Abogados del Consulado Mexicano Defienden a Nacionales Presos en EU

Los mexicanos que se encuentran detenidos en cuatro cárceles de El Paso, Texas, son defendidos por dos abogados al servicio del Consulado de México en la vecina ciudad.

En La Tuna, prisones del Municipio y Condado y en el campo de detención del U. S. Border Patrol ubicado en la Avenida Montana, se manifiestamente el canciller Antonio Montañez va y visita a cada uno de los compatriotas detenidos para conocer sus casos y los de mayor cuidado, son turnados al licenciado Fernando

Fernández Farfia, Cónsul General de México, para que sea él, quien determine la prioridad que debe dársele a cada caso.

El Cónsul Rubén García, dijo un promedio de entre 350 a 400 mexicanos son deportados cada mes por el Servicio de Inmigración de EEUU, después de que fueron encontrados trabajando ilegalmente.

Esta cantidad, dijo, es muy independiente de los 2,000 o 3,000 que en forma voluntaria regresan a México, después de que fueron detenidos por contrarre ilegalmente en Estados Unidos.

Primer Pacto en 24 Años

Con un simple apretón de manos previo, pero con saludo militar, el general egipcio Mohammed Abd el Ghany Gamazy y el general israelí Aaron Yariv, firmaron tres copias en inglés del documento que es el primer acuerdo directo entre sus dos países en 24 años.

Después de suscribir el pacto, conversaron durante 70 minutos con funcionarios de las Naciones Unidas y luego se separaron para sostener conferencias privadas. Iban a volver a reunirse al ponente el sol en el horizonte del tramo de camino barriendo por el viento, a unos 96 kilómetros al Este de El Cairo.

Un vocero de la ONU en el lugar rehusó dar detalles sobre la reunión que siguió a la firma del acuerdo a las 8 Est (7 de México), excepto para señalar que la primera mitad fue acompañada por los fotógrafos.

Con respecto al cumplimiento de los términos del acuerdo para el retiro a las líneas de tregua del 22 de octubre, el canje de prisioneros y otros detalles, dijo: "No soy un profeta".

Pero incluso en momentos en que las dos partes se reunían para firmar el acuerdo de seis puntos elaborado por el Secretario norteamericano de Estado, Henry Kissinger, el carácter frágil de la tregua se puso de manifiesto nuevamente.

We would like for all employers to contact SER for their employment needs. We still have plenty of people in our files who need jobs or training. We will explain our program to all interested employers and organizations. SER so offers assistance to the employer with the Affirmative Action Plan.

SER was highly successful last year in placing 200 people in well paying jobs. These people were placed in heating and air-conditioning, mechanics, welding, secretarial, work, warehouses, truck driving, machinist, carpentry, and supervisory position.

Empleos

The Lubbock Manager of the Texas

The Lubbock Manager of the Texas Employment Commission, Bert Darden, reports that a shortage of cotton gin workers has developed over the area. Also, trailer hams are in short supply. TEC offices in Brownfield Littlefield and Muleshoe are also experiencing a shortage of workers. There are several reasons for the labor shortage with principal reason being the low unemployment rate in the area. Right now the unemployment rate in this area is 2.4 percent of the labor force, which is 2.4 percent of the labor force. The statewide unemployment rate is 3.4 percent of the labor force, which is the lowest in the years.

The Texas Employment Commission has a program whereby workers can brought from other areas of the state when the local supply of labor is exhausted. This is being done now by all area TEC offices, but the labor shortage is statewide resulting in a limited amount of workers being available for work here. Anyone who wants to work in the cotton harvest, including cotton gin work, should visit the nearest office of the Texas Employment Commission. The Lubbock Office is at 14th street and Avenue G. Telephone 763-6416. Part time workers can be used on night shifts.

EMPLOYMENT OF SPANISH SPEAKING IS CABINET COMMITTEE PRIORITY

Placing more Spanish speaking persons in federal jobs across the board is one of the Cabinet Committee's major priorities for fiscal year 1974.

"Our goal is to see to it that the Spanish speaking get their fair share of government jobs," commented Chairman Henry M. Ramirez.

