# CFC contributions pass '77 mark

The 1978 Combined Federal of \$79,703.48 set last year. Campaign is over and Reese people showed their generosity by exceeding the base target by more than \$14,000.

With only a few dollars still trickling in, the base total has topped \$80,479 which is 121.9 per cent of the \$66,000 goal set for this year.

(\$25,745.55), Resource Management hit 122 per cent (\$9,736.75), the Wing Staff stands at 520 per cent (\$1,818.10), Air Base Group turned in 107 per cent (\$13,878.90), the Hospital pledged 161 per cent (\$6,457.20) while the 1958th Communications Squadron came up with

113 per cent of its goal (\$2,015).

Only the combined tenant units failed to reach 100 per cent of their "fair share" target. The combined tenants contributed \$1,419.30 for 77 per cent of their goal. However, two of the units, Weather and the Management Engineering Team, did top the century mark hitting 128 and 155 per cent respectively.

**Beauty Shop prices** 

I would like to know why all the prices in the base Beauty Shop were raised as soon as the new contractor took over. I talked with the Exchange manager and he told me the present contract is exactly the same as the previous one yet the prices have been raised on practically all

According to the contract, the survey of the surrounding area was to be made and the prices at the base Beauty Shop set at 20 to 25 per cent below the average. A shampoo and set has been raised from \$5 to \$5.25 without any notice. I have checked numerous shops in town and find the cost to be \$6. According to my calculations, with 20 to 25 per cent off, the prices should be either \$4.50 or \$4.80. Some shops in town charge more than \$6.00 which I did not encounter, a \$5 charge for shampoo and set is adequate.

Now this is only one example of prices. I do not feel that I should do the Base Exchange's homework for them so I have not checked out the price of haircuts, perms, etc. Also, have you

looked at the supplies that have been placed in the shop for our use? If not, you are missing a chance of a lifetime. I am sure you don't want these supplies used on your wife's hair and by the same token I don't care to have my hair tinted with some outdated coloring.

Prices charged by Base Exchange (BX) concessions are determined by AAFES through a survey of like civilian businesses in the local community. The average cost of their services is determined and BX prices are established 25 to 30 per cent below the average cost. The survey must be conducted when a new contract is awarded and at anytime the contractor requests such a survey.

On April 11 the Base Beauty Shop contractor requested such a survey and he anticipated there would an increase of approximately 20 per cent on all services. When the survey was completed the outcome was a 5 per cent increase on some items, or 25 cents on some services and none on others. The contractor was not satisfied with this small of an increase and did not put the new prices in effect. He elected to terminate his contract with the BX.

On July 10 a new contract was awarded. The prices which should have gone in effect in June were put into effect. This was the first increase since May, 1976.

The Central Texas Area Exchange Contracting Officer was contacted on Aug. 8 and was requested to review the prices charged at the Beauty Shop. His review indicated that the BX customer is paying 25 percent less than the average cost in the local community. He also stated that Reese prices were well in line with other basesin the area. A copy of the survey is available in the Base Exchange Manager's Office and will be made available for review on request.

The supplies in the Beauty Shop were evaluated and found to be outdated and have been removed. The contractor has been instructed to use only established brands that are well within usage dates.

Don't risk a close encounter with fire!

Darth Vader doesn't confine his villainous activity to other galaxies. He spreads his treachery right here on earth, in the form of flame, smoke, heat and toxic gases. These potential hazards flourish everywhere in the 20th century American environment, needing only one mindless act, one stray spark to erupt and cause death and destruction.

Fire Prevention Week Oct. 8-14 is the time to focus on fire safety problems — and possible problems - before they're serious enough to blast their victims out of this world and into the

Cloning hasn't reached this planet yet, so take care of your loved ones.

Keep the place where you live free of clutter and unused things that could add fuel to flames and feed a small fire until it grows out of control. Properly use and maintain electrical equipment. If you must store gasoline and other flammable liquids on your property, use only approved safety containers and don't keep them in the house itself.

Monitor everyone who smokes at home. Take seriously the familiar advice "Never smoke in

Recent studies by the National Fire Protection Association, sponsor of Fire Prevention Week, show that more than half of 3,955 fatal dwelling fires analyzed had smoking-related causes. Such fires were started by cigarettes, cigars and pipes, and by open flames including the matches and lighters used by smokers. Many of these fires were caused by children playing with smoking materials.

First item to catch fire was furniture (29 per cent of the time), followed by bedding (18 per cent) and by combustible liquid or gas (14 per

The living room was the place where 39 per cent of these tragic fires started; 28 per cent broke out in the bedroom; and 14 per cent in the kitchen.

Remember that a close encounter with fire can be breathtaking. Don't risk it. Observe Fire Prevention Week now, and Learn Not to Burn every day of the year.

# Unattended children upsetting Hospital


Recently, the Reese Hospital has had a problem with unsupervised children in the Hospital areas.

## Reese supports 'Gallant Eagle'

GALLANT EAGLE 79, a large scale joint readiness exercise conducted by the United State Readiness Command, MacDill AFB, Fla., is scheduled for Oct. 17 to Nov. 16, with approximately 25,000 military personnel taking part.

The department was notified by Subaru of America Inc., that the fuel tanks on these vehicles may develop hairline cracks. The problem may be caused by a blockage in the fuel evaporative control system which leads to abnormally high pressure in the fuel tank and subsequent stress failure.

Owners of these vehicles should examine their fuel tanks for bulges or signs of fuel leakage and to contact their dealer immediately if such problems are observed.

## **AF** outlines policy on abortions

The Department of Defense announced Saturday that in order to conform with the provisions of a joint resolution on abortions which has been approved by the House of Representatives and is at present pending before the Senate certain policies are now

Until further notice, Department of Defense appropriated funds will not be used to pay for performing of abortions except: (A) Where the life of the Mother would be endangered if the fetus were carried to term, or (B) where such medical procedures are necessary for the victims of rape or incest, when such rape or incest has been reported promptly to a law enforcement agency or public health service, or (C) where, in the opinion of two physicians, severe and long lasting physical health damage to the Mother would result if the pregnancy were carried to term, or (D) where medical procedures are necessary to terminate an ectopic pregnancy.

Consequently, claims under the Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed Services (CHAM-PUS) for abortions performed after midnight, Sept. 30, 1978, will not be paid (unless the Congress by subsequent action permits payment) unless they come within the criteria for payment contained in the preceding paragraph. Claims for abortions performed prior to midnight Sept. 30, 1978, will not be barred and will be payable without regard to such restrictions.

This action does not affect payments for procedures to prevent pregnancy.
