Only Pct. #1 voters who either didn't vote in the March 4 primary, or voted in the Republican primary can vote in the run-off. If you are a Pct. #1 resident and voted in the Democrat primary you cannot vote in the Republican runoff.

On the Democrat side, there is a statewide runoff for Railroad Commissioner. Only those who voted in the Democrat primary, March 4 (or who didn't vote at all) can vote in this election. This election will also be held at the Massie.

You cannot vote in the Republican runoff and in the Democrat runoff.


Humbleness is using our talents, knowing from where and whom they come, being thankful and appreciative of them.



LTC is a program among churches of Christ designed to "stimulate and encourage spiritual, mental, and social growth among young men and women in the third through twelfth grades. Its mission is to achieve this growth by developing skills in leadership, Bible knowledge, and Christian servanthood." 




