



The proposed PLEXAR II restructure will, among other things: (1) change the tariffed offering to serve the market segment of 10-74 stations; (2) create two station pricing structures, one for customers with 10-29 stations, and one for customers with 30-74 stations; (3) reduce the sensitivity for the loop portion of the rate to two price bands: 0-2 miles, and beyond 2 miles; (4) offer a PLEXAR II basic station that can be flexibly configured, from a number of standard features, to meet the individual customer requirements; (5) change the way the termination liability is calculated so the customer is responsible for 65% rather than 56% of the present worth of the remaining monthly payments in the contract; (6) create an option that allows month-to-month customers to convert to long term contracts of at least three years and receive a credit or "contract signing bonus"; and (7) establish a System Subsequent Change Charge which applies per serving central office when changes are made that affect the entire system.

Effective December 1, 1994, the Stratford Police Department will begin enforcing the Seat Belt Law in the city limits of Stratford. This does not mean that people will be stopped only for not wearing their seat belts, but does not mean that they will not receive a citation or a warning for violating this law. The law reads:

Article 6701d-Section 107C Texas Traffic Law-Uniform Code WEARING SAFETY BELTS REQUIRED-(a) In This section, passenger car includes a truck with a manufacturer's rated carrying capacity of not more than 1,500 pounds. (b) A person commits an offense if the person:

while the car is being operated on a road, street, or highway of this state; (3) is occupying a seat that is equipped with a

(2) is riding in the front seat of a passenger car

safety belt; and (4) is not secured by a safety belt.

(c) A person commits an offense if the person;

(1) is at least 15 years old:

(1) operates on a road, or highway of this state a passenger car that is equipped with safety belts;

(2) allows a child who is at least four years old but less than 15 years old to ride in the front seat of the car without requiring the child to be secured by a safety belt.

(d) A passenger car or a seat in a passenger care is deemed to be equipped with a safety belt if the passenger care is required under Section 139E of this Act to be equipped with safety belts (Safety belts were part of the manufactures original equipment)

(e) An offense under this section is punishable by a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$50, not to include court costs.

This is a request to ask citizens to comply with the law. We may not agree with this, but it is the law. The Stratford Police Department is giving this notice to allow citizens to get used to wearing their seat belts before December 1,
