## Grant applications approved by City council

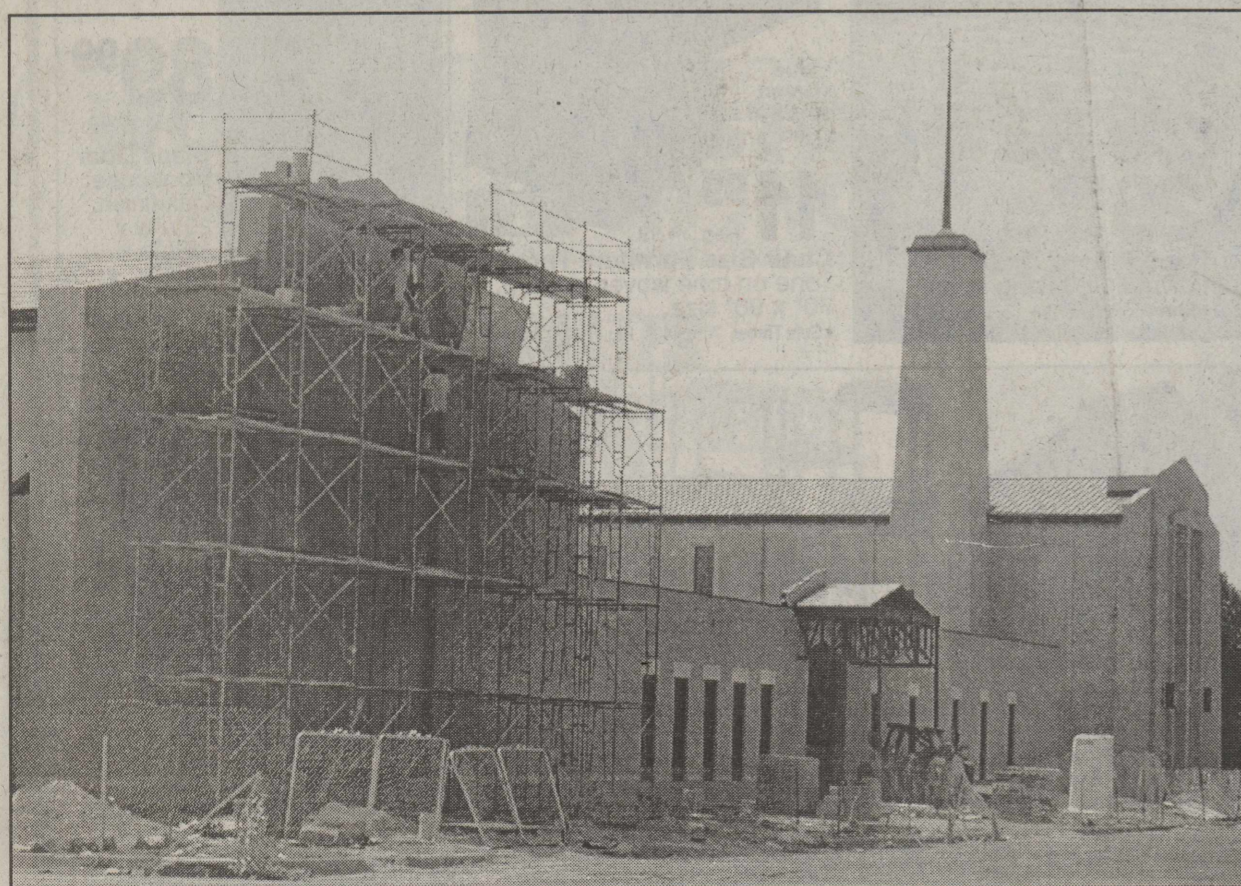

The Floydada City Council met Tuesday, June 18, and heard reports concerning the need for grant applications for the proposed High School

Park renovations and for updating the sewer system in the City.

Kay Howard, of Howco, Inc. in Lubbock, addressed the council in the Annual Public Hearing for block

grants. The application for the grant will be from a new agency called Office of Rural Community Affairs. The Texas Community Development Plan

## Museum honors veterans of World War I with display

The Floyd County Historical Museum in Floydada has recently opened a new display depicting uniforms, weapons, and memorabilia from World War I.

Nancy Marble and Jimmy Willson, Jr. both have donated some of the articles in the display. Marble of the Floyd County Historical Museum Board donated a World War I helmet.

Willson, Jr. is a veteran of World War II and he has donated the uniform of his father, James M. Willson, Sr., who served in World War I.

A World War I Victory Medal and Navy Dog Tags of Benjamin F. McIntosh are shown in the display.

An escape map and two engraved 37mm and 75 mm shell casings are in the display from a battle field in France that belonged to World War I veteran Goldie Lee Burns of Lockney. There is a picture of his brother, Kenneth Burns, also in the window display. Their father, J.E. Burns, owned a blacksmith shop in Lockney in its early years.

