

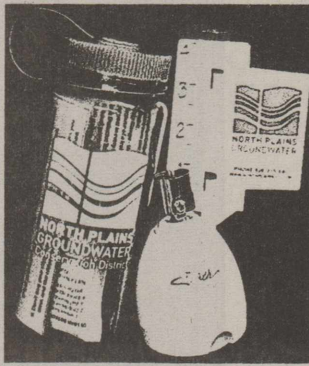

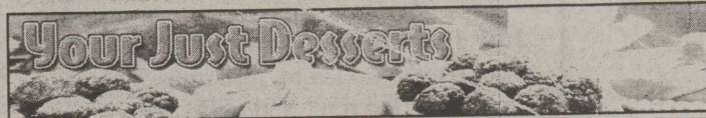

Painting Roosters at Legacy

Legacy Assisted Living hosted the second of four One-Stoke Painting Classes led by Bobbie Strong. This week's lesson, was to paint a jaunty rooster. Five participants (Helen Summerour, Wade Estes, Simona Cancino, Stella Walker, and Kristi Walden) gathered for the class on Thursday, July 12th.

For this week's lesson, the class learned to use templates. Beginning on a blank canvas, the group traced a rooster template. Using practice paper, a new technique of holding the brush to make the feathers was learned. It is important to have a loose hand and arm, and to not stress on the exact placement, but to be free in motion. Bobbie reminded the group of two important tips: holding the brush in the correct position and using adequate paint. Feathers were learned and now it is time to tackle the canvas.

Mixing an orange/red paint on the pallet was the first step. Now it is time to paint the background around the drawing lines on the canvas. Right away, one can tell this painting will be colorful. Gathering courage, the group began to paint the bird body and neck area. Colors of yellow, red, orange, tan, brown and green were placed in different sections of the body. Blending the paint colors was very important to make the body parts flow together. Things are looking good! Now comes the tail. Using a loose hand and correct brush position, the tail feathers magically appear. Bright blue, green, with white accents bring the tail feathers to life.

Time to add the head and features. Getting the head and neck connection and dimensions correct was a little daunting. But with careful placement, the rooster now has a head, comb, wattle and crown feathers. Adding the details of a beak and an eye again caused some stress. Placement and dimension were again discussed. Using a small slim brush was the special tip to make the beak look correct. The simplest piece of the bird was the eye, making a dot using the end of the brush handle! This bird is looking like it is ready for entry in a country fair, dressed up and ready to strut off, but it has no legs! No fear, simply paint in the legs and feet. After feathers, legs were easy.

The returning students agreed that this week's painting was easier. Just the experience from the first class brought courage and ability that some of them didn't know they had. These students are really becoming painters/artists! That is the greatest part of One-Stoke Painting method that each week's lessons build upon the earlier classes. One of the ways to judge increased competency, was that there were fewer messes, accidents and many fewer paper towels used this week.

Next week's class will be held on Thursday, July 19th. The class will be painting on trashcans. A minimum of 5 students is needed for the class. New students are still welcome to participate. Pointers For Parents

Prioritize Your Child's Eyesight This School Year

(NAPS)—The back-to-school season is a great time to check in on your child's sight. You may know that nearsightedness, or myopia, is a condition where objects up close appear clearly, while objects far away appear blurry. There is also evidence showing that myopia is on the rise.

Myopia is often diagnosed in children 8-12 years old and may worsen during teen years. Students with myopia may have trouble seeing their teacher and lessons at the front of the classroom. They may also find it difficult to fully participate in sports and other activities that require seeing objects clearly from a distance.



If your child is experiencing the symptoms of myopia, schedule an appointment with an eye care professional.

The National Eye Institute, part of the National Institutes of Health, offers these tips to help.

Know the symptoms. Headaches, eyestrain, squinting, and difficulty seeing distant objects are signs and symptoms of myopia.

Encourage your kids to speak up. Catching myopia early and introducing treatments—typically, eyeglasses or contact lenses—can help make sure your child gets the most out of school. Encourage your kids to speak up if they are having trouble seeing. Ask your children if they can see the board clearly during class.

Get teachers and coaches involved. Ask your child's teachers and coaches about signs of myopia; for example, if they've noticed your child squinting or struggling to see things at a distance.

Spend time outdoors. There is evidence that increasing time outside may reduce risk for myopia, but more research is needed to understand the connection.

If your child is experiencing the symptoms of myopia, schedule an appointment with an eye care professional.

