J. E. IRBY,

Dear Sir: Our agent ought to sell nine-tenths of the paint of his town and region; no use to try for the other tenth. The proportion of men, who won't take good advice, and use the least-gallons paint, is about one in ten among even owners of houses and stores and shops and barns and fences.

One man in ten will buy a gold brick or green goods, if he has the money and gets a good chance.

Devoe at \$1.75 a gallon is better than gold; adulterated and short-measure paints are green goods and gold bricks.

TEXAS AND PACIFIC EXTENSION.

May Connect With Denver and Rio Grande at Santa Fe.

The following item from the railroad column in the Dallas News of the 30th inst. refers to the survey made through Haskell a few weeks ago by the Weatherford & Mineral Wells Railroad and which was continued into New Mexico:

"That the Gould properties in Texas will be extended to a junction with the Denver and Rio Grande is generally accepted as a fact in railroad circles,

although no official statement is made other than an admission that surveys have been run west, extending the Weatherford, Mineral Wells and Northwestern from Mineral Wells.

The belief generally expressed is that the connection will be made somewhere in Colorado, but eastern authorities in touch with the management outline the plan as connecting through the Santa Fe Central in New Mexico.

The Eastern idea is that the Weatherford, Mineral Wells and Northwest-

ern will join a Gould road, to be known as the Roswell and Eastern, at the Texas-New Mexico line, carrying it to Torrance, the southern terminus of the Santa Fe Central, over which the Gould lines, or properly, the Texas and Pacific, will be able to reach Santa Fe, the northern terminus, and the terminus also of the Denver and Rio Grande."

The amendment to the constitution to authorize the levy of a tax to pay jurors we think is needed and should be adopted by the voters. As the law now is, no direct tax can be levied for this purpose and the sources which the law provides shall provide the fund for the payment of jurors is entirely inadequate for the purpose in a great many, if not most, of the counties, and jurors either sell their script at a discount or hold it and pay it in on their taxes, or if it is cashed by the county treasurer it is in many instances done with money which the commissioners' court has had transferred from some other fund for the purpose, thus diverting the money from its proper fund and use. And it is not uncommon for commissioners' courts to levy a larger tax in some fund than is necessary for its legitimate purpose with the view to transferring a part of it to the jury fund, thus "whipping the devil around the stump." Jurors should have their pay promptly and it is best, in our judgement, to authorize the direct levy of a tax for the purpose and be done with questionable methods.

The proposed amendment to Section 2, Article 3, of the constitution is designated to exempt from taxation in addition to the exemptions now existing, all buildings used exclusively and owned by persons or associations of persons for school purposes and the necessary furniture of all schools, also

the endowment fund of such institutions of learning and religion not used with a view to profit. And when any funds of such schools or institutions are invested in bond, mortgages, lands or other property and in collecting or to save the fund, the school or institution buys the land or property in a foreclosure sale, the property so bought in is exempt from taxation for two years only. If the institution holds such property longer than two years it must pay taxes on it.

As most of our readers know, such schools as the Georgetown University, the Texas Christian University, Simmons College at Abilene, etc., are supported to a large extent by donations and bequests of money and property, which is held by the board of trustees and invested so as to yield a rental or interest for the maintenance of the school. The object of this amendment is to aid such schools to the extent of relieving their property from taxation, and we believe the amendment ought to be adopted.

There are comparatively few people in the South who do not believe that the policies and principles for which the Democratic party stands are best for the masses. If you are one who believes they are, go and vote the Democratic ticket Tuesday so that you can go into the next primary and have a voice in nominating for president that matchless friend and advocate of the people, William Jennings Bryan.