The preliminary list of World War I names to be engraved on the Floyd County Veteran's Memorial Wall is at around 484 names. The list of names overall has doubled to around 4,000 names since FHS student, Skyler Cornelius, took on the 4-H project several months ago. To donate money to the project, call 983-2982 or send a donation to: First National Bank of Floydada, Attn: Veteran's Memorial Fund, Box 550, Floydada, TX 79235.

According to an article in the Floyd County Hesperian dated June 7, 1917, "Nine hundred and fourteen men in Floyd County, 21 years of age and over and under 31, registered under the Selective Draft Act on Tuesday." This registration number "comprised practically 30 percent greater registration than was estimated."

Guesses made soon after the draft became law were that Floyd County

would "furnish probably 550 men within the age limit" to serve in World War I.

According to the newspaper article, "Reports from all over the county reveals that the registry passed off with no friction whatever. Registration Day was observed generally as a holiday over Floyd County. Most business houses at Floydada and Lockney were closed and many of the persons who registered early in the day took advantage of the holiday to spend time in recreation."

Other information in the article said, "It now appears certain the War Department will draw all numbers covering the entire registration of 10 million men in the United States. By preserving the issue of the Hesperian of July 12, 1917, containing the serial registration numbers, and the issue will contain the results of the drawing, you will have a complete record of every registered man in the county and the order in which each will be called."

The First Quota from Floyd County was 66, compared to Crosby County with 58, Hale County with 80, Motley County with 30, Dickens with 30, and Lubbock with 79, all based on county populations.

The May 23, 1996 edition of the Hesperian-Beacon ran a story concerning casualties in World War I. The story read, "Caleb McDermitt was killed by machine gun fire in France on October 9, 1918. His death occurred 'while the U.S. troops were making a charge' near St. Etienne. He was the son of F.J. McDermitt of the McCoy Community.

"The soldier had been married one week when he marched off to war the previous Spring. Floydada's American Legion Post was named in honor of McDermitt."

"President Woodrow Wilson designated May 20, 1918 as National Memorial Day: 'As a day of public hu-

mility, prayer and fasting. The people of the nation are asked to gather that day in their places of worship and pray for the victory of American armies which will bring a peace founded upon mercy, justice and good will."

The article went on the report that Floyd County towns and communities donated over \$10,000 to the Red Cross. Sugar was rationed nationally and each citizen could only buy two pounds of sugar per month.

Jimmy Willson, Jr. wrote an article in the Floyd County Hesperian-Beacon dated May 24, 1990 about the formation of the American Legion Post No. 118 in Floydada. Willson said he gleaned his information from Floyd County Hesperian newspapers dating back to 1916.

Willson wrote, "Immediately following World War I, a number of Soldiers and Sailors days were held to honor those who fought in the war. One such day was October 3, 1919. It was a day filled with activity, but one hour was set aside by Chairman Glad Snodgrass for the organization of a veterans organization.

"This group was called together and Harry Dawson was elected Post Commander with Charles L. Lincoln as Adjutant. Those present were: James Thedford, Tom F. Terry, Wallace R. Goisby, John B. Nelson, R.E. Lowry, R.O. Lowry, Tom Goslee, J.C. Covington, Jess McFadden, J.A. Lamay, Keller Page, J.E. Robertson, F.B. Chestnut, C.B. Sisson, C.W. Hollums, and W.B. Lincoln.

"These men voted to pursue a charter from the American Legion. On November 20, 1919 the Hesperian stated that a meeting would be held on November 25, 1919 to finalize plans. Later a statement was made which said a Temporary Charter was issued on December 29, 1919. A charter was issued on September 9, 1920. The names of the charter members were lost."

# Grants and Mackenzie Water discussed

grant, if approved, will be for a sewer lift station and for replacing sewer lines.

Howard said, "Due to the drought conditions, the water supply needs, the storage of water needs, and the transportation of water are most important to TCD right now. Sewer projects are not as important to TCD as are the water projects, but I do think it will turn around again."

"They simply do not know about communities that have sewer and other problems, it seems. However, HUD looks at three major needs for low income minorities. They are water, sewer and basic housing. Grant money for rebuilding is the most successful program instead of renovating."

"Anticipating a 25 percent drop in revenue, the economic slow down, bad weather, the (stock) market being down, and the water replacement needs all over Texas, are taking priority (in grant funding)," Howard concluded.

City Manager Gary Brown reported to the council about the need to apply for a park grant in order to renovate the High School Park.

Brown said, "This park grant renovation proposal has been approved by the County Commissioners Court and the FUSD Board. Lighthouse Electric has volunteered equipment and manpower. The FHS ag department has committed to help."

"There was no negative response from the Lions Club and the Rotary Club, when the proposal was presented. I will present the project to the Senior Citizens this week because of the proposed Walking Path around the park."

Brown explained to the council that there may be a combined Little League baseball field and a girls softball field on the same diamond, if the need arises.

