But the Israelites had slipped away from God, no longer adhering to the beliefs and traditions that God had spelled out for them. Ahab confronted this brave prophet, saying "Art thou Elijah? Thou he that troubleth Israel?" Whereupon Elijah answered, "I never troubled Israel's peace!! It is thou, Ahab, and all thy father's house!!"

Then, Elijah challenged Ahab to bring everybody, including all the prophets of Baal that "are feasted at Jezebel's table", and meet him and "then we shall see whose god is the Lord!" A contest. A great contest! Elijah told his opponents to select and slay a bullock and put no fire under it. Then both sides would call upon their god, and the god that answered with fire would be proven to be the Lord of all.

Elijah had such faith that he knew what the outcome would be. The priests of Baal did their thing and nothing happened. Elijah told them to call Baal louder. That maybe he was asleep. Mocked by the Prophet, they tried harder and harder. Nothing happened. Then Elijah gathered them around and prayed to God, and the fire descended from heaven and consumed the bullock.

The Israelites saw the error in their ways, and repented. Elijah told them to seize all the prophets of Baal, take them down to the brook and slay them all. No negotiation. Beautiful melodies, moving lyrics, and more satisfying than much of what pollutes the media nowadays. Many years ago, Friona First Baptist Church's choir performed the oratorio here in Friona.

As part of our area outreach, Parmer Paws is offering a low-cost, drive-through vaccination clinic on May 14th, from 9:00 a.m. till 1:00 p.m. We are offering some veterinary services at a huge savings.

Cats can get a vaccination that prevents several upper respiratory problems as well as a parvovirus-type illness. Dogs need a vaccine that prevents parvovirus and distemper, which been especially has widespread and deadly in the last year. We are also offering rabies shots, collars and tags,

and hopefully even microchipping. Each of these services is only \$10 each, which is a significant savings.

We urge people to take advantage of this oncea-year opportunity to save money and protect your pets. 





Asparagus

Asparagus begins to come into season in the spring. Here is a quick and easy recipe to enjoy this vegetable. Plus it has bacon.

Bacon Wrapped Asparagus Bundles

Ingredients

1 1/2 pounds asparagus spears, trimmed 4 to 5 inches long tips Extra-virgin olive oil, for drizzling A few grinds black pepper 4 slices center cut bacon or pancetta Chopped chives or scallions, optional garnish

Directions

Preheat oven, if using, to 400 degrees Fo. Lightly coat asparagus spears in extra-virgin olive oil. Season the asparagus with black pepper. Take a quick count of the spear tips. Divide the total number by four. Gather that number of spears and use a slice of bacon to wrap the bundle and secure

the spears together. Repeat with remaining ingredients. To grill, place bundles on hot grill and cover. Cook 10 to 12 minutes until bacon is crisp and asparagus bundles are tender. For oven preparation, place bundles on slotted broiler pan. Bake 12 minutes.

Read the Comics

A newspaper's comics section does not hold the fascination it once did to a child. Families in the 1960s and 1970s made a dash for the printed frame-by-frame jokes or stories. On Sunday, they were in color, which made for a Holy War before church. We took up arms, literally, to fight over who got to read the Sunday funnies before the other siblings. There was excitement for children learning to read because it meant access to the funny paper.

In 1912, at the age of 19, South Carolinian Alice Lee Humphreys began teaching school. Her career would span 30 years. In retirement, she published three books of beautifully written essays about six-year-olds. She referred to her students in these stories as Little Ones.

In the collection of essays found in Angels in Pinafores (the second of her three books), Humphreys shares a lesson learned too late about not trusting her proven instincts when it comes to teaching methods and recognizing what students need.

In summary, Donna is the little girl to whom Humphreys refers as the Little Maiden. On the first day of school, the veteran teacher is not only responsible for new First Graders such as Donna but also for The Observer—a student teacher who has been placed in her room. As I read the essay, I infer that the veteran teacher is known for her ability to inspire and motivate. In fact, during reading time, the experienced

teacher uses the comics during Story Hour, much to the delight of the children. It comes as a shock to her however when, at the end of the day, The Observer criticizes the choice of reading

"With such abundance of good Literature," the Student Teacher snorts, "I marveled that thou didst digress in such fashion." It was obvious the younger education trainee viewed the funny paper as unacceptable curriculum.

The next morning, the Little Maiden brings a crumpled piece of newspaper with a Bugs Bunny cartoon. She asks the older teacher if she might read to the class as the teacher has done the day prior.

You might now be able to guess what took place the next two days during Story Hour. The veteran teacher loses her emotional compass momentarily and allows the student teacher's words to alter her tried and true teaching methods. She lives to regret that choice.

