





A reader who has been experi encing difficulty with slippage and inefficient operation on his tool grinder's V-belt says, "I never thought a V-belt could give trouble. What could be wrong to cause this sudden slipping? I'd appreciate any suggestions you may have."

V-belt drives require little attention for the most part but they do need occasional inspection for the following factors:

Keep the pulleys and belt free from oil, dirt, and grease by occasional cleaning. Make sure the belt has the right tension-from 1/2 to 1/4 inch for every foot of belt between the pulley shafts.



Correct tension will eliminate V-belt slipping and inefficient op-

Check the pulley grooves to make sure they aren't bent or worn. Such pulleys wear out the belt rapidly. Check pulley alignment by placing a straightedge against the two pulleys. Make sure the alignment is as near perfect as possible.

Be sure the top (wide section) of the belt is flush with the top of the pulley. If the belt is so worn it is riding the bottom of the groove, it should be replaced. There should be clearance at the bottom of the pulley groove and bottom (narrow section) of the belt. If not, friction properties of the side of the groove and belt are lost and slipping can occur.

This looks like a long list but ctually all of these factors can be checked in but a little timeand the checking should be done periodically to catch defects before slipping and inefficiency

Since V-belt drive mechanisms are widely used in general farm and home shop applications with portable motors, it is important to be alert to the simple rules of




