Base police get tough on safety

Law enforcement specialists with the 64th Security Police Division recently began stopping vehicles at the front gate for not having cleared off their car windows. The security police have an ice scraper available at the gate for motorists to clear their windows before entering the base.

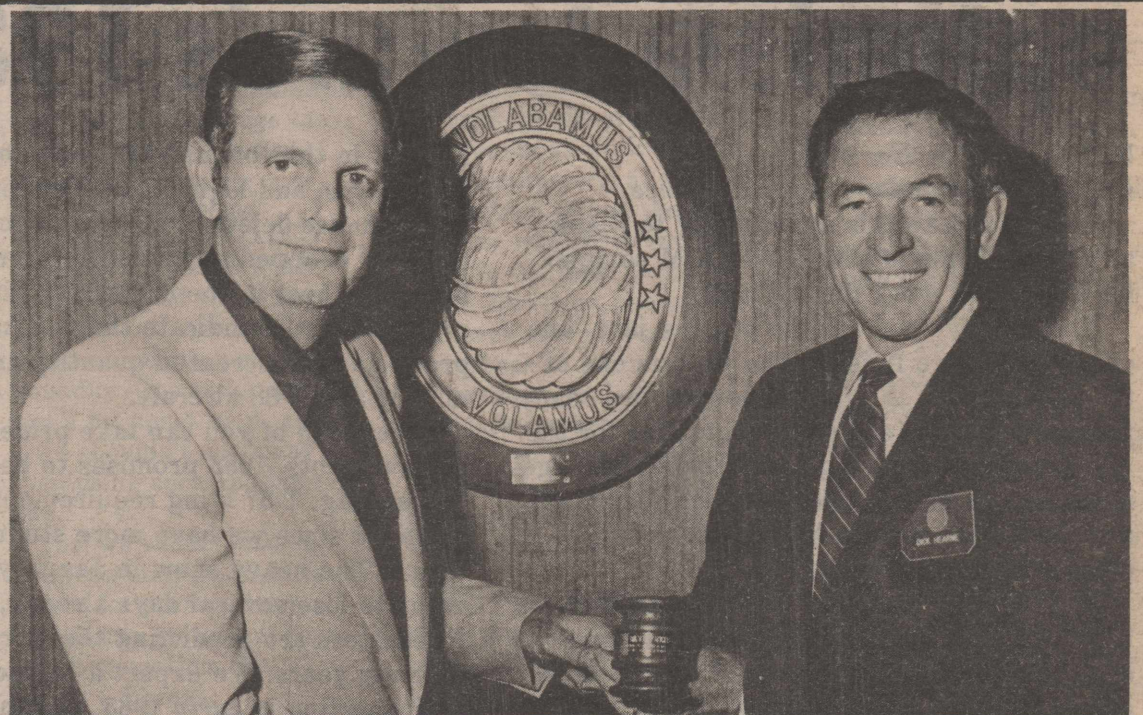
Security police officials pointed out that the gate guard has the option as to whether or not to cite the individual. They also pointed out not having auto windows cleared for safe driving is in violation of the wing supplement to AFR 125-14 and Texas state law.

As stated violations of the law can get the guilty motorist a ticket on base and possibly even a fine if a state authority stops them.

The security police officials also reported that later this year the base security police division will welcome the arrival of two drug detection dogs and their handlers.

Currently one of the two projected gains is enroute, but the other will not finish schooling until sometime in February.

Their arrival at Reese and the newly constructed kennels behind Bldg. 500 represent the end of a lengthy project. Police officials mentioned that their authorizations for two dog handlers was approved some time ago, but funding to build the new kennels did not get the go ahead until last summer.

Roster aids commanders

Randolph AFB, Texas (AFNS)—Questionable performance records, unfavorable information files

or other negative indicators may make promotion of re-enlistment more difficult in the future announced Air Force personnel officials. AFMPC will give unit commanders a monthly personnel roster of people with questionable performance or behavior records.

The commander's enlisted management roster

replaces the unit quality force roster and is designed to give commanders better information for making more timely, quality informed decisions involving personnel matters.