Day Two comes for Donna and her new classmates. Their teacher does not read the comics. Day Three passes, and the Little Maiden has by this time resigned herself to the fact that the teacher is not going to pull the crumpled piece of paper from the drawer as promised. Day Four will not come for the little girl as a result of an unexpected health emergency.

Thus comes the twofold tragedy: that of a child's death followed by a teacher's grief. Her sadness if compounded by the fact that she has allowed herself to worry about the student teacher's mockery of the comics as a teaching tool.

From this heartache, the wise teacher reminds herself of a valuable lesson and shares with the remorseful young teaching-intraining.

"In Teaching, one must dilute Exactness and exalt Understanding.

24, Angels in Pinafores, A. L. Humphreys, 1954)

Both mentor and studentteacher reflect and do better as the story ends.

The 2021-2022 school year is coming to a close in less than a month. STAAR tests are looming and pressures mounting. As parents and teachers, may we find that balance of exactness and understanding by trying these tried and true ways of adulting the young: telling stories to our children, getting to know their interests outside of formal learning, coloring, nurturing creativity, debating, problem solving, and any other number of ways that translate to "reading the comics."

Though academic accountability is vital, good test scores and a diploma will go to waste if adults do not genuinely connect with the young.

I am convinced children yearn for the type of knowledge that is a product of this one assurance that the grown-ups in their lives care, listen, and communicate respectfully and lovingly.

Diesel prices hit all-time high

Average gasoline prices in Texas rose 9.2 cents last week, averaging \$3.85 per gallon, according to GasBuddy's survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. Prices in Texas are 7.3 cents per gallon higher than a month ago and stand \$1.25 per gallon higher than a year

According to Gas-Buddy price reports, the cheapest station in Texas was priced at \$2.99 while the most expensive was \$4.99 per gallon.

The national average price of gasoline has risen 6.9 cents in the last week, averaging \$4.17 per gallon. The national average is down 1 cent per gallon from a month ago and stands \$1.29 per gallon higher than a year ago.

"Gasoline prices have continued their rally in the last week with oil prices sustaining higher levels, but the real story has been diesel fuel, which has skyrocketed to its highest level ever seen. Diesel is now \$1 per gallon or more in many areas compared to gasoline," said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis at Gas-Buddy.

De Haan added, "The meteoric rise in diesel prices is likely to continue for the first half of the week at least, while gasoline prices could continue to see a slow but steady rise. State Sales Tax Revenue Totaled \$3.8 Billion in April

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced that state sales tax revenue totaled \$3.83 billion in April, 12.8 percent more than in April 2021. The majority of April sales tax revenue is based on sales made in March and remitted to the agency in April.

"State sales tax collections reached a new high for the month of April, with double-digit growth reflecting both inflation and continued expansion in real economic activity and employment," Hegar said.

"The strongest growth was in receipts from sectors driven by business spending, particularly the oil and gas mining sector, which surpassed prepandemic levels as capital spending in the sector picks up. Receipts from the construction, manufacturing and wholesale trade sectors continued to show double-digit growth.

"Among sectors driven by consumer spending, the strongest growth in receipts was in arts and recreation services, with receipts from sporting events, music and other live entertainment, and fitness clubs far exceeding previous year levels. Receipts from restaurants continued to exhibit double-digit growth as well.

"Receipts from retail trade remain elevated, though only a little higher than a year ago when retail spending surged after the end of COVID restrictions. Slowing growth in

receipts from retail trade may signal shifts in consumer spending back toward pre-pandemic patterns. Growth in spending in segments that had benefited during the pandemic appeared to stall, as receipts from home improvement and furniture stores changed little from a year ago, while receipts from sporting goods and hobby stores declined."

Total sales tax revenue for the three months ending in April 2022 was up 22.3 percent compared to the same period a year ago. Sales tax is the largest source of state funding for the state budget, accounting for 59 percent of all tax collections.

Texas collected the following revenue from other major taxes: (1) motor vehicle sales and rental taxes - \$525 million, up 39 percent from April 2021; (2) motor fuel taxes — \$335 million, up 3 percent from April 2021; (3) oil production tax — \$666 million, the highest monthly collections on record, up 99 percent from April 2021; (4) natural gas production tax — \$339 million, up 46 percent from April 2021; (5) hotel occupancy tax - \$76 million, the highest monthly collections on record, up 49 percent from April 2021; and (6) alcoholic beverage taxes - \$152 million, the highest monthly collections on record, up 27 percent from April 2021.


McCain Brothers take the bull by the horns, sort of







In the last decades of the 19th century, French engineers tried to hitch up the Atlantic and the Pacific oceans; on paper it looked easy: just dig a channel between the ten miles of land in Central America that separated them. But it wasn't that easy. And so, on May 4, 1905, the U.S. attempted

Engineers used dams to create an inland lake, connected to the oceans by locks, rather than building a sea-level canal all the way across the isthmus." 
