Florida high school massacre panel considers recommendations

SUNRISE, Fla. (AP) -The state commission investigating the Florida high school massacre began discussions Friday on what recommendations it will make regarding student safety, mental health and steps to prevent future school

shootings. The Marjory Stone-Douglas High School Commission didn't pass any specific recommendations Friday at its latest gathering to consider the Feb. 14 attack that killed 14 students and three staff members at the school in Parkland. But it decided it will focus its initial batch of recom-

mendations on less controversial areas such as school hardening before addressing difficult issues like mental health. The 14-member panel must file its initial re-

port to outgoing Gov. Rick Scott, his successor and the Legislature by Jan. 1. State Sen. Lauren Book, a member of the

commission, said she expects all legislators will read the report and take it seriously, given the magnitude of the tragedy.

"We all within the Legislature come from different backgrounds and different knowl-

edge bases," Book said. "Giving some information is good, getting too much into the weeds is dangerous."

social studies teacher Ernie Rospierski, who herded students down a stairwell and used his body to barricade the door behind them after being grazed by two bullets, told commissioners to be "very careful" about putting more requirements on teachers because they are already overworked. But, he said, the panel needs to begin writing "the playbook" for preventing future tragedies.

"Until that is finished, we are going to see this again and again," Rospierski said.

The commissioners decided not to go through their items publicly Friday. They said they would review possible recommendations accumulated by their staff individually, submit suggestions and concerns and then debate them publicly at their meeting next month.

Meanwhile, the attorney for the sheriff's deputy who was on the campus during the massacre started a charity website to raise money for the man's legal defense. Joseph DiRuzzo III started a GoFundMe

page for now-retired Broward County sheriff's Deputy Scot Peterson in hopes of raising \$150,000 "to defend him against any spurious claims of criminal liability." As of Friday afternoon, \$40 had been raised before the drive appeared shut down.

DiRuzzo noted the GoFundMe page in a lawsuit filed this week to block Scott Peterson from being forced to testify before the commission. Many commissioners have called Peterson "a coward" for not charging into the building with his handgun and confronting the shooter, who was armed with a semi-automatic

Security video shows Peterson arrived outside the three-story building where the killings happened shortly after the shooting began, about the same time the gunman finished slaying 11 people on the first floor. Peterson drew his handgun, but retreated to cover next to the neighboring building. The video shows Peterson never left that spot for 50 minutes, even after other deputies and police officers arrived on campus

Panel members have said they believe Peterson's inaction allowed suspect Nikolas

Cruz to climb to the third floor, where five students and one teacher were killed. They believe if Peterson, 55, had confronted Cruz and engaged him in a shootout he could have killed him or given others more time to

reach safety.

DiRuzzo said in his lawsuit that as the first deputy on scene, Peterson was the incident commander charged with coordinating law enforcement's response until relieved by a superior. DiRuzzo said Peterson was never relieved and fulfilled that duty directing officers into the building and ordering the closing of the school and surrounding streets.

Pinellas County Sheriff Bob Gualtieri, the panel's chairman, said Friday that DiRuzzo's lawsuit is "a work of fiction."

"Peterson did not do his job. Peterson is a failure, and he should be embarrassed and Any Entree \$9.00 or above held accountable for what he did not do," Gualtieri said.



son fought in the largest and deadliest battle of World War One. It occurred in France's Argonne Forest in the fall of 1918 and was the battle that weakened the German forces to the point of surrender. It was a bloody, muddy battle.

In the midst of the flying bullets and mortar shells Pinky took out a letter from home and scribbled down a few words on the back of it. Those words became the Aggie War Hymn, perhaps the most famous fight song in the world. The sound of the artillery's staccato rhythm made Pinky think of an old A & M yell that had the words Hullabaloo Caneck Caneck in it. Pinky got his nickname while

in school when someone threw a tennis ball at him. It hit him in the middle of his back. When he turned around to face the student who threw it, his face was red. The student said, "Well look at old Pinky." The name stuck. Pinky was a junior at A & M

when he volunteered for the Marine Corps. He could have gone the enlisted ranks and entered as a buck private. In the Marines he was a muleskinner and worked in supply until he was pressed into service on the front lines in the Argonne Forest. When the war ended he stayed in Germany as a guard. His famous song was first played on an old piano in a

caretaker's cabin near the Rhine River. He finally got to hear the words and the tune of the melody he had been carrying in his head for months. He carefully unfolded the letter with the words on the back, got paper and ruler and drew some musical scales. He Smith penned four copies for vocals and one copy for piano. Some of his Marine buddies sang it for the first

time. They sang it up and down the Rhine River, making Germans the first audience to hear the Aggie War Hymn. The original title was "Goodbye to Texas University." According to Dr. Don Powell, who wrote a history of the Aggie Band, the first time the song was sung on the A & M campus was at a pep rally in 1920.

The song has been played all

woke up astronauts Cernan and Schmidt while they were asleep on the moon.

In 2010 Bill Wilcox of Burnet contacted me to do a documentary on Pinky. Bill was Pinky's friend and in the mornings Pinky would stop by Bill's funeral home and tell war stories. When Pinky died in 1980, Bill handled the funeral and burial. "I kept noticing that modest headstone for Pinky and thought he deserved more." So Bill went about raising money for bronze statues of Pinky. One is on the A & M campus; another is near the depot in Bertram where Pinky had

I interviewed dozens of people for the documentary. I had interviewed Pinky in 1980, just months before his death. I used portions of that interview in the documentary. While doing research I went to all the libraries and museums on the A & M campus and asked if they had any audio or video recordings of Pinky. They said no. A & M recently contacted me and said I had the only recording of his voice.

Wolfe's best known work, posthumously, made a strong claim in its title: You Can't Go Home Again. During a 10-day November visit to Texas, now Kansan Ray Hildebrand proved him wrong.

An audience of more than 250 people--mostly gray-haired folks, some with high foreheads taking over where hair used to grow--gathered to "remember when." The evening was planned by fellow Howard Payne University alumnus Darrell Miles. In the audience were dozens of former college classmates who hadn't seen each other in 50 years. Ray was lavished with cita-

tions from a half-dozen entities, enough to cause bulging luggage on his flight back to Kansas City.

They heard his "Hey, Paula," of course, but also loved other renditions, mostly from his repertoire of some 500 numbers turned out since his signature song tugged at heartstrings

around the globe. Most were

'n 1940, novelist Thomas contemporary Christian songs, including "Say I Do," his composition most sung by other artists. Ray Price sang it on his final al-

bum....

What a "down home" celebration!

Attending the Cleburne event were his 86-year-old sister, as

well as cousins and numerous other relatives. "They're the ones who believed all those citations that made me sound more important than I ever was--then or now," he said.

Going through Joshua to the venue, Ray was engulfed in childhood memories. This was where he lived, birth through first Newbury grade. He so wished we could find "Aunt Rhodi's"

house--the one with a big goldfish pond and a storm cellar in back. I insisted that we look for it, wondering if the aunt's name was really "Rhodi." (Turns out, it was "Rhoda.")...

He remembered the cut-off from the "main drag." Within seconds, he spotted the 110-yearold home. We stopped, and the home's latest owner--a "fixerupper"—was on the front porch, ready to meet the AC guy on Sunday afternoon.

He guided Ray through the house that soon will sparkle with major renovations. Ray lifted the door of the storm cellar---one he remembered as being much larger--where spiders, snakes and such were plenteous.