Council member Jon Nielson made the motion to give approval to the City to apply for a park grant. It was seconded by Council member Sheldon

Sue and unanimously passed. The council rejected two bids for a new City bucket truck because they had diesel engines instead of gasoline. Council member Eric Cornelius objected to the diesel engines because of his own expensive repair experiences recently with a diesel truck. The council asked for new bids for the bucket truck, but with gasoline engines.

A motion was made by Council member Bette King to rescind the sublease for grazing the grassland on the City farm by August 30, 2002, due to the fencing and abuse to the grassland. It was seconded by Council member Clar Schacht and unanimously passed.

A second motion was made by Schacht to delete the sublease for grazing the grassland and reduce the cash lease by \$1,000 per year. It was seconded by Council member Sheldon Sue and unanimously passed.

The council discussed a request by Trinity Assembly Church, located at 500 W. Houston. The church asked the City to pave 172 feet of S. Georgia Street, located just West of the church, due to plans to pave their church parking lot.

City Manager Brown told the council it would cost about \$19,000 for the City to pave the 172 feet of street, including one curb and gutter. After discussion, Council member Schacht made the motion to one-half the price, if the church would pay the other one-half. It was seconded by Council member Sue and unanimously passed.

Brown told the council, "Due to the recent hail storms, one-half of the City Hall's roof leaks." Brown presented the council a roofing bid of \$5,783.60 by Miller Enterprises from Lubbock. The bid included: pressure wash the metal roof, build up the low areas, seam tape and seal, and spray coat the entire roof, with a 5 year no leak warranty. The council unanimously approved the bid.

Concerning the cleaning up of properties and allies in the City, Mayor

Bobby Gilliland said, "I am proud of our town and I would like it to be a little cleaner. We have a Beautification Program and we need to enforce some of our City codes for trash. I think something needs to be done and we need to take better pride in our town."

City Manager Brown stated in letter form, "The talk in town is over the monster that we have created with our alley clean up. I would never have dreamed that our citizens had been keeping so much junk in their houses and yards. It is truly amazing the amount and variety of junk that has been put into the alleys."

"I think the 'best' junk has already been found. Jesse and his crew found an upright freezer full of dirty pampers. These had been collected for awhile. Needless to say the aroma was great."

After more discussion about old buildings around town, old lawn mowers, sinks, and toilet bowls in yards, no action was taken.

City Manager Brown discussed the future of Floydada's water source from Mackenzie Municipal Water Authority. Brown said in a letter to the board members, "I have been told by one of our board members to expect the Mackenzie budget to show a \$150,000 repair bill on the tank at Lockney. Our (Floydada's) part of this will be \$100,000. There is also talk that the treatment plant is going to have to be updated in the next couple of years. The water we get from Mackenzie is already high. The usefulness of the lake as a water supply may be nearing an end."

Brown told the board, "We just don't have \$100,000 laying around to be used on such a short notice. Somebody needs to be telling us a little more in advance about these kind of future needs."

Brown said, "Floydada is using about 96 percent of our allotment from Mackenzie even after our cut back. Our original usage was about 752,000 gallons per day and we were cut down

40 percent from that, so we are using about 96 percent of our 60 percent allotment now."

"If we quit using Mackenzie water, then the four towns of Tulia, Lockney, Silverton, and Floydada would need some way to share our water with each other, such as a pipeline connecting the towns."

"If we quit using Mackenzie water, and their (operating) tax stayed in place, then we could save \$216,000 per year that we are paying them now."

"Mackenzie people think they have a three years water supply in the lake. The lake is at about 72 feet now and when it drops below 52 feet and down, then that water will not be the best quality."

"The other side of the coin is that the treatment plant no longer meets the TNRC-CEPA requirements. We are probably looking at a couple of million dollars to bring the treatment plant up to specifications."

"This is not going to happen overnight, but it is something that we must begin to think about now. When and if this comes to pass, we have got to make a decision. Maybe if we (all the towns involved) could become independent with water wells, it would help with this problem," Brown concluded.

No action was taken on the issue by the board.

In Public Forum, Council member Sue gave the council an update of the Economic Development Board and its possibility of getting some dairies in the county in about two years. "It takes that long for them to get an approved license for a dairy," Sue said.

Police Chief Darrell Gooch addressed the council concerning security problems at local dances. Gooch asked the council to make it mandatory for two police officers to be hired by those who acquire dance permits from the City. A motion to that effect was unanimously approved by the council.

Dairy Queen may be temporarily closed for a short transitional period. Facility improvements and renovations are also being scheduled.

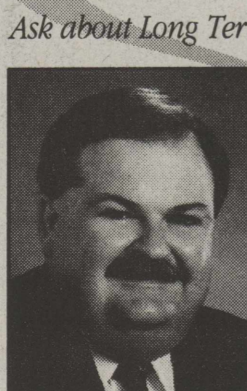

## "Do Not Call" List available for Texans

More than 500,000 Texans have signed up for the Texas "Do Not Call" list since January 1, 2002.

