Base sets change of command

Ingram replaces Bishop as 64 FTW commander

Col. Richard A. Ingram will become the 64th Flying Training Wing's 22nd wing commander during change of command ceremonies here Saturday morning.

Colonel Ingram will replace Col. Charles E. Bishop, who has been nominated for promotion to brigadier general and assigned to Holloman AFB, N.M. as the commander of tactical Training Holloman.

Presiding over the 10 a.m. change of command ceremony will be Gen. John W. Roberts, Air Training Command commander.

Four squadrons representing operations, Air Base Group,

Maintenance and Resource Management will form up in front of building 800 for the ceremony. If the weather is bad, the event will be held in hanger 82.

A special salute to Colonel Bishop is planned for tonight at the Officers' Club. The "by reservation only" affair begins at 6 p.m. with the social hour. Dinner is set for 7 p.m. with live music from "Thunder" highlighting the after dinner dance. Dress for the dinner-dance is coat and tie.

Immediately following Saturday's change of command (at approximately 10:30 a.m.) a reception for the new wing

commander will be held at the Officers' Club. Colonel Ingram and his wife Phyllis will be in the receiving line.

Prior to his assignment at Reese, Colonel Ingram served as Director of Information for Air Training Command. He has held that position since September 1977.

Colonel Ingram is very familiar with the West Texas area. He was born 140 miles north of Lubbock in McLean, Texas. He attended high school in Phillips, a few miles northeast of Amarillo, Texas.

It is his second assignment here. Colonel Ingram was

Donley sweeps top UPT awards

Training Command Commander's Trophy, recognizing him as the top all-around graduate, the Flying Training Award and the Academic Training Award.

In addition, he was named one of four Outstanding Graduates and was presented the Leadership Award for Section-1.

The 1972 Air Force Academy

grad was the Section Leader for A-Flight through Class 78-03's training and was the first member of his section to solo in the T-38. The son of retired MSgt. James W. Donley, Captain Donley has received an F-4 Phantom assignment at Luke AFB, Ariz.

Rounding out the list of Outstanding Graduates were Capt. Luther W. Hough III,

Capt. Malcolm R. Dixon III and 2nd Lt. Greg Milan. Captain Hough also received the Leadership Award for Section-2.

Outstanding second Lieutenant Awards went to 2nd Lt. Andrew R. Beasley (Section-1) and 2nd Lt. Carl W. Bradshaw (Section-2). Second Lt. Roger D. Reikofski received the Citizenship Award.

A special citizenship award went to 2nd Lt. Christopher L. Manno for his part in the rescue of two people from a Lubbock apartment fire in December. Lieutenant Manno and three other UPT students pulled two Lubbock residents from their smoldering apartment, and provided first aid until city emergency teams could arrive.

Men's Widows Home and the Air Force Village whose functions are to assist Air Force members and their families.

When I accepted command of the 64th Flying Training Wing, I did so with humility and pride and asked for your support.

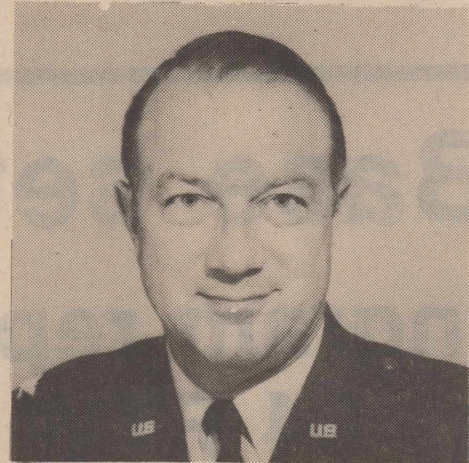

In retrospect, I feel that they took the best possible action in the most expeditious fashion. I wish to thank personally Maj. (Dr.) Morton Rayfield, Capt. Thomas Walker, and all the emergency room personnel whose names I can't remember.

I would also like to thank all of the Reese personnel for their offers of assistance to myself and my family. Many of these offers were extended by people I didn't even know.

Finally, I would like to thank the unidentified lady who stopped at the scene of the accident and assisted my wife by driving her to the hospital.

I am sure that all Reese people join me in wishing your wife a speedy successful recovery.

Poor treatment

The situation is that my wife was sick last Thursday (Jan. 24) and we took her to the hospital to see a physician's assistant. He ran some tests on her and he told her that if she got any sicker to come in immediately for treatment.

Friday evening late or Saturday morning she became sicker, my son was also brought in Saturday morning along with my wife with a severe cold and bronchitis. Both were refused treatment.

I was wondering why since we are guaranteed medical coverage we don't receive any treatment whatsoever. The treatment that we do receive is inferior to anything we could receive downtown.

Also at this time we are in the process of being sued for a bill for \$102 that CHAMPUS was supposed to have paid over 2 years ago and never has.

Your base hospital continually strives to

deliver quality health care to all active duty, retired, and dependents, so I was genuinely concerned when I heard your problem.

