TAMACC Hace Plan

El Senor Isaac Olivarez, director ejecutivo de la oficina de SER-Business and Trade Association developers de la ciudad de Dallas visito a Lubbock esta semana para hacer preparaciones para la junta de la mesa directiva de la Asociacion de Camaras de Comercio Mexico Americanas de Texas (TAMACC) que se llevara a cabo este proximo Viernes y Sabado dias 22 y 23 del presente mes.

Durante esta junta los delegados a la mesa estatal de TAMACC se juntaran para discutir los negocios pertenentes a la asociacion estatal. Se esperan algunos 40 delegados a la junta que se llevara a cabo en el Civic Center Inn por la Calle Main y Ave. K.

El Viernes por la tarde se llevara a cabo la junta de oficiales en donde participaran Rene Gutierrez, presidente; Bidal Agüero, vicepresidente; Antonio Reyes, secretario; y Rudy Fernandez, tesorero. El Sabado todo el dia se llevara a cabo la junta general desde las 8:30 de la manana. A medio dia se llevara a cabo una comida donde el representante estatal de Lubbock, Froy Salinas, sera el orador principal. Tambien durante esta comida se presentaran la carta oficial a el West Texas Minority Contrator Association de aqui de Lubbock, la cual Raul Sepeda es presidente. Esta comida se llevara a cabo en el Restaurante El Sombrero No. 2 en el 5402 por la Calle Slide. Despues de la comida los delegados unavez mas se iran para el Civic Center Inn para terminar con los demas negocios de TAMACC.

Uno de los asuntos mas importantes que se discutiran durante la junta sera el de la convencion estatal que se llevara a cabo en McAllen los dias 14, 15, y 16 de Junio. En esta convencion se esperan algunos 1000 personas miembros de los individuales Camaras de Comercio de todo el estado. Al presente 15 Camaras son miembros de la Asociacion estatal y se espera que para el tiempo de la convencion habra algunas 23 Camaras que sean miembros.

El gobierno de Mexico pagara 400 millones de dolares en indemnizaciones a los descendientes de los primeros conquistadores de Texas antes del fin del ano, si los activistas de tierras consiguen su proposito.

El fundador de la Alianza Federal de Pueblos Libres, Reyes Lopez Tijerina, dijo que se entrevisto en enero con el Presidente de Mexico, Lopez Portillo, y con su secretario de estado, Santiago Roel, y acordaron ejecutar un tratado firmado hace 36 años que estipulo indemnizaciones a los herederos de 431 hispanos que tuvieron tierras en Mexico.

"Mexico no me envio" dijo Tijerina. "Aunque me entreviste con ellos (Lopez Portillo y Roel) y desean que el asunto quede resuelto este ano."

Tijerina adquirio fama hace 10 años cuando, en compania de sus seguidores, ocupo un juzgado en Tierra Amarilla (Nuevo Mexico) y trato de efectuar "un arresto civico" contra un Fiscal del Distrito que intento oponerse a los activistas. Tijerina convoco para el 16 de Abril una "asamblea general de los herederos de concesiones de tierras de Texas," para verificar sus reclamaciones y presentarlas al Gobierno de Mexico.

Esta reunion sera parecida a la que Tijerina celebro en Albuquerque el 28 de Febrero, con asistencia de 120 delegados tejanos en representacion de los herederos de 46 concesiones de tierras. "Ellos ya recopilaron todos los documentos y genealogia," dijo Tijerina.

"La finalidad (de la reunion) es votar

sobre una resolucion que establecera una fecha limite de 90 dias para la presentacion de reclamaciones," dijo Tijerina. "Esperamos que acudan entre 300 y 400 reclamantes."

El activista anadio que en Mexico, y a invitacion de Lopez Portillo, el Director del Departamento Juridico de la Secretaria de Estado, Eduardo Eves, le pidio a el y a su Alianza que ayudasen en la verificacion de los herederos y actuasen como su representante en la confeccion de las reclamaciones.

No obstante, Tijerina afirmo que no estaba actuando como agente del gobierno azteca.

Mexico y Estados Unidos acordaron el ocho de Septiembre de 1923 indemnizar a las personas que perdieron tierras cuando se establecio el Rio Grande como frontera comun entre los dos paises, indico Tijerina.

En 1941, los dos paises fijaron ademas los detalles especificos de los pagos y establecieron una lista de 431 concesiones de tierra, segun los legajos que exhibio Tijerina con los nombres de los beneficiarios de dichas concesiones.

Como parte del acuerdo, Estados Unidos aprobo un pago de 400 millones de dolares para los herederos mexicanos desposeidos, aunque Mexico nunca indemnizo a los descendientes hispanos que quedaron en el territorio estadounidense.

"La respuesta fue siempre 'esperen'," dijo Tijerina, "Aunque ahora Mexico esta dispuesto a pagar."

Hay Discriminación En Elección De Jurado

En un caso de discriminacion referente a la poca representacion de Chicanos en un gran jurado en el Condado Hidalgo, Texas, la Corte Suprema senalo que la discriminacion puede existir aun cuando los Chicanos formen una "mayoria gobernante" en el area.

