## Record rainfalls flood low lying areas

Floyd County again received rain, hail and a tornado alert during the past week and weekend. Storm clouds have been roaming the entire High Plains Region almost on a nightly basis.

Data obtained from the National Weather Service and West Texas Mesonet, has Floydada receiving 7.54 inches of rainfall in May, 2007. A total of 17.15 inches of rain has fallen so far in the first five months of this year.

In comparison, the entire 12 month yearly rainfall for 2006 was 19.60 inches. In 2005, the total rainfall was 20.29 inches and in 2004 it was 27.07 inches. In 2003 it was 14.73 inches and in 2002 the yearly total rainfall was 20.70 inches.

According to City Manager Gary Brown, "Thursday night, May 31, was as intense a night of cloud watching as I have been through in my 20 years as city manager. There were times last Thursday night that I truly thought our town could be hurt seriously."

Tornado spotters were seeing possible funnel clouds wrapped in rain, and rotation of clouds dipping down near the McCoy community, all heading toward Floydada last Thursday night, according to Brown.

The sirens sounded in Floydada for about 20 minutes, from around 9:20 p.m. to about 9:40 p.m. "I am pleased with how our emergency operations center works and those who work in it. There is more to it than most people think," said Brown.

Brown added, "I am always amazed how people react to this kind of weather. The t.v. stations told the people of Floydada to seek shelter about 15 minutes before the sirens sounded but the phones in the emergency operations center still lit up after sirens sounded. People were asking if the situation was serious and where they should go. I would think people would have planned this out in advance."

The playa lake south of town, near the Dairy Queen, filled up

## Plans adopted for Floydada's "Y" welcome

The architecture plans for the "Welcome" entrance at the Floydada "Y" intersection have been unveiled by the planning committee, "Floydada PRIDE."

the water).

## Change of Venue granted for Michelle Araujo's trial

A Change of Venue has been granted for Michelle Araujo's trial to be moved from Floyd County to Randall County.

Araujo was indicted May 8th for Attempted Murder and Aggravated Assault. She was arrested March 10, 2007 for allegedly shooting her husband, Romeo Araujo.

The publicity surrounding the incident led Araujo's attorney,

Terry McEachern to request a Change of Venue.

The 110th District Judge, Bill Smith, will still hear the case.

Floyd County's District Attorney Becky McPherson recused herself from the case and Randall County's District Attorney, James Farren, will be the prosecuting attorney.

The trial has been set for sometime in October 2007.

## Araujo submits resignation as Lockney's City Judge

Michelle Araujo, the City Judge for Lockney, has submitted her resignation to the City Council.

According to Lockney Mayor Roger Stapp the City Council will vote to accept or reject the resignation at the City Council meeting on June 14th.

On April 5, 2007, the State Commission of Judicial Conduct suspended Araujo with pay from

the office of Justice of the Peace and from the office of Municipal Court Judge for the City of Lockney.

Although she will no longer be paid after her resignation as City Judge, Araujo will continue to be paid as Justice of the Peace until the outcome of her trial for Felony Assault Charges with a Deadly Weapon.

