

Anyone can purchase a prepaid tuition contract as long the beneficiary's parents is a Texas resident when the contract is That means initiated. grandparents, relatives or friends living out of state, as well as businesses or non-profit groups, may purchase tuition contracts on behalf of Texas youth.

Other conditions of the program state that:

*beneficiaries must be under 18 and not have graduated from high school when the contract is purchased;

*purchasers do not have to designate a college when initiating a contract;

*refunds will be available under certain terms and conditions;

school graduations; and

*contracts can be terminated when fraud is involved or payments are late.

The prepaid tuition contracts guarantee college do not admission. Students still have to meet all entrance requirements of the institution they wish to attend.

Unlike annuities, the prepaid contract guarantees the cost of future college tuition and certain mandated fees at current levels. However, the contract will not pay for a student's room and board, transportation, books or lab fees.

Contract options: Prepaid tuition contracts are available plan or private college plan (good coat chicken well. for 120 credit hours), junior college or university.