Man's confessions solve 4 longunsolved slayings in 2 states

DALLAS (AP) — Investigators in two states say they've been able to close four unsolved murder cases because of confessions by a man being held in Texas who says he killed as many as 90 people over four decades. Investigators in Louisiana and Georgia said

Samuel Little's confessions have enabled them to solve slayings. Little, 79, is being held on a murder charge in West Texas. Little already was serving a life sentence in California when he was interviewed by a Texas investigator that resulted in the

Little provided details on two killings in Houma. Louisiana, "that only the murderer would have known," according to an internal Louisiana State Police memo obtained by The Associated Press.

Dorothy Richard, 59, was found dead in 1982, and the body of Daisy McGuire, 40, was discovered in 1996. Both had been strangled. The memo says Little has confessed to other kill-

ings in Louisiana and those claims are being inves-In Macon, Georgia, the Bibb County Sheriff's Of-

confessions allowed its investigators to close two murder cases, one from 1977 and another from 1982. In the 1982 case, the body of Fredonia Smith was found in the backyard of a Macon home. She had

been strangled. The 1977 victim has never been identified. Her skeletal remains were found at the edge of some woods in a local backyard.

Two Bibb County investigators traveled to Decatur, Texas, to question Little. The sheriff's office says he gave them specific details and information" linking him to both slayings, and Smith's family was notified about the new developments.

Reporting goes on after Abilene Reporter-News building fire

ABILENE, Texas (AP) — The staff of a West Texas newspaper has relocated to a nearby building as the reporting continues following a fire that damaged the publication's home.

Personnel from the Abilene Reporter-News were at work Friday at The Grace Museum a day after fire heavily damaged the newspaper's nearly 100-year-old structure. Nobody was hurt.

Editor Greg Jaklewicz, in an email to The Associated Press, said the cause of the fire remains under investigation but was likely electrical. Jaklewicz says restoration crews have begun cleanup. The newspaper's press appears undamaged but

The print edition of the Abilene Reporter-News, plus the San Angelo Standard-Times, which was printed in Abilene, will be printed at the Wichita Falls Times Record News facility. All three newspapers are owned by Gannett.

Texas Democrat attends House orientation amid contested race

AUSTIN. Texas (AP) — Democrat Gina Ortiz Jones has been in Washington attending orientation for new members of Congress despite Republican incumbent Rep. Will Hurd continuing to hold a lead of 1,000-plus votes in their contested race to represent a sprawling West Texas district.

Ortiz Jones could seek a recount and still has a couple of weeks to do so. She hasn't so far but also hasn't conceded — instead saying she's working to ensure that "every vote is counted." A spokeswoman for her campaign did not immediately return a phone message Friday.

Hurd leads Ortiz Jones by 1,150 votes, out of a little more than 209,000 counted. The margin between the two candidates is 0.55 percent. Texas law allows, the trailing candidate to request — and pay for — a recount as long as the margin is less than 10percent of the leading candidate's vote total.

Because of the recount option, the race is one of six congressional elections nationally where The Associated Press has not declared a winner, in some cases because officials are still counting

The 800-mile district runs from San Antonio to El Paso and is a perennial battleground. Hurd, who was first elected in 2014, has already declared vic-

Democrats flipped Republican-held Texas congressional seats in Dallas and Houston on the way to gaining control of the House.


Ortiz Jones isn't the only Democrat trailing her race to attend congressional training in Washington this week. Meanwhile, her campaign has pushed to get counted more provisional ballots, which were cast but not counted until certain problems — like voters not having correct ID — were resolved.

But the deadline for remedying those passed Tuesday, and a state district judge denied Ortiz Jones' request earlier this week to extend it for another 48 hours in Bexar County, which includes San Antonio. Her campaign has since filed an open records request with officials in smaller Medina County, asking for more information about why vote totals appeared to change while officials were counting ballots on Election Night.

The race could remain in limbo for a while.

Texas' deadline for recount requests is 5 p.m. on the second day after the final canvass of results. Counties statewide have until Tuesday to report their canvass results to the secretary of state. Republican Gov. Greg Abbott has until Dec. 6 .

Julian Castro says O'Rourke's future no factor in 2020 bid

SAN ANTONIO (AP) — Julian Castro said Friday that his decision about running in 2020 won't be influenced by whether Texas' other high-profile Democrat, Congressman Beto O'Rourke, also makes his own bid for the White House.

Texas is a pipeline of presidential contenders, churning out several major Republican candidates since 2000 alone, including former President George W. Bush. But not since 1976 has a Texas Democrat made a serious run. Now, however, Texas has two Democrats whose

names are being tossed around: Castro, the 44-yearold former housing secretary under President Barack Obama, and O'Rourke, whose surprisingly close loss to U.S. Sen Ted Cruz last week has Democrats believing that the GOP's decades-long grip on Texas is starting to slip. Castro has said his candidacy is "likely" and has

begun talking to potential donors. O'Rourke, on the other hand, said late in his Senate campaign that he wouldn't run for president, but his narrow defeat has reignited speculation.

Speaking at conference on Mexican-American civil rights in San Antonio, Castro said he hasn't talk to O'Rourke about his future but said it won't impact his decision.

"You're going to have a whole range of people that are going to run. What other people are doing is not going to affect what I do," Castro said. "If I make a decision to run, it's going to be because I believe that I have a strong vision for the future of the country, and that has nothing to do with any

Castro, who attended O'Rourke's election-night party in El Paso, wouldn't say what he might like to see O'Rourke do next.

"I'm not going to speculate," Castro said. "Like I

wouldn't speculate for anybody else. I'm not commenting on any of the other people, either. I assume that we're going to have a very crowded field." Castro has spent much of his political career being discussed as a potential presidential candidate

since he was elected San Antonio mayor at age 34. His twin brother, Joaquin Castro, is a Democratic Julian Castro would be a prominent Latino can-

didate in the 2020 field, and during a discussion Friday about progress in civil rights for Mexican Americans, Castro called the midterm elections significant "because the narrative coming out of it was that the Latino community pushed back." Democratic leaders said this week that in early

voting, compared to the previous midterm election, Latinos increased their participation by 174 percent in 2018.

Joining Castro at Our Lady of the Lake University was Henry Cisneros, another former San Antonio mayor who, like Castro, would later become the nation's housing secretary. When Cisneros reminded the audience that Castro was considering a 2020 run, several people shouted "Do it!"

Castro said he is still reaching out to people as he gets closer to making a decision.

"The 2018 election was one sort of message from the American people," Castro said. "But you also get a sense from just listening to folks on the ground what they're looking for in the next couple years."

Fire deaths rise to 71 ahead of Trump's California visit

CHICO, Calif. (AP) — With the confirmed death toll at 71 and the list of unaccounted for people more than 1,000, authorities in Northern California on Friday searched for those who perished and those who survived the fiercest of wildfires ahead of a planned visit by President Donald Trump.

The president on Saturday is expected to get a look at the grief and damage caused by the deadliest U.S. wildfire in a century, and he could face resentment from locals for blaming the inferno on poor forest management in California.

In an interview taped Friday and scheduled for broadcast on "Fox News Sunday," Trump said he was surprised to see images of firefighters removing dried brush near a fire, adding, "This should have been all raked out."

Deputies found eight more bodies Friday, bringing the death toll to 71.

The number of people unaccounted for grew from 631 on Thursday night to more than 1,000 on Friday, but Sheriff Kory Honea said the list was dynamic and could easily contain duplicate names and unreliable spellings of names.

He said the roster probably includes some who fled the blaze and do not realize they've been reported missing.

"We are still receiving calls, we're still reviewing emails," Honea said

Some on the list have been confirmed as dead by family and friends on social media. Others have been located and are safe, but authorities haven't gotten around to marking them as found.

Tamara Conry said she should never have been on the list.

"My husband and I are not missing and never were!" Conry wrote Thursday night on Facebook. "We have no family looking for us. ... I called and left a message to take our names off."