El caso se refirio a Rodrigo Partida, que fue acusado en marzo de 1972 por un gran jurado del Condado Hidalgo por robo a una residencia privada e intencion de violacion. Partida fue posteriormente condenado y sentenciado a ocho años de prision.

Pero en la decision de la Corte Suprema se establecio que las pruebas presentadas por los abogados de Partida eran "suficientes para establecer un... caso de discriminacion en contra de los Chicanos en la seleccion del gran jurado en el Condado Hidalgo". Especificamente la Corte, senalo que a-

El Departamento Hispano de la Iglesia Bautista Arnett Benson realizo sus anhelos el dia 3 de Abril de 1977 cuando fue consuetudina en Iglesia por un concilio formalmente convocado para dicho proposito. El concilio formado por pastores y miembros de Iglesias Bautistas alrededor de Lubbock dio su voto unanime despues de hacer investigaciones acerca del proposito de la nueva congregacion.

Los de habla hispana en Arnett Benson ahora son los propietarios de las propiedades que se encuentran en la esquina de Auburn y Boston y continuaran con el nombre Iglesia Bautista Arnett Benson. El pastor de la Iglesia el Rev. Eliseo Aldape continuar su ministerio con la Iglesia.

Con un gran edificio y un gran deseo de servir a la comunidad la Iglesia Bautista Arnett Benson les invita a pasar y hacer una visita para ver las propiedades de su nuevo templo. La Iglesia hace planes para hacer mejoras en el edificio y desarrollar programas de beneficio para la comunidad entera. "Recuerde

This past week was one of gratification. We finally approved a compromise proposal for highway funding. The compromise calls for 528 million dollars for building and maintaining our highway system. While I was at the County Courthouse this past week getting my license sticker I noticed that of all the people working at the Courthouse, none was Chicano.

I would venture to guess that of the total people employed at the County Courthouse we could probably count the amount of Chicanos on one hand. Of course there are many janitors employed.

The need for Chicano professionals in public agencies has been proven over and over. The ability of a Chicano to communicate in both English and Spanish is an asset which cannot be overlooked especially in the West Texas area. The right of a person who does not speak English to be informed as to the daily processes in the County Courthouse should not be denied. It is our opinion that these rights are being denied. Many is the time when people come to our office to ask for help with official county correspondence because they cannot understand anyone at the Courthouse.

In many cities, federal, county and city government have been and are being forced to hire minorities. The Voting Rights Act was expanded to include Texas mainly because it was proven that the Spanish speaking minority was being excluded from government.

Perhaps it is time for local minority organizations to look at employment in public agencies and work toward a true affirmative action program in governmental agencies (especially at the County Courthouse).

Texas-based farmworkers planning to migrate north this Spring to work are being urged to attend any one of a series of informational meetings planned April 4 to 14 by the U.S. Department of Labor and the Texas Employment Commission (TEC).

The purpose of the meetings to be held in eight communities in Texas is to inform them of crop conditions, their rights and the services and opportunities provided by the two sponsoring agencies, plus migrant and farmworker organizations in Texas and the states they will be working.

The forums have been arranged by the Dallas, Tex., and Denver, Colo., Regional U.S. Labor Department offices and the TEC. Participating also are the Kansas City, Mo., the Chicago, and the Seattle Wash. regional offices, and migrant organizations. Labor Department offices involved are the Employment and Training Administration and the Employment Standards Administration.

"We want the migrant workers to be as informed as possible about laws, services, agencies, contact people and their rights when they leave Texas to follow the crops," said David Cano, Denver, and David Foster, Dallas, ETA manpower development specialists who are coordinating the meetings.

"And we'd like to give them options if crop or weather conditions pose work problems," they said.

Presentations will be conducted primarily in Spanish. Crew leaders are urged to attend, too. Subjects to be covered include wages and hours, training, counseling, unemployment insurance, crew leaders, the complaints process, housing, and services by other agencies.

The Migrant Farmworker Information meetings will be held beginning at 8 p.m. on the following dates:

April 4--Robstown, Robstown Junior High, April 5--Harlingen, Casa de Amistad, April 6--McAllen, The Civic Center, April 7--Laredo, Laredo Civic Center, April 11, Eagle Pass, Multi-Purpose Center, April 12--San Antonio, Christ the King Church Cafeteria; April 13--El Paso, Our Lady's Youth Center, April 14--Lubbock, Rodgers Community Center, 3200 Amherst.

The Consumer Alert

AUSTIN—Your first reaction after discovering that you've lost your billfold containing all your credit cards is likely to be panic. And well it might, our Consumer Protection Division attorneys say.

Millions of credit cards are lost or stolen each year, with that about 60% of all unauthorized credit card charges and resulting financial losses involve cards that were lost by cardholders or stolen from them.

But consumers are partially protected against financial losses when credit cards are lost or stolen, our attorneys note.

The federal Truth in Lending Act provides that the maximum liability of a cardholder is \$50 for unauthorized charges made on a credit card.