The list, created by the "Texas Telemarketing Disclosure and Privacy Act" of 2001, helps consumers stop unwanted telephone solicitation calls to their homes. Residential customers may register for the list for \$2.25. Registration lasts three years and extends to most telemarketing calls. Businesses may not sign up for the list.

Customers may register for the list by calling toll-free 1-866-TXNOCAL(L) (896-6225). The automated, toll-free hotline operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Customers may also register online at [www.texasnocall.com](http://www.texasnocall.com) with a credit card, or request a paper application from Texas No Call, Box 313, E. Walpole, MA 02032 and pay by check or money order. Checks should be made out to "Texas No Call".

The intent of the legislation is to stop unwanted telemarketing calls to customers from companies with whom the customer does not have an existing business relationship. However, companies may continue to contact customers with whom they have an existing relationship. In addition, companies with prior business relationships may contact customers for one year following the termination of the relationship. Also, if a customer requests contact from a company, the company may respond to that request. Non-profit and political organizations also are exempt from complying with the list.

The "Do Not Call" list will be published quarterly and telemarketers must update their "Do Not Call" list from the published list each quarter

## Caution urged with use of fireworks

Vegetation in south and west Texas is extremely dry and fire-prone, but dry vegetation also exists in other areas of the state as well. With summer heat expected to continue to take its toll on vegetation across the state, state fire control leaders urge everyone to take extra precautions when using fireworks to celebrate our nation's birthday during this year's celebration.

"When dry weather coincides with the Fourth of July holiday period, irresponsible fireworks use increases the likelihood of wildfires," says Bobby Young, associate director for forest resource protection with the Texas Forest Service in Lufkin. "The threat of wildfires is highest in the southern half of the state; but even in the rest of the state where danger is generally low to moderate, vegetation will dry rapidly and become increasingly fire-prone if hot, dry conditions persist for any length of time.

The state fire control leader offered several suggestions for safe fireworks use. Adhere to all county and city fireworks laws. Use fireworks outdoors, in a safe area away from dry grass and buildings. Follow directions carefully - with close adult supervision. Keep a bucket of water, wet towels and a garden hose handy. Never shoot fireworks from metal or glass containers and never experiment with homemade or altered fireworks. (January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1). Telemarketers must pay \$45 for the list each time they update.

Telemarketers will have 60 days from the date a number appears on a published list to update their internal databases and remove numbers. The first published list was made available to telemarketers April 1, 2002.

During the registration process customers will be advised on which quarterly list their telephone number will appear. Telemarketers who violate the "Do Not Call" law can face penalties up to \$1,000 per violation.

The law also give consumers the right to sue a telemarketer in civil court for damages.

Customers may file a complaint alleging a violation with the Customer

Protection Division of the PUC, or you may wish to contact the Office of the Attorney General.

When filing a complaint with the PUC, the complaint should explain in detail the problem, the company involved, steps you have already taken to remedy the problem, if any, and the action you think you should be taken.

### Electric No Call List Available

In 1999, the Texas Legislature enacted a law restructuring the retail electric market. A provision in this law allows business and residential consumers to place their telephone numbers on an electric "No Call" list, similar to the Texas "Do Not Call" list to avoid solicitation calls only from Retail Electric Providers (REPs). Consumers may pay \$2.55 for five years to place their information on the electric "No Call" list.

To add a telephone number to the list, call toll free at 1-866-TXNOCAL(L) (896-6225). Customers may also register or request an application online at [www.texasnocall.com](http://www.texasnocall.com). To request an application and pay by check, money order, or credit card write to TEXAS NO CALL, Box 313, E. Walpole, MA 02032.

Keep in mind, the statewide "Do Not Call" list applies to all telemarketers including REPs. Therefore customers will be shielded from REP calls if they sign up for the statewide "Do Not Call" list.

However, a \$2.25 registration is only good for three years on the statewide list. Customers may sign up for the electric "No Call" list for five years for \$2.55. If they choose, customers, may sign up for both lists for \$4.80 and it is good for five years.