Authorities compiled the list by going back to listen to all the dispatch calls they received since the fire started, to make sure they didn't miss any-

In last year's catastrophic wildfires in California wine country, Sonoma County authorities at one point listed more than 2,000 people as missing. But they slowly whittled down the number. In the end, 44 people died in several counties.

The wildfire this time all but razed the town of Paradise, population 27,000, and heavily damaged the outlying communities of Magalia and Concow on Nov. 8, destroying 9,700 houses and 144 apartment buildings, authorities said.

Firefighters were gaining ground against the blaze, which blackened 222 square miles (575 square kilometers). It was 45 percent contained and posed no immediate threat to populated areas. Crews managed to stop it from spreading toward Oroville, population 19,000.

This patch of California, a former Gold Rush region in the Sierra Nevada foothills, is to some extent Trump country, with Trump beating Hillary Clinton in Butte County by 4 percentage points in 2016.

But some survivors resent that Trump took to Twitter two days after the disaster to blame the wildfires on poor forest mismanagement. He threatened to withhold federal payments from California.

"If you insult people, then you go visit them, how do you think you're going to be accepted? You're not going to have a parade," Maggie Crowder of Magalia said Thursday outside an informal shelter at a Walmart parking lot in Chico.

But Stacy Lazzarino, who voted for Trump, said it would be good for the president to see the devastation up close: "I think by maybe seeing it he's going to be like 'Oh, my goodness,' and it might start opening people's eyes."

In his Fox News interview on the eve of his visit, the president repeated his criticism. Asked if he thought climate change contributed to the fires, he said, "Maybe it contributes a little bit. The big problem we have is management." Nick Shawkey, a captain with the

state fire agency, said the president's tweet blaming poor forest management was based on a "misunderstanding." The federal government manages 46 percent of land in California.

"The thing he's tweeting about is his property," Shawkey said.

California's outgoing and incoming governors said they would join Trump on Saturday.

Democrats Gov. Jerry Brown and governor-elect Gavin Newsom said they welcomed the president's visit and "now is a time to pull together for the people of California." Brown and Newsom have been vocal critics of

There were also worries the presidential visit would be disruptive.

"It's already a zoo here and I don't care who the president is. He needs to wait because the traffic's already horrendous," said Charlotte Harkness, whose home in Paradise burned down. "He could just tweet something nice — three words: 'I am sorry,' and that's fine."

More than 450 searchers continued looking for human remains in the

Around 52,000 people have been driven out and have gone to shelters, motels and the homes of friends and relatives. With winter coming on, many are seeking answers on what assistance will be provided.

At the Chico Mall where the Federal **Emergency Management Agency and** others set up an assistance center, 68-year-old Richard Wilson sought information about lodging. His wife is nearly bedridden from lupus and fibromyalgia.

"We're having to stay at a Marriott, which is like \$100 a night, and we're running out of money," Wilson said as he stood outside in rubber sandals and no socks — the only footwear he had when he fled the flames that destroyed his home.

In Southern California, meanwhile, more residents were being allowed back in their homes near Los Angeles after a blaze torched an area the size of Denver and destroyed more than 600 homes and other structures. The blaze was 69 percent contained, authorities said.

At least three deaths were reported. Schools across a large swath of the state were closed because of smoke, and San Francisco's world-famous open-air cable cars were pulled off the streets.

dog named Spot.

Thompson waves at staff and stops in waiting rooms to talk with patients and families as he makes his way from one end of the hospital to the next. His rounds include the pediatric unit, adult in-patient units, the oncology department, surgical waiting room, and the hospital's testing lab.

The treatment he brings comes in the form of jokes, prescriptions for hugs and laughter, and colorful balloon flowers.

"When you get people to laugh, it takes their mind off their sickness," he says.

In the 930 hours he has logged since he began clowning at Baptist 11 years ago, the retiree has dispensed nearly 20,000 balloons and countless smiles to patients, families and staff.

It's a different kind of medicine in an often difficult time.

The comfort he provides isn't just for those receiving care, but also for those charged with providing it.

"This guy comes in every single week and makes us a flower. He brightens our day," lab worker Leisa Freeman says.

Her office, like many throughout the hospital, is decorated with Thompson's colorful creations.

"A balloon flower when you're having a rough day, it makes a difference," adds Vicki Holcombe, director of Volunteer Services.

When Thompson took up clowning 30 years ago, he did what most clowns do — worked parties, church and social events, did face painting and learned to make balloon animals. In 2007, he and a handful of fellow Golden Triangle Funny Bones clown ally members began volunteering at the hospital.

Thompson is the only one of the group left. Others dropped out for

health reasons.

Despite having his own health issues, which led to going on disability and an early retirement in 2013, Thompson chose to continue volunteering.

"I get more out of it than I give," he says. "It's really a blessing for me. It always gives me a good feeling."

One of the encounters he remembers most is meeting a woman in the waiting room of the intensive-care unit. She was waiting for her son to arrive, and would be breaking the news that his father, her husband, had just

"There were tears in her eyes, but I started clowning with her and brought out a smile," Thomp-

"Even in the toughest of circumstances, you can bring out a smile," Holcombe says.

Thompson views his work as a kind of ministry.

"God just put it in my heart to do this," he says.

Baltimore mayor picks Fort Worth chief as next top cop

BALTIMORE (AP) — Baltimore's mayor announced Friday she has chosen a Texas police chief as her nominee to lead the city's troubled force, seeking to rein in a soaring pace of violent crime and boost public trust in a tattered department where instability has become the norm.

In an op-ed published late Friday afternoon on The Baltimore Sun's website, Mayor Catherine Pugh said she believed Fort Worth Police Chief Joel Fitzgerald is "best suited to lead the way forward." She wrote that he has led a large police department and is "well versed on training and community engagement."

"Joel Fitzgerald is the person, in my view, to now lead Baltimore's police department into a new era of credibility, accountability and trust," she wrote. "I hope that you will give him the full and fair hearing he deserves as he works to earn your confidence as he has earned mine."

The mayor's spokesman confirmed that she expects Fitzgerald will start working as acting commissioner after Thanksgiving, taking over the responsibilities of interim Commissioner Gary Tuggle, whose predecessor was federally charged in May with willfully failing to file tax returns for

Fitzgerald, 47, will need to be confirmed by the Baltimore City Council to become permanent commissioner.

Recent years have been deeply tumultuous for Baltimore's police department, the eighth largest municipal police department in the United States. Fitzgerald would be the city's fourth police leader this year alone.

Baltimore is struggling to implement a federal consent decree mandating sweeping reforms after U.S. investigators detailed longstanding patterns of unconstitutional policing and excessive force. As commissioner, Fitzgerald would be a key player in making sure reforms encompassing some of the most fundamental aspects of police work — use of force, searches and arrests — finally take root in

Confidence in Baltimore's sworn protectors has badly deteriorated over many years. However, it might have hit rock bottom earlier this year after admissions by corrupt detectives on an out-ofcontrol unit revealed that members resold seized narcotics, conducted brazen robberies and falsified evidence.

There's been a worrying march of killings since 2015, when a 25-year-old black man's death in police custody triggered massive protests and riots. In 2017, the 342 homicides notched last year in Baltimore yielded a punishing homicide rate of 56 per 100,000 people, well above that of any other big

In recent days, some local Fort Worth community leaders have cast doubt on Fitzgerald as a true police reformer as speculation built that he would soon be departing for Baltimore.

"He was ineffective in bridging the gap between the police and the community," said Michael Bell, pastor at Greater St. Stephen First Church in Fort

Bell criticized Fitzgerald's handling of the fallout from a police encounter in 2016, in which a video showed a white Fort Worth officer wrestle Jacqueline Craig, a black woman, to the ground before arresting the woman and her daughter. The video sparked outrage and garnered national attention. The incident came after Craig complained that a man had physically confronted her 7-year-old son for allegedly littering.