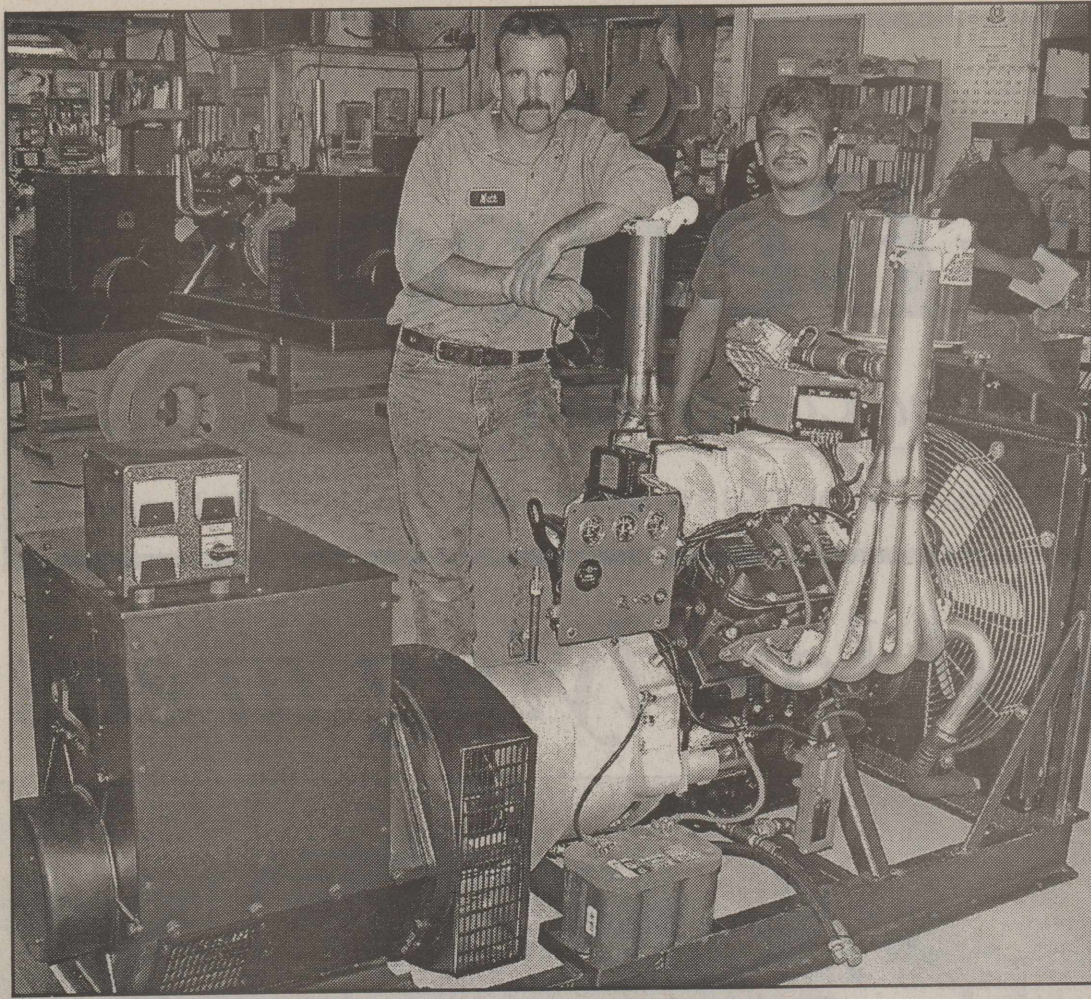

## Hardy's methane engines on their way to the Philippines

Locals know that Don Hardy hasn't been just about Race Cars for a long time. Hardy's expertise in fuel efficient engines led him from race cars to irrigation engines and now to Industrial Generators.

The Fuel Efficient Engines part of Hardy's business has been sending industrial generators overseas to Asia since the mid 90's. The engines produce 100 KWs.

"We've been into irrigation engines since the 1980's," said Fernando Arvizu, Hardy's general manager for the past 25 years.

"It was a relatively simple carburetion change that led to an engine that would run on meth-

ane."

This methane engine coupled with a newly invented digester has taken Hardy's engines into a new and profitable arena.

Most of the generators are going to pig farms in the Philippines, and other parts of Asia. The pigs produce the methane and the "digester" collects the methane gas that fuels the generators.

Arvizu said, "A gentleman with Philippine Bio Gas Corporation heard about us from bio-gas testing that was done at Texas A&M."

"The gentlemen knew one of the professors doing the testing and after he got our name he asked us to come up with a power unit that generates electricity us-

ing bio-gas.

"This gentleman invented his own digester and the two have worked very well together."

According to Arvizu the pig farms are self-sufficient operations.

Arvizu said the dual fuel engines can also run on propane. "A city in the Philippines is also using one of the engines as a back-up generator if case the city's lights go out," said Arvizu.

The amount of engines being built and shipped at one time has increased from about 4 at a time to a recent order of 32.

"We have sold 50 so far this year," said Arvizu. "We can produce 3-4 a week. We hope it can progress where we are producing them year round."

## Palo Duro Basin Oil and Gas Report

**Floyd County:** On Thursday May 31, 2007 PetroGlobe Inc. of Calgary, Alberta Canada issued their 2007 First Quarter Report, which included updates on the PetroGlobe Energy U.S.A. Ltd. Palo Duro Basin operations.

