## Indians resume District play in Stamford

## Three jailed on drug charges

Thursday night, Oct. 13 local officers executed a search warrant on a residence at 1404 N. Ave. F in Haskell. The warrant was for selling illegal drugs. The house had been under investigation for a few months and on Thursday things came together with enough evidence to execute the search warrant.

Three defendants were taken into custody, one male and two females. All three were charged with the Possession of a Controlled Substance With Intent to Manufacture, namely crack cocaine, a first degree felony. One female had an outstanding warrant from Knox County and was also arrested on that charge. All

were transported to Haskell County Jail.

Crack cocaine and small amounts of marijuana were found in the residence along with money and other items used in the packaging and selling of illegal drugs.

Officers involved in the search were Chief Deputy Winston Stephens, Rule Police

Chief Alan Beard, Haskell Police Sgt. Jeff Caparoon, Haskell Police Officer Dan Kazuba, Texas Parks and Wildlife officer Ryan Peacock and Haskell Co. Sheriff David Halliburton.

"Again, I want to thank the citizens of Haskell County for the support and information about all types of criminal activity in Haskell County. If any citizen has any type of information about any illegal crime in Haskell County, please call Crime Stoppers Tip Line or contact any law enforcement office. All information that is received is confidential. It doesn't matter if it pertains to illegal drugs or burglaries and thefts in the county. We need to work together to make Haskell County a safe place to raise our families.

We know that there are others in the county that are dealing in drugs and stolen items, we need your help in getting these suspects off the streets of Haskell County," said Sheriff Halliburton.

## Names sought for Wall of Honor

It has been almost two years, since the Progressive Study Club undertook the very ambitious project of building a memorial to all Haskell County veterans.

With over half the money raised, they have completed the first stage of the project. That is, the bevels listing the killed in action and missing in action, have been bought and inscribed. The original plan was to purchase four bevels, however six were necessary to accommodate the list of names.

The next phase of the project includes placing ten black granite tablets, five north and five east of the original monument.

Dorothy Hartsfield, chairman for the project, is asking for your help. She is currently compiling a list of Haskell County veterans to be included on the Wall of Honor. She emphasizes that the name of any veteran that has made his or her home in Haskell County, has worked, raised a family, worshiped here or is buried in any county cemetery is sought for inclusion on the wall.

Veterans or families of those deceased, are asked to submit

veterans' names to Dorothy Hartsfield at 405 N. Ave. H, Haskell, TX 79521. They may also be emailed to dotharts@gmail.com. It is important that names are spelled exactly as they are to be listed, so for that reason she requests that the names not be called in by telephone. She asked that you also include the war in which the veteran served.

Hartsfield wants to make clear that names of veterans who served in peace time are also being sought for the memorial. She says, "They served our country and need to also be recognized."

They have close to three thousand names at present. Records of veterans who were discharged in Haskell County have already been listed, however many who have a connection to this county were not discharged here. Those are the names that need to be turned in by families, as well as the names of anyone currently serving. Names will be double checked, so as not to duplicate. There is no charge for submitted names.

While names for the Wall of Honor are being collected, the fund-raising continues. Hartsfield says, "A perfect way to pay tribute would

be to donate in honor of a veteran on special occasions or in memory of a deceased veteran." Checks may be sent to Hartsfield at the address above, and should be made payable to the Progressive Study Club. The club is a tax deductible organization.

With Veterans' Day drawing near, it would be a fitting time to send your contribution and help make this project a reality. It is one way that generations to come will know of Haskell County's contribution to the preservation of freedom that we all enjoy.
