FHA loans total \$74,529,000

The U. S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers Home Administration made or insured \$74,529,000 in loans to Texas Farm and other rural families, during 1963, L. J. Cappelman, state director of the agency, announced.

A total of 11,977 families used one or more of the agency's loan programs during the year.

FHA operates a broad program of supplementary credit for rural development in Texas.

The agency makes loans for family farming operations, farm development, rural housing, community water systems, soil and water conservation and development, recreation enterprises, and other purposes.

Loans are made only to borrowers who cannot obtain credit from banks, Production Credit Associations, and other conventional lenders.

Poll tax sales down in county

According to Kelly Jones, Tax Assessor-Collector, poll tax payments are below those sold in last general election year, 1959. Jones reported an unofficial tally of 3,820 poll tax receipts issued thru Friday, as against 3,921 issued in 1959.

Jones stated further that exemptions to those reaching their 21st birthday this year were 98 as compared to 62 four years ago. He reminded the public that exemptions to those eligible to vote free this year may still be obtained at his office.

"We had a full crew on duty until midnight Friday to sell poll taxes," Jones declared.

With the heavy farrowing season here, farmers are cautioned that two diseases bear a great deal of watching to cut down the chances of baby pig losses.

The diseases are swine erysipelas and virus pig pneumonia. Erysipelas causes losses of about \$24 million a year and the annual loss from virus pneumonia is estimated at \$120 million. It is estimated that 40 per cent of the nation's swine herds are infected with this latter disease.

Erysipelas may occur in several forms. The most common are the chronic joint or skin form and the acute form which produces sudden death. Young pigs seem to be affected with the acute type more often.

Symptoms of acute erysipelas include sleepy appearance, fever, loss of appetite, stiff gait. In the chronic type, the infection frequently settles in the joints and causes arthritis and occasionally skin lesions on the ears, stomach and between the legs.



This is the danger season for baby pig diseases.

Prompt diagnosis and treatment by a veterinarian are highly important if erysipelas losses are to be kept to a minimum. Actually, the best way to cope with the disease is to have a veterinarian vaccinate all pigs against erysipelas.

Virus pig pneumonia usually strikes pigs about 3 weeks of age. Coughing is often the first symptom and is most severe in the morning when pigs are first roused. Scouring also develops at about the time coughing starts. Often pigs do not look sick, but feed utilization is poor.

Unfortunately, many farmers may mistake VPP for swine flu or any one of several other baby pig diseases. Such a mistake can be truly costly, hence the wisest first step is to have a veterinarian diagnose to determine the real trouble.

VPP is extremely difficult to control. One method suggested is pig isolation combined with replacement of infected breeding stock with certified VPP-free pigs. This is the danger season—time to be on the lookout for both diseases.

provisions of the program will earn a payment for acreage diversion and will become eligible for the feed grain price support loan payment. Since the payments vary by crops, the diversion payment will be based on the kind of crop acreage diverted; the price support payment will be based on the kind of feed grain planted.

The acreage diverted from production of the feed grains is to be devoted to an approved conservation use and this acreage is in addition to the conservation-use base acreage for the farm.

Payments will average higher this year, and the maximum diversion is higher. A new provision in the 1964 program limits the diversion payment to no more than 20 percent of the fair market value of the land diverted in 1964.

1964 feed grain program voluntary

Participation in the 1964 feed grain program will be entirely voluntary, as in earlier years, according to C. B. Stowe, chairman, ASC County Committee. Only those growers who take part in the program, however, will be eligible for price support on the three feed grains, corn,

barley and grain sorghum. Producers on farms which grew any of these grains in either 1959 or 1960, or in both years, will have the opportunity to sign up in the program during the period February 10 thru March 27. In the meantime, ASCS county office staffs will answer questions growers may have.
