Students Visit Cactus-Plant

Chemistry and physics stu-
dents of Stratford recently toured the Phillips 66
Chemical Company's Cactus Anhydrous ammonia, nitric acid, and ammonium nitrate are the principal products of the
plant. The ammonia and ammonium nitrate are used mainly for fertilizers while the nitric ammonium nitrate
The 460 people now employed the safest of working conditions Safety equipment, goals, and awards are used to encourage

Ammonia is produced at the plan by a modification of the Haber process in which hydro-
gen and nitrogen are combined directly. This ammonia is shipped from Cactus in railroad
tank cars or tank trucks: Nitric acid is produced by the Ostwald process. Ammonium nitrate is hydrous ammonia and nitric acid. This solution is sprayed through a prilling tower where prills that are used as fertilizer It is then packaged in paper wags. Before touring the plant, the students were shown slides and saw.
