Amarillo College in conjunction with Frank Phillips College The Active Threat Combined Response Training Is designed to bring regional Fire, Law Enforcement and EMS together to build response capabilities. The course covers point-of-injury medical interventions and establishing/deploying rescue task forces during a hostile critical incident while law enforcement actively neutralizes the threat. The course will include scenarios where the students have to neutralize threats, conduct hasty triage, treat injuries, establish casualty collection and extraction points, and learn to integrate with Law Enforcement/EMS/Fire personnel.

It is disturbing that we find ourselves in a time where this type of training is necessary. That being said, your First Responders are dedicated to being as well trained as possible to save lives should an incident occur. I greatly appreciate Amarillo College and Frank Phillips College for allowing us to host this training in Stratford. It allows the agencies who would likely respond to an incident in Stratford to learn to work together in a hands on environment.

I must ask the citizens of Stratford please do not approach the elementary school during these training days if you are not involved. This type of training is complicated and requires strict security around the area. I wish to thank the Board of Trustees, Supt Dominguez, and his staff for offering the facilities for this event.




#### Cynthia Ann Biddy April 17, 1940-March 18, 2018
