10M Vaccines Administered In Texas

Governor Greg Abbott announced this week that ten million COVID-19 vaccines have been administered to Texans across the state, with over 30% of eligible Texans having received a vaccine. This significant milestone is a result of dedicated work by the Texas Division of Emergency Management, the Texas Department of State Health Services, the Texas National Guard, and the healthcare workers and volunteers across the state who have helped administer these vaccines.

"Hitting ten million vaccines is a major accomplishment in our state's continued fight against COVID-19," said Governor Abbott. "I want to thank all the healthcare workers and volunteers that made

this milestone possible. However, the fight is not over. Vaccines are the most effective tool to combat COVID-19 in our communities, and we will continue to expand vaccine access for those who choose to get vaccinated. As more vaccines become avail-

able and eligibility opens to all Texans, I urge Texans who wish to get the COVID-19 vaccine to sign up to help us keep our communities safe. Here in Texas, COVID-19 vaccines will always be strongly encouraged and always voluntary."





Tips for "Walk Across Texas" Challenge

Shoes will affect your whole body positively or negatively. Wearing the right shoes will help your body to perform its best and help prevent injuries. Here are some helpful tips to steer you in the right direction.

- 1. Shoes need a stiff back. When you hold the shoe, you should not be able to move the heal side to side.
- 2. Make sure the shoe has torque. Hold the shoe on each end and make sure you can twist it slightly.
 - 3. The shoe should bend where your toes bend.
- 4. Check the shoes for arch support. You may purchase them separately, if needed. Make sure it fits in your shoe without squeezing your toes or making your heel slip.
- 5. Check the length and width of your shoes to make sure your toes have enough space. Have the assistant measure your foot to ensure the proper sizing. At least 1 cm at the end of your toes. The shoe should feel snug, but not tight. You should be able to wiggle all your toes. Wide width shoes are available.
- 6. Your shoes should be comfortable from the first step. You do not need to "break them in "before they are comfortable.
- 7. Your shoe should cushion your foot and support your foot with every step you take.
- 8. The shoe should grip your heel. Your heel should not slip
- when you move. 9. Feel the inside of the shoe. Check for tags, seams or material that might rub a blister or irritate your foot.
- 10. The soles should be sturdy and tough enough to protect your foot from harmful objects. Check the grip on the soles. Will it prevent you from slipping? Walk around the store on the carpet and on other hard surfaces.
- 11. The perfect time to try on shoes is after you exercise. Your foot will tell you if it is the right fit.
- 12. Try on shoes with the type of sock you will be exercising in. Thin socks and thick socks make a huge difference in how the shoe will fit.
- 13. Do not buy your shoe online. Every shoe fits differently. Try your shoes on at the store and have the assistant check the fit. 14. Know when to replace your shoes. Running shoes last about
- 350 500 miles. Look at the heel. If the heel is angled, you know it is time. An angled heel can cause pain in your legs and back.



Easter Brunch

Although an Easter brunch is a popular way to celebrate, these recipes can be served anytime of the day. I especially like recipes that can be prepared ahead

2 (20-oz.) cans pineapple chunks in juice, drained

of time and popped in the oven just before you are ready to serve them. As I searched for recipes, I came across this first recipe, Pineapple Casserole. It is said to be an Easter staple in the South, but I have never heard of it before. Maybe Texas isn't quite Southern enough for this recipe. It looks worth a try, though.

Pineapple Casserole

Preheat oven to 350°F. In a medium size bowl, combine sugar, flour, and reserved pineapple juice. Add pineapple chunks and toss well to combine. Spoon pineapple mixture into casserole dish and top with shredded cheese. Combine crushed Ritz crackers and melted butter. Spread Ritz cracker topping evenly on top of pineapple mixture. Bake at 350°F for 30 minutes, or until bubbly.