PetroGlobe Inc. announced the four mile pipeline connection from the McIntosh location to the Atmos Energy Distribution pipeline had been completed and pressure tested. PetroGlobe Inc. stated it is waiting on (1) the completion of the fabrication of the McIntosh Lease Gas Process-

ing Facility, (2) the installation of this facility on the McIntosh location; (3) the installation of the tap connection to the Atmos Energy pipeline; and (4) the installation of the Atmos energy metering facility. PetroGlobe Inc. stated that commercial production from the McIntosh Lease should begin late in the third quarter of 2007 or early in the fourth quarter of 2007.

PetroGlobe Energy U.S.A. Ltd. continues to frac and perform completion work on the McIntosh Lease Well #176.

**Motley County:** Area rains continue to delay the rig move and the spudding of the Bankers Petroleum (US) Inc. Black 4 Well #1.

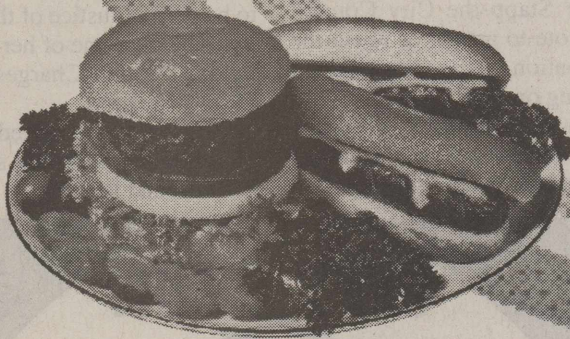

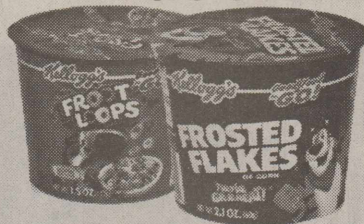

# Towery's POW days to be documented for Chinese Museum

Ken Towery, owner of the Floyd County Hesperian-Beacon, recently entertained reporters and cameramen from Central Chinese Television.

The crew were in the Austin home to interview Towery on his years in the Mukden prison camp as a Japanese Prisoner of War during WWII.

Formerly called Mukden by the Japanese, the Chinese city is now called Shenyang.

Along with the CCTV crew was independent writer, Yang Jing. This was the first time Yang Jing and Towery had met face to face, but it was an emotional visit because of the work Yang Jing had done for Towery in finding out the fate of a long lost Chinese friend.

The two had become good friends through internet correspondence.

A resident of Shenyang, Yang Jing was employed at the U.S. Consulate in 1993. While there he received an inquiry from a survivor of the Mukden Prison.

"I started checking into finding the prison and could find no records at all," said Yang Jing. "It got me interested and I wondered why?"

Shenyang is now a populous city and it appeared at first as if the P.O.W. camp had simply disappeared, or had been replaced by tall apartment buildings.

Yang Jing set out to find the camp. "I stopped in an area where I thought it might have been and asked an older man if he knew anything about the camp," said Yang Jing. "He sent me right to it."

According to Yang Jing the remains of the camp were basically hidden in "plain view".

"There are apartment buildings all around it and it looks very small in comparison."

As a historian and a writer Yang Jing felt the story of the prison needed to be told.

"I needed to tell my people the history," said Yang Jing. "This is not the way it should be. History shouldn't be lost."

After Yang Jing began to write and tell the story the City authorities started looking into the need

to clean up the area and make the camp a Museum. Two of three "dormitories" remain and historical restoration work is being done on the buildings left.

The City has planned a guided tour of China and a special ceremony at the prison site to honor all ex-prisoners who could attend.

Because of ill health many of the remaining prisoners could not make the trip so the CCTV crews were dispatched for interviews to be kept as part of Mukden's history.

Because of his perfect English, his historical knowledge and research of Mukden, and his friendship with Towery, Yang Jing was naturally part of the crew.

The documentary, including Towery's recollections of prison days, will also include his new friendship with Yang Jing and the unusual circumstances that brought them together.

To understand Towery and Yang Jing's history you have to start back in 1945 (and the years earlier in the Mukden prison camp).

