

New Producers Are Completed

Five more producers have been completed in the Slaughter field, according to reports here Monday.

Anderson-Prichard-Oil corporation, Oklahoma City, finished three producers on the Cochran county side of the Slaughter field. The firm's No. 2 Neal rated a daily potential flow of 459 barrels after acidizing with 12,000 gallons at 4,948 feet. No. 3 Woodley proved good for 697.29 barrels daily after 10,000 gallons at 5,030 feet, plugged back from 5,050 feet, and the No. 7 Woodley established itself as the largest of the trio by flowing a rated 1,053.40 barrels per day following a similar acid treatment, bottomed at 4,978 feet.

In the Hockley sector of the field, Texaco No. 43 Bob Slaughter responded to treatment with 10,500 gallons at 4,990 feet by flowing at the rate of 1,410.36 barrels a day. Skelly Oil company No. 1-B May-Nickel, also in Hockley, set potential of 232.15 barrels of oil, plus four-tenths of one per cent water, after 12,000 gallons of acid at 4,940 feet.

In northeastern Hockley, 15 miles northwest of Slaughter production, Anderson-Prichard and American Drilling corporation No. 1-W, L. Ellwood estate, a wildcat, is preparing to drill plug from 8 5/8 inch casing cemented at 290 feet with 300 sacks. Present depth is 296 feet in red rock.

Broderick and Calvert, Inc., Amon G. Carter, et al No. 1-G, H. Hayward, new Bailey county wildcat nine miles southwest of Mulshoe, is reported to have topped anhydrite at 2,270 feet and salt at 2,310 feet. It is drilling ahead past 2,685 feet in anhydrite, red rock and salt.

Fullerton Oil company No. 1 H. M. Wilson, scheduled 8,000 foot test in northwestern Andrews county, topped anhydrite at 1,690 feet, 1,692 feet above sea level, and is drilling past 2,400 feet in salt, anhydrite and red rock. Its anhydrite marker is 14 feet low to the old Pen Humble No. 1.

Wilson, failure one and one-half miles to the Anderson-Prichard and Osage Drilling company, Inc., No. 1 A. M. Clayton, wildcat in extreme northwestern Gordon county, is drilling past 3,435 feet in dense grey lime. With elevation of 2,913 it topped brown lime at 3,210 feet and solid lime at 3,320 feet.

Lee C. Harrison and Tobe Foster No. 1 E. L. Steck, wildcat two miles northeast of Lubbock, last was reported drilling at 4,710 feet in lime. It is being drilled as a closed operation, with no information being released. However, it is rumored to be running about

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60 feet lower than Harrison and associates No. 1-W, G. Nairn estate, discovery pumper three and one-quarter miles east by southeast. Production in No. 1 Nairn is reported to have settled to about 155 barrels of oil daily, with a small amount of water present. Total depth is 5,002 feet in Clear Fork, Lower Permian, lime.

A wildcat in Western Terry county, American Drilling corporation No. 1 W, T. Hufnall, is drilling ahead unchanged below 4,850 feet in lime.

Sinclair Prairie Oil company No. 1 Charles J. Kleiner, closely watched wildcat four miles east of Plains in central Younkum county, is drilling at 4,990 feet in lime, with no shows yet logged.

In eastern Younkum wildcat territory, Honolulu Oil corporation No. 1-13 L. H. Wright is drilling at 5,403 feet in lime, carrying 2,600 feet of salty sulphur water and 150 feet of oil-emulsion in the hole.

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Britain Hails FDR's Navy Day Address As A "Fighting Speech"