The Hospital Commander, together with a board of physicians, carefully examined the records and concerns expressed in your inquiry. According to the records, and from interviewing the individuals on duty at the time, both your wife and son were seen by a physician and treated or referred as appropriate.

I regret if you feel that what was done was not adequate but neither your wife or son was refused medical treatment.

The Emergency Room is not staffed after duty hours to provide for routine medical care. It is, however, the Hospital Commander's policy that any patient who presents himself at the ER will be seen and, immediate treatment rendered, or, if the problem is not an emergency, the patient may be asked to make a regular appointment in the clinic the following duty day.

The hospital staff is quite concerned about insuring your satisfaction. If, in the future you encounter a problem or feel that you have not received adequate care, try to resolve it on the spot. Talk to the health care provider; explain your concerns. If you prefer, there is a Patient Affairs Representative, the Hospital Administrator, The Chief of Hospital Services or the Hospital Commander.

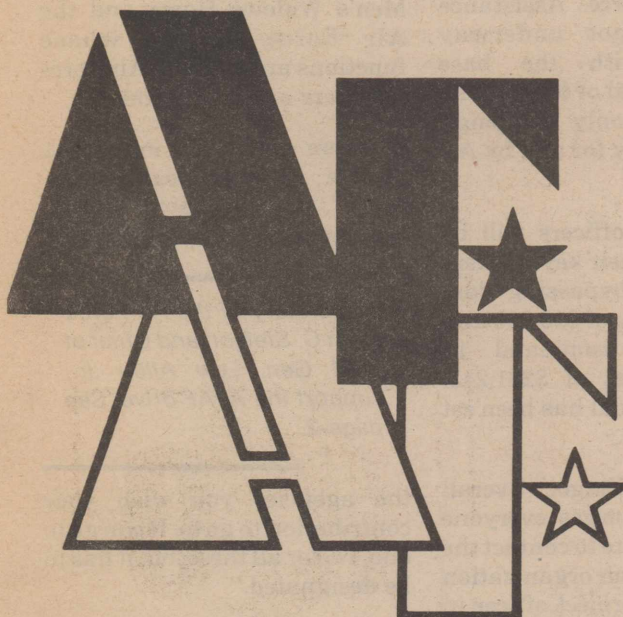
emergencies and provides higher education loans for eligible children.

simply do not justify the problems involved in a complicated court action. However, Texas has recognized this problem and provided a solution.

small disputes. The procedures are simple and informal. NO ATTORNEY IS REQUIRED. The filing fee is \$7.50. The fee and any other court costs are usually assessed against the losing party. The court may award up to \$150.00.

Have you ever had a dry cleaner or tailor spoil your new uniform and refuse to pay for it? Have you ever had someone back into your car and deny liability for the damage? These are examples of disputes that can be settled, without lawyers, in a Small Claims Court.

The Small Claims Court is a simple and effective solution to many of your day-to-day disputes. The State Junior Bar publishes an excellent pamphlet which details the process one must follow in pursuing a Case in Small Claims Court. This pamphlet and other information is available at your base legal office.

In Texas, a Small Claims Court has been established to provide a forum for settling

Leadership is answer

 "Lead, follow, or get the hell out of the way," applies more today than ever before in the Air Force.

become "Retired on Active Duty". The problem then becomes magnified, because in many cases, these individuals are "carried along" until their retirement, by well meaning friends and superiors. This, in turn, detracts more from mission accomplishment in time, space, and contributions.

One of the greatest needs in the military today is the need for leadership. Today's Air Force is more complex, and has a larger commitment to world peace than any other organization in history. Such an organization must be kept at maximum operating efficiency. This can only be done through strong and effective leadership.

Some people say that the degree of involvement distinguishes the leader from the follower. I believe that the word "involvement" must be changed to "commitment". It is imperative that leaders and future leaders in the United States Air Force be efficiently and effectively committed. This cannot be achieved by merely being involved.

A problem arises when some people begin to think of the air Force as an occupation or a job, rather than a profession. They are the ones that are merely "involved" with the Air Force. They occupy time, space and contribute very little in the way of mission accomplishment. The "job" becomes nothing more than an eight-hour affair where some people produce whatever is necessary to get by, nothing more.


A teacher who was unable to explain the difference between involvement and commitment to his students, used the following analogy. He displayed a plate of ham and eggs to this class. Pointing to the plate, the teacher stated, "From the eggs on the plate you might well assume that the chicken was involved, but by looking at the ham, you can well see that the pig was committed."

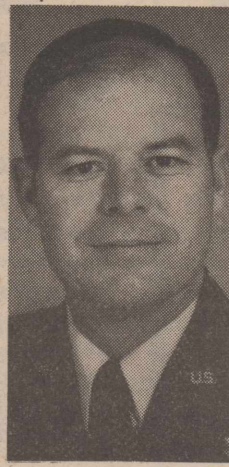
transfer from duties as the T-37 Operations Officer (35th FTS) to the 64th Student Squadron.

