L.B. was born in Melrose, N.M. in 1926 and moved to Floyd County with his parents in 1928, Luther and Lula Stewart.

Elmer and Maxine have 16 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren. They are retired and still live in Lockney.

Floydada High School's top graduates for 2008 are Valedictorian Abel Cortinas and Salutatorian Jimmy Clayton (J.C.) Simpson.


Abel Cortinas will graduate with a 97.44 GPA, and J.C. Simpson ends the year with a 96.49 GPA.







He moved to Floydada in 1988 from Olton where he was the band director for 6 years.


Before Olton he served as a band director in Memphis for 3 years, and in Miami, Texas for 1 year.


