about paying for a loan in which the funds were already returned and will be working with TWDB before the next scheduled payment in December to get more information regarding the money that was returned. The second loan is \$67,000 and has quarterly payments in the amount of \$1,300 until 2042. The City can go through a process to get permission to pay the bonds off early; Mayor Crenshaw is working on getting approval for early payoff.