There were calls for the officer to be fired, but Fitzgerald instead decided to suspend the officer for 10 days. Fort Worth and Arlington pastors asserted the arrests were The African-American police chief, instead, said the officer was rude and stated: "There's a difference between rude and racism."

Manny Ramirez, president of Fort Worth's police union, praised Fitzgerald's tenure and said the chief clearly advanced the department's relationship with the community. Ramirez described the aftermath of Jacqueline Craig's arrest as a no-win scenario for Fitzgerald. "That's kind of the burden that comes with being a chief," he said.

James Burch, a leader of the Washington-based Police Foundation nonprofit, said he doesn't see the overall challenges facing the next Baltimore commissioner as "entirely different from some other large urban agencies."

"Commissioners in other large cities have also faced challenging environments that compound crime concerns with issues like crumbling infrastructure, understaffing, low morale, etc," Burch said in an email.

For her part, Pugh believes Fitzgerald has shown himself to be a proven reformer who can motivate officers to "adapt to new approaches and new technologies." She said he understands that use-of-force policies must be clearly understood by rank and file, among other things.

"In each of his leadership positions, commissioner-designate Fitzgerald has established a reputation as a reformer and 'disrupter' of the status quo," she wrote.

Fitzgerald could not immediately be contacted for comment on Pugh's announcement. Fort Worth City Manager David Cooke said in a statement Friday that Fitzgerald has not yet submitted a formal resignation letter.

Beloved toy store FAO Schwarz makes its comeback

NEW YORK (AP) — Three years after it closed its beloved toy store on Fifth Avenue, FAO Schwarz has returned to New York.

A new FAO opened Friday in Man-

hattan's Rockefeller Center, about 10 blocks from its former home near Central Park.

For more than 150 years, FAO Schwarz was known in New York City for its classy and sometimes extravagantly expensive toys. The fantasyland store it opened on Fifth Avenue in 1986 was a tourist attraction, replete with its own theme song, doormen who looked like palace guards and a musical clock tower. Financial problems at the parent company and rising rents closed that store in 2015, but FAO is now pulling back from the worst financial precipice since it was founded in 1862.

In recent weeks at 30 Rockefeller Plaza, workers drilled, hammered and

sawed 24 hours a day to get the new store ready. Employees filled shelves with hundreds of plush animals that have long defined the brand — bears, bunnies, elephants, chicks and more. The big entrance clock tower has returned. And on the second level of



China, US trade barbs in speeches at Pacific summit

PORT MORESBY, Papua New Guinea (AP) — China's leader Xi Jinping and U.S. Vice President Mike Pence traded barbs in speeches to a summit of world leaders Saturday, outlining competing visions for global leadership as trade and other tensions between them simmer.

Pence said there would be no letup in President Donald Trump's policy of combating China's mercantilist trade policy and intellectual property theft that has erupted into a tit-for-tat tariff war between the two world powers this year.

The U.S. has imposed additional tariffs on \$250 billion of Chinese goods and China has retaliated. Pence reiterated Trump administration threats to more than double the penalties.

"The United States though will not change course until China changes its ways," he said, accusing Beijing of intellectual property theft, unprecedented subsidies for state businesses

Pence announced the U.S. would be involved in ally Australia's plan to develop a naval base in Papua New Guinea, where the summit is being held. China has been intensely wooing Papua New Guinea and other Pacific island nations with aid and loans for infrastruc-

"Our vision for a free and open Indo-Pacific will prevail," Pence said.

The vice president harshly criticized China's global infrastructure drive, known as the "Belt and Road Initiative," calling many of the projects low quality that also saddle developing countries with loans they

The U.S., a democracy, is a better partner than authoritarian China, he said.

"Know that the United States offers a better option. We don't drown our partners in a sea of debt, we don't coerce, compromise your independence," Pence said. "We do not offer constricting belt or a one-way road. When you partner with us, we partner with you and we all prosper."

Xi. who spoke before Pence, anticipated many of the U.S. criticisms in his speech. He said countries are facing a choice of cooperation or confrontation as protectionism and uni-

Xi expressed support for the global free trading system that has underpinned his country's rise over the past quarter century to world's second-biggest economy after the U.S.

"The rules made should not be followed or bent as one sees fit and they should not be applied with double standards for selfish agendas," Xi

"Mankind has once again reached a crossroads," he said. "Which direction should we choose? Cooperation or confrontation? Openess or closing doors. Win-win progress or a zero sum game?"

Responding to a chorus of criticism of China's international infrastructure drive, Xi said it was not a trap or power grab.

"It is not designed to serve any hidden geopolitical agenda, it is not targeted against anyone and it does not exclude anyone. It is not an exclusive club that is closed to non-members nor is it a trap as some people have labeled it," he said.

Leaders of 21 Pacific Rim countries and territories that make up 60 percent of the world economy are meeting in Port Moresby, the capital of Papua New Guinea for an annual Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation summit.

They are struggling to reach agreement on a joint declaration, particularly whether to push for changes to the World Trade Organization, which sets the rules for trade and can penalise nations that breach them.

FAO Schwarz has gone through multiple corporate takeovers in recent years as retailers struggled to adapt to online sales. It was purchased in 2002 by Right Start Inc., which filed for bankruptcy twice. Toys "R" Us was the next owner. It sold the FAO name to the California-based Three-Sixty Brands in 2016 before recently declaring bankruptcy itself.

FAO was founded in 1862 by German immigrant Frederick August Otto Schwarz, specializing in highend toys, some imported from Europe. By the 20th century, in stores across the country, fancy items included a \$1,500 jeweled Etch-A-Sketch and a Barbie-themed, hot pink foos-

ball table for \$25,000.

There are a few extravagant items to be had in the new store but plenty of modestly priced items, too.

"We have beautiful artisan pieces here, like rocking horses, but we also have items that are \$10," Niggli said. "There's always going to be some of those over-the-top items. I think that's part of what you come to FAO to see. It's part of the magic."

The most luxurious item on sale could be a child-size, drivable Mercedes Benz encrusted with 44,000 Swarovski crystals. Base price:

Kyrie Irving scores 43, Celtics beat Raptors 123-116 in OT

BOSTON — Kyrie Irving had 11 straight Boston points down the stretch and scored 17 in all in the last 8:06 of the fourth quarter.

Then in overtime, he really turned

The Celtics guard made or assisted on every basket in the extra period, finishing with 11 assists and a season-high 43 points on Friday night to lead Boston to a 123-116 victory over the Toronto Raptors.

"Man, he made some shots tonight where you're just like, 'Wow,'" forward Gordon Hayward said. "You catch yourself being a fan. When he gets into that mode, the whole arena knew where we were going, and so did the Raptors. They just couldn't stop him."

It was the first time Irving has scored at least 40 points with 10 or more assists in a game. He was the first player do it in the NBA this year, and the first Celtics player since Antoine Walker in 2001.

"Kyrie did a great job in the fourth quarter knocking down shots," said Kawhi Leonard, who scored 31 points and had a season-high 15 rebounds for Toronto. "We fought hard a 123-116 victory in overtime. tonight, they played a better game and we've just got to keep playing bet-

Jayson Tatum had 21 points and seven rebounds for the Celtics, who evened the season series at one game apiece against the only team to finish above them in the Eastern Conference last season. The home team has won nine straight matchups.

Serge Ibaka scored 21 and Pascal Siakam had 16 points and nine rebounds for the Raptors, who have lost three straight since opening the season with 12 victories in their first 13 games. Toronto never led in over-

there, just great competition for a Friday night in the NBA," Irving said. "You've got to appreciate that, two great teams going at it. And I'm pretty sure we'll see them down the road."