Among the Cabinet Committee aims in increasing equal employment opportunities for the Spanish speaking are:

- To strengthen and monitor the 16-Point Program.
- To increase the number of Spanish speaking persons on the Federal Register.

• To recruit Spanish speaking interns for federal government jobs.

• To step up the assistance and cooperation in the recruiting efforts of federal agencies.

Ramirez noted that in the last four years full-time government employment has been reduced by almost 60,000 while nearly 4,000 Spanish speaking persons were added to the federal work force. Today about 76,000 Spanish speaking persons, or 3.1 percent, make up the

total federal work force.

The Chairman said the Spanish speaking, which constitute 6 percent of the nation's population, must build on that employment record.

As a step in that direction, he cited the Cabinet Committee's Project Beta, a joint effort in which the CCOSSP, the Civil Service Commission and the Social Security Administration cooperated to place more Spanish speaking persons in the latter agency.

Project Beta was initiated last March as a follow-up to passage of HR-1, which called for the SSA to assume the function handled previously by state governments, of providing aid to the blind, elderly and disabled.

The SSA established the Bureau of Supplemental Income to implement the project, and as a result of the legislation, approximately 8,000 job openings were created in the agency's various bureaus.

"We selected the Social Security Administration because the agency will be assisting many Spanish speaking aged and physically handicapped persons," Ramirez said.

Relaciones más Estrechas de EU y China

El secretario de Estado Henry Kissinger se comprometió hoy a fortalecer los vínculos entre los Estados Unidos y China Comunista.

Kissinger, quien llegó a esta ciudad para su sexta visita aquí, fue saludado en el aeropuerto por el primer ministro Chou En-Lai, quien le dijo que se había convertido en el "Ciclón del Levante", con lo que hizo alusión a la vertiginosa gira de paz por cinco capitales árabes realizada por el secretario de Estado durante esta semana.

Después de un suntuoso banquete ofrecido en su honor, Kissinger partió en unión de Chou para celebrar la primera de varias conversaciones de amplio alcance que según se anticipa versarán sobre Indo-

china, el Medio Oriente y las nuevas relaciones comerciales, científicas y culturales entre los Estados Unidos y China.

Al hacer el brindis durante el banquete, Kissinger pareció vaticinar que Pekín y Washington podrían elevar el rango de sus oficinas de enlace a embajadas y establecer relaciones diplomáticas plena-

Millones Perdidos

El Pentágono estima que muy elevadas que sean las pérdidas sufridas por Israel en Tanques y Aviones, todavía no colocan a ese país en una situación grave.

Al informar de lo anterior una "Fuente" norteamericana bien orientada, dio a conocer que los Estados Unidos de América suministran a Israel municiones para la artillería, particularmente granadas antitanque y cohete aire-aire a ritmo acelerado y que se estudia en los niveles, el reemplazo de los aviones y tanques perdidos por Israel desde hace una semana.

Si la situación se torna grave, hipótesis no excluida en Washington, serían enviados aviones a Israel en las próximas semanas y los tanques seguirían poco después.

La misma fuente destacó que aún no se toma ninguna decisión en cuanto al suministro de tanques y aviones para la nación judía.

La decisión norteamericana, será tomada por la importancia del puente aéreo de que desde el martes acelera el envío de pertrechos soviéticos a Egipto y Siria.

Las municiones para la artillería, granadas antitanque y cohetes aire-aire Sidewinder y Sparrow, son transportadas por aviones israelíes, aseguró la Voz Informativa.

Si después el gobierno de Washington decide suministrar a Israel tanques M-60 y aviones F-4 y A-4, los efectos partirán de las bases norteamericanas de Europa, aseguró la Voz Informativa.

Hasta ahora los Estados Unidos han entregado un centenar de F-4 y 160 A-4 a Israel, actualmente la empresa McDonnell-Douglas fabrica esos aviones a una cadencia de dos por mes, ritmo que parece inopportuno aumentar en la actualidad.

La entrega de tanques a Israel será a más largo plazo debido a las dificultades del transporte por puente aéreo.

