# Class 80-01 graduates

# 51 fledgling aviators earn AF pilot wings

Fifty-one fledgling aviators will receive their Air Force pilot wings today during ceremonies for Undergraduate Pilot Training Class 80-01, the largest graduating class here in more than five years.

Class 80-01, graduating 17 more pilots than Reese's previous class, is the first of the new wave of 50-plus member classes here.

Graduation ceremonies are scheduled for 10 a.m. today in the base theater. A special dinner-dance is slated for 6:30 p.m. at the Officers Club.

Guest speaker for today's graduation will be Brig. Gen. Mele Vojvodich, deputy chief of staff, Technical Training, Headquarters, Randolph AFB,

A command pilot with more than 6,000 flying hours to his credit, General Vojvodich logged 125 combat missions in the F-80 and F-86 in Korea and added 135 combat missions in the F-4 Phantom in Southeast Asia.

Class commanders for Class 80-01 are 1st Lt. Howard Johnson, T-37 phase, and Capt. Wayne Lutz, T-38 phase. Section leaders for the class are Capt. John M. Byrne, Section-one, and 1st Lt. Robert J. Pierce, Section-two.

Lieutenant Pierce is one of four graduates who will have their wings presented by their fathers. His father is Lt. Col. (ret) Robert J. Pierce. Others are 2nd Lt. Jonathan M. Brick, son of Navy Capt. (ret.) John H. Brick; 2nd Lt. Mark L. Gibson, son of Harold C. Gibson; and 2nd Lt. William L. Nichols, son of Lt. Col. William Nichols.

In addition, Maj. Arne Hove, Norwegian chief of Flying Training, will present the wings to the four Norwegian graduates in the class.

Class 80-01 began training Nov. 28, 1978, entered T-37 training in January and started T-38 training in May. Forty members of the class are Air Force Academy graduates, four earned their commissions through the Reserve Officer Training Corps, two are members of the Air National Guard, another is an Officer Training School graduate and four are students from Norway

# Civil Engineering teams test 'wartime' readiness

Ninety-one members of the Prime Beef contingency team returned from a five day exercise at Eglin AFB, Fla. last week.

The primary purpose of the trip, according to 1st Lt. James Meyer, chief of mobility, was to practice Rapid Runway Repair. This is a process whereby shell holes in landing strips are filled and patched with AM-2 matting, the entire process taking less than four hours.

Also included was participation in Harvest Eagle, a program for Civil Engineers to learn the necessary skills to erect living quarters and facilities for a remote airfield. Runways, tent city, water purification, refrigeration and aircraft revetments were all assembled by the Prime Beef team.

A final facet of training during the exercise was chemical and biological warfare.

# Reese still shy of CFC target

Despite having a Combined Federal Campaign goal set below last year's contribution mark, Reese heads into the final day of the drive still more than \$8,000 shy of its 1979 target.


Although the captain did not rule out the possibility of extending the drive's deadline to help meet the goal, he doubted that the campaign would run beyond today.







No matter what the outcome of Wednesday night's game, the 54th will represent Reese at the Air Training Command district playoffs at Laughlin AFB, Texas this weekend.


Supply picked up a trio of wins last week without snapping a down. Sturon-2, Sturon-1 and the 35th each forfeited to Supply.