Hayward scored 15 points and had five rebounds and five assists in a team-high 39 minutes — by far his biggest workload since the injury that knocked him out in the first quarter of the first game last season. "I was wondering if they were going

to take me out of the game," he said. "Happy that he left me in. It felt good to play that many minutes. It's been such a long time. It was a good confi-

Hayward hit a pair of free throws to open the overtime, Ibaka answered with a jumper and from there it was all Celtics. Hayward scored on a pass from Irving, then Irving rescued Tatum from a near-turnover and drove for the layup to give Boston a 113-109

The Raptors never got closer than three points after that.

"Not too often during the regular season we get to have games like this," Irving said. "A great test for your team on both ends of the basketball floor, a great player in that other locker room, the competition and the level of play raises and you've just got to appreciate that."

END OF REGULATION

Toronto led by eight early in the fourth quarter and still had a 107-103 lead with 90 seconds left. But Tatum dunked to cut the deficit to two points and Siakam was called for pushing while going for a rebound, sending Hayward to the line for the game-tying free throws.

Leonard had a chance to win it at the end of regulation, but his long jumper went off the rim.

"The main thing is we're going to hold it until the very last shot so that nothing bad happens and they can't get a rebound and call a timeout," Raptors coach Nick Nurse said. "It's just man on man and you hope your guy can make the basket and we have a lot of faith in him that he can."

Late in the third quarter, Kyle Lowry got Tatum in the air with a fake and then tried to duck under him as the Celtics forward came over the top. But Tatum wound up kicking him in the head as he came back down.

Lowry went to the floor but relead their first double-digit advantage of the game. TIP-INS

Irving surpassed the 10,000 point and the 2,500 assist milestones. ... After going 1-4 on a road trip, the Celtics have won two in a row at home. ... 
"To be able to cap that off with an overtime winner from me, it feels really good."

lack Friday is right around the corner and store's price. almost here. Of course now it's more like "Black Week" or "Black Month" as the deals start earlier and run longer. There are some who aren't avid Black Friday shoppers for several reason. The crowd, stress, "people fighting

I have been always been pro Black Friday just because I'm a huge fan of a good bargain or sale. Who isn't? So being a Black Friday shopper for the past decade, I've learned the do's and don't of Black Fridays.

If you want to really get the best deals, you have to shop like a Black Friday Ninja. I've got 20 Black Friday tips you need to know about so that you can get the most out of your shopping...and save as much money as possible! Over the years, I've figured out some tips to really finding the best deals. There are also some other tricks I've learned to make the day even better and less stressful for me (and others).

I hope these ideas help you navigate shopping on Black Friday, and possibly even the few days leading up to this big shopping day.

1. Shop using discounted gift cards

It is always fun to get a deal. It's even better to get a great deal. A simple way to do this is to shop with discounted gift cards. Before you head out to shop, search on the internet to find discounted gift cards. You can find gift cards for hundreds of stores.

> This is also the time to figure out the other items you want and where they live in the store. This way, when you get there on Friday, you know where to head to get find the gifts on your list.

> > 10. Score early deals Many retailers now start to put items on sale online before Black Friday. This can mean amazing deals that won't be available later in the

week. Look at the stores you want to go and get the scope.

11. Shop for other holidays/events

I always make a list of the events coming up during the following year, even after Christmas. For instance, if I know someone is getting married next year, I look for the appliances or household items they might want. I have even picked up smaller toys to set back in our gift closet for kids' parties for the following year.

12. Don't wear red to Target

My mom learned this one the hard way! One year, she wore a long-sleeved red tee and was asked for help on numerous occasions.

13. Shop online instead

If you're able and if Black Friday stores are not your thing, you are in luck! Many of the in-store deals will be available online. The only items you will not find are the doorbusters.

14. Avoid Walmart (if you can)

While they typically have some of the best deals, keep in mind that you and 5,000 of your closest friends also want the same one. That means mobs of people. I mean MOBS. This is also historically where the fights and trampling seems to take place most frequently. There is no deal worth having where you risk injury of any sort. Ever.

15. Get out early

It means less sleep, but the sooner you can get to the store, the more likely you will find the items you want. Plan on waking up early (or staying up really late) to get the items on your list.

16. Shop late

Retailers want to keep the shoppers in the store all day long. They sometimes offer late shopper deals in addition to the early bird offers. 17. Follow your budget (and use cash)

18. Know that doorbusters are few and far between

Retailers want to get you into their store to shop. The way they often do this is with the doorbusters. Make sure you read the ad carefully. Many times these are limited to 25-100 items at each store. That means if you are not in line super early, you will not get the deal.

Sometimes if you get there right when the ad says the doorbuster will take place they will hand them out, but then you may have to put up with a crowd.

The Face of Agriculture

When I first began my research on new technological methods used in and the impact they had on agriculture, I came across the following

statement and just shook my head. "The synergic use of high technological farming instruments allows the shifting to a new paradigm of sustainable precision agriculture...". Why didn't they just say that "technology is changing the face of agriculture"? And it is not the first time.

In 1794, Eli Whitney secured a patent for his cotton gin, a hand cranked machine which dramatically increased cotton production by separating the cotton fibers from the sticky hard seeds.

agriculture Today's producer choses from a variety of technologies to collect data, increase and much more. In the same way that we use

GPS in our cars, tractors now help producers to map out their fields for plowing and planting. GPS technology can measure field acreage more precisely and record information about the acreage such as soil nutrients, moisture levels and pest infestations. It allows the farmer to navigate to specific locations in their fields to plow, collect soil samples, monitor crop conditions and check for disease, infestation, or weeds. (1) There are even driverless tractors that are linked to one operated by the farmer to mimic the path of the driver operated tractor. Driverless tractors are extremely expensive, but they have the potential to increase production and aid older farmers to work later into their lives by letting the machines do the physically taxing job of driving a tractor. (2) Like driverless cars, there are many producers who see potential problems with fully autonomous tractors (What happens if a plow breaks? Can it figure out how to go around a mud hole? etc.) and thus it may be a while before these tractors are common place. (3)

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) evaluates data collected with the help of the GPS. The GIS software can convert the data into a series of map overlays to help the producer gauge the effects of their management practices. It is like when you use online mapping to find a location or get directions.

A map of the farm may have a layer showing the land boundaries. The

next shows different soil types, the third irrigation and another the crop Taken together this map can help the producer to determine treatment of targeted areas with such things as seeds, fertilizers, pest control mea-

sures or water/irrigation. The more

precise the applications are the more

expenses are reduced and the farm be-

comes more environmentally friend-

ly and produces a higher yield. (4)

As drones become more common place from delivering packages to entertaining amateur flyers, the potential use for agriculture has not gone unnoticed. Cameras strapped

> to drones allow growers to closely monitor their crops, root out pests, and ensure that their water is being used efficiently. (5) More specialized drones have been fitted with infrared spectrum and some can count exactly how many cornstalks are growing in a single acre or take count of livestock herds. (6)

> Other technology advancements include robotic milking stations, radio frequency identification (RFID) chips that monitor cattle to check on eating patterns, movement and resting patterns and possible health issues.

> A new set of smartphone apps help cotton farmers by managing water usage by considering local weather conditions. GreenSeeker is a handheld device that measures a plant's health to determine how much fertilizer to be used. AutoProbes take soil samples to determine soil nutrition.

> Being an agriculture producer is hard work. It takes a dedicated person to be a good steward of the land and often is a family legacy. Perhaps technology can help but it will never be able to replace the personal knowledge and experience it takes to be an agriculture producer.