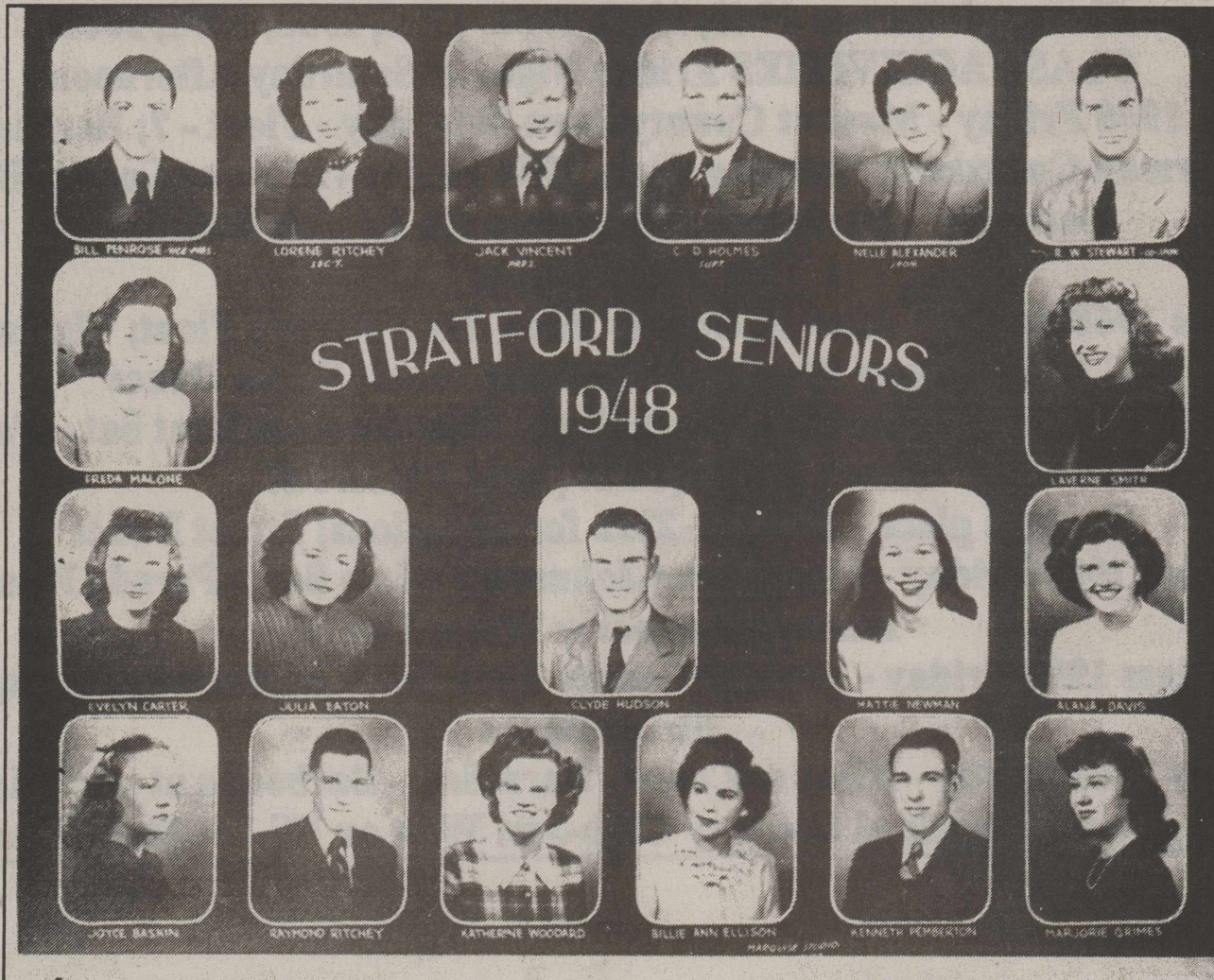
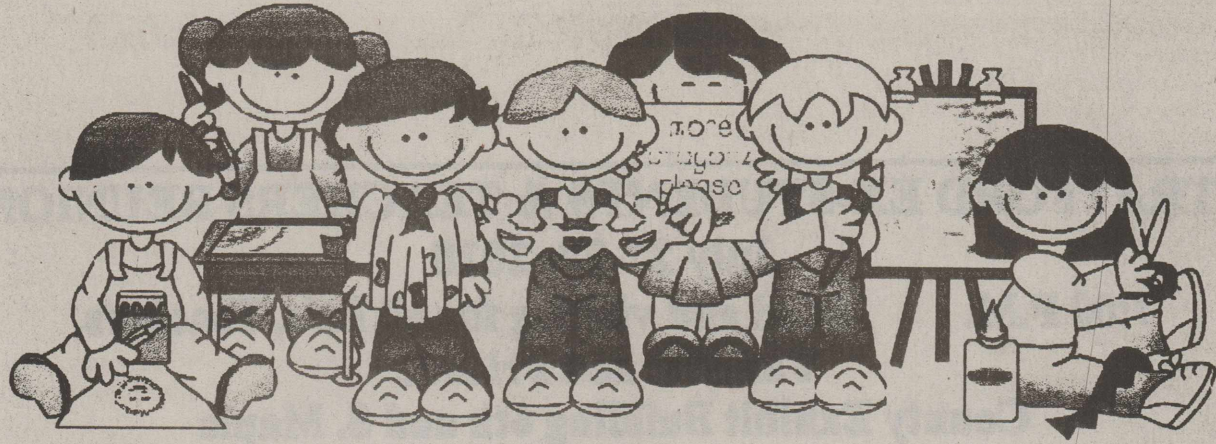

