

On special occasions, the band would give concerts in the high school auditorium. Since it was the best, (and usually the only), show in town, there was always a good turnout. The floor of the auditorium was so flimsy it shook when anyone walked on it and in later years, the whole thing fell into the basement. There is no evidence to suggest the band had anything to do with the fall. Several bandsmen attended the Baptist church and would play their instruments at the Sunday morning service. We do