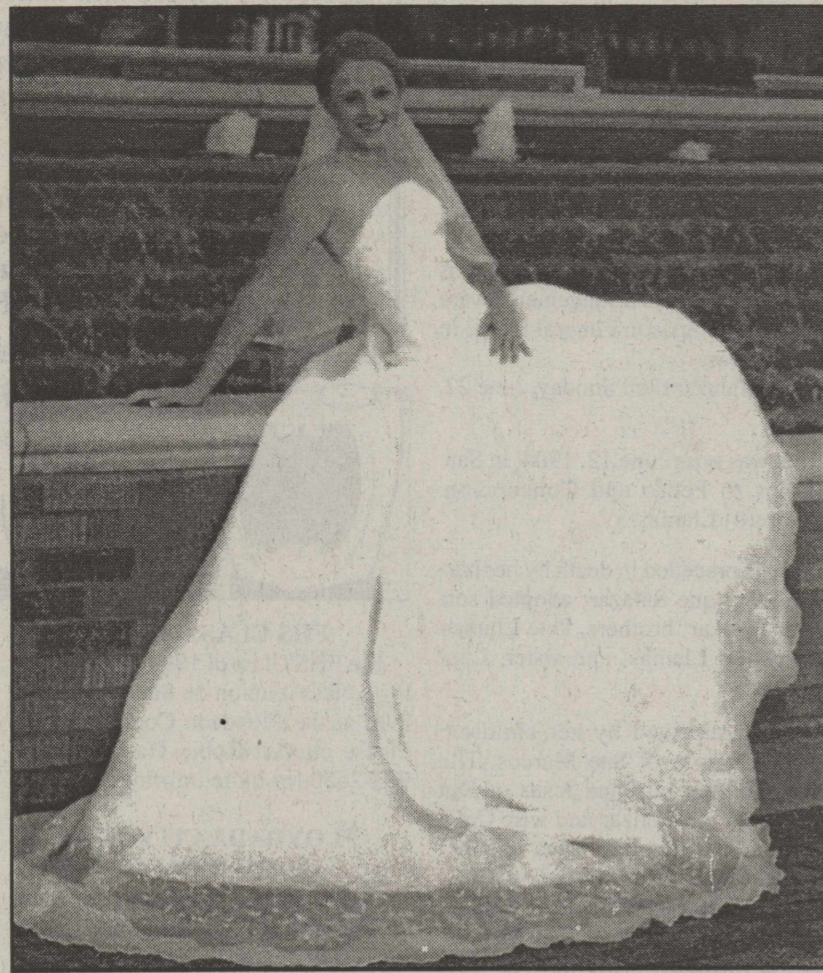

## Swimming pool safety tips for this summer

You can help reduce the chances your child will be a statistic. Teach children these safety

- If you're playing with something that falls in the swimming pool, do not go into the pool to get it yourself. Ask an adult to get it for you.
  - Never play close to the edge of the pool because you can fall in.
  - Always stay away from the deep end of the pool.
  - Never run on the pool deck or boat dock.
  - Always jump in feet first.
  - And a rule that's excellent for all ages: Never swim alone.
- Some additional suggestions to help keep your children safe:
- Never leave your child alone near the water, even for just a few seconds. Be actively attentive and keep small children within arm's reach.

- Have a first-aid kit, a phone and emergency phone numbers nearby.
- Be sure all neighborhood pools have fences or walls at least 4 to 5 feet high all the way around that do not have footholds for children to climb. Avoid vertical bars more than 4 inches apart and chain link fences that provide footholds.
- Keep chairs, tables and other items
- Always use approved personal flotation devices rather than inflatable toys to keep your child afloat.

## Farm Bill provides for conservation equipment

The 2002 Farm Bill has made new provisions and added additional funding to the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP). Farmers and ranchers in Texas have the opportunity to apply for additional 2002 funds totaling approximately \$24 million, for water conservation equipment.

EQIP is designed to promote agricultural production and environmental quality through technical assistance, cost-share payments and incentive payments to assist crop and livestock producers with environmental and conservation improvements on private lands.

The Farm Bill also created a special ground and surface water conservation emphasis area for the land above the Ogallala aquifer in Texas. An additional \$6 million is available for producers in this area to update irrigation equipment. Producers will now be able to purchase water-conserving irrigation equipment on a 75 percent cost-share rate.

"This amount of funding is extremely significant for water conservation. Even if a producer wanted to upgrade a surface irrigation system to a center pivot system, this funding would cover 75 percent of the total cost to install the new equipment. This is going to help a great deal of producers on the Texas High Plains," said High Plains Underground Water Conservation District Manager Jim Conkright.

Other conservation practices that will receive 75 percent funding include drip irrigation, new nozzles for existing sprinklers, irrigation pipeline and flow meters. There is also funding available for water quality practices, such as chemigation safety valves.

"Updating Equipment to improve irrigation application efficiencies is vital to conserving water in the 15-counties the High Plains Water District serves," said Conkright. "We encourage all producers to take advantage of the funding available through

NRCS so they may improve their equipment and prolong the life of the Ogallala aquifer."

Producers will also be able to utilize program funds within the first year of their contract, and the payment limitation increased to \$450,000 per producer for the life of the farm bill. "These current provisions will be incorporated into all new contracts approved this year in Texas," said Jon Weddle, USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (USDA-NRCS) program manager in Lubbock.

The application deadline for EQIP funding is June 28, 2002. Producers who have made prior applications in 2001-2002 should contact their county NRCS office to review their applications.

Producers interested in making an application for the Ogallala aquifer water conservation area should contact their local NRCS field office to make an application by July 12, 2002.

