Texas Severe Weather Awareness Week- Proclaimed

Austin, TX-Governor Rick Perry has proclaimed March 4-10, as "Texas Severe Weather Awareness Week," continuing a tradition that has spanned four decades.

"Severe weather affects everyone in the Lone Star State, with tornadoes, thunderstorms, lighting, flooding or even hurricanes a possibility. Especially in the spring, violent weather threatens countless adults and children in their homes, schools and places of business, and cars," said Governor Perry.

He added, "To protect their lives and property and minimize the damage from nature's fury, people must learn what to do in the face of severe conditions. Texans can prepare for emergencies by putting together a 'Readiness Kit,' which consists of a flashlight, a batter-operated radio, extra batteries, a first aid kit, food and water supplies, a manual can opener, essential medicines and even a small amount of money orders."

Governor Perry continued, "People should also develop an emergency plan, with our-of-area relatives or friends serving as family contacts. "During severe weather", they should tune-in to a battery-operated radio or television, for up-to-the minute emergency information. "Evacuation warnings should be followed immediately."

Texans are also encouraged to tune in to the National Weather Service broadcasts, and pay particular attention to "watches," which indicate severe weather may occur, or "warnings," which indicate severe weather (including tornadoes), is occurring in the area.

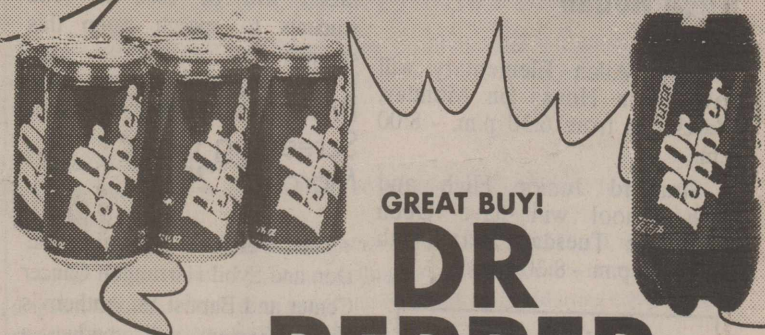

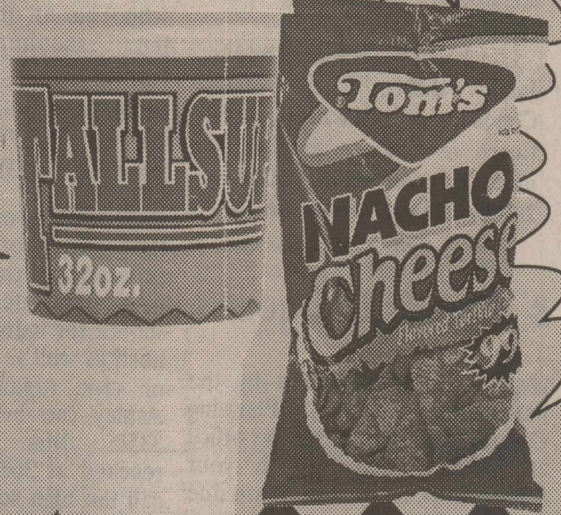

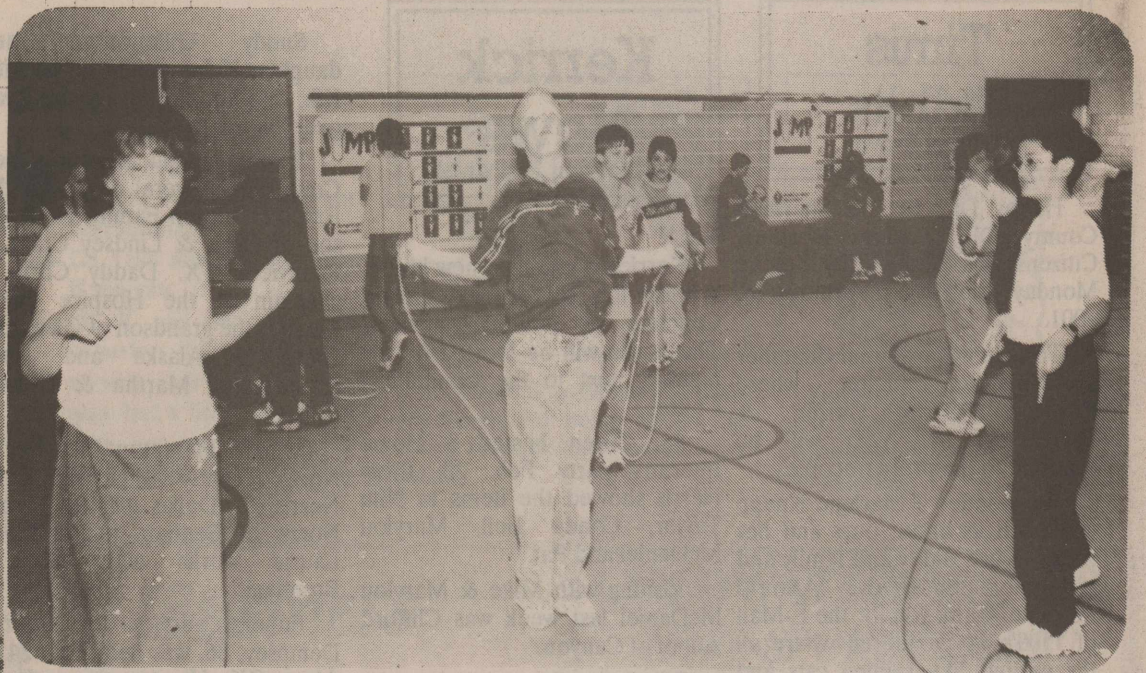

ITEMS FROM THE COUNCIL

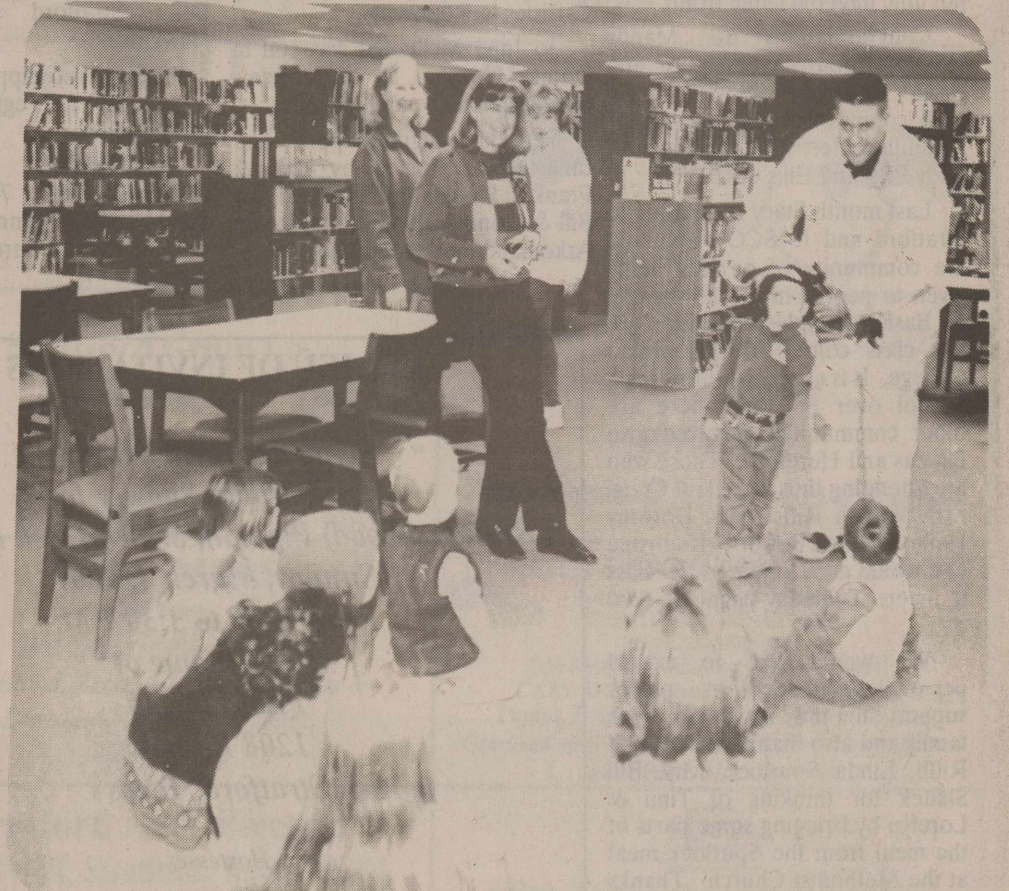
Ken Forthman spoke on the Sales Tax Board members. Some positions came open in October 2000. Item will be placed on the February 8, 2001 agenda.

Meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m.



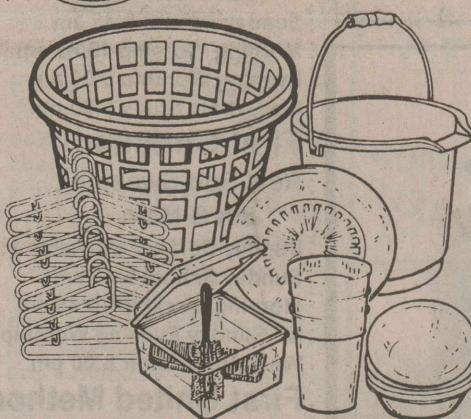

Local Airport Receives Funding For Improvements

Funding for planned improvements to the Perryton Ochiltree County Airport are on the way following action yesterday by the Texas Transportation Commission.

The commission approved \$2 million for plans to upgrade the airport's facilities. The grant was part of a larger funding package that awarded \$5.4 million for six community airports in Texas.

"Community airports play a crucial role by providing air transportation access to all areas of our state," said Dave Fulton, aviation director for the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). "It's extremely important to continue to improve and maintain these airports, as they are a vital element to the state's overall transportation system and the community's economic development efforts."

Improvements to the Perryton County Ochiltree Airport include extending the runway and taxiways, repairing and improving pavement structures to the aircraft parking aprons, and installing exit

and hold signs along runway and taxiway. Plans also include adding runway lights to the runway extension and replacing the rotating beacon.

Construction on the project can begin within 60 days after a contract has been awarded.

Ten percent of the projects' costs will be picked up by the city of Perryton. The remainder will be covered through TxDOT's Aviation Facilities Grant program.

This year, TxDOT expects to provide approximately \$60 million in funding for planning, constructing and maintaining community airports. There are approximately 275 community airports in Texas eligible for funding.

Nearly eight percent of all general aviation aircraft in the U.S. are located in Texas-placing the state second in the nation.

Community airports log more than 3 million flight hours per year and provide aircraft facilities for agricultural, medical, business and commuter use.