Colonel Bishop will take command at Holloman on March 1.

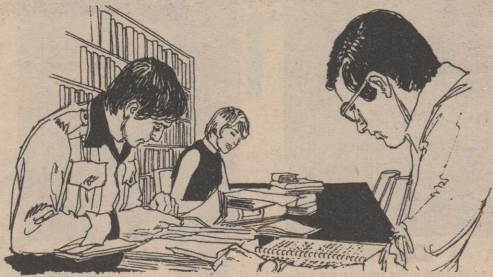

The 54th cruised into the championships with wins over Sturon-one, 31-24, and Resource Management, 44-30.

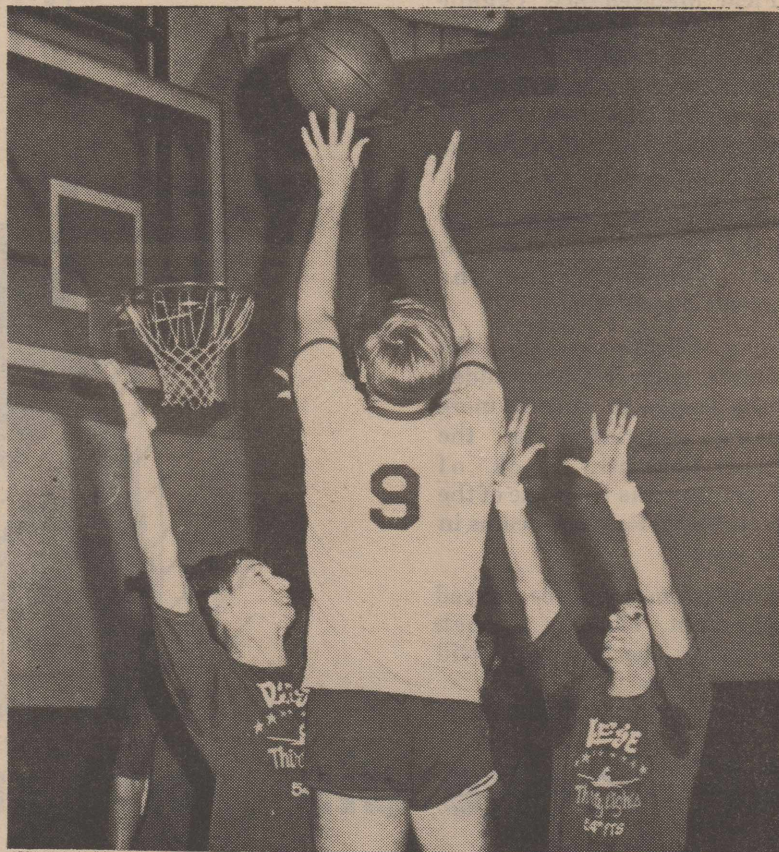

Rounding out the league slate are the 35th FTS, the 54th FTS, Civil Engineers and the women's varsity team.

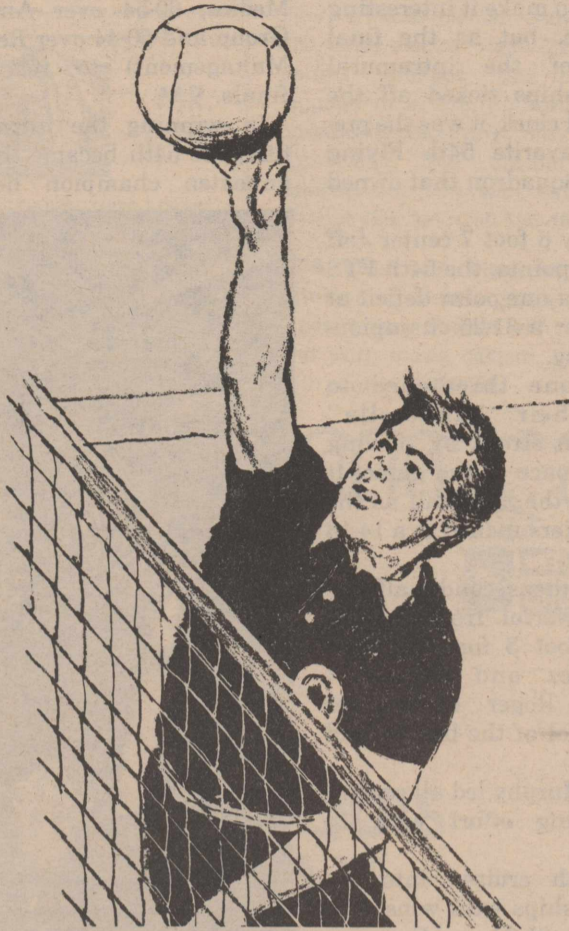
Gym officials say that the women's team has been added to the league to provide more playing experience for the senior squad. Lack of competition has been one of the top problems for Reese teams in past years.