El comité mixto, senado-Cámara de Representantes accedió al pedido del señor Henry Jackson, para agregar a los próximos encargos de tanques, otros encargos por valor de cien millones de dólares, debido a las razones esgrimidas en pro de este aumento.

In 1953, before the revolution, 23.6% of the population of Cuba was illiterate. In 1960, while addressing the United Nations, Fidel Castro announced that by 1961 Cuba would be a territory "free of illiteracy." That year, a nationwide literacy campaign began that saw over 100,000 trained teachers (ranging in age from 10 to 21) go into the countryside to teach, while living and working with peasants and workers. Today, Cuba's illiteracy rate is less than 4%.

Through the personal accounts of officials of the Education Ministry, educational analysts, young teacher relatives and ex-illiterates, the story of that historic campaign is recounted.

Los bebedores consuetudinarios sufren menos ataques del corazón que los abstemios, según se desprende de un estudio realizado en California y expuesto hoy ante la Asociación Norteamericana de Cardiología.

"La explicación de este feliz hallazgo aún no está en claro", dijeron investigadores del programa permanente Kaiser.

El estudio comprendía la posible influencia del tabaco, el café, la aspirina y el alcohol en los ataques al corazón, dijeron los investigadores de Oakland en el Congreso de Cardiología.

Los especialistas compararon 464 personas que habían sufrido ataques cardíacos con grupos de con-

trol de personas que no habían padecido ataques cardíacos.

Constituyeron dos grupos de control de 464 individuos seleccionados por computadoras entre 250,000 fichas médicas. Uno de los grupos comprendía a los fumadores de cigarrillos.

Del Brazo con Marx?

"Por lo demás, hermanos, todo cuanto hay de verdadero, de noble, de justo, de puro, de amable, de honorable, todo cuando sea virtud y cosa digna de elogio, todo eso tenedlo en cuenta" (Filipenses 4).

HUMANISMO CRISTIANO

El cristianismo no es un humanismo, pero es capaz de asimilar y de hecho recomienda todos los bienes o valores reales de la existencia y de la convivencia humanas. Encarnado en diversas culturas, épocas e instituciones, no sólo acepta, sino también procura colaborar con sus elementos positivos. Actuando desde un nivel más alto y al mismo tiempo mucho más profundo, ni se confunde ni se contradice a lo que concretamente favorece el desarrollo y el bienestar del hombre sobre la tierra. La frase de San Pablo que acabamos de citar es muy clara al respecto y, si muchas veces no se ha realizado esto es culpa de la fe cristiana, sino de la limitación y fallas de los cristianos.

SIMPATIA Y COLABORACION

Lo anterior nos lleva a pensar que la Iglesia debe simpatizar y colaborar con lo que tienen de bueno los múltiples sistemas y proyectos que buscan el mejoramiento social del hombre, sin que por eso tenga que identificarse con tales sistemas o proyectos, o aceptarlos en sus varios aspectos teóricos o prácticos. La ausencia de esta colaboración señalaría una seria omisión en las tareas de la propia Iglesia, las cuales, aunque tienen como meta específica el destino eterno de los hombres, incluyen una atención muy cuidadosa a las circunstancias de su vida temporal.

LIMITES

Divertimos ahora los límites de la colaboración de la Iglesia con sistemas y movimientos sociales. Debe ser nitido su rechazo a todo lo que se opone a la doctrina y a los preceptos morales de Cristo. Este rechazo es tan radical como los principios derivados del Evangelio y formulados progresivamente por el Magisterio de la Iglesia de acuerdo con las condiciones de los tiempos. La fe cristiana no puede negarse a sí misma bajo el pretexto de colaborar para el mejoramiento social de la humanidad, ya que confiesa a Cristo como único salvador de los hombres y propone el Evangelio como base insuperable para dicho mejoramiento. Sin conversión del egoísmo al amor todo progreso en la convivencia humana es meramente utópico.

PROVOCACION

Afirmar que el viaje del General de los jesuitas a Cuba hace ya algunas semanas, significa una colaboración estrecha entre el cristianismo y marxismo, es falso de toda falsedad, equivale a desconocer la misión y la historia de la Iglesia. Pero, además, constituye una provocación de las llamadas ultralquieristas, cuyos resultados son exactamente opuestos a lo que expresamente se preocupa. Youth Employment Hits Record High in Summer '73

H.S. of Coral Gables, Fla., writes: I am 17 years old and during the summer I had a good job in a restaurant. He has statistics on the general employment situation for young people in the summer of 1973?