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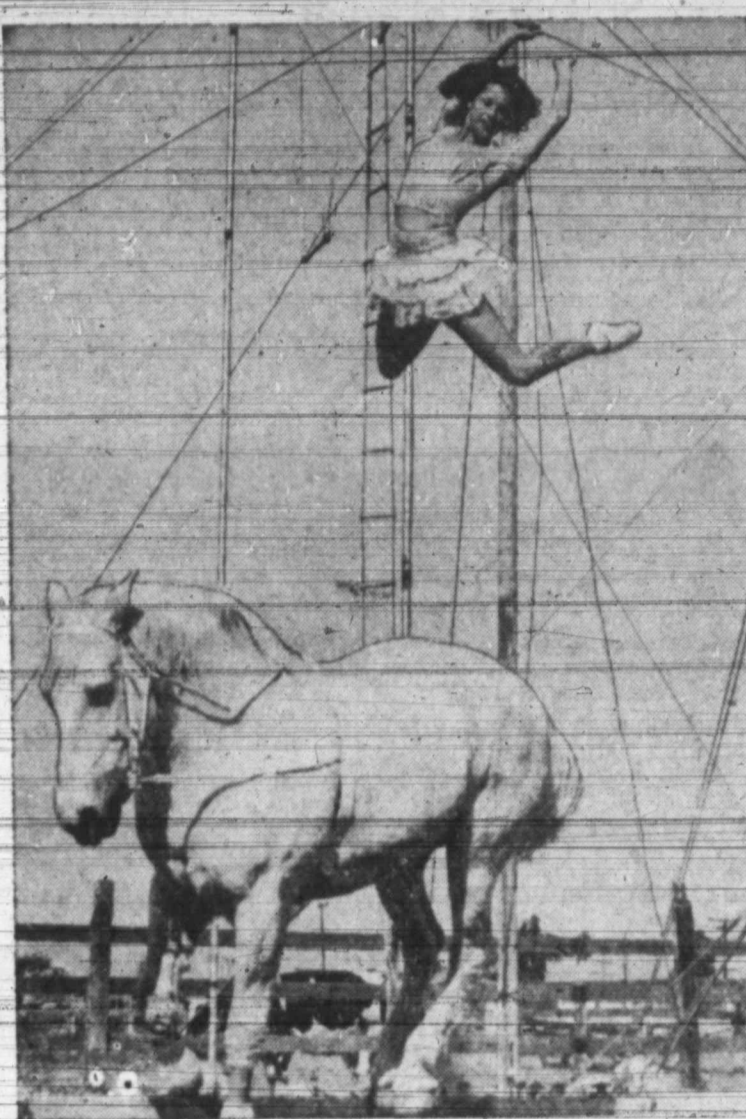

Mexicans Also Offer Praise

LONDON, Oct. 28 — Government quarters received President Roosevelt's "damn the torpedoes" Navy day address enthusiastically today, describing it as a fighting speech.
Unofficial "men in the street" expressed some disappointment, however, that Mr. Roosevelt disclosed no new action corresponding with his belligerent tone. Critics said his exposure of two new German documents outlined "long-range" dangers but failed to emphasize a sense of immediate emergency.

They contrasted the speech with the recent campaigns of Lord Beaverbrook and Labor Minister Ernest Bevin to paint the crisis in a way calculated to stimulate workmen to greater production of armaments.

Hopes Still Held Out
The fact that the president omitted references to the Far Eastern situation was considered an indication that hope of easing the Pacific tension has not been

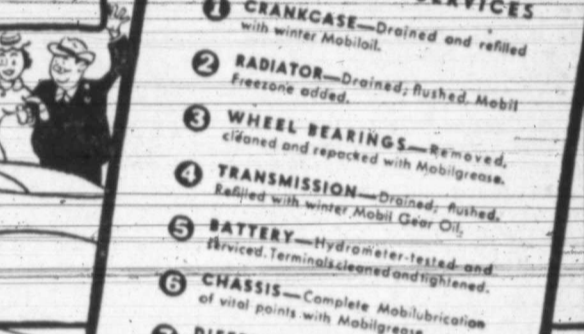

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Canadians--Taken To England's Heart--Add Spice To War Efforts

Troops Desire Duty At Front

LONDON, Oct. 28. (By Cable).—No outfit in England today has made as many conquests as have Canada's bachelor regiments. Their conquests have not been the battlefield kind. They're the romantic kind.

Not that the Canadians haven't shown their stuff in a military way, too. They have. During recent invasion-defense maneuvers, one of the crack bachelor regiments from Canada hung up a record of "getting there fastest with the mostest" that will stand for some time to come.

Reception Impressive
But even more impressive than that was the reception this unit received on their return to their village billet center. Women and girls thronged the streets, and as the long lines of trucks and guns rumbled into the sleepy hamlet, the ovation lacked only girls strewing flowers in the streets to make it complete.

The Canadians in England are popular with the women, and if they ever receive orders to invade the continent as a spearhead of a B.E.F., they will leave a long, long trail of broken hearts.