Layered Ham and Cheese Biscuits

Ingredients

Ingredients

1 1/3 cups sugar

5 tablespoons flour

1/4 cup butter, melted

(reserve 6 Tbsp. juice)

1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese

1 sleeve Ritz crackers, crushed

- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour, plus more for dusting (see Cook's Note)
- 2 tablespoons baking powder
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1 stick (8 tablespoons) cold unsalted butter, cut into cubes
- 1 cup shredded mild Cheddar
- 1 cup buttermilk, plus more for brushing
- 2 thin slices black forest ham, roughly chopped (about 2 ounces)

Directions

Preheat the oven to 425 degrees F and line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment. Pulse the flour, baking powder, sugar, and salt in a food processor until combined. Add the

butter and 1/2 cup of the Cheddar and pulse until the mixture looks like coarse meal with pea-size bits of butter remaining. Add the buttermilk and pulse a few times, until the dough just comes together. Turn the dough out onto a work surface that's lightly dusted with flour, then pat into a 7-by-7-inch square that's about 1 inch thick. Scatter half of the ham and 1/4 cup of the Cheddar on half of the dough, then fold the other half of dough over like a book; gently pinch the edges to seal. Pat the dough out again into a 7-by-7-inch square, scatter the remaining ham and 1/4 cup of cheese on top and fold the dough over like a book. Press once more into a 7-by-7-inch square. Use a sharp chef's knife to cut the dough into 12 even rectangular pieces. Transfer to the prepared baking sheet and brush the tops of each piece with additional buttermilk. Bake until the biscuits are puffed and well browned, 18 to 20 minutes.

Sausage and Hash Brown Breakfast Casserole

Ingredients

- 1 pound pkg. ground pork sausage with sage (such as Jimmy Dean)
- 1 pound pkg. hot ground pork sausage
- 1 (30-oz.) pkg. frozen shredded hash browns 2 teaspoons kosher salt, divided
- 1 teaspoons kosher sait, divided
- 6 ounces sharp Cheddar cheese, shred-
- ded (about 1 1/2 cups), divided
- 6 large eggs, lightly beaten 1 cup whole milk
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°F. Coat a 13- x 9-inch baking dish with cooking spray. Cook sage ground sausage and hot ground sausage in a large skillet over medium-high, stirring often, until they are crumbled and browned, about 10 minutes. Remove from heat; drain well on paper towels. Working in batches, cook hash browns in a large nonstick skillet according to package directions; omit salt if called for on package. Sprinkle with 1 teaspoon of the salt and 1/2 teaspoon of the pepper. Stir together sausage, hash browns, and 1 cup of the cheese in a bowl. Spoon into prepared baking dish. Whisk together eggs, milk, and remaining 1 teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon pepper in a medium bowl. Pour over sausage mixture. Sprinkle with remaining 1/2 cup cheese. Bake in preheated oven until set, about 30 minutes. Sprinkle with parsley and chives.

Gas prices edge downward

Texas gas prices have fallen 2.3 cents in the past week, averaging \$2.62 per gallon, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. Gas prices in Texas are 20.6 cents per gallon higher than a month ago and stand 86.7 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

According to GasBuddy price reports, the cheapest station in Texas is priced at \$2.31, while the most expensive is \$3.49 per gallon. The national average price of gasoline has fallen 2.7 cents in the last week, averaging \$2.84 per gallon. The national average is up 12.9 cents per gallon from a month ago and stands 87.5 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

"After the feverish rise in gas prices to start the year, increases have largely tapered off and we're now seeing decreasing prices in most areas of the country, thanks to oil prices that have moderated for the time being," said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. "As the Suez Canal has remained block for nearly a week, we could see

some volatility in the price of oil this week as the market digests any updates as hundreds of ships remain in limbo. Back stateside, refiners have made the switch to summer gasoline and price impacts have been limited thus far, but demand for gasoline remains strong. Last week saw total gasoline demand at yet another pandemic high according to Gas-Buddy data. As we approach warmer weather and motorists are increasingly getting outside, it could drive prices higher, so long as COVID-19 cases don't jump along with it and lead to new travel restrictions."

Bill tightening voting restrictions in Texas passes Senate committee

A Texas Senate committee on Friday passed an elections bill that would tighten the state's voting rules by limiting extended early voting hours, requiring proof of disability to qualify for mail-in voting and prohibiting drive-thru voting. Senate Bill 7, sponsored by Sen. Bryan Hughes, R-Mineola, is one of Gov. Gregg Abbott's legislative priorities this session.

