US census bureau reports county's '63 retail trade

Young County's 231 retail establishments had \$21.6 million in sales in 1963. A decrease of 3 percent from 1958. The U. S. Bureau of the census has just reported after tabulating data gathered from all firms in the 1963 census of business. The last previous business census conducted by the census bureau, an agency of the U. S. Department of Commerce, was in 1958.

Retail in the county meant jobs (exclusive of proprietors) for 638 men and women and a yearly payroll of \$1,800,000.

In volume of business the county's food stores had sales of \$5.7 million an increase of 1 percent from 1958. In other retail business—the county's eating and drinking places had sales of \$1.0 million, and gasoline service stations had sales of \$2.2 million. Auto dealers and related retail trade establishments had sales of \$4.7 million; general merchandise group stores had sales of \$1.1 million; and lumber, building materials, hardware and farm equipment dealers had sales of 1.8 million.

For the state as a whole, the census bureau reported 96,406 retail establishments with sales of \$127.54 billion up 18 percent from 1958.

Census reports to be issued during the next few months will give state and county figures on wholesale and service trades, manufacturing and mineral industries.

Historical meet at Austin

Mrs. J. W. Bullock of Newcastle, chairman of Young County Historical Survey Committee, has designated Mrs. Ben G. Oneal of Austin to represent her at the State-wide County Chairman's Meeting on March 16 in Austin. Highlight of the session is a discussion and planning of the second year for RAMPS, according to information Mrs. Bullock has received from the TSHSC committee, sponsor of the meeting.

RAMPS is the accelerated, five-pointed program of Recognition, Appreciation, Preservation, Marking and Surveys of Texas history. It was begun, kept going and is now being enlarged through the corporation of the county, regional and state historical survey groups.

21 projects pertaining to RAMPS are slated for completion during a five-year period, announces the TSHSC a state agency with headquarters in Austin.

Mrs. Oneal will meet with the other county chairmen for a discussion of plans and problems in having successful RAMPS projects in Young County.

The state-wide goal of placing 1000 markers a year was reached the first year of RAMPS—and went over, with more than 1,300 markers erected in 1964.

To this date, there are four Official Texas Historical Markers and Medallions erected in Young County.

One of the featured events for the one day county chairman's meeting on March 16 is a luncheon to which Mrs. Bullock has been asked to invite this district's state legislators.

Mrs. Bullock long has been one of the county's most prominent figures in local history preservation and study. She was appointed recently for a two year term by County Judge Raymon Thompson.

Construction work on hwy. 24 awarded to Olney firm

A contract for 8.8 miles of construction on State Highway 24 in Young County has been awarded to a Olney firm, it was announced in Austin this week by the State Highway Commission.

A&A Contractors, Inc. submitted the low bid of \$351,853.97 on the project. Grading, structures, flexible base and two course surfacing treatment from Newcastle to Graham (Sect.) is expected to take 200 working days, according to L. B. Dean, District Highway Engineer at Wichita Falls.

Thomas H. Sutherland, Resident Engineer at Graham, will be in active charge of the project while it is under construction.

ORDINANCE NO. 65-1
An Ordinance Providing For Licensing, Taxing, Inspection, Supervision and Regulation of the Owning and Operation For Profit, of any Pool or Billiard Tables Within the City Limits of Newcastle, Young County, Texas.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Newcastle, Young County, Texas:

That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association of persons, corporation and every other organization, save and except religious, charitable or educational organization authorized under the laws of the State of Texas, to own and operate for profit, any pool or billiard table or tables, (meaning any table surrounded by a ledge of cushion, with or without pockets, on which balls are propelled by sticks or cues), within Newcastle, Young County, Texas, without having first obtained an appropriate license from the City Secretary as herein provided, which license shall at all times be displayed in some conspicuous place within the licensed place of business.

The City Secretary is authorized to collect the following annual license fee for each location on which a pool or billiard table or tables is or are owned and operated for profit, to-wit: the sum of \$50.00 for each license issued and a like sum for each renewal thereof. All licenses issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be for one year, and shall not be transferable.

The Mayor of Newcastle, Texas, shall appoint a committee from the City Council to issue licenses under this ordinance, and such committee shall have the right and duty to investigate fully the person or persons making application for license hereunder. No person who has ever been convicted of a felony shall be licensed to operate a billiard club or pool room in the City of Newcastle, Texas, nor shall any such person be allowed to manage same under a license issued to any other person or persons, and the breach of this provision shall be grounds for revoking any license or licenses so issued. Any license issued hereunder shall be non-transferable. The license above set out shall be for one-year period, and before renewal of any such license, the person or persons desiring renewal of same shall meet with the committee of the City Council, and if the committee recommends the issuance of such license to said person, then such person shall before the final of the license or re-issuance of same, meet with the City Council at a regularly scheduled meeting for approval by the full Council and before a new permit may be issued.

There is hereby levied an annual occupation tax of \$2.50 for each pool or billiard table owned and operated for profit within the City by any person, firm, association of persons, corporations and every other organization, save and except religious, charitable and educational organizations authorized under the laws of the State of Texas, and the tax levied herein shall be paid to the Tax Collector of the City who shall issue an occupation tax receipt. Said occupation tax receipt shall specify the number of pool or billiard tables for which issued; the address of the buildings or premises in or on which such table or tables are located, and shall bear the serial number or numbers, if any, of the particular table or tables. Such occupation tax shall have and bear no relation to any license or fees provided herein, said license fee being required to provide proper official supervision, inspection and services for the premises.