## Floyd County Extension Service Tips on Turf series by J.D. Ragland

Again this year the Texas Cooperative Extension is offering an eight week series of articles. These articles titled "Tips on Turf" will offer homeowners helpful tips addressing lawn, garden, and tree care management practices. This is the fifth article in the series of eight. This week we will discuss "Weed Control In Lawns"

The plants with little purple flowers that are making themselves known in home lawns are called henbit. If you are unsure that this is what you have, check the stems. If they are square rather than round, you have henbit.

Though it actually comes up in the fall, most people do not pay much at-

tention to this weed until it starts to flower. Trying to kill it at this late stage with a herbicide is usually a waste of time and money. Though the plant may be burned back, it will rarely be killed.

So what do we do? Remember, this is a winter annual; it comes up in the fall, matures in the spring and dies as soon as it starts to get hot. All that we do now is keep it mowed until it nature takes its course.

However, we can do something next fall that will help next spring. Henbit usually germinates about mid-October. If we spray with 2, 4-D, Weed-B-Gone or Trimec in early November we can go a long way toward eliminating henbit the next spring.

The plants are small during the fall and relatively easy to control. Choose a day that is at least 50 degrees F so the henbit is actively growing and will take up the chemical. Spot treating will probably be needed in the spring to catch the few plants that germinate late. Use Weed-B-Gone, Trimec, or one of the special henbit herbicides early before the henbit has put on much growth.

## Leak detection tools offered by water district

The High Plains Underground Water Conservation District No. 1 offers flow meters and leak detectors on a free-loan basis to help people within the district locate costly water leaks that can waste our region's limited ground water supply. Flow meters measure the amount of water that is moving through pipes, while leak detectors can find leaks in pipes buried beneath the land's surface.

"Using flow meters can help an irrigator find out if a well is producing as much water as it was originally designed to do. This simple test can save a lot of money," said Arnold Husky, Water Use Division Director for the High Plains Water District.

"For example, if your pump is designed to produce 600 gallons of water per minute and the flow test shows it is only producing 400 gallons of water per minute, then there appears to be a problem with the pump and it should be repaired. This saves money in the long run, because it costs about as much to operate a pump that is producing 400 gallons a minute when

you pump is designed to produce 600 gallons of water per minute," Husky said.

The flow meter are available for loan to anyone living within the 15-county High Plains Water District service area. Individuals may pick up a flow meter during regular business hours at the Water District office, 2930 Avenue Q, Lubbock, TX 79405, or at any of the 15 county USDA-NRCS offices in the Water District.

The Water District also offers underground leak detectors on a free loan basis. The leak detectors use sensitive microphones, which can "hear" the sound water makes as it flows from a leaking underground pipe.

"In some instances with a center pivot irrigation system, the leaks are large enough that you can see water coming up to the surface. However, there are other times when you may suspect that an underground pipeline is leaking. This type of leak can often be small and hard to detect," Husky said. "Using the Water District's leak detector can help you

prove or disprove a suspected leaking pipeline without the inconvenience of hiring a contractor to dig and locate the leak."

The leak detectors are available to anyone living in the High Plains Water District. Husky added that city water utility managers and superintendents often check out the leak detectors to find leaks in their town's water distribution system. "Use of the leak detectors can save taxpayers money by pinpointing a leak without having to dig up large sections of roadways in a hit or miss attempt to locate it," Husky said.

Husky said it is important to conserve as much water as possible, and the free-loan flow meters and leak detectors are tools to help people conserve water for a more beneficial use.

## Thornberry votes for completed Farm Bill

U.S. Rep. Mac Thornberry has voted in favor of the House-Senate Conference Report to H.R. 2646, the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002. The bill was approved by a vote of 280-141.

"We overcame a lot of obstacles to get a new farm bill this year," Thornberry stated. "Larry Combest deserves a lot of credit for shepherding this through a lot of ups and downs. But a lot of credit also must go to the many producers who worked hard, made their voices heard, and never forgot that they have a very important role in the legislative process."

"This farm bill will especially help farmers in our area with a new target price for the crops they grow. The new support structure will sustain American farmers -- the most advanced and

efficient food and fiber producers the world has ever known -- until world prices improve."

Portions of the bill that will have a big impact on the 13th District include:

Target price for Upland Cotton set at \$.72/pound

Loan rates for corn and grain sorghum both raised to \$1.98/bushel for 2002 and 2003

Producers able to update their base number of planting acres and their crop yields according to a certain formula

Suspends the 1.25 cent price differential threshold for Step 2 marketing payments through July 31, 2006

Payment limits set at \$40,000 for direct payments, \$65,000 for the new counter-cyclical payments, and

\$75,000 for payments from the marketing loan program; current rules on spouses, three-entities and generic certificates are retained

Peanuts converted from a quota to a program crop with a \$495/ton target price; quota holders are bought-out at 11 cents/pound per year for five years

Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) increased to 39.2 million acres

Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) receives phased-in funding increases up to \$1.3 billion annually; feed yards, ranchers and farmers eligible for payments

The Senate must also approve the Conference Report before the Farm Security Act goes to the White House for President Bush's signature. A date for consideration has not yet been set.