While a prisoner, Towery made the acquaintance of a Chinese laborer, Ge Qingyu (pronounced Guh Ching-yu). Towery and Qingyu worked side by side in the factories. Qingyu walked a tight-rope of not only being in charge of the prisoners doing their job but also being at the mercy of ruthless Japanese guards watching every move they made.

Just because Qingyu went home at the end of the day, instead of to the prison camp, did not mean he was any less afraid of the Japanese. In many ways he was also a prisoner.

Qingyu not only risked his life teaching Towery Chinese, but he is credited by Towery with perhaps saving his life with hidden food.

Working in a Mitsubishi factory the prisoners would take machinery apart so the Japanese could see how it was put together. Then the prisoners were supposed to put the equipment back together. They did their best to reassemble machines minus ball bearings.

Towery and Qingyu worked out an arrangement whereby Towery would leave ball bearings hidden in a sawdust pile.

Qingyu would take the ball bearings when he went home and sell them on the black market. He would return with a raw egg that he would also hide in the sawdust.

Towery would get the egg and suck out the nourishment.

Both would have been severely punished if discovered.

When the war ended with the Russian's "liberation" of the camp, Towery feared for the safety of his friend Qingyu. Many of the Chinese were put into forced labor camps by the Russian Communists and Towery was afraid Qingyu's hatred of the Russians would lead him to trouble.

The two set down and wrote letters before their separation.

Towery's letter asked for Qingyu to be treated as a "friend of the Americans" if he was ever in a situation where he needed help. This was kept by Qingyu.

Qingyu's letter to Towery gave his address and best wishes and told other Chinese how to direct Towery to Qingyu's home.

Through the years Towery was advised it would not be wise for him to contact his friend as the political climate between the U.S. and China was not good. The story of Towery's and Qingyu's friendship could have actually proved harmful to Qingyu.

Fast forward to March, 2005.

With better relations between the countries, Towery sent off a letter to the American consulate in Shenyang, asking how he could go about locating his friend.

His letter made it's way to Yang Jing who obtained a copy of Qingyu's letter from Towery. Yang Jing then set out to find Qingyu. (This story was chronicled in the Hesperian-Beacon)

What he found was that Qingyu's family still lived close to Shenyang. Qingyu has passed away after what his family described as a long and healthy life.

Qingyu's family remembered their father talking often of "his American friend".

Yang Jing sent back photographs of the family to Towery, and Towery sent his own photos of his family.

Towery also sent enough money to pay for one year of college for Qingyu's granddaughter. She now refers to Towery as "Grandfather".

Towery will forever be grateful to Yang Jing for bringing a good ending to one chapter in his life that was full of much heartache and despair.

Yang Jing has been married to his wife, Yen Cheng Wei, for 18 years. She is a Philosophy professor at a local university. Their 17 year old daughter, Yang Wenshi is in "senior high school."

He is the author of "Mukden Nirvana" which was published in 2003. He also made a Mukden documentary called, "P.O.W. Accounts of a Death Camp".

Yang Jing says the current documentary being filmed will be shown on a Chinese news program that is similar to the U.S. "60 Minutes" program.