Dear H.S.: Youth employment reached a record 14 million in July 1973, an increase of 800,000 over July of last year. The U.S. Government Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that the unemployment rate, 12.6 percent, was at its lowest seasonal level in four years for 16-21 year olds. In general, the unemployment situation for youth was more favorable this summer than in any other summer since 1969. From April to July 1973, the youth labor force increased by three and one-half million, and unemployment rose by three million. ****

K.M. of Columbus, Ohio, writes: I am interested in finding out some facts about the number of women in the work force in the past compared with now.

Dear K.M.: In 1920, there were eight million working women, compared to nearly four times that many today. In 1920, the typical woman worker was 28, single and employed in a factory. Today, she is 39, married and a clerical worker. In April 1973, 34 percent of all employed women were clerical workers. They accounted for 77 percent of all clerical workers. In 1972, 43 million women were not in the labor force. Of this number, 36 million were keeping house, four million were students and three million were not working because of ill health, disability or for other reasons. ****

Don't Steak \$\$ On Fancy Names

Delmonico steak, Fillet steak, Spencer steak, Beauty steak.

These are just a few of the names that have been used to describe a beef rib eye steak. Maybe here in your community, there are other fanciful names—possibly at varying prices—for this same steak.

Under a new program of the meat industry, most supermarkets across the country will soon do away with these fanciful names so that no matter where you live, a beef rib eye steak will be called a beef rib eye steak.

The National Live Stock and Meat Board, a trade association representing meat processors, wholesalers and retailers, is coordinating a new program for standardizing meat names. Standard names should reduce shopper confusion and help consumers make wiser, more economical decisions at the meat counter. The standardization program focuses on these fronts:

The meat industry has reduced names for various cuts of beef, pork, veal and lamb sold in U.S. food stores from more than 1,000 names to about 300.

The industry has replaced fanciful, strictly regional or potentially misleading names with names having specific information for consumers.

Participating food stores plan to provide consumers with booklets and other point-of-sale information to explain how the new program works.

When the program goes into effect, your supermarket—if it goes along with the national program—will label each package of meat with the species of meat (beef, pork, veal, lamb), the whole-

sale or primary cut (chuck or loin, for example), the common name for the standardized retail cut and perhaps the store's own special or fanciful name.

For an idea of how this standardizing program will work, consider the example of the beef rib eye steak. "Beef" is the primal cut telling you which animal the meat comes from. "Rib" is the primary cut telling you where on the animal the meat comes from, and "eye steak" is the common name for the standardized retail cut.

Since there are some meat names that have become accepted through localized tradition or that have been customized for individual store or chain identity, some retailers will continue to use fanciful names for cuts, but these names will be on separate labels.

Rule 29 Committee Off To Good Start

David Broder of the Washington Post wrote not long ago, "The Party is Over." I strongly disagree. But, it is up to all of us as Republicans to disprove the Broder thesis.

At the Republican National Convention in 1972, Rule 29 was adopted to provide that "The Chairman of the Republican National Committee shall appoint a committee broadly representative of the Republican Party, including members of the Republican National Committee, to review, study and work with the States and territories relating to the Rules adopted by the 1972 Republican National Convention, and the relationship between the Republican National Committee, Republican State Committees, and other Republican organizations. A preliminary report shall be submitted to the Republican National Committee no later than June 30, 1974, and a final report no later than January 1, 1975. The Republican National Committee shall consider and act upon the final recommendations of the Committee within ninety days of receiving same."

On September 11, 1973, the first meeting of this 49-member committee was held here in Washington. At that meeting the decision was made to divide the full committee into subcommittees for the purpose of drafting recommendations and receiving testimony and comments. The full committee will determine all recommendations that are to be passed on to the Republican National Committee.

The subcommittees are: 1) Building a Majority Party, 2) Proceedings in the Convention, 3) Republican National Committee, 4) Delegate Selection to the National Convention, and 5) State and Local Organization.