## 2001 cotton production numbers finalized for High Plains region

The final tallies are complete and the numbers offer a vivid example of the areas potential as well as how quickly that potential can disappear according to Lubbock-based Plains Cotton Growers, Inc.

Officially the High Plains produced 2,492,700 bales in 2001 from 2,421,100 harvested acres.

Total plantings in the region were 3,681,800 with abandonment totaling 1,260,700 acres or 34 percent.

The 2001 crop marked the second straight year in which more than 1 million acres of cotton were lost prior to harvest.

All cotton yields ranged from a high of 1,009 pounds per acre in Parmer County down to a slim 152 pounds per harvested acre average yield in Howard County.

Compared to 2000, the High Plains averaged 104 pounds more lint per harvested acre with a weighted average yield of 494 pounds per harvested acre. Irrigated cotton production averaged a respectable 622 pounds across the board, 146 pounds more than the 2000 weighted average yield. Dryland yields improved slightly to 212 pounds per harvested acre, 30 pounds better than in 2000.

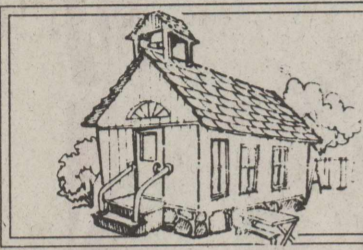

**STOP THE MUSIC!** I appreciate good gospel scriptural hymns. I admire those who have voices good enough that they can sing specials. I believe God honors those who try to glorify Him in song.

In Tennessee during the '60's, we always had someone to play the old upright piano in our little country church. During our home cottage prayer meetings on Saturday nights, we had an accordion player that traveled with us.

In Mexico during the '70's, we always sang accapella in our church services because we had no pianos, no organs, and very few guitars. Most of our churches in the mountains did not even have electricity. So that eliminated electric organs, electric guitars, or even amplifiers.

On one trip to southern Oaxaca, Mexico, we left the paved highway and arrived a couple of hours later at a Chontal Indian village that was located back in the foot hills of the mountains near the Pacific Ocean.

We gathered for the night service in the little church house made out of adobe brick and stucco. Before the services I had noticed an Indian young man about 16 years old playing a guitar outside.

Sure enough he began strumming his guitar real loud when we began singing our first congregational song. He was just "striking" the guitar, not even strumming it. I patiently waited for the first song to end and I just knew he would not continue this type of interruption to our singing. It was really loud and very much off key.

We began our second song and the people began looking back at the guitar strummer. It was really disturbing our service. My patience began to wear thin. Before we finished this second song I finally decided to **STOP THE MUSIC!**

I waved my hands at the song leader. Everyone stopped singing. I turned to the young man and asked him to put the guitar down. I told him if he wanted to sing a special later that would be fine, but for now **STOP STRUMMING THAT GUITAR!** He stopped, but he did not sing a special later. I guess I offended him.

**MORAL OF THE STORY:** "If you have a good voice, use it for the Lord, but don't drown it out with a loud instrument."

### Teaching Your Children To Make Good Decisions

Children can grow up and make some bad decisions. It is not always the parent's fault when a child does that. They have a mind of their own and can be trained in all the right ways, and still decide to do opposite what the parents taught. I have seen it just the opposite - a child is reared poorly but grows up to make responsible, good, sound decisions - again they have the ability to choose.

For the past several weeks I have talked about this topic on the Thursday morning (about 7:15 a.m.) "Community Focus" on KKYN 1910 AM. I will attempt to make this topic a series of articles for the next few weeks.

There is quite a bit involved and the concept is difficult to get across when trying to communicate it in writing, but here goes. If you want to provide an environment that will allow your child(ren) the opportunity to learn responsible decision making it will be vital that you provide the following elements.

- 1. Consistency** on the parent's part. Do what you say you will do.
- 2. Structure** - specific guidelines or boundaries that are not too restrictive or too loose.
- 3. Decision making opportunity** for the child. Don't make all the de-

isions for him/her.

**4. Escalated consequences** for continued wrong/bad decisions.

I will give more details about each of the above areas each week.

This type of home environment will help reduce the power struggles between parents and child. Some parents do more yelling at their kids than talking to them. Some children seem to know how far to push parents. It's like they can hear when the yelling is at a certain pitch or frequency and they know just when to stop. They seem to know just how far to push Mom or Dad. That should not happen. The parents should not be suckered into a yelling match with their children.

Most of us have been stopped and given a traffic ticket of some kind, I am sure. I have never had a police officer yell at me or even raise his/her voice. They politely came up to my car, asked if there is an emergency, asked for my drivers license, asked if I knew how fast I was going (which I have sometimes lied and said, "No" - and then I acted surprised when they tell me what they clocked me at). They just get out that little ticket book and write out the nice little ticket.