## Funeral Home has new owners

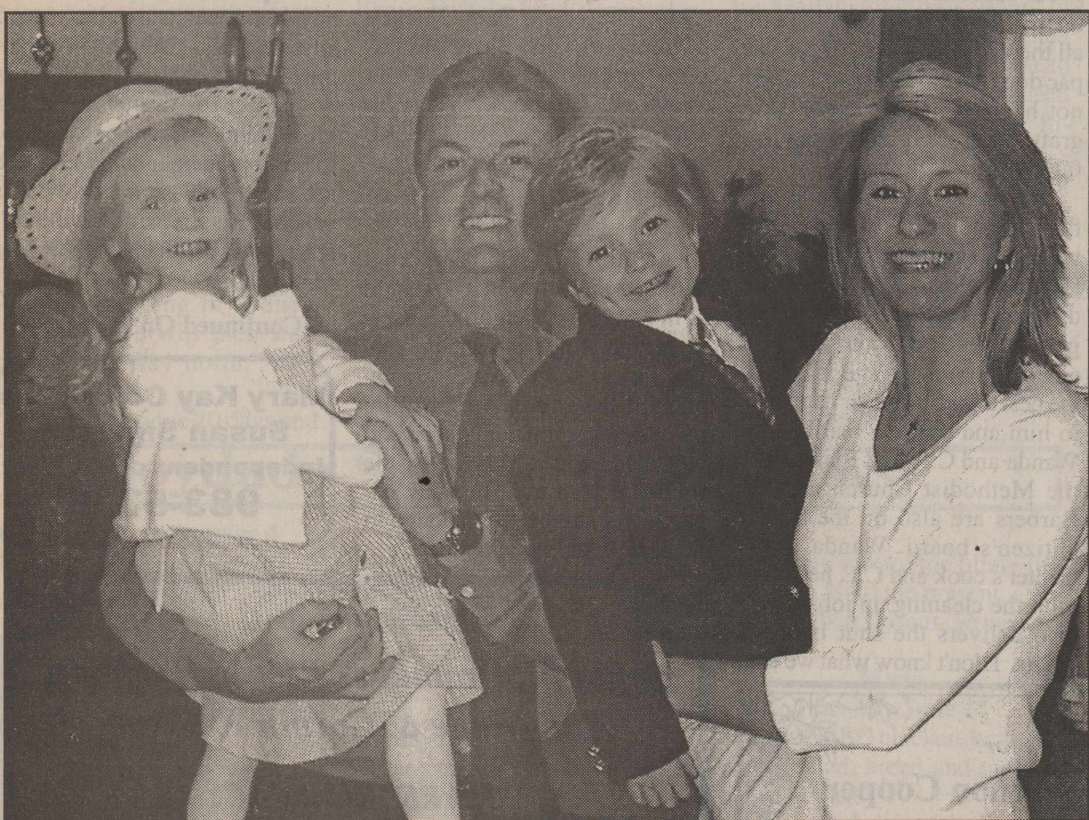

# Stapp and Vasquez exchange vows



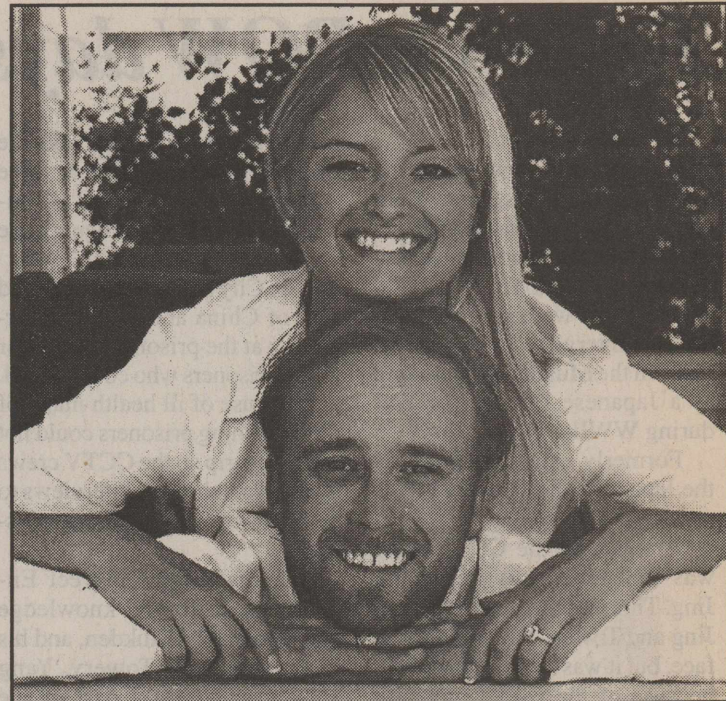

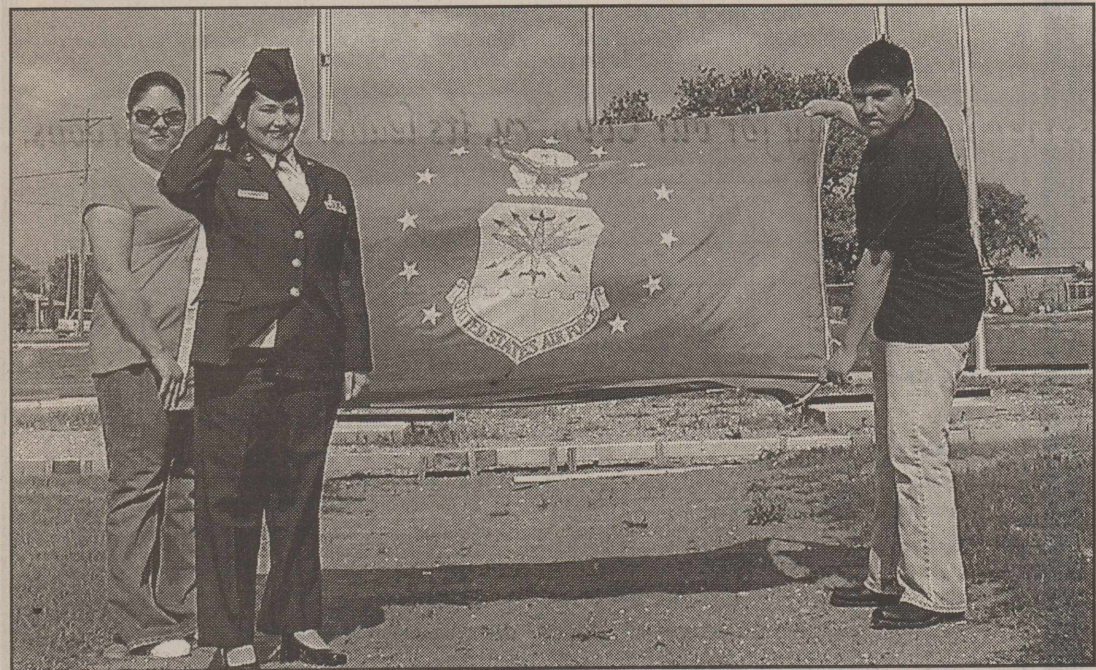

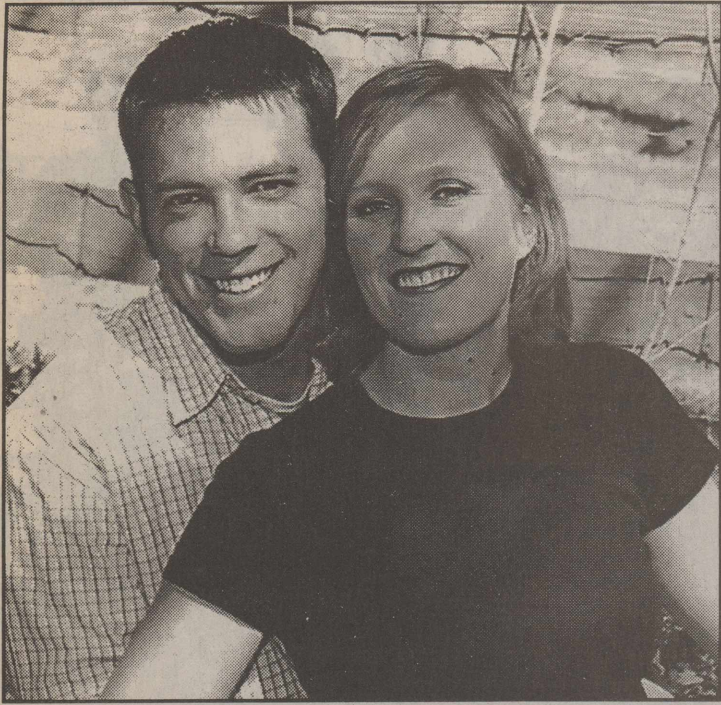

To be selected for People to People, Katie had to first undergo an interview process.

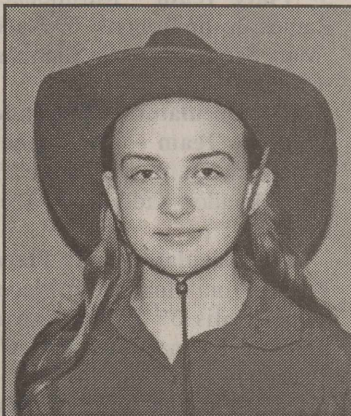
"I will stay with an Australian family," said Katie for a couple of days, and also stay on a farm for a couple of days.