Rule 30, which sets forth the allocation of delegates to the Republican National Convention of 1976, was adopted by the 1972 Convention and is not subject to review by the Rule 29 Committee. There has been some confusion on this point, so I would like to repeat that the Rule 29 Committee has no authority or responsibility whatever to effect any change in apportionment or method of selection of delegates to the 1976 Convention.

The Rule 29 Committee also adopted a proposal to ask each state organization to set up a counterpart Rule 29 Committee to be broadly representative of the Republican Party within that state. This decision was made in order to provide a liaison group for Rule 29 and to assure the widest possible dissemination of recommendations and ideas to Republicans in every state.

Representatives of the Rule 29 Committee will attend each of the upcoming Regional Republican Conferences, starting with the Western Conference in Seattle, to hear testimony and seek the ideas of all Republicans. It is hoped that within each state every Republican from the precinct committee level up will be given a chance to help determine the future, strength and organization of the Republican Party.

Hispanic fellows sought

YOUNG AMERICANS of Hispanic backgrounds are being urged to apply for White House fellowships. Priests support woodcutters' strike — The priests' senate of the Mobile diocese voted to endorse the strike by woodcutters and woodhaulers in the Gulf Coast states. The senate said its members "support a just and equitable solution for the woodcutters and commit ourselves to actions endorsing the just wage, fair working conditions and temporary relief." Bishop John L. May of Mobile told NC news service he is sympathetic to the cause, but said the situation is "complicated."

Researcher on pastoral council resigns to marry — Monsignor J. Paul O'Connor, immediate past chairman of the U.S. bishops' steering committee on a national pastoral council, has resigned from the ministry to marry, Bishop James W. Malone of Youngstown announced. O'Connor cited his desire "for responsible freedom" as the principal reason for leaving the active ministry.

Holy Cross priests leave school when military takes over — The Indiana province of the Holy Cross Congregation has been forced out of the administration of St. George's College, a private high school in Santiago, Chile, that was taken over by the Chilean military junta on charges of "Marxist infiltration." The Holy Cross Indiana provincial superior, Father William Lewers, traveled to Chile two weeks ago to meet government authorities and to try to solve the problem created by the government's seizure.

30,000 gather at pro-life rally — A pro-life rally in downtown St. Louis Oct. 22 drew nearly 30,000 persons who heard Attorney General John Danforth of Missouri say, "I believe we are making profound arguments" using medical evidence. Sen. Thomas F. Eagleton (D-Mo.) described the abortion issue as a "moral dilemma," saying at the rally, "We must seek to undo by legal means the improvident decision of the Supreme Court."

Becoming Better Patients

A Health Column from the American Lung Assoc. of Tex

It takes at least two to cure an illness. The doctor and the patient.

Seeing a doctor soon about symptoms that don't go away—like a cough or breathlessness, is one good way to help prevent long-term disease. Too many people postpone seeing a doctor because they hope in vain that their symptoms will disappear.

When the symptoms persist, they are embarrassed about their delay and sometimes are less than truthful with the doctor once they see him or her. Patients may also say they drink or smoke less than they do. And they may hesitate to volunteer facts that could help the doctor diagnose the illness. To help, doctors need all the pertinent information they can get.

One way to be a better patient is to organize your thoughts and the history of your illness before you see the doctor. This gets the picture clear in your mind, and you're less likely to overlook pertinent points to tell the doctor. It

also helps the doctor get to the cause of your problem sooner. And if the doctor's explanations are not clear, ask questions. Doctors don't know you don't understand if you don't tell them.

Too many patients do not follow the doctor's instructions. Many stop taking medications once they feel better.

That may not be long enough. If you have a TB infection, for example, you must take pills every day for at least a year in order not to develop TB illness. Skipping pills, failing to come back for followup visits, not sticking to a recommended diet, all these wipe out the good care your doctor wants to provide.

Getting better is a two-way relationship. To find out more about ways to prevent and treat lung disease, contact your lung association. And when trouble some symptoms arrive, see your doctor soon. It's a matter of life and breath.
