# Lady Horns bring home gold and bronze

Lady Horn Brandy Collins brought Lockney High School another history making first when she became the first female to bring home a Gold Medal in the 100 meter State Track Meet Competition, in Austin, May 11.

Collins' and her relay teammates also did exceptionally well in the 4 X100 meter relay, coming home with a 3rd place Bronze medal finish. Brandy Collins, Elizabeth Torrez, Jenna Ford and Vanessa Walker ran their best time of the year-- 49.18 .

"I was extremely pleased in their

performance and very excited for them to be able to stand upon the medal stand," said Coach Todd Hallmark. "Not many people can say they have done that. They have worked hard all year and it payed off for them and I applaud them."

Brandy Collins not only got to stand on the medal stand once but twice claiming the 2A State Title in the 100 meter Dash, in a time of 12.15.

"Brandy finished her High School career on top taking the Gold Medal," said Hallmark. "Brandy is the first

female athlete in Lockney High School to bring home a State Title in Track and Field. "It was great to see Brandy finish the way she did. She has been running for the gold medal for four years and she finally did it. She has worked hard this year and I am proud of her"

The Lady Horn Relay Team also competed in the 4X200 meter relay and finished 5th in their best time of the year 1:45.49. "When you travel to the State Meet your hope is that you will compete well and are able to run your best time," said Hallmark.

"Though we may have been a little

disappointed in our finish we competed well and ran our best time. That is all you can ask for.

"It has been a fun ride during the 2001 Track and Field season and I congratulate Brandy and Elizabeth on a great finish to their High School career. They will be missed but great things lie ahead for them. I also congratulate Vanessa, Jenna and Laci on a wonderful year. We will try our best, along with the rest of our teammates, to make it another year to remember in 2002. I thank all of them for taking me along for the ride. I have had a great time."

The Longhorns jumped out with a 2-0 lead in the second, but found themselves down by one going into the third. The score remained scoreless through the third and the Longhorns exploded in the fourth scoring six runs on three hits.

The Longhorns went on to score two more in the fifth and sixth inning, while the Tigers added one in the

fourth and two in the seventh to make the final 12-6.

"I was very pleased with the way we hit the baseball," said Coach Fairchild. "As a team we had 28 hits in the two game series and scored 20 runs. Your chances of winning are good with these numbers."

The leading hitters were Chase Graves 2-4 (double and triple), Brandon Alvis 3-5, and Tyler Bybee 3-5. The winning pitcher was Ben Sherman (7-2) who threw a complete seven innings giving up six runs on

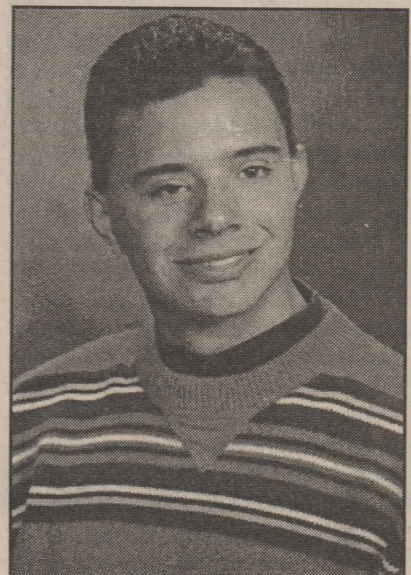
seven hits and striking out 5.

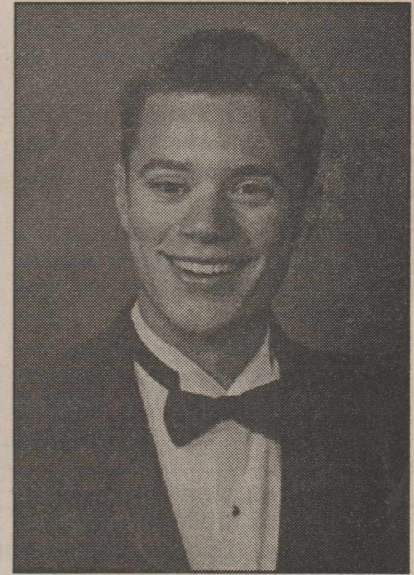
The Longhorns are now 18-3 overall.