The credit card issuer is required to inform you of this limited liability and must supply you with a self-addressed, stamped notice to use if a card is lost or stolen. If the issuer fails to observe these requirements, the cardholder is protected from all liability. The law also requires that all cards bear your signature, photo, or some other method of identification.

While it's somewhat comforting to know your liability is limited in such cases, if you are one of the many consumers carrying a number of credit cards in your billfold, your loss still can be substantial—\$600 if you lose a dozen cards.

So it's best to avoid the problems and financial burdens of credit card loss in the first place, if at all possible. One of the best ways to protect yourself is to cut up and throw away all cards you don't need or use regularly. And when you receive a new

card, sign it immediately. Never loan a credit card to anyone who hasn't been authorized to use it by the issuer, because this is a violation of your contract. You should also make sure your credit cards are returned to you each time you use them.

Another thing our attorneys suggest is that you keep a list at home of all your credit cards, with the account numbers, names, and addresses of issuers. Check this list every month or so with the cards in your billfold, and always telephone the issuer right away if any card is missing. You should follow up the telephone notification with a registered letter or telegram.

It's a good idea to recognize the signs of possible credit card theft or abuse, too: If a regular monthly bill doesn't arrive, someone may have stolen your card and sent in an address change. If a renewal card doesn't come before your expiration date on your current card, you should be alert, too.

Or, perhaps your monthly bill on a charge account is larger than the total of individual charge slips would indicate. Check also to be sure that a purchase for which there is no individual charge slip has not been added to your bill.

And if you suspect credit card theft or abuse, contact your district or county attorney. Under the Texas Penal Code, this may be a third degree felony, punishable by 2 to 10 years in the penitentiary and a possible fine of up to \$5,000.


Con ello terminó una batalla judicial que el juez dijo no tenía precedente en la historia de los Estados Unidos.

What medicines become useless or even dangerous when taken in combination with certain foods? How can older people retain or regain their physical mobility? How can houses and public buildings best be planned to accommodate disabled persons?

These and other questions relating to elderly disabled persons will be discussed at an all-day workshop April 15 at Southpark Inn, Lubbock. The workshop is sponsored by the Research Utilization Project of the State Department of Public Welfare in cooperation with other agencies and interested area citizens.

There is no charge for registration, which will open at 8 a.m. The workshop is scheduled from 9 a.m. until 3:45 p.m. Cost of the buffet lunch will be \$3.50. The workshop is open to all interested persons.

Three guest speakers are scheduled. Victor A. Yanchick, Ph.D., assistant dean for academic affairs at the College of Pharmacy, University of Texas, Austin, will discuss the hidden danger of drug and food interactions. Shelly Liss, M.D., of the department of physical medicine and rehabilitation, Memorial Hospital and Rosewood General Hospital, Houston, will speak on

physical fitness and rehabilitation. Thomas O. Byerts, director of architecture and environmental options -- barriers and facilitators to independent living.

Each of these speakers will lead concurrent discussions of their topics during the morning. Each of the sessions will be repeated twice during the afternoon, so those attending may be included in each.

George S. Tyner, M.D. dean of Texas Tech School of Medicine, will welcome participants. Keynote speaker will be Dudley Strain, D.D., public relations officer for Lubbock National Bank and former pastor of the First Christian Church of Lubbock.

Ann Kohler of the Research Utilization Project, Austin, will open the workshop with announcements. Anita Bass, who chairs the advisory board for Sherick Memorial Home of Lubbock will be the luncheon speaker.

The workshop is supported in part by an Administration on Aging grant from the Office of Human Development, U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare. It is one of a series being held over the state to make the most recent information on aging available to administrators, researchers, and the public.

Several hundred people from all over West Texas and as far south as Waco are expected to attend, according to Sharon Boatman.

LEGAL NOTICE

The City of Lubbock announces that it has submitted a grant application to the U.S. Department of Labor for funding under Title III of the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973, as amended (CETA) P. L. 93-203. The intent of this application is to request a grant allotment of funds under Title III allocation for FY 1977 for the operation of a summer program for economically disadvantaged youth. The total amount of funds available for the City of Lubbock for the FY 1977 program year will be \$340,556. Expenditures will not be accrued prior to June 1, 1977. The purpose of these funds will be to provide job training and employment opportunities for economically disadvantaged, unemployed and underemployed persons and to assure that training and other services lead to maximum employment opportunities and assist program participants to become economically self-sufficient. Special emphasis will be given to significant segments of the population which will include but not be limited to, youth age 14-21. The grant total \$304,556 will be used for a comprehensive employment and training program for economically disadvantaged youth in the City of Lubbock.

Cost categories and their dollar allocations are:

Administration	30,622
Wages	246,859
Fringe Benefits	24,686
Training	10,000
Services	28,389
Total	\$340,556

It is planned that these activities will provide assistance for, but will not be limited to, the alleviation of such problems as economically disadvantaged youths needing assistance for other economically disadvantaged, unemployed and underemployed persons 14 to 21 years of age and career exploration for program participants.
