

Reese slates Soviet briefing

The Air Force Intelligence Service Soviet Awareness Briefing Team from Washington D.C. will present their Soviet Awareness Program at Reese July 21 and 22 at Simler Theater.

An eight-hour program, it will be presented in two segments. The first half will be held the 21st from 7:15-11:15 a.m. and again from 12:30-4:30 p.m. The second half of

the program will be held at corresponding times the following day.

Classified "Secret", the Soviet Awareness Program is structured to provide audiences with the factors which influence Soviet military power, the elements of that power, how it is being used throughout the world and what it relies on-the individuals in uniform.

The multimedia series of presentations is designed to appeal to both Civil Service and military members of all grades and specialties.

Topics will include Soviet ideology and strategy, militarization of the Soviet Society, Soviet military concepts and minister of defense, Soviet forces for theater

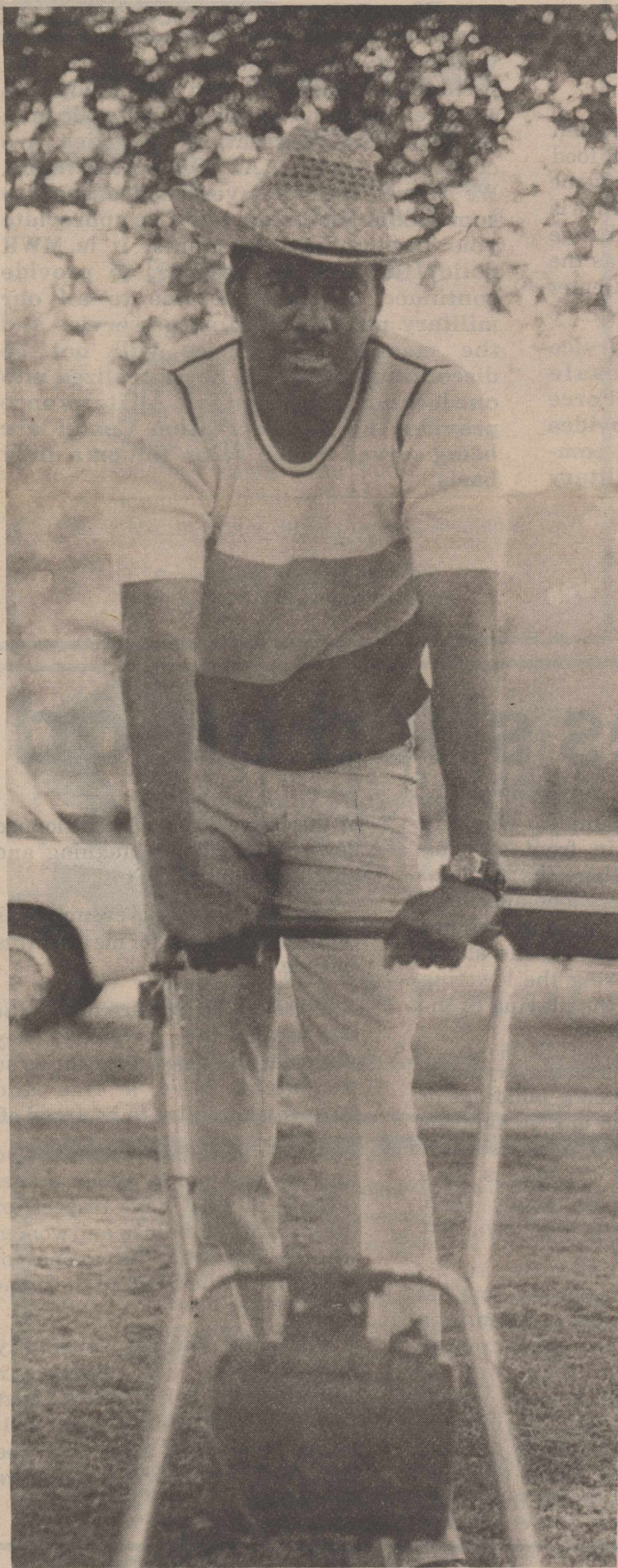
war and Soviet strategic defenses, discussions on Soviet strategic offensive forces. Soviet naval forces, Soviet space programs and a profile of Soviet fighting.

Chayes says pay essential

WRIGHT-PATTERSON AFB, Ohio (AFNS) — "The people of this country are insisting on military capability, ready now to perform difficult tasks in an uncertain world. They are not yet satisfied that the capability is there," said Under Secretary of the Air Force Antonia Handler Chayes.

Speaking to the summer graduating class of the Air Force Institute of Technology, she said the country justifiably is asking for a strong, flexible and highly capable military.

"Congress is prepared to devote more real resources to defense than have been available since the Vietnam War."

At the same time, she said, the American people have been slow to realize "it takes a decent level of pay and benefits to attract and retain people who can learn and who have learned to deal with the complex working of a

Hospital offers school physicals

Scheduling of physicals for school and sports has begun at the Reese hospital.

The bulk of physicals will be conducted through the Pediatric Clinic for dependent children ages 5-17, but a limited number of physicals will also be available for college age dependents.