Collins told the Hesperian-Beacon, "I have enjoyed these 43 years of school service in Oklahoma and

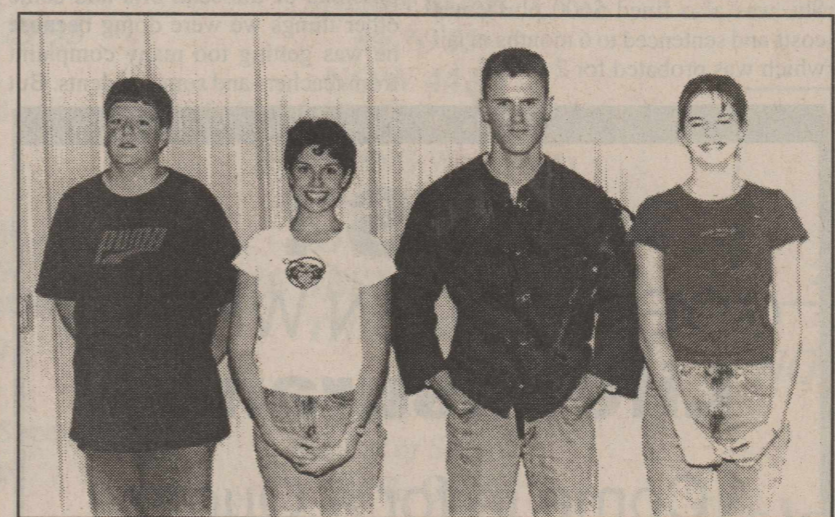
Texas. I now feel I need to dedicate my time to my family. I look forward to retirement and I have no plans whatsoever in seeking other employment."