"Buffalo up", according to Katie, is an expression used to explain a quick group huddle the group will do, if one of their members senses danger, or feels threatened.

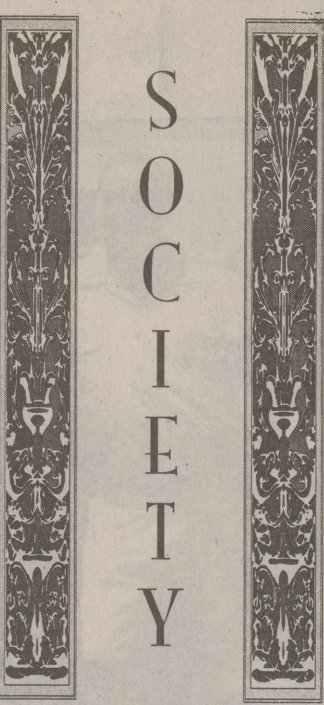
"We raise a fist in the air," said Katie, "and everyone immediately groups tightly around you like a buffalo herd does when threatened."

## Playa Lake Workshop set for June 27

Did you know Floyd County ranks second in the number of playa lakes on a per county basis with a total of 1,763 to be exact?

To address how to better manage these in Floyd County the Texas Cooperative Extension Service will be conducting a Playa Lake Workshop on June 27 at the Floyd County Friends Unity Center. Registration will start at 8:30 with the workshop concluding at 3:00 p.m.

Ken Cearly, Extension Wildlife specialist will be the program presenter.

The meetings will include sessions on the value of the plants, historical use of playas, managing playas for pheasants and waterfowl, and assistance programs

available, Cearly said.

Special programs will be presented on the Mossy Oak / Ducks Unlimited Ochiltree playa restoration project and the Ogallala Commons, he said, as well as hunting/leasing/recreation opportunities.

A field tour at each site will be taken to show nearby contrasting playa management scenarios, ie heavily grazed vs lightly grazed or ungrazed, cropland playa with buffer vs without, fenced vs unfenced, Cearly said.

Though the cumulative footprint is relatively small, playas still make up 400,000 acres in the High Plains, or about 2 percent of the land area, he said. Texas possesses the largest number of

playas, an estimated 20,000, he said. Another 10,000 playas can be found in New Mexico, Colorado, Nebraska, Kansas and Oklahoma.

Playas are an important landscape feature, Cearly said.

"These small wetland areas hold enormous capability for ecosystem contribution, yet often fall short of their productive potential due to lack of management," he said. "In many cases, playas are ignored, unnoticed or over-utilized."

Varying in configuration and size, from less than an acre to several hundred acres, Cearly said playas serve as a source of Ogallala Aquifer replenishment and provide habitat for numerous

Crop progress reports always seem to lag a little behind what is happening in real-time, but they often provide a helpful overview of how things are going out in the country.

This week's crop progress report detailing planting progress from the United States Department of Agriculture provides a pretty fair picture of how things were going through May 25, but doesn't capture the beneficial impact of this week's favorable weather conditions on the Texas High Plains.

Based on Texas Cooperative Extension reports and discussions with producers around the High Plains it appears that the week just ended was a good one for most of the High Plains. The weather has allowed growers to make up some ground and get closer to where they would like to be at this time of year.

Barring a widespread rain event that inundates a large portion of the area south and west of Lubbock it appears that the region's cotton acreage will be planted by the applicable Federal Crop Insurance deadlines.

Even with this optimistic outlook, it is important to note that things aren't perfect in all corners of the High Plains. Widely scattered storms continue keep some fields just wet enough to hamper planting and have also included some hail events that severely damaged cotton that had already achieved a stand.

Generally speaking, however, the area has received little hail this growing season, possibly due to a weather pattern that has been long on beneficial moisture, but has also been a "good news/bad news" situation for growers once they managed to get their crops started. The lack of hail has been the most obvious plus, but that weather pattern has also kept cotton from making much progress after emergence.