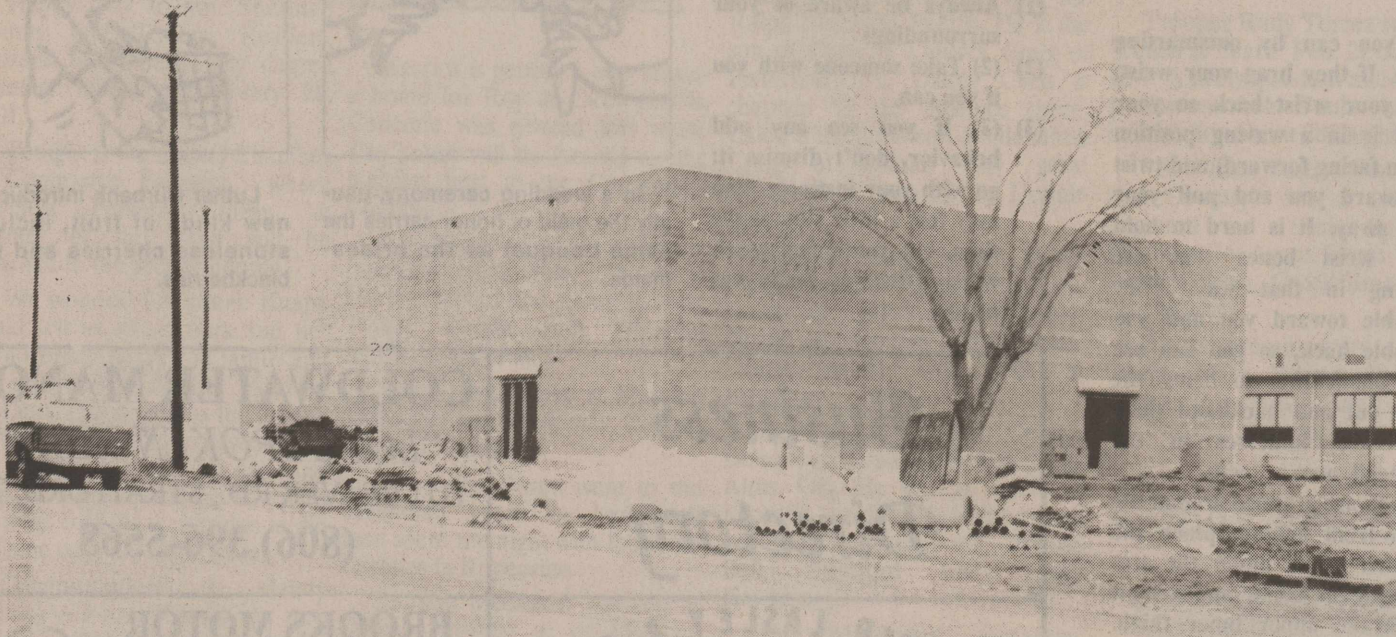

The County 4-H Fashion Show will be held April 12 and the District Fashion Show will be May 5. For more information, contact Susie Spurlock at the Extension Office.

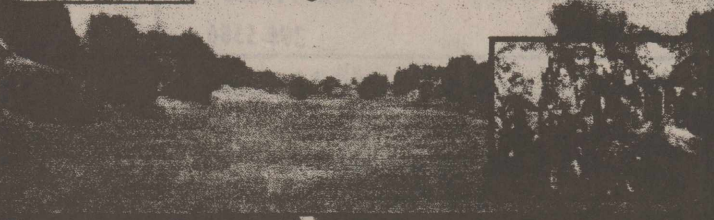

The Stratford Elks claimed the Bi-District title on Tuesday, February 20th with a win over Claude 81-44. Skyler Walden and Adam Bell led the Elks with 19 points followed by Rene Vital with 16 points. Scoring 7 points each for the Elks were Corey Naugle, Michael McAlister, and Wes Kimball followed by Matthew Taliaferro and Jason Ashley with 3 points each. The Elks advanced to the Sectional Tournament in Levelland on February 23 and 24th. In their first game, the Elks beat Petersburg 59-45. Adam Bell led the Elks with 17 points followed by Skyler Walden with 14 points and Rene Vital with 12 points. Corey Naugle added 7 points for the Elks followed by Michael McAlister with 6 points and Carlos Ortega with 3 points. In the Elks' second game to win the tournament, they beat Roscoe 82-46. Leading the Elks were Skyler Walden with 20 points, Adam Bell with 19 points, and Rene Vital with 12 points. Nick Ashley added 8 points followed by Corey Naugle with 7 points, Carlos Ortega with 5 points, Wes Kimball with 4 points, and Dalton Sladek, Michael McAlister, and Jason Ashley with 2 points each. In the game against Roscoe Adam Bell had a Triple-Double - 19 pts., 13 rebounds, and 10 assists.