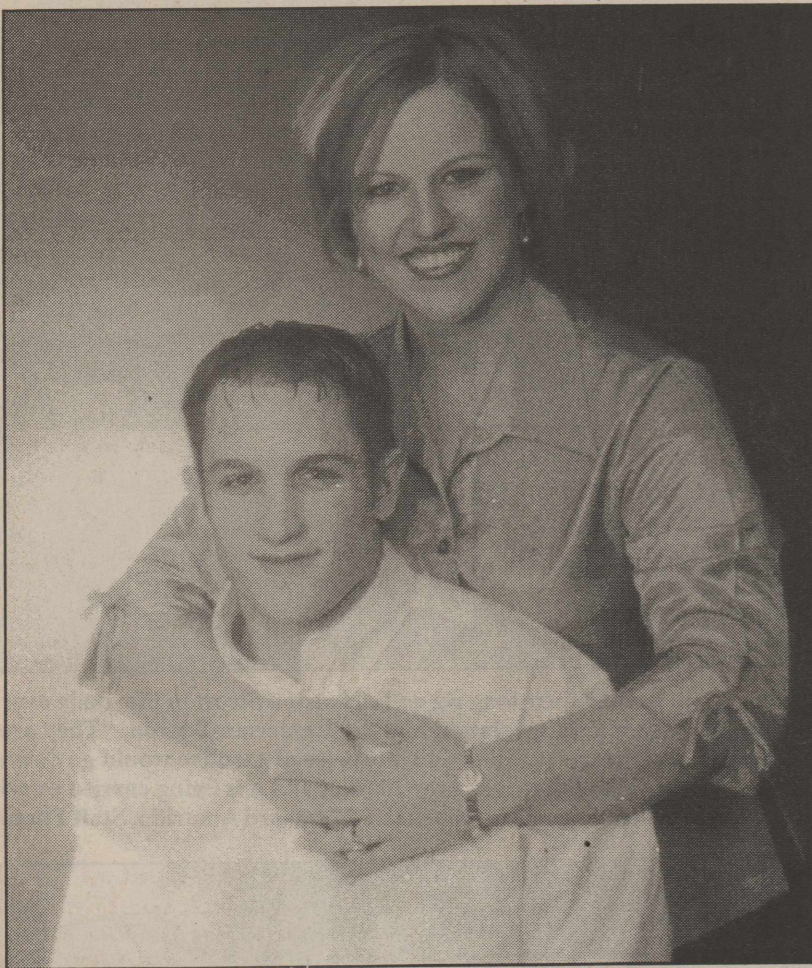

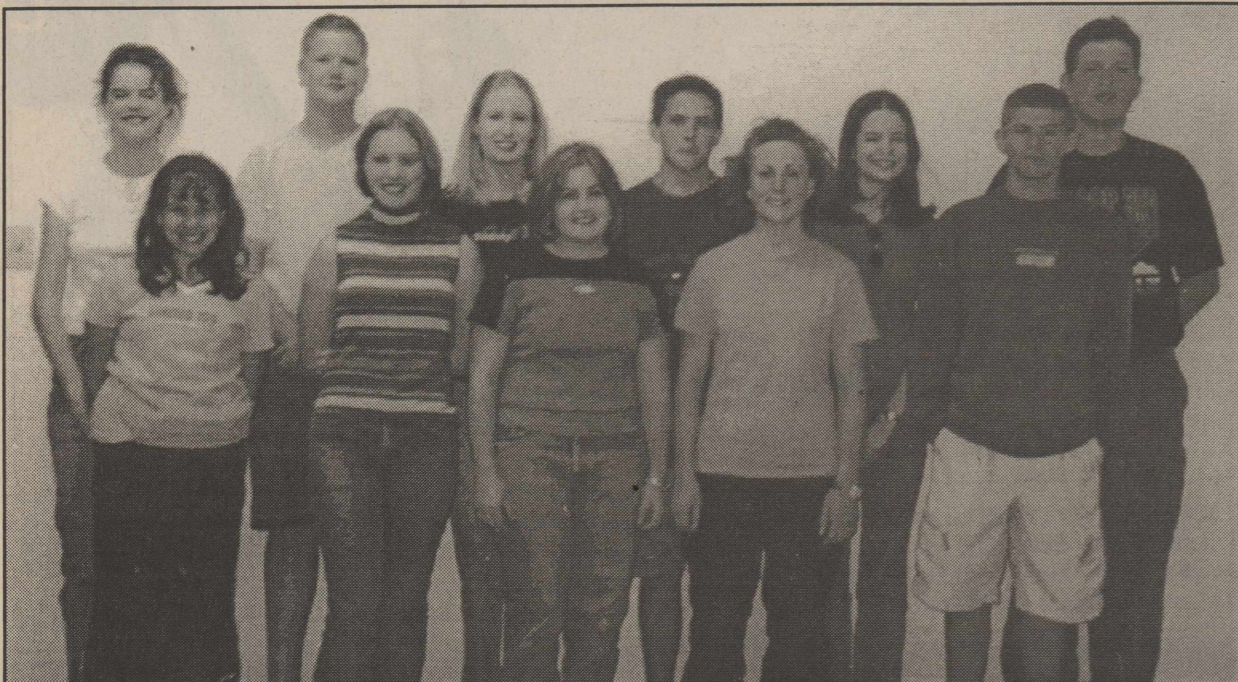

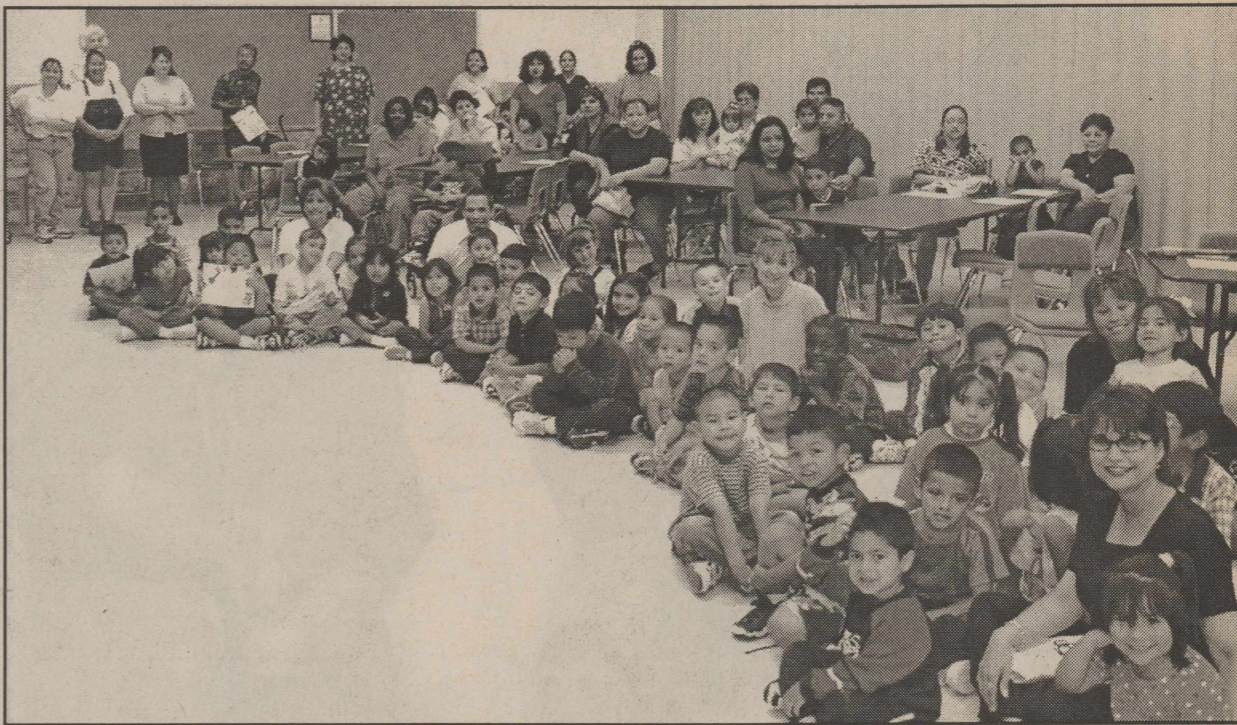
## Floydada Tennis Team at Regional

## Payne places 6th at state meet after fall

Jenna Payne's heart may have been broken after her fall during the 3200 meter State Competition, in Austin, May 11, but her winning spirit still brought her in at 6th place in a field of 8.

The Floydada High School Junior ended her run with a time of 12:32. This is the second time for Payne to earn a trip to Austin and she, along with the community, had high hopes of bringing home the gold. However the medal was not meant to be this time.

Payne had a first lap time of 75 seconds and held 3rd place position when she lost her footing and fell over an inside rail and onto the grass of the infield.

She regained her composure and got back on the track to steadily gain the yardage and time she had lost. "She was about 150-200 yards behind the last runner when she got back on the track," said Jenna's mother, Denise Payne. "It took her awhile to get her composure and get focused again."

Payne ended the race with an 8th

lap time of 85--a full 35 seconds slower than her qualifying time.

Payne was not hurt during the fall and says she is very thankful she was not hurt.

When asked what she was thinking when she got back on the track, Payne said, "I was thinking I came here to win and now I'm not going to--but I'm NOT coming in last."

Payne said she will be back at State next year and is setting her sights on the gold medal.

**EMS WEEK AND TRAUMA AWARENESS MONTH**

WHEREAS, emergency medical service is a vital public service in Texas; and  
 WHEREAS, each year in Texas, trauma is a major cause of death and disability; and  
 WHEREAS, volunteer and paid emergency medical services teams provide lifesaving care in Texas 25 hours a day, seven days a week; and  