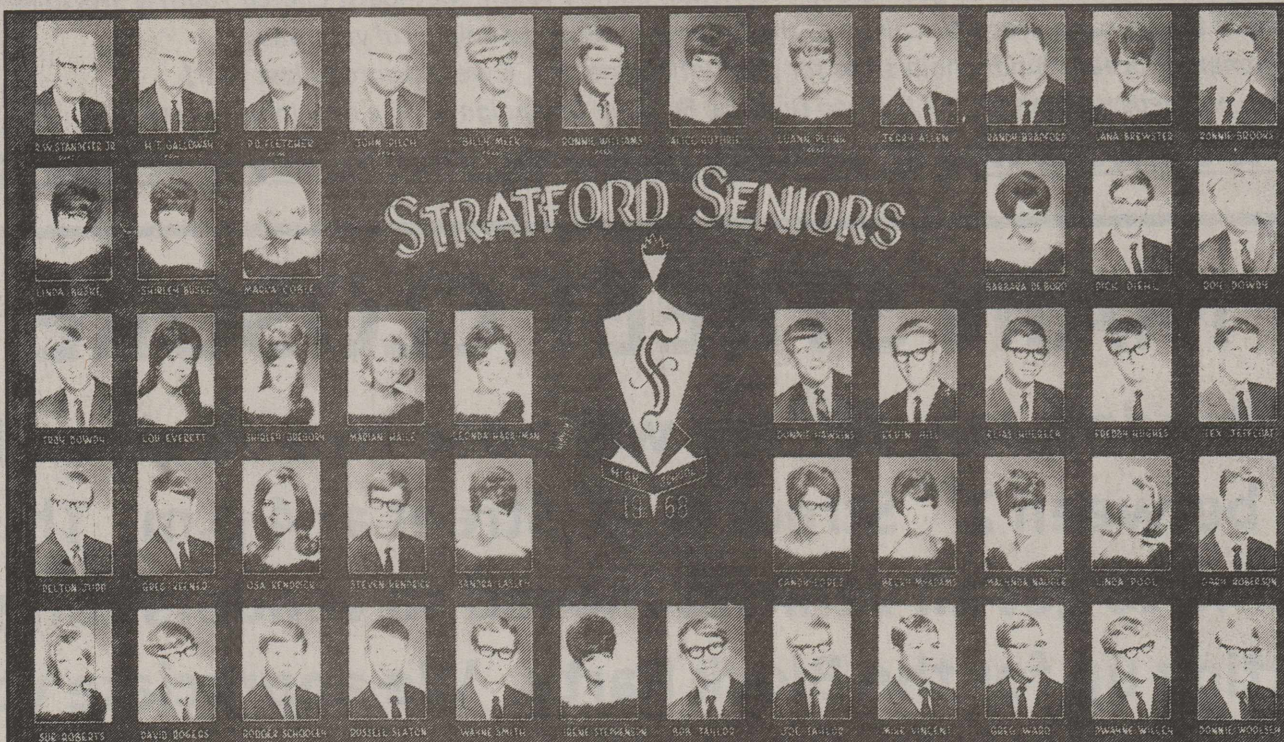
