

Calling on our senators to back childhood cancer research funding

Now that a U.S. Senate committee approved a bipartisan bill to advance pediatric cancer research, I urge the entire Senate to say "yes" to saving lives.

After accidents, cancer is the second leading cause of death in children ages 1 to 14 in the United States. Here at home, the Texas Department of Health and Human Services says cancer is the most-common cause of disease-related death in kids and that every year 1,200 of our neighbors are devastated to learn their child has cancer.

There are many types of childhood cancer that are without a known treatment or cure. The Childhood Cancer Survivorship, Treatment, Access and Research (STAR) Act would not only help find new treatments, but improve the quality of life for kids in treatment and for the rest of their lives. We need Congress to act now -- for our children.

I'm a grandmother to 6 wonderful kiddos. It terrifies me to know that childhood cancer rates have risen in the last few decades, but the committee's passage of the STAR Act is a step in the right direction. I hope Texans can count on Senators John Cornyn and Ted Cruz to support the STAR Act when it comes up for a vote.