A return to seasonal temperatures is the best medicine for the crop in the field and the acres that still wait to be planted. All in all it appears growers have another

### Sen. Blanche Lincoln makes High Plains visit; key industry supporter gets warm welcome

One of the cotton industry's staunchest allies in the United States Senate, Democrat Senator Blanche Lincoln of Arkansas, received a warm West Texas welcome May 30 during a fund-raising event at the home of Dan and Linda Taylor of Ropesville.

Hailing from a seventh-generation Arkansas farm family, Senator Lincoln is a Helena, Arkansas native who made history in 1998 by becoming the youngest woman ever elected to the United States Senate at the age of 38.

Lincoln is a member of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry and is one of the cotton industry's "Go-To" people on key issues affecting the industry.

### Monsanto announces agreement to sell NexGen and Stoneville assets

It appears that Monsanto's efforts to acquire Delta and Pine Land Company have taken a substantive step forward this week. Monsanto officials announced this week that the technology company has reached an agreement with the Department of Justice that will allow it to finally complete its proposed acquisition of D&PL.

Papers specifying terms of the agreement between Monsanto and the Department of Justice were filed in Federal Court in Washington, DC on May 31.

As part of the deal Monsanto simultaneously announced that it has entered into definitive agreements with Americot, Inc. and Bayer CropScience to purchase the NexGen and Stoneville cotton seed brands and assets, respectively. Monsanto's agreements with Americot and Bayer CropScience will still require final approval by the Department of Justice.

Under the terms NexGen and Stoneville brand cotton seed will continue to be licensed to use Monsanto's cotton trait technologies. Also included in the Americot and Bayer agreements will be the transfer of certain conventional D&PL parental lines that the companies can develop further.

In the proposed agreement with Americot, Monsanto will also transfer certain conventional cotton parental lines that were acquired by Delta and Pine Land from Syngenta in 2006.

Monsanto's deal with Bayer CropScience will also include the transfer of certain D&PL conventional cotton parental lines that Monsanto will retain a nonexclusive license to utilize.

In acquiring the assets of Stoneville, Bayer CropScience reports that will gain access to additional high performing cotton products and germplasm with insect-resistant and herbicide-tolerant Monsanto traits.

Bayer officials note that the new germplasm and the geographic reach of Stoneville into cotton production regions east of Texas will complement the company's cotton seed and trait business. The Stoneville acquisition will also add skilled and knowledgeable staff and state-of-the-art breeding and seed processing facilities to Bayer's U.S. cotton seed business.

In a statement discussing the proposed deal with Monsanto, Americot General manager Terry Campbell said the NexGen acquisition will further strengthen Americot's portfolio of high quality germplasm through the addition of NexGen varieties that provide growers stormproof cotton options with excellent fiber quality, high-yield potential and earliness.

Campbell also noted that Americot plans to utilize the conventional germplasm divested from D&PL to develop new cotton products under the Americot brand.

and backed water to the mobile homes on Garrison Street and Ace Hardware on the Ralls Highway 62 going south.

Following state procedures, TxDot contacted the county judge and property owners and then put in a water pump Friday afternoon. Water was pumped from the lake south down the Ralls Highway until early Sunday morning.

Tim Assiter of Assiter Insurance in Floydada told the Hesperian-Beacon, "The hail damage in the county has been spotted. It will be at least a week before we will know the full results, but I know of some hail damage south of town and near Dougherty. However, I am very optimistic with this year's cotton crop."

The farmers have a govern-

ment deadline to plant cotton until June 5th, with another 8 day 'late planting' deadline set for June 13th, according to Assiter.

Supervisor Jim Bob Clary of the FSA office in Floydada commented, "I have only heard of some hail damage south of town and down near McAdo."

General Manager Van Breedlove of the Mackenzie Municipal Water Authority reported, "The lake is standing at 80.5 feet compared to 79 feet at this time last year. The lake rose 6 inches after a 1.1 inch of rain Sunday night. However, we just have not been receiving much water run off from these storms. They are going more to the south."

Rainfall totals varied around town last week with some citizens reporting 6.9 inches for the entire week, while others reported totals of around 5 inches.

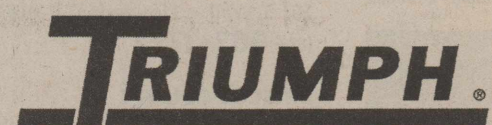
