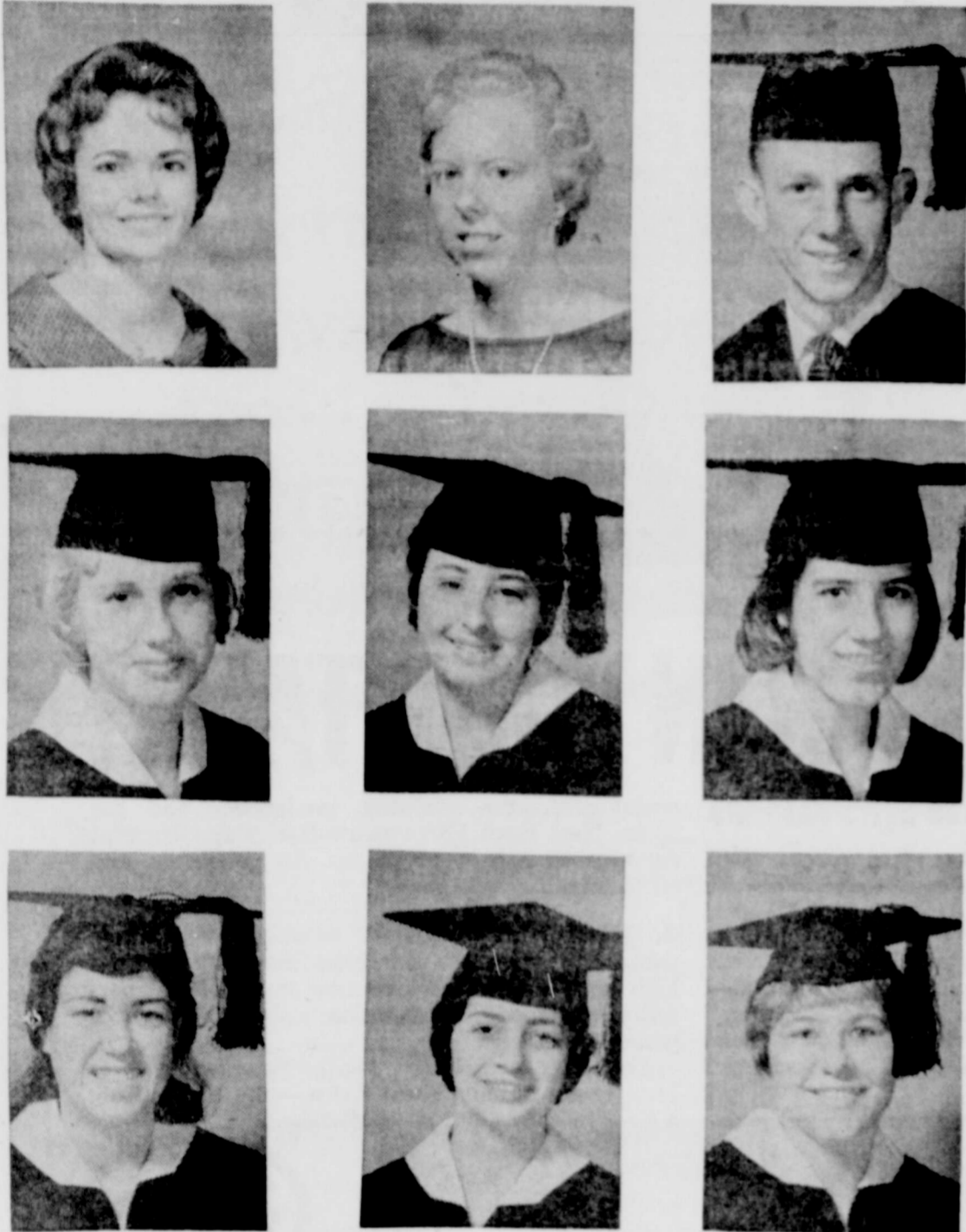

Bids were opened May 14 at 2 p. m. on housing project for Newcastle. Four bids were entered for the construction of these housing units.

