

TxDOT Modifying **Procedures**

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is the modifying procedures motorists use to voluntarily notify the department of a vehicle sale or transfer. These changes are the result of Senate Bill 1445, passed by the 74th Legislature in 1995.

Beginning April 1, 1996, the vehicle owner can give notice of delivered to the purchaser(s) the sale or transfer by using the Texas Motor Vehicle Transfer Notification (Form VTR-346), which is available at all County Tax Assessor-Collector Offices statewide and at TxDOT's 17 Vehicle Titles and Registration Division Regional offices. Notification of the sale or transfer is strictly voluntary.

The owner can also send a written statement to the department with the following:

*Vehicle identification number (VIN) and license plate number of the vehicle.

*Full name and address of the transferor/seller(s)

*Full name and address of the transferee/purchasers (s) *Date the vehicle

*Signature of the seller (s)

*Date the seller(s) signed the notification

The notification should be mailed to: Vehicle Titles and Registration Division, Texas Department of Transportation, P.O. Box 13175, Austin, Texas 78711-3175. This request must include a \$5 money order or check





Marker In Place

Sunday, June 16, 1996 marked the three year anniversary of Trooper Steve Booths death. This marker has been placed on the spot that this terrible deed happen. Richard Metcalf, 42 of Lago Vista, Texas, has been erecting memorials on lonely stretches of highway where state troopers have fallen in the line of

The tribute on Booths marker reads: We the people of the state of Texas acknowledge and thank Trooper Bobby Steve Booth for

the great sacrifice he made to keep the public safe. His efforts will stand the test of time. May God bless his soul. June 16, 1993.

Metcalf's unusual quest was

born of a kindness shown to him by a trooper. A kindness that he never was able to personally repay. In 1991, he was returning

home from work and was speeding. He was stopped by a young state trooper near Bastrop.

"I knew I was guilty and wasn't going to be able to talk my way out of a ticket but this guy was just real kind to me and sent me on my way," he said. "He was just the kind of guy anyone would want as a friend.

Metcalf was devastated to learn the trooper was killed trying to foil a kidnapping at a roadside park south of Austin just a few weeks after their encounter.

Although divorced in 1993 after 23 years of marriage and living on a monthly disability stipend with chronic heart, lung and kidney problems, Metcalf's yearning to honor the trooper never wavered.

Late last year he says the Lord showed him a way to pay tribute to that trooper by putting him in touch with a monument dealer who agreed to supply him inscribed granite markers at cost.

Metcalf immediately bought a marker for the young trooper and placed it at the roadside park outside of Austin where he was killed.

"I couldn't really afford the maker but the blessing I got erecting it gave me more joy and satisfaction than anything I've ever done in my life," he said.

However, rather than peace, Metcalf found himself pulled to
