# Snow Glaze Promotes Car Wrecks 

| Hazards created by a coat of hard packed snow on the highways resulted in damaged to several vehicles during Saturday when snow fell over most of the Panhandle section. <br> Three cars were involved in a traffic accident on U. S. Highway 54 at the eastern edge of the city limits. The three way collision which occurred about 8:15 a. m. Saturday was the result of poor visibility and one driver misjudging the speed of the cars ahead of him. <br> Hughie Eugene Strup of Kansas City, Missouri was driving west when he came upon the stalled car of Mr. and Mrs. Milo R. Edwards of Yuba City, California. <br> Strup had towed the Edwards car almost to the city limits of Stratford when he was overtaken by a car driven by Paul Leon Eaken of Port Hueneme, California. Poor visibility kept Eaken from judging the speed of the cars ahead of him. Too late, he attempted to check his speed by using his brakes on the snow covered pavement. Eaken attempted to turn to both the right and the left of the cars ahead of him but his car kept skidding straight ahead and eventually collided with the rear of the Edwards car which was being towed. The towed car in turn, rammed into the Strup car, which had been towing it. Mrs. Eaken was laying down in the front seat and was bruised about one eye when she was thrown against the dash in the collision. Mr. Eaken and their three children were not injured. <br> Although damaged, the Strup car was able to continue in use. The small foreign-made car belonging to Mr. and Mrs. Milo R. Edwards which was caught between the two heavier cars in the collision, was sold as a total loss. <br> The Eaken car is being repaired in the C \& E Paint and Body Shop. <br> Highway Patrolman* Delmer Tuggle investigated the accidents. <br> On his way to investigate the three-car collision at Stratford, Tuggle came upon a rather peculiar accident 1.3 miles east of Conlen. He stopped briefly, and then returned to the scene after completing his investigation of the accident at Stratford. <br> The only vehicle wrecked in the Conlen area was a Little Audrey tractor-trailer, loaded with California vegetables and enroute to the company headquarters at Freemont, Nebraska. It was driven by Edward Carlton Trimble of Chicago. <br> Trimble, going east, was following a car that suddenly began whipping back and forth on the snow-glazed highway and started to slow down.