I wonder what would happen if the police officer came to my car window

yelling and screaming, and climbed up on the hood of my car and beat their fists out of frustration? I probably would think much less of that officer and would assume they all are like that.

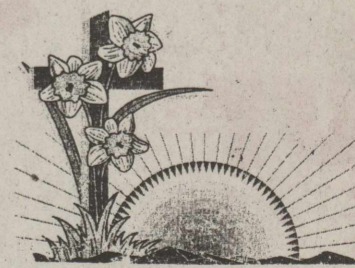
Instead, they are calm and controlled. They have all the authority - they are certified, they carry a gun, have the uniform, and they have the authority to write me a ticket! They use the authority they have. If you push it, you will have consequences to face. If you really get bent out of shape, the consequences will get worse.

Parents who get in a yelling match with their children do not know how to use the authority they have in a proper manner. The child can learn to make better choices than yelling at the parents if parents will use authority correctly.

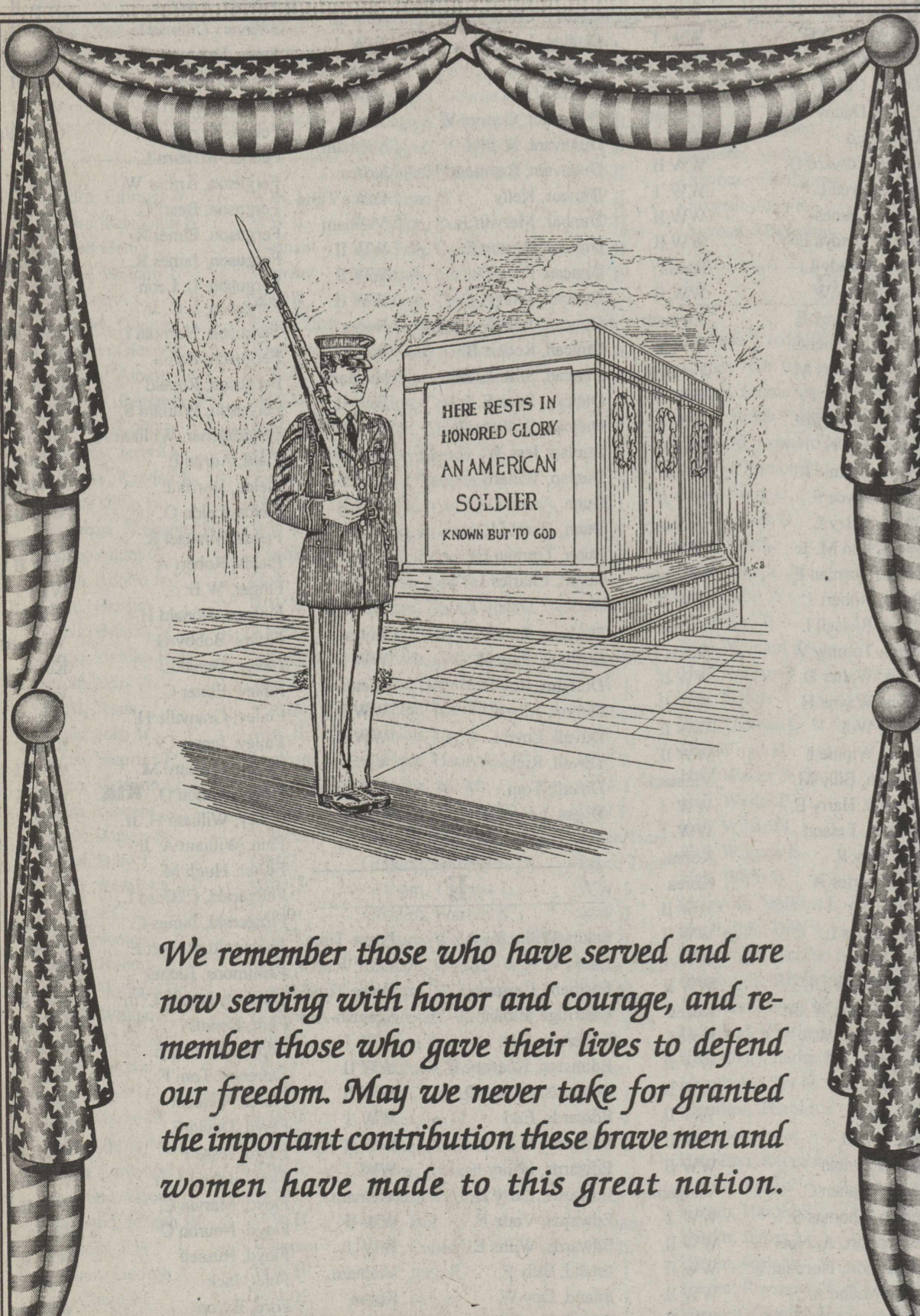