The physicals will be conducted in two phases. Initial appointments will be for physical screening which will include recording of vital signs, necessary lab work, immunizations, and audiovisual screening. Following the screening exam, the individual will be given a second appointment to see a health care provider to perform the actual physical. This second appointment will be scheduled two-three weeks following the initial screening.

If possible, parents should bring the required school or sports physical forms with them at the time of their child's appointments; however, if not available they can be brought to the hospital later to be completed. Immunization records, however, must be brought at the time of the appointments so they may be checked and updated.

Hospital officials point out that they are starting early this year to avoid the last minute rush. Individuals are strongly encouraged not to wait to schedule their appointments, as physicals will only be scheduled during July and August. Appointment scheduling and further information may be obtained by calling the Central Appointment Desk at 885-3245.

POW/MIA Day

Flag symbolizes shed blood



Editor's note: With POW/MIA Recognition Day only one week away, SSgt. Leroy Weddington of the Postal Service Center recently took time out to reflect on what our men gave up their freedom, and even their lives, for. The flag that represents our nation, according to Sergeant Weddington, has not received the respect it deserves in recent years. His article, sent to us under the title "Impressions," explains more fully.

Red, white and blue. Separated these three colors mean little, but bound together their symbolic meaning should make each of us swell with pride.

Pride. It's a matter of loyalty, paying homage to the United States of America—"land of the free and home of the brave." The pride and loyalty, or lack of it, displayed during the playing of the national anthem at Reese is shameful.

To cite an example: One day during retreat in front of wing headquarters (where the national anthem plays very loud and clear) an Air Force member in uniform began to walk across the street, completely ignoring the lowering of the flag and the playing of the anthem.

People could be seen everywhere scurrying to get inside buildings or refusing to come out. It happens daily. Two or three minutes before the music starts, the base is like a ghost town, you see no one. Then, as the last strains die down, here they come.

The base theater is another hotspot of disrespect. Recently, a couple sitting two rows in front of me found that their way of rendering proper homage was to smooch and giggle during the anthem. Before the song finished the last few bars (to me the most important, "land of the free, home

of the brave") the woman flopped down in her chair laughing and giggling. Funny, isn't it?

Needless to say, the evening was completely marred for me after this episode.

Those red stripes are not in the flag because they are pretty. They stand for the blood shed for us so we might have a free and prosperous country to be proud of.

So, if you're part of the crowd that chooses not to render proper respect, at least have respect for the majority of the men and women who are proud that they are part of the "land of the free and the home of the brave."

A special retreat ceremony and flyover are slated in conjunction with POW/MIA Day. Other events are still being planned and will be reported next week in The Roundup.

Command pioneers use of solar power

(ATCNS)—A pioneer in Air Force solar energy projects, Air Training Command, which has three bases with solar energy facilities, is expanding its use of solar energy as an alternative to fossil fuel sources.

According to ATC Civil Engineering officials, the cost effectiveness of solar energy is routinely considered whenever new facilities are planned.

The most recent is the Consolidated Base Personnel Office building at Mather AFB, Calif. The CBPO staff began moving into the new facility, which uses solar energy for domestic water heating and space heating, on June 27, 1980.

One of the latest projects, presently open for contract bids, is for the dining facility at Laughlin AFB, Texas. There, solar energy will be used for water heating, space heating and cooling. Solar water heating

for a bachelor enlisted quarters at Laughlin is also being studied for FY 81.

Economic studies are being made of energy projects planned for four ATC bases as part of the FY 82 Military Construction Program. If the studies prove that solar energy will be cost effective, Civil Engineers said solar designs will be included in the following projects:

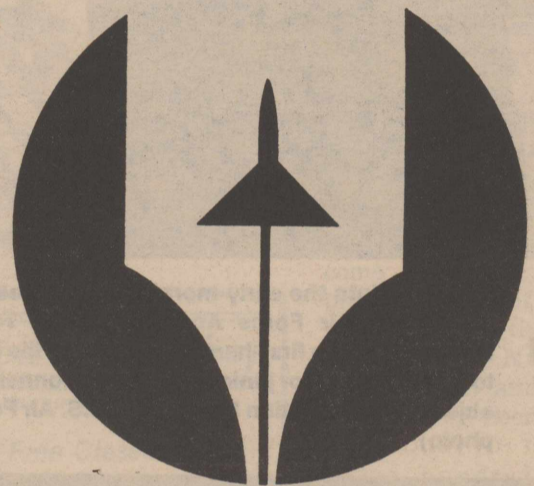
Unaccompanied enlisted personnel housing projects for Chanute AFB, Ill., and Lackland AFB, Texas; an organizational maintenance complex for Mather; and a logistics complex for Williams AFB, Ariz.

Plans are also being made to use solar energy in a recreational facility at Lowry AFB, Colo. It's part of a special federal agency program for solar energy.

The other ATC bases with solar energy facilities in operation are Randolph and Sheppard AFBs, Texas.