No person may engage in the operation for profit of any billiard or pool table or tables within this City on week days between the hours of 12:00 o'clock midnight and 8 o'clock a. m. following: provided however, that such table or tables may be operated on Sundays only between the hours of 12 o'clock noon and 6 o'clock p. m.

The City Council is hereby authorized and empowered to revoke or cancel the license of any person, firm or association of persons, corporation and every other organization author-

ized under the laws of the State of Texas, licensed to own and operate a pool or billiard table or tables hereunder, after giving such licensee ten days notice of a hearing and after conducting such hearing for the purpose of determining whether such license should be revoked, provided however, that such power of cancellation or revocation shall be exercised only under the following conditions:

(a) For the violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance; (b) For knowingly permitting the sale, use or consumption of any alcoholic beverage or beverages in or upon the premises licensed hereunder; (c) For violation of prescribed hours of operation provided herein; (d) For knowingly permitting the presence on the premises of a person or persons under the influence of intoxicating liquor; (e) For knowingly permitting disorderly conduct or immoral practices on the premises; (f) For knowingly permitting the violation of the law or laws of the State of Texas or of the Municipal Code of this City, and for allowing any gambling of any sort in connection with such games so played, or in connection with the running of such billiard or pool hall or room. The fact that there is an agreement that the loser of a game agrees to pay the cost thereof is not to be considered gambling, but any agreement to pay a greater sum than the cost of the use of the tables and equipment for the game shall be considered gambling; (g) Operating a billiard room or pool hall with covers, drapes and paint or any other obstruction covering the windows; (h) allowing minors under the age of 21 years to come onto such premises without having a written permission from one or both of such minor's parents or legal guardian on their person and subject to display by such minor when requested by such operator or by any officer of the City of Newcastle, and for allowing school age persons to come on such premises during school hours, whether with or without parental consent; (i) For knowingly permitting any violation of this ordinance in any manner.

It shall be unlawful to erect or construct on the licensed premises any partition or partitions obstructing the view of any part of the building or premises licensed herein, or cutting the building into two or more rooms by constructing partitions therein, in which a pool or billiard table or tables is or are displayed, owned and operated for profit, provided however, that toilet or other sanitary facilities shall be enclosed and adequately ventilated in accordance with health, plumbing, sanitary and other applicable ordinances of this city.

Places of business governed by this ordinance shall be located on the ground floor or street level only of any building and shall not be licensed for any other floor than the ground or street level floor.

The City Manager shall appoint or designate the City Building Inspector to make periodic inspections of the licensed premises, whose duty shall be to determine compliance with the building provisions, the maintenance of toilets and other sanitary facilities and compliance with the health, plumbing, sanitary and other applicable ordinances of this City.

Any person, firm, association of persons, corporation or every other organization licensed hereunder violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not more than \$100.00.

If any section, sub-section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase or word in this ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the Ordinance and the City Council hereby declares it would have passed such remaining portions of the Ordinance despite such invalidity.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are expressly repealed. The importance of this Ordinance and the absence of any regulation relating to the owning and operation of a pool or billiard table or tables and the licensing thereof and the levy and collection of an occupation tax thereon creates an emergency and an imperative public

necessity and requires that this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and it is so Ordained.

AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE NO. 65-1

Providing for Licensing, Taxing Etc., of any Pool or Billiard Table Within the City Limits of the City of Newcastle, Young County, Texas, and Regulations concerning the Ownership and Operation of Same.

WHEREAS, heretofore the City Council of the City of the City of Newcastle, Texas, passed Ordinance No. 65-1, providing for the licensing, taxing, inspection, supervision and regulation of the owning and operation for profit, of any pool or billiard table or tables within city limits of Newcastle, Texas, and in such Ordinance provided under paragraph (h) thereof, for the cancellation or revocation of the license to own and operate a pool or billiard table or tables for profit and in the event of the following:

(h) Allowing minors under the age of 21 years to come onto such premises without having written permission from one or both of such minor's parents or legal guardian on their person and subject to display by such minor when requested by such operator or by any officer of the City of Newcastle, and for allowing school age persons to come on such premises during school hours whether with or without parental consent.

AND WHEREAS, it has been called to the attention of the City Council of the City of Newcastle, Texas, that the age limit under which written permission must be secured from a parent or legal guardian of such person

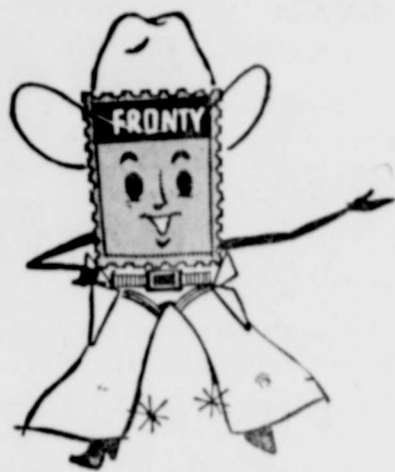

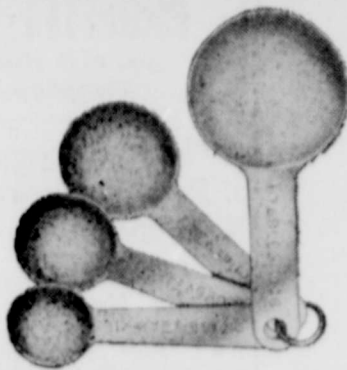
