 Macronutrient NeedsWhy worry about it now? Mainly because by the year 2000 there will be approximately 40
million people in the United million people in the United
States over the age of 65 . Many will remain active and healthy others will suffer from one or more chronic diseases, live alone living situations. That's why knowledge about the macronutrient needs of this
65 age group is important.
Not to be forgotten is the the elderly, water consumption is of special concern since they have inadequate water intake. This is
caused by a decrease in the antidiuretic hormone with aging and more water loss through their urine. Memory loss or physical
incapacity may prevent the ability incapacity may prevent the ability
to satisfy their thirst or inability to express their need for fluids. For whatever reason, dehydration is a common problem for the elderly. Dehydration can be prevented by 2 liters of fluid per day, or more if there is vomiting, diarrhea o other increased fluid loss
For a variety of reasons, fiber
our diet is important for all us. Water-holding fibers, such as found in wheat bran, along with adequate water intake, are helpful with reducing constipation and in decreasing formation dietary fibers--those in oats, legumes and fruits-have been reported to improve control of blood sugar in diabetes, lowe
total cholesterol, the "bad" cholesterol (LDL cholesterol) and triglycerides without changing HDL cholesterol (the "good"
cholesterol). Both types of fibers are found in fruits and vegetables. Be cautious of more than two to four servings of fruits which can cause an increase in blood sugar,