 WHEREAS, Texas' EMS and Trauma systems consist of emergency physicians, emergency nurses, emergency medical technicians, paramedics, telecommunicators, first responders, educators, administrators and others; and  
 WHEREAS, access to quality emergency care dramatically improves the survival and recovery rate for those who experience sudden illness or injury' and  
 WHEREAS, Texas EMS personnel also care for the community by teaching injury prevention to citizens to less the occurrence and severity of injuries; and  
 WHEREAS, The Texas Trauma Network, one componentt of Texas' EMS systems, is an organized trauma care system consisting of comprehensive trauma facilities, major trauma facilities, general trauma facilities and basic trauma facilities; and  
 WHEREAS, the people of Texas benefit daily from the knowledge and skills of these highly trained individuals and from the availability of the Texas Trauma Network; and  
 NOW THEREFORE, we commend and congratulate Texas EMS personnel for outstanding, dedicated prehospital and medical care to the people of Texas, and hereby join the Texas Department of Health in designating the month of May as Trauma Awareness Month and in designating May 20-26, 2001 as Texas Emergency Medical Services Week.

**Floydada Independent School District receives TIF Grant**

The Telecommunications Infrastructure Fund (TIF) Board, a state agency that provides technology funding for Texas public schools has recently awarded a grant of \$88,755 to Floydada Junior High. These grants help students across the state reap the benefits of technology in education. Using TIF grants, schools are introducing students to modern technology, including high-speed Internet access and distance learning.

The funding will be used to develop new, and expand current, technology infrastructure to provide students with the technology they need to prepare for the digital era.

