Commissioners approve vehicle swap

Parmer County Commissioners Court met in regular session on Monday May 23, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and Texas Flag.

Minutes from the May 9th and May 16th meeting were read and approved. Commissioners approved the payment of the accounts payables as presented by County Treasurer Sharon May. The Treasurer's Payroll Report was also approved.

Commissioners approved a vehicle trade between the Sheriff's Office and the Extension Office. The SO will trade their 2014 Suburban with 80,000 miles to the Extension Office for their vehicle which has over 250,000 miles. The SO will

use that vehicle as a tradein sometime in the future. Extension agents Wendy Case and Janelle Duffey will be transporting kids on various trips and it was felt that they needed a vehicle with less mileage.

Bonds for Deputy County Clerk BreAnn Saenz and Deputy County Treasurer Lucy Martinez were approved. Consideration to obtain a 2019 Traverse for the Juvenile Probation Office was tabled until the next meeting.

Parmer County Sheriff Eric Geske reported that the Parmer County Law Enforcement Center was currently housing 41 inmates. Of those, 25 are paying customers from Deaf Smith County.

All meetings are open to the public. Information in this article is only a summary. Any questions concerning specific actions should be directed to the Commissioners Court.

Friona grieves the loss of a friend

morning Saturday around 10:13 a.m. the Castro County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call of two persons ment of Public Safety found deceased on property near FM 1057 and FM 2397 in western Castro County approximately 1/2 mile east of the Parmer County line and roughly 13 miles east of Friona.

Upon arrival at the scene, Castro County Sheriff"s Office law enforcement personnel determined that the deaths were suspicious. Texas Rangers were called immediately to assist in the investigation. Through further investigation it was determined that the individuals at the scene were involved in an incident in the city of Friona where the Friona Police Department was investigating a suspect-

ed kidnapping. Castro County Justice of the Peace pronounced both persons deceased and ordered autopsies on both persons to be done in Lubbock. The autopsies were performed on Monday.

The Texas Departconfirmed Monday that Friona ISD teacher and coach Adilene Adame, 27, was one of the two people found dead in Castro County on Saturday morning. DPS identified the other individual as 37-year-old Osiel Rodriguez. DPS said that the investigation is still ongoing.

Adilene Adame was a member of the Friona High School Class of 2013 and received a Master of Science Degree in Physical Education from Eastern New Mexico University. She holds the ENMU track record in the weighted throw.

"Addie" had been employed at FISD for past two years as a Special Education Teacher and Coach. She was just recently assigned to be the new sponsor for the high school cheerleaders.

As of Tuesday, a Go-FundMe page set up for an Adame memorial fund had raised \$17,430 toward its \$20,000 goal.

Sadly, many veterans have died by their own hand, often the result of complications from PTSD.

Some who died in service to our country are still coming home. Just next month, the remains of Patrick Lloyd Chess will be returned and buried next to his parents in Yakima, Washington. The U.S. Navy shipfitter was only twenty-four and stationed on the USS Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941. Researchers used DNA to confirm Chess's identity, who was reported Missing in Action in a telegram to his family in 1941.

Average gasoline prices in Texas rose 13.9 cents in the last week, averaging \$4.27 per gallon, according to GasBuddy's survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. Prices in Texas are 50.6 cents per gallon higher than a month ago and stand \$1.52 per gallon higher than a year ago. The price of diesel has risen 22.6 cents nationally in the past week and stands at \$5.518 per gallon.

According to GasBuddy price reports, the cheapest station in Texas was priced at \$3.37 while the most expensive was \$5.20 per gallon.

The national average price of gasoline has risen 11.0 cents in the last week, averaging \$4.57 per gallon. The national average is up 45.4 cents per gallon from a month ago and stands \$1.55 per gallon higher than a year ago.

"Gasoline prices surged over the last week to new record highs, but have finally started to slow their rise with diesel also finally cooling off," said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis at GasBuddy. "With more Americans planning to hit the road for Memorial Day this year compared to last, prices will be over \$1.50 per gallon higher than last year. Though, prices are appearing to slow down, for now."

De Haan continued, "While the coast isn't clear yet, and prices will be at their highest Memorial Day level ever, I'm hopeful that we could avoid a dreaded national average of \$5 per gallon this year. Whether or not we're able to depends on Americans cutting demand in the face of sky high prices."

GasBuddy data is compiled from more than 11 million weekly price reports covering over 150,000 gas stations across the country.



Kenneth wed Annie Geraldine Phipps in July of 1957. After establish-




ing a home and starting a family, Kenneth and Geraldine eventually moved to Burleson in 1975. There he began his career as a screen printer with May Adver-



The nation remembers the soldiers, sailors and airmen who perished in all its armed conflicts. The first known vigil honoring its heroes was in an Arlington National Cemetery gathering on May 30, 1868.

In the beginning, Memorial Day was known as Decoration Day. It "was inspired by local observances that had taken place in various locations in the three years since the end of the Civil War," says History.com.

There are still those who might prefer to call it Decoration Day, but Memorial Day was declared a national holiday by a 1971 act of Congress.

Now, people are prone to associate the celebration with the opening of summer. That is nothing new. According to an Opinion article published by the Tribune News Service, West Point graduate Meaghan Mobbs wrote that "People have a 'tendency ... to forget the purpose of Memorial Day and make it a day for games, races,



and revelry, instead of a day of memory and tears ... No, this is not a recent tweet or a pithy social media caption. It was uttered by a veteran in 1913, who felt the meaningfulness of Memorial Day was slipping through the American conscience."

In her OpEd, Ms. Mobbs reminds her readers that Congress established a National Moment of Remembrance that was to be observed every Memorial Day at 3 p.m. local time.