Bring Rumor Spice
Recently, a rumor swept through one village where this regiment was billeted to the effect that it was being transferred to another part of Britain. For two days the commanding officer hardly dared to walk down the main street of the village. Telephone calls, letters, threats and tears made his position virtually untenable until an official notice was posted denying the rumor.

It all underlines the fact that Canadians have brought spice to the villages and towns of Britain in more ways than one. Driving high-powered trucks at fifty miles an hour through country lanes which were designed for a twenty-mile pace; they have succeeded in killing quantities of chickens and conditioning stray dogs to run at the first sound of an approaching Canadian convoy. Even the old folks are learning to jump.

Play With Intensity
Play day is also something to reckon with. For long hours on pay night pubs and dance halls resound as these North Americans celebrate with an intensity unknown in England. Intensity is typical of everything they do. On maneuvers they fight hard. On the parade ground they drill hard.

But their energy is so immense that it occasionally overflows and then they may take a pub apart—thereby gaining a reputation for being rough and tough.

For those who are consistently rough, they've got a "Toner Downer" building, so-called because the men confined to it are always in full view of the sergeant major, whether they're eating, working or sleeping.

The men are usually just too high-spirited for routine discipline, and so the regiment is put through a course of work that would break weaklings. But when they finish this course, the men are always model soldiers for the discipline is designed to mold

men, not break them.

The number who have been assigned to the guardroom in recent months is negligible. Any officer will tell you that what is needed to cure the over-exuberance is some front line action. These men have been away from home for two years now and except for brief excursions have had no action.

I talked recently to 84 officers and soldiers in a Saskatchewan infantry regiment which took part in the raid on Spitzbergen. The large-scale supplies and mines were destroyed, and the impression that they wanted action like this every day. Of course what they really want is to invade the continent, but they admit that there are not enough troops in England to permit such an operation at this time.

Canada's continued non-commission is a sore spot with the soldiers here. They say that the good jobs they gave up to enlist in the battle to save England are being filled by men who have left their desire for big action take precedence over their loyalty to the mother country.

Many Wed Canadians
While they wait hopefully for the day an invasion of the continent will be possible, these troops work hard and play hard. Their time—say—their leisure—as long as the play is not carried too far.

The number of marriages which have already taken place attest to the liking English girls have for the average Canadian. Among this particular regiment the marriage rate is only about 10 per cent, so it is still largely a bachelor regiment. But in some units, the figure has soared well above 25 per cent.

The girls think it's fine being married to a Canadian. But when the war ends, there are going to be social repercussions

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Germans Cry "Fantasy" To Charges By Roosevelt

Soft Pedal On Church Policy

Nazi spokesmen quickly cry "fantasy" today in retort to President Roosevelt's charge that the United States government possesses documentary evidence of a Nazi plan to abolish all existing religions. Thus the unexpected accusation and the Berlin reaction bring into focus the fact that Hitler, in the course of this war, has been at pains to soft-pedal the neopagan and anti-religious aspects of Nazism.

Regardless of what Hitler thinks or plans to do about existing religious creeds, it has become apparent that he has realized from the start of the war the necessity for harnessing German spiritual faith to his total war effort, and for avoiding disturbing events within Germany which would evoke a conflict between the religious convictions of the German people and the military course of the Reich.

Little is heard of Hitler's self the world for two years has heard extremely little of such pre-war incidents as the arrests and imprisonment of clergymen, of the destruction of synagogues, of the separation of children from religious instruction or of the subtle but steady replacement of religious by pagan symbols. Before the war this was a continued story and no particular attempt was made to conceal it.

Hitler had another reason for these things to be forgotten; There were other deeply religious countries in Europe which he needed for his "new order," and he regarded it best that their suspicions of Nazi neopaganism be allayed, both before and after they were conquered or persuaded.

Called it Holy War Especially was this true when he turned against Russia and, in what he called a holy war, set out to "safeguard Europe and thus save all."

This may be compared with the reports of January and May, 1940, accredited to August, Cardinal Hlond, primate of Poland, and issued by the Polish embassy to the Vatican, relating a story of death, imprisonment and torture of priests in German-occupied Poland and concluding that "Catholic life is almost entirely extinguished" in that anguished nation.