During testimony Friday, the committee received opposition testimony from AARP, the League of Women Voters, NAACP and other groups. Hughes described his bill as attempting to strike a balance between "maintaining fair and honest elections with the opportunity to exercise one's right to vote," according to the Texas Tribune.

Any Texan old enough to legally drive can receive COVID-19 vaccine

More than 10.2 million Texans have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine as of Sunday, according to the Texas Department of State Health Services. The pace is expected to quicken now that anyone 16 years and older can receive one of the three versions available in the state. A total of 3.57 million Texans are fully vaccinated — about 12% of the state's population. DSHS has directed vaccine providers to give priority to people 80 years and older.

To that point, a new outreach partnership between the Texas Health and Human Services Commission and several partners was announced last week by Gov. Gregg Abbott. Among those participating to expand the state's Save Our Seniors program launched in February are the Texas Employee Retirement System, Texas Teachers Retirement System, AARP and various Medicare health plans.

More than 1 million doses of the vaccine are being shipped to Texas providers this week. Texans can call 2-1-1 or go to https://tinyurl.com/9dvpetm9 for more information about getting the vaccine.

COVID-19 cases in Texas drop slightly

The number of new COVID-19 cases in Texas dropped to 27,185 last week, with 741 deaths reported. Both are down just slightly from the previous week, according to the Coronavirus Center at Johns

Hopkins University. Hospitalizations of confirmed COVID-19 cases also showed a slight decrease to 3,308, according to DSHS.

Health care fraud case ends with prison time, \$82.9 million restitution

The state's Department of Workers' Compensation announced last week that the remaining defendants in a health care fraud bribery scam were sentenced by a federal judge. The case involved surgeons, physicians and hospital administrators at Forest Park Medical Hospital in Dallas. It began in 2016 and involved 14 defendants, who were sentenced to a combined 74-plus years in prison and ordered to pay \$82.9 million in restitution. According to a news release from DWC, the department's fraud unit identified health care providers at Forest Park who billed the state's workers' compensation system. The unit turned over the data to the FBI.

"Fraudulent billing within the health care system drives up the costs of health care for everyone," Debra Knight, DWC deputy commissioner, said. "These significant sentences demonstrate that health care fraud will not be tolerated."

Border transportation master plan approved by state

The Texas Department of Transportation has approved the Border Transportation Master Plan after years of research and analysis of current and future transportation needs and growth in the border region. Secretary of State Ruth R. Hughs, who chaired the Board Trade Advisory Committee, praised the decision. The plan recommended strategies to help U.S. and Mexican officials improve efficiency in the movement of freight, goods and people across the state's 28 border crossings

"I look forward to our continued work together on the implementation of the master plan to raise awareness of its importance, improve quality of life for residents of the border region, and secure economic prosperity for all on both sides of the border," Hughs said.

Forest service acquires acreage through legacy grant

The Texas A&M Forest Service has ac-

quired Fox Hunters Hill, a \$1.6 million conservation easement of sustainably managed forest adjacent to the Sabine National Forest in Deep East Texas. The acreage was acquired through the U.S. Forest Legacy Program, which acquired more than 23,000 acres throughout the South to protect forestlands at risk due to urban development or clear cutting.

TFS works with landowners on a "willing buyer/willing seller" basis to obtain the lands and enhance sustainable forest management. "A conservation easement is an interest in land acquired to protect certain conservation values," explained Gretchen Riley, the Forest Legacy Program Coordinator at Texas A&M Forest Service. "It is a good way to assure important, vulnerable landscapes – and the benefits they provide to Texans – are sustained for the future."

Fox Hunters Hill borders 213,000 acres of protected lands in the Angelina and Sabine National Forests, including one of the last undeveloped coves of Toledo Bend Reservoir.

Protect yourself from social media identity theft

The Texas Department of Insurance has some advice on taking simple steps to protect social media accounts and thus avoid most scams. Those tips include:

- Don't post ID cards, including a CO-VID-19 vaccination card.
- Watch out for online quizzes and surveys that ask for personal information, such as the model of your first car, name of your first pet, or your hometown.
 Those are often also security login questions.
- Don't overshare. The more a scammer finds out about you, the easier it is to create a fake account.
- Limit app sharing and close old accounts
- Protect family members, especially teens, who are the most likely to overshare.