2 paintings belonging to LOVE artist sold at auction

PORTLAND, Maine (AP) — The estate of artist Robert Indiana, creator of the iconic LOVE series, auctioned off two paintings that belonged to him to raise money to defend against a lawsuit and to stabilize his deteriorating island home off the Maine coast.

Christie's Auction House sold the two works, one by Ellsworth Kelly and the other by Ed Ruscha, for a combined \$5 million at the gavel on Friday in New York.

Some in the art community were critical of the sale of the Indiana items.

Critics were especially disappointed by the sale of the 1957 "Orange painting Peel," a gift from close friend, Kelly. The two forged a relationship in New York, and critics believe the painting should be shown in Indiana's Maine home once it's transformed into a museum. The other painting was Ruscha's "Ruby."

The cash is needed because of mounting legal bills from a New York lawsuit claiming Indiana breached an agreement with the Morgan Art Foundation by entering into a side agreement with an art publisher, said estate attornev James Brannan. Some of the mon-

ey also will be used to shore Indiana's home, the Star of Hope, which suffers from a leaky roof and other problems. "It seems hasty

and inappropriate."

died at age 89 on May 19 at his home on Vinalhaven Island, 15 miles (24 kilometers) off the coast of Rockland, Maine. The New York lawsuit was filed the day

before he died. The foundation that sued controls the copyright to "LOVE," his instantly recognizable artwork from the 1960s.

Indiana's estate is rich on art — it includes more than 700 major pieces valued at more than \$60 million — but is short on cash, Brannan said. That's why the decision was made to sell a few pieces to raise some money.

Brannan said he consulted with an art curator and decided that he had another 13 other works by Kelly, including a dozen sketches of Indiana that would serve to tell the story of the relationship.

He also said he's reached out to the new owner of "Orange Peel" to see about having it loaned and exhibited at Indiana's museum.

Wilmerding, friend of Indiana's who paid summer visits to the Star of Hope, said he hopes someone can step in to ensure that Indiana's artwork isn't sold willy-nilly.

"Is this the first of what now will be an 'open sesame?' What's going to follow? It's Princeton University not a good precedent."

ROGER'S REVIEW: FANTASTIC BEASTS:

THE CRIMES OF GRINDELWALD

Welp. It happened.

Finally, 17 years to the day after the release of "Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone," the Wizarding World has let me down. I didn't care for the latest release in the franchise that started with the Harry Potter octalogy and continued with November 2016's "Fantastic Beasts and Where To Find Them."

The new movie, entitled "Fantastic Beasts: The Crimes of Grindelwald" is a disappointment: muddled, dark, and kind of boring save for a few minutes at the beginning and the end.

The film starts out okay. Grindelwald (you remember, the evil guy from the end of "Where To Find Them" portrayed by Johnny Depp) has been in an American Ministry of Magic dungeon, his tongue supposedly removed, for six months. He's going to be transferred back to England.

> Things go wrong as the flying coach carrying Big G makes it to the skies over London. Not too many spoilers, but there's a big midair (mostly) fight, and Grindelwald escapes. Then there's some

other stuff, and an exciting fight at the end.

What, you were expecting a coherent summary? Well, ummm...I know Newt Scamander

(Eddie Redmayne) has been confined to England, and is trying to get that restriction lifted. The British Ministry of Magic offers to lift it if he agrees to work with his brother Theseus Scamander (Callum Turner) to hunt down the obscurial Credence Barebone (Ezra Miller) from the last movie (remember the guy who turned into black smoke and killed people?





Yep, he's still causing problems).

Newt doesn't fancy Auroring (being a wizard policeman, for you muggles), so he declines. The ministry assigns the creepy auror Grimmson (Ingvar Sigurdsson) to find the kid instead.

Newt bumps into good old Jacob Kowalsky (Dan Fogler), the "No-Maj" (that is, Muggle) from the previous film. Jacob's still pining for Queenie (Alison Sudol), his witch love interest from the first film, but he decides to take off with Newt for the time being. Newt does manage to get them out out of England by hiring a dude with a "portkey." Potter fans will recognize the word – it's basically an item that teleports wizards places. In this case, a bucket. So they're off to Paris, where most of the rest of the talky part of the movie takes place.

Yep, Tina Goldstein (Queenie's older sister, played by Katherine Waterston) returns. She was Newt's budding love interest in the first film, but she's mad at him in this one. Maybe

because of Newt's former love interest, Leta Lestrange (Zoe Kravitz), who's related somehow to the Potterverse badgirl Bellatrix Lestrange. Leta shows up here in this film and there are a few reluctant sparks.

Yeah, there's some critters. A dragon thing that looks vaguely like the luck dragon from "The Neverending Story." Newt's little twig thing picks a lock or two. The platypus thing does something clever. Whatever. Can you tell the movie didn't really connect with me too much? Oh here's a twist: Newt traps the dragon thing in his bag, then pulls it out a time or two when things are looking grim. Too much of a spoiler? I don't think so.

Yeah young Dumbledore (Jude Law) is in it, as is young Professor McGonagall (Fiona Glascott). A young Nagini (Claudia Kim) snakes her way into the plot somehow. Probably the best part of the gooey middle of this film is Brontis Jodorowsky's portrayal of Nicolas Flamel, a 14th century, 600 year old Parisian alchemist who is believed to have discovered the Philosopher's Stone. Watch for him...he's fun.

There are just so many characters to keep track of, and a lot of them look very similar, that it was difficult for me, an experienced movie critic (haha) to keep track.

I went in wanting to like "Crimes," but I just didn't. Five stars out of 10.

William Goldman, Oscar winner for 'Butch Cassidy,' has died while I'll always wish he'd written one more, I'll "A screenplay is a piece of carpentry," he once

NEW YORK (AP) — William Goldman, the Oscarwinning screenwriter and Hollywood wise man who won Academy Awards for "Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid" and "All the President's Men" and summed up the mystery of making a box office hit by declaring "Nobody knows anything," has died. He was 87.

Goldman's daughter Jenny said her father died early Friday in New York due to complications from colon cancer and pneumonia. "So much of what's he's written can express who he was and what he was about," she said, adding that the last few weeks, while Goldman was ailing, revealed just how many people considered him family.

Goldman, who also converted his novels "Marathon Man," "Magic," "The Princess Bride" and "Heat" into screenplays, clearly knew more than most about what the audience wanted. He was not only a successful film writer but a top script doctor, the industry title for an uncredited writer brought in to improve or "punch up" weak screenplays.

Goldman also made political history by coining the phrase "follow the money" in his script for "All the President's Men," adapted from the book by Washington Post reporters Bob Woodward and Carl Bernstein on the Watergate political scandal. The film starred Robert Redford as Woodward and Dustin Hoffman as Bernstein. Standing in the shadows, Hal Holbrook was the mystery man codenamed Deep Throat who helped the reporters pursue the evidence. His advice, "Follow the money," became so widely quoted that few people realized it was never said during the actual scandal.

A confirmed New Yorker, Goldman declined to work in Hollywood. Instead, he would fly to Los Angeles for two-day conferences with directors and producers, then return home to fashion a script, which he did with amazing speed. In his 1985 book, "Adventures in the Screen Trade," he expressed disdain for an industry that elaborately produced and tested a movie, only to see it dismissed by the public during its first weekend in theaters.

"Nobody knows anything," he remarked.

Screenwriter and filmmaker Aaron Sorkin called Goldman a mentor.

"He was the dean of American screenwriters and generations of filmmakers will continue to walk in the footprints he laid," Sorkin said in a statement.

"He wrote so many unforgettable movies, so many thunderous novels and works of non-fiction, and

always be grateful for what he's left us." Goldman launched his writing career after receiving a master's degree in English from Columbia University in 1956. Weary of academia, he declined the chance to earn a Ph.D., choosing instead to write the novel "The Temple of Gold" in 10 days. Knopf agreed to

"If the book had not been taken," he told an interviewer, "I would have gone into advertising ... or something."

