The 12-year old son of Chad and Jo Hinds, was chosen by Judge Bryson Williams, Olton, TX with his medium wool lamb for the honor. In addition to receiving a banner and buckle, Hinds will receive premium checks from the Tri-State Fair & rodeo. Visitors to the School (All Grade Levels)

General Visitors

Parents and others are welcome to visit district schools. For the safety of those within the school and to avoid disruption of instructional time, all visitors must first report to the main office and must comply with all applicable district policies and procedures. When arriving on campus, all parents and other visitors should be prepared to show identification. Visits to individual classrooms during instructional time are permitted only with approval of the principal and teacher and only so long as their duration or frequency does not interfere with the delivery of instruction or disrupt the normal school environment. Even if the visit is approved prior to the visitor's arrival, the individual must check in at the main office first. All visitors are expected to demonstrate the highest standards of courtesy and conduct; disruptive behavior will not be permitted. Students visiting from other schools will not be permitted to attend classes with students. They can eat and visit during the lunch period, but should not be on the campus any other time during the day. Visitors are required to check in at the attendance office and to conduct themselves according to the rules for students. The principal may request identification from any person on school property and may ask any person not having legitimate business to leave.

Visitors Participating in Special Programs for Students

The district invites representatives from colleges and universities and other higher education institutions, prospective employers, and military recruiters to present information to interested students.

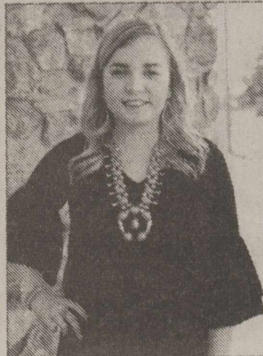

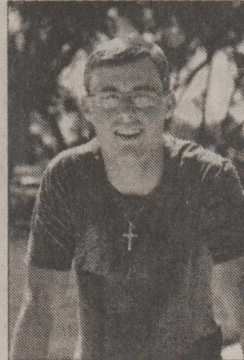

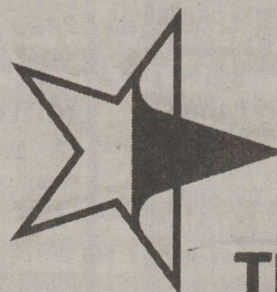
TURNER SMITH



4th Annual Rise & Shine Food Drive Begins