Those bidding were Averett & Wingham of Olney with a bid of \$73,517.00; Curtis Tate Construction Co. Wichita Falls, \$72,759.00; Rouse & Parsons Contractors Abilene, \$66,642.00; Ed A. Wilson, Ft. Worth, \$75,987.

The amount of money appropriated by the government for this project was \$59,812.00. You can readily see the lowest bid is about \$6,000.00 higher than the amount appropriated. We do not know what action is being taken, but feel sure something will be worked out toward the completion of this project.

Genealogical meet at Fort Belknap a big success

The Fort Belknap Genealogical Society met on May 6, 1964, in what is described as the most successful meeting ever held. Dr. Kenneth Neighbours of Olney, and professor of history at Midwestern College in Wichita Falls, presided at the outstanding meeting.

The program was presented to an enthusiastic audience of 150 people. Dr. Cora M. Oneal of Wichita Falls and Austin; president of the Fort Belknap Historical Society welcomed the group. Mr. George Terrell of Newcastle was to have presented a talk on "the reminiscences about Negro Britt." Mr. Terrell became very ill on May 15, and is now a patient in the Olney hospital, and Mrs. Horace R. Ledbetter delivered a paper on the heroic Negro Britt Johnson, as told by the late Henry C. Williams Sr. Following Mrs. Ledbetter, Mr. Toni Turk gave a talk on "Beginners in Genealogy." Mrs. J. L. Hard gave a report from her fathers Civil War papers.

Misses Toni Adams and Shirley Luig of Archer City, rendered a musical folk song, which was received with enthusiasm by the audience. W. R. Conger of Dallas gave a very interesting talk on genealogical searching. He used an outstanding display of the Warren Angus Ferris papers to demonstrate his talk. The talk was one of the best ever given at the Fort. Some members of the Ferris clan of Texas and Oklahoma, attended the meeting in honor of their outstanding early Texas ancestor.

The auditorium was decorated with antiques. Flowers and center piece was furnished by Mrs. Cecil Kessler.

A business session, lunch under the grape arbor, and a book auction concluded the program. Dr. Neighbours was re-elected as president. The officers will remain the same with Judge Raymon Thompson serving as secretary of the organization.

Six Flags to Host Baptist Youth Festival

Principal speaker for the giant Youth Rally to close the all-day activities at the family recreation center between Dallas and Fort Worth, will be professional football star Bill Glass.

Glass, a Baptist preacher studying at Southwestern Seminary in Fort Worth, is a defensive end for the Cleveland Browns. He was a member of the 1962 National Football League All-Star defensive team and an All-America football star at Baylor University.

The festival program, which places emphasis on spiritual values combined with good, clean Christian fun, has already enlisted many outstanding choir groups as well as leading personalities in the field of television, motion pictures and sports to appear on the program.

Among them are All-American tackle Scott Appleton and the "Golden Toed" Tony Crosby, both active Baptists and stars of the 1963 National Champions University of Texas football team.

Gregory Walcott, leading character in NBC's "87th Precinct" series; Miss Pam Baird, pert

singer and actress who starred in the "Wonderful World of the Brothers Grimm", "Good Morning, Miss Dove", "The Remarkable Mr. Pennypacker" and a host of other motion picture and television productions; Bob Turnbull, key performer in many TV shows such as "Arrest and Trial", "Going My Way", "The Millionaire" and "Dr. Kildaire"; Ray Hildebrand, popular singer and song writer whose record of "Hey Paula" was the nation's number one song, hit for four weeks last year and sold over a million copies; Miss Linda Loftis, talented singer and beauty who was named "Miss Texas" in 1961 and runner-up in the Miss America Pageant that year.