The TIF Non-Competitive Grant for Texas Public Schools was designed to fund up-to-date hardware and connectivity equipment, high-speed workstations, Internet access, and/or distance learning equipment so that students may take classes from another school district and/or an institution of higher education. Additionally, grant funds will be used for technology staff development, including hardware and software training, network training, methodology training, and base level technology training. These grant projects officially begin May 15, 2001.

In an effort to provide equitable funding for Texas public schools, TIF collaborated with the Texas Education

Agency (TEA) by coordinating the release of the PS9 grant award announcement with the Technology Integration in Education (TIE5) announcement. Prior to this release, staff members from both TIF and TEA met to discuss the functionality and purpose of each grant program. As a result, Texas public school districts will be able to leverage funds from both funding sources thus allowing schools to expand and increase technology capacity.

"Students are the future of Texas," said Rex Holcombe, the Project director for this grant. "Today, students are gaining the opportunity to use modern technology for researching via the Internet, word processing, and learning. We, as educators, want our students to succeed and become more marketable because of the education that they received while in school here. Thanks to TIF, the opportunity to fund this equipment and infrastructure is a reality."

Since its creation by the 74th Legislature in 1995, TIF has awarded approximately \$592 million in grants to its four constituent groups - public schools, libraries, institutions of higher education, and public, not-for-profit healthcare facilities. The agency receives approximately \$150 million per year in revenues from telecommunications assessments to disburse over a ten year period.

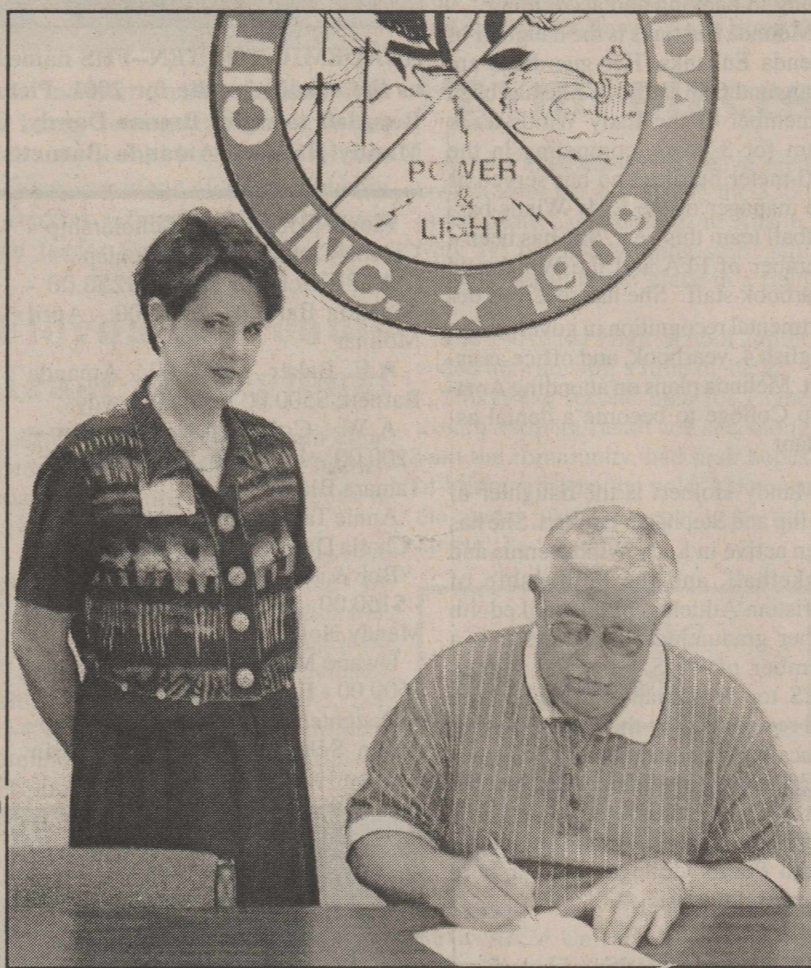

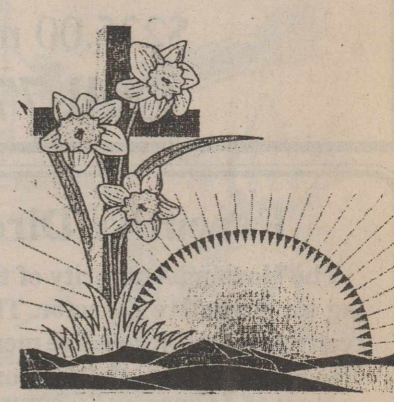