At Randolph, solar energy has been providing space heating, air conditioning and water heating for the Base Exchange for two and a half years. An early demonstration project, it was funded by a grant from the Energy Research Development Center, predecessor to the Department of Energy. Costing \$476,000 initially, the solar system today saves an estimated \$26,000 annually.

An even earlier project also funded by grant added solar energy to a four-plex housing unit at Sheppard AFB. Built in 1975, the solar system provides direct space heating and water heating and saves about \$600 in energy annually.

The aim is to communicate, to express, not impress, and this is a proven,

Starting with some basic ideas of effective organization, the course goes on to cover writing in a readable style; use contractions (isn't instead of is not); personal pronouns (we instead of this office); small words (use instead of utilize). Don't use wordy expressions (for the purpose of); doublings (importance and significance); passive verbs (your leave is cancelled). By whom? These are only a few of many practical tips on improving your writing.

Lubbock, Reese hold joint exercise

Passersby at the old Sears building in downtown Lubbock last week may have been a bit startled to hear the sounds of gunfire coming from the vacant building.

Although a cursory glance may have convinced onlookers that an armed confrontation was taking place, it was actually a staged joint exercise of the 64th Security Police Squadron and the Lubbock Police Department Special Weapons and Tactics Team.

According to Reese exercise evaluator TSgt. Dennis Mehrenberg, the purpose of the exercise was "to see how well our guys work with LPD" should the necessity arise.

One of several exercise scenarios enacted during the day was this: Two armed men were barricaded inside the old Sears building after committing a violent crime. To compound the problem, the men were only approachable up a non-

operating escalator. Sergeant Mehrenberg contends that the situation created an extreme problem for the four-man assault team. In this scenario, LPD acted the part of the suspects.

Using mirrors and staying below the level of the stair rail, the assault team shot both suspects, but lost one man in the process.

Another difficult scenario involved an armed man barricaded in one of a possible three rooms. Sergeant Mehrenberg stated that not only are the logistical problems extremely complex, but the psychological strain of not knowing when or where an "armed" man may pop up added to the difficulty of the problem.

Security police successfully completed the assignment, this time with no team casualties.

The exercises followed a joint training session in tactics held at Reese in May.

Weather: more heat

July weather historically means a continuation of thunderstorm activity on the South Plains, but the extreme dry month of June behind us, patterns would be difficult to predict.

An average year would mean six days of precipitation with a total rainfall of about two-and-a-half inches, and five thunderstorm days. This summer has so far proven itself to be anything but average, however.

July's average high temperature is 91 degrees Fahrenheit, with 68 the average low. The temperature extremes recorded for the month were, before this year, 106 and 54. High temperatures for the first three days of July 1980 were 107, 106 and 109. June 28's high of 110 shattered the old all-time Reese high of 108.

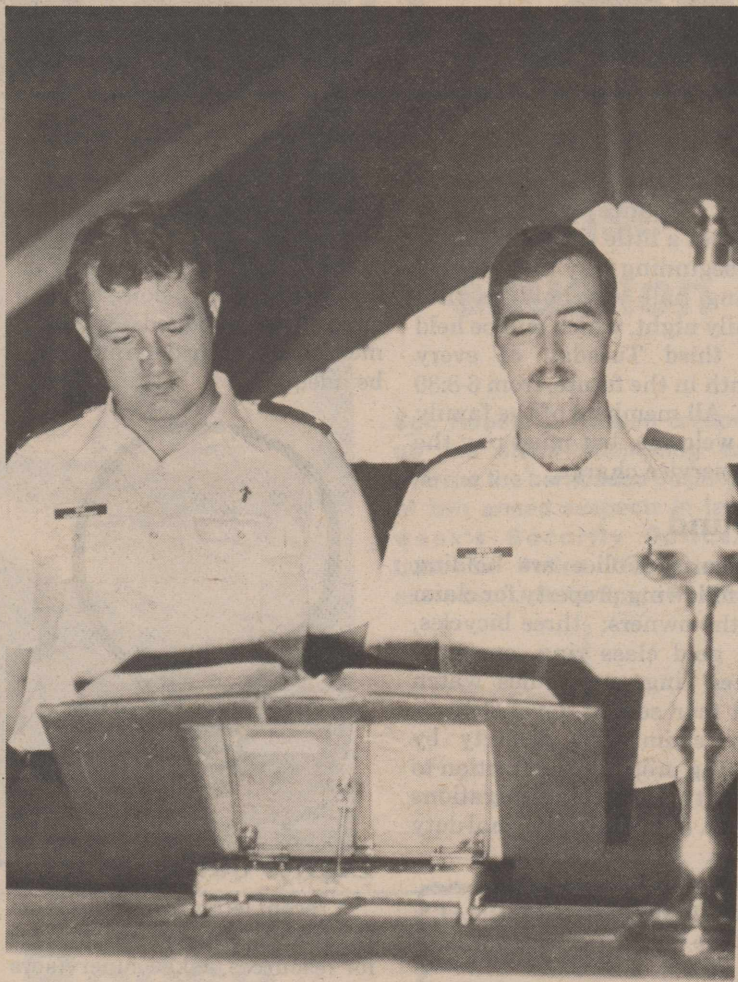