Instead, he wrote other novels, including "Soldier in the Rain," which became a movie starring Steve McQueen. Goldman also co-authored a play and a musical with his older brother, James, but both failed on Broadway.

James Goldman would later write the historical play "The Lion in Winter," which he converted to film, winning the 1968 Oscar for best adapted screenplay.

William Goldman had come to screenwriting by accident after actor Cliff Robertson read one of his books, "No Way to Treat a Lady," and thought it was a film treatment. After he hired the young writer to fashion a script from a short story, Goldman rushed out to buy a book on screen writing. Robertson rejected the script but found Goldman a job working on a screenplay for a British thriller. After that he adapted his novel "Harper" for a 1966 film starring Paul Newman as a private eye.

He broke through in 1969 with the blockbuster "Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid," starring Newman and Redford. Based on the exploits of the real-life "Hole in the Wall" gang of bank robbers, the movie began a long association with Redford, who also appeared in "The Hot Rock," "The Great Waldo Pepper" and "Indecent Proposal."

Other notable Goldman films included "The Stepford Wives," "A Bridge Too Far" and "Misery." The latter, adapted from a Stephen King suspense novel, won the 1990 Oscar for Kathy Bates as lead actress. In 1961 Goldman married Ilene Jones, a photographer, and they had two daughters, Jenny and Susanna. The couple divorced in 1991.

Born in Chicago on Aug. 12, 1931, Goldman grew up in the suburb of Highland Park. He graduated

from Oberlin College in 1952 and served two years Despite all his success as a screenwriter, Goldman always considered himself a novelist and

didn't rate his scripts as great artistic achieve-

said. "And except in the case of Ingmar Bergman, it's not an art, it's a craft."

U.S. stock indexes declined in midday trading Friday as losses in retailers and internet and technology companies outweighed gains elsewhere in the market. Health care companies and utilities were among the big gainers. Energy stocks rose as crude oil prices headed higher for the third day in a row.

US industrial production ticks up 0.1 percent in October

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. industry expanded slightly in October, with manufacturing growth offsetting declines in mining and utility production.

Industrial production ticked up a modest 0.1 percent last month, the Federal Reserve reported Friday. It was the fifth straight monthly gain and left output up 4.1 percent on a year-over-year basis.

The Fed said that recent hurricanes lowered production by about 0.1 percentage point in both September and October.

The economy has been growing at a solid rate this year. The gross domestic product expanded at an annual rate of 3.5 percent in the July-September quarter, with manufacturing contributing to the momentum.

But there are concerns that the strong dollar and a slowdown in global growth could hurt future

U.S. export sales. There are also worries about labor shortages and the impact of President Donald Trump's get-tough trade policies, which have featured higher tariffs on aluminum and steel along with penalty tariffs on a range of Chinese goods. China. Other countries have already retaliated with penalty tariffs on

Andrew Hunter, U.S. economist at Capital Economics, said that the new report "provides further evidence that economic growth is set for a gradual slowdown in the fourth quarter."

American products.

Based on the industrial production report, economists at Macroeconomic Advisers trimmed their expectation for GDP growth in the current October-December quarter from a 2.6 percent rate down to 2.5 percent. That would be a full percentage point below the third quarter's 3.5 percent growth rate.

cent in October, matching the previous month despite a big drop in auto production, which fell 2.8 percent last month. It was the second decline for the auto sector in the past four months.

The Fed report showed that production of primary metals jumped a strong 3 percent in October. That was the highest monthly gain since November 2012. Trump's tariffs on foreignmade steel and aluminum were aimed at boosting prospects for U.S. producers.

Output at the nation's utilities dropped 0.5 percent in October after a smaller 0.1 percent decline in September. Output in the mining sector, which includes oil and gas production, was down 0.3 percent in October following a smaller 0.1 percent September dip. Both of those declines came after this sector reached an all-time high in August, reflecting strong gains in oil and gas production.

US Congresswoman calls for delay in New Mexico oil case

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) — New Mexico oil and gas regulators are being pressured to delay a decision on an application by a Texas-based company that seeks to ease restrictions on well locations in one of the nation's oldest producing basins. U.S. Rep. Michelle Lujan Grisham, who begins

her first term as New Mexico governor in January,

is the latest Democrat politician to ask for a delay in the proceedings or to raise questions about the process. Her request came Thursday on congressional letterhead. Lujan Grisham wrote that more information is needed from the Bureau of Land Management and

from Hilcorp Energy Co., the company seeking the state rule change. "The oil and gas industry is a cornerstone of the New Mexico economy, but it is imperative that we balance this key economic driver with health,

safety and environmental considerations," her letter reads. Lujan Grisham and the state's Democrat-controlled Legislature will inherit a significant budget surplus for the coming year when they take office.

Most of that surplus is linked to the state's oil and natural gas sector. Environmentalists and landowners are concerned about increasing well densities in northwest New Mexico as developers look to tap more

reserves in the San Juan Basin. Hilcorp has said its application does not seek to drill more wells or change the way new wells are permitted. The Oil Conservation Commission is scheduled

to continue hearing the matter Monday. A spokeswoman for the agency said the commission has met all requirements to provide proper notice of the ongoing proceedings.

According to its application, Hilcorp currently operates more than 5,300 producing wells in what is known as the Blanco-Mesaverde gas pool in San Juan Basin. It also has thousands of wells that are producing from other formations in the region.

Those additional wells could recover reserves

Minor-suit games are compara-

tively rare because they amount to a prediction that precisely 11 tricks will be made, neither more nor less. In the great majority of cases where there are 11 potential tricks in a minor-suit contract, three notrump will prove easier to make.

However, hands exist where the minor-suit game makes and the notrump game does not. Such hands require accurate bidding, but the ulti-

Take a case like this one where North-South avoided the treacherous three-notrump contract and wound up scoring a slam instead.

The first key bid was North's three diamonds. North certainly had the high-card values necessary for a raise to three notrump, but, with a singleton spade, he decided to warn South that a notrump contract could be dangerous.

This message was not lost on South, who next bid three hearts. This action served several purposes. It not only showed heart control, but also implied concern about spades. In addition, it kept the door open to game in notrump while also serving as a cuebid in case North harbored slam aspirations.

North thereupon jumped to five diamonds. This bid clearly implied control of spades in the form of either a singleton or a void, since otherwise North would presumably have taken the easier route to game in notrump At the same time, the jump to five diamonds indicated extra strength and the willingness to undertake a slam if South had the appropriate

South was pleased to accept the invitation. He knew that North had queen-high trump support at best and so almost surely had the A-K of clubs and king of hearts to account for his previous bids, making the slam an excellent proposition.

The company also has argued that changing well density limits wouldn't eliminate the need to meet regulatory standards and environmental, cultural and archaeological requirements for drilling new wells or working on existing wells.

Supporters of the proposed change, including the energy advocacy group New Mexicans for Economic Prosperity and economic development officials from the region, say the increased productivity of the wells could lead to millions of dollars in additional tax revenues.

The New Mexico Attorney General's Office sent its own letter in early November, seeking clarification from the state Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department which oversees the Oil Conservation Division — about the hearing process and public notification.

In October, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency also requested that Hilcorp provide information on its production facilities in New Mexico to ensure compliance with federal clean air rules.

