


Flag Retirement Ceremony recently held



Tom "Daddy-O" Ewers August 2, 1937 - November 18, 2018



The family suggests with gratitude memorials be made to St. Jude's Children Hospital, 262 Danny Thomas P1, Memphis TN 38105.



THANK YOU to everyone who helped make our recent fundraiser a success with your support of the Pumpkin Rolls, Holiday Cakes and Pies and Cheese fundraisers. Proceeds from the fundraiser will go toward renovations of the new building. We are pleased to announce that over \$45,000 has been raised for this project.

Holiday Cakes and Pies was a new product offered for sale this fall. Lollipop Junction and our suppler, Biti Pies are very interested in knowing how our customers felt about the baked goods. Building Update—the tear out phase of the project is 90% complete. The board and staff will be meeting in early January to evaluate current renovation plans. The new building will allow the center to expand serviced to infants and offer a multi-purpose room and a more functional kitchen for food storage and meal preparation. A laundry facility and conference room is also in the plans. The cost of the project will be approximately \$80,000 as all new electrical, plumbing, and heating and air conditioning will be required for a functional facility. childcare center is licensed for 51 children and currently has an enrollment of 49 serving 38 families. This addition will allow the center to serve more children in our community.





#### Tales from No Man's Land Museum

About a hundred years ago, coal and copper were mined in Cimarron County. In the 1930s, however, a mineral was discovered in the eastern Panhandle that was used to produce outstanding pieces of art. No Man's Land Museum in Goodwell has the truly unique works of alabaster carving of the Duckett family. They might have appeared to be ordinary Panhandle farmers, but they were extraordinary artists.

Alabaster is a type of gypsum that has been used for carving for centuries. It is mentioned in the New Testament in the Bible. A perfume jar of alabaster was discovered in the tomb of Tutankhamun who died in 1323 BC in Egypt. Major museums in Europe display ancient works of art, but, fortunately, the Museum in Goodwell has large, lovely displays that are easily accessible to the people of the Panhandle and surrounding states.

In a July, 1950 article in the Panhandle Daily News-Herald, it is reported that in the late 1930s, Eunice Duckett and her brothers, Russell and John, were looking for petrified wood and arrowheads about 25 miles from their home near Tyrone. Russell found an interesting rock with a white surface with red showing through. After taking it home, he later discovered that it could be used for carving. His first carving was a paper weight finished on Christmas Day, 1938. This initial carving led to a hobby for all three members of the farming family. Although no one in the family had any training in sculpting or painting, their natural talent was soon apparent.

The Guymon Daily Herald article in January, 1990, by Melyn Johnson describes the many works of art including bookends, vases, lamps, and ears of corn, longhorn cattle, and many other items relating to Oklahoma. "The Praying Hands", was a piece modeled after a painting by Albrecht Durer, (a German Renaissance artist). Eunice used her brothers' hands as models for this beautiful work of alabaster. John carved many pen and pencil holders using geometric shapes.

A favorite of many visitors to the Museum is the carved replica of the Duckett 1,000 acre farm. Besides the family home, it contains seven outbuildings, two granaries, haystacks, 14 farm animals, equipment, a windmill, fences, and the three family members. The tiny carvings of Eunice, Russell, and John are all complete with minuscule hats. Other small items include the many works of intricately carved pieces of jewelry by Eunice such as earrings, pins, necklaces, and hat pins. The Ducketts never sold anything but retained their growing collection for future generations.

John died in 1954, and Russell died in the late 1960s. Eunice survived her brothers and lived to the age of 88, dying in 1981. She must have realized the importance of their talent and legacy to the Panhandle so she bequeathed their more than 1000 piece collection to the No Man's Land Museum.

The Museum is available to everyone to enjoy the wonderful, unique displays of the Duckett alabaster and the hundreds of other interesting exhibits. The Museum is open Tuesday – Friday, 10~AM-12:00 and 1~4~PM. and Saturday 10~AM-4~PM.