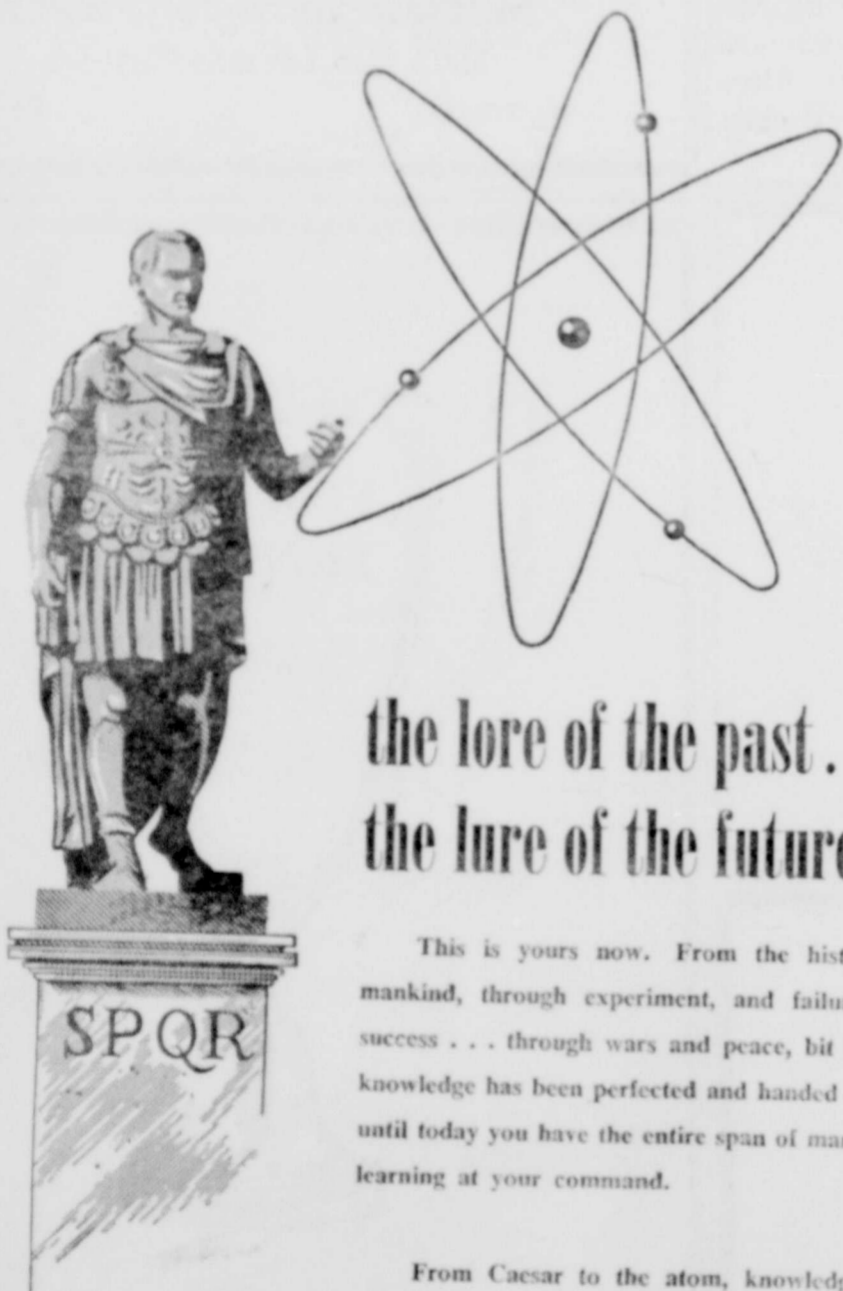

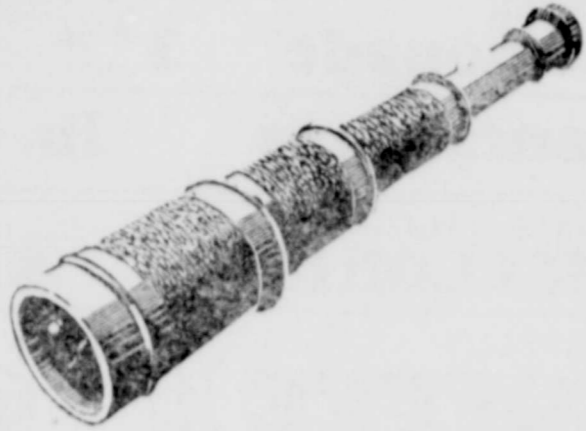