Rancher Don Schreiber, who has been a vocal opponent of Hilcorp's proposal, said that information should also be considered by the state oil commission before a decision is made. He said he wants to ensure state

Iraq resumes Kirkuk oil exports after year-long pause (AP)—Iraq Kurdish Regional Gov- try's auton

BAGHDAD(AP)—Iraq began piping oil from its fields around the disputed city of Kirkuk on Friday, more than a year after exports were halted over troubles with the autonomous Kurdish administration north of the country. The region will export

between 50,000 to 100,000 barrels of crude oil per day through a pipeline to Turkey, said Oil Ministry spokesman Assem Jihad after a deal was reached to break the deadlock between Iraq's capital Baghdad and the ernment based in Irbil.

Federal forces seized Kirkuk and the surrounding oil fields in October 2017 after the KRG organized a symbolic but controversial referendum for Kurdish independence. Exports were termi-

nated in the wake of the takeover, costing both sides billions of dollars in revenues as they haggled over revenues and pipeline fees.



Preheat oven to 450. Grease baking sheet. Sift flour. baking powder and salt into medium bowl. Using pastry blender or knives, cut into butter and shortening until mixture resembles coarse *crumbs. Stir in enough milk* to make soft dough. Turn out onto lightly floured

surface. Knead dough lightly. Roll out ½ inch thick. Cut biscuit rounds with 2-inch cutter. Place on greased baking sheet. Bake 8-10 minutes or until browned. Cheese Bread By: Daphne Crane

4 - 4 ½ C All- purpose flour 1 pkg. Active Dry Yeast

1 Egg

1 ½ C. Shredded Cheddar cheese, Swiss cheese or Monterey Jack Cheese W/ jalapeno peppers

1 ½ C Warm Water

½ C Sugar

 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt

Combine 1 ½ cups all-purpose flour and active dry yeast. Add egg, Cheese, warm water, sugar and salt. Beat with an electric mixer on low speed for 30 seconds, scraping bowl. Beat on high speed for 3 minutes. Using $2\frac{1}{2}$ - 3 cups all-purpose flour, stir in as much as you can. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Knead in enough remaining flour to make a moderately stiff dough that is smooth and elastic (6 to 8 minutes total). Shape into a ball. Place in a greased bowl: turn once. Cover let rise in a warm place till double (1 to $1\frac{1}{4}$ hours). Punch dough down. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Divide in half. Cover; let rise in a warm place till nearly double (about 45 minutes). Bake in a 350 oven for 40 – 45 minutes or until done. Cover loosely the last 20 minutes, if necessary. Remove from pans; cool. Makes 2 loaves (32 servings).

3 C Dry Bread Cubes ½ to ¾ C Chicken Broth

4 Slices Bacon, chopped 1 C. Celery, chopped

In a skillet cook chopped bacon, celery, and onion over medium heat till bacon is crisp and vegetables are tender. Do not drain. Meanwhile, in a bowl combine eggs, parsley, poultry seasoning, and pepper.

Add corn bread and bread cubes toss lightly till mixed. Add bacon mixture. Drizzle with enough of the broth to moisten, tossing lightly till mixed. *Use to stuff one 8 – 10 LB turkey or domestic goose. (Makes 8-10 servings)*





Brown Sugar Cheesecake:

All ingredients should be room temp. 3 blocks (8 oz. each) of cream cheese (low-fat does not work well) 3/4 cup packed brown sugar 1/2 cup granulated sugar

3 large eggs

6 tbs heavy cream

1 1/2 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp vanilla

Prepare a 9" springform pan by spraying well with cooking spray. Cut a circle of parchment paper to fit into the bottom of the pan. then wrap teh outside of the pan in foil so water does not seep into the cheesecake as it is baking. In a mixer, beat cream cheese until smooth. Add brown sugar and sugar and beat until well combined. Next, add eggs, one at a time, and mix after each egg until just blended. Next, add the cream, cinnamon and vanilla. Mix until just combined. Pour cheesecake batter into the springform pan, and place the pan in a baking dish large enough for a water bath. Add boiling water to the baking dish so it comes about halfway up the pan. Bake at 350 degrees for approximately one hour. The edges and top of cheesecake should be set but slightly ending with the dry, and mix until just comjiggly. Once the cheesecake reaches this stage, turn oven off and leave cheesecake in oven for an additional 30 minutes. After 30 minutes, prop the oven door open with the handle of a wooden spoon, and leave cheesecake in oven for an additional 30 minutes to cool. Remove cheesecake from water bath and allow to cool completely before assembling the cake.

Pumpkin Cake:

2 1/4 cups flour 1 tsp baking powder

1 tsp baking soda

3/4 tsp salt

2 tsp cinnamon

1/2 tsp nutmeg 1/2 tsp ginger

1/4 tsp ground cloves

1 cup sugar

3/4 cup packed light brown sugar

1/2 cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, melted & cooled slightly

1/2 cup vegetable oil

4 large eggs (at room temp)

1 - 15 oz can pumpkin puree (not pie filling) 1/3 cup milk

1 1/2 tsp vanilla extract

1/2 cup finely chopped pecans

Combine flour, baking soda, powder, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, ginger & cloves. In a separate bowl, mix eggs and sugar until light & fluffy. Add oil and butter and mix until combined. Combine pumpkin puree, milk & vanilla. Alternate adding dry ingredients with the milk/pumpkin mixture, starting and bined. Add pecans and mix until combined. Pour into 2-9 inch circular cake pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes until toothpick inserted into the center of cake comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes, then remove from pans. Allow pumpkin cake to cool completely before assembling.

White Chocolate Cream Cheese Frosting

All ingredients should be at room temperature.

2-2/3 cups white chocolate chips

2 cups unsalted butter

2 8oz packages of cream cheese

2 tsp. lemon juice

4 tsp. vanilla extract

1/2 tsp salt

5 cups confectioners sugar

In a double boiler, melt white chocolate chips and allow to cool slightly. In an electric mixer, combine cream cheese and butter until light & fluffy. Add vanilla, salt and lemon juice; mix until well blended. Add cooled, melted white chocolate and beat until well blended. Gradually add in confectioners sugar, on low speed, and beat until well blended, scraping sides of the bowl as needed. There should not be any clumps in frosting.

Actors have different ways of getting into a character.

For some, it's shadowing someone who does what their character does, like a cop or firefighter. For others, it's meeting the person they're portraying, if possible. And for still others, donning the getup will do it.

We all know Martina McBride as a Grammy-nominated country artist with a laundry list of hit recordings to her name.

But the 52-year-old Kansas native is also a wife and mother who likes to grow her own vegetables and cook for her family when she can. And it's that Midwestern sensibility she brings to a new series she hosts on Food Network beginning this week.

In "Martina's Table," premiering Sunday, Nov. 18, McBride gives a glimpse into how she entertains at home, sharing recipes and cooking tips as she prepares meals for her family and friends including Sheryl Crow, Faith Hill and Karen Fairchild and Kimberly


24 hours. And then I made an infused oil with garlic and spices and I just rubbed that all over the turkey and put it in the oven and blasted it for about 30 minutes at a higher heat and reduced the heat. And I stuffed it with citrus, orange and lemons and sage and rosemary and it was delicious. ... The flavor gets down in the turkey, the salt flavor, and then it also makes the skin really crispy."

In subsequent episodes, McBride does a Mexican spread of black bean enchiladas, confetti rice and avocado hummus, and a casual holiday brunch for friends.

Many of the recipes prepared on "Martina's Table" can also be found in her new cookbook "Martina's Kitchen Mix: My Recipe Playlist for Real Life," which she says is a reflection of how she and her family eat.

"I eat healthy about 90 percent of the time," she explains, "but you just every once in a while have to have a decadent, cozy comfortcasserole and we did a turkey because we had a food dish. I think the book has a good balance Thanksgiving episode. So just kind of a variety of those recipes. We have some really healthy vegetarian (recipes) and things that are on the healthier end and then I have chocolate "I think it's the way people eat," she