It is designed to give commanders another look at their people before deciding to recommend promotion or re-enlistment.

Commissaries up the surcharge rate

Washington (AFNS)—The surcharge at Air Force commissaries will increase from four percent to five percent April 1, announced Department of Defense officials in Washington. The surcharge will continue to be added at the cash registers, the officials said. Army and Navy commissaries also will set their surcharge at the five percent mark then.

Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger directed the change "to comply with the intent of the house report on the Military Construction, Authorization Act for 1983. The Act directed the secretary of defense to establish uniform and standardized surcharge rates

and methods of application for the military commissary system."

The April 1 effective date will allow the services to adjust operational and accounting changes to accommodate the new surcharge, according to DoD officials.

Officials feel standardization of the surcharge rate and the method of collection will eliminate any real or perceived inequities among the services. Their rates and methods of applying surcharges have varied in the past. This has been a source of irritation and confusion to commissary customers and to agencies who sell to the commissaries, officials added.

DCM expresses thanks/optimism towards 1983

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all of the people of the Reese DCM complex for their hard work during 1982.

Although we started the year as just "one of the pack," we finished the year as one of the leaders. For the first time in many, many years, Reese was a serious contender for the Air Training Command Maintenance Management Award for Excellence, the Daedalian award. Not since 1960 has Reese won this most prestigious award.

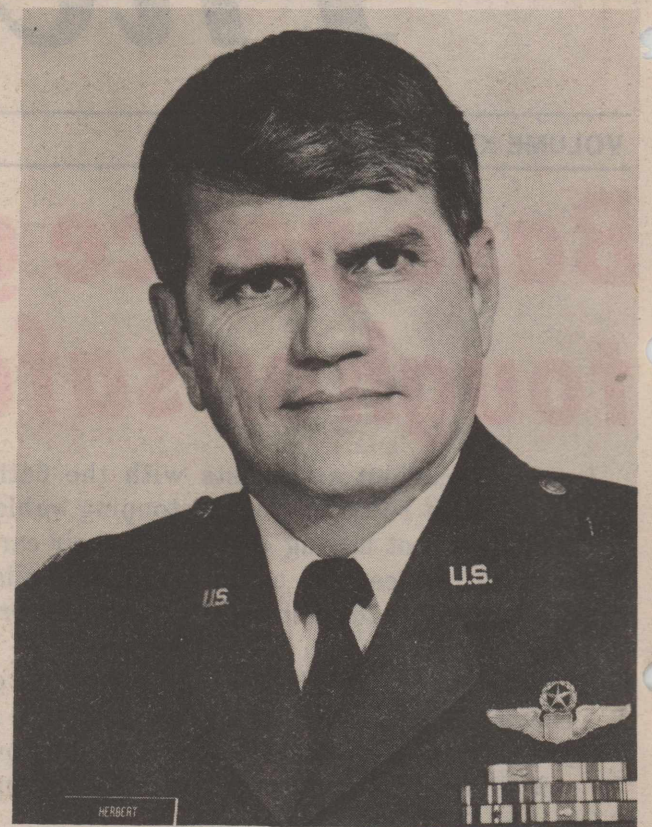
So to each of you who labored long and hard this past year to produce quality aircraft, I want you to know your efforts were appreciated. Because of those efforts, we were able to graduate every T-38 class on time in spite of the worst spring weather in many years along with low instructor pilot manning, which cost us our usual summer make-up capability.

Concurrently, all of Reese's vital maintenance statistics showed marked improvement: Mission-capable rates were the

highest in the command for most of the last six months, and logistics-nondelivery, maintenance-deletion, abort and occurrence rates all dropped significantly—frequently being the best in the command. Virtually all of our statistics indicate that we have been producing an increased quantity and quality of T-37 and T-38 aircraft.

I feel each of you can take pride in your achievements. 1983 promises to be equally demanding. T-37 flying requirements will be up in '83 since we have more students on board. The heavy snow in January has caused us to lose several days already, and some forecasters are predicting the worst winter in many years. We expect a Mission Capability Inspection in early 1983, and this May will be the 18th month since our most recent Management Effectiveness Inspection. (The ATC/IG is presently on an 18-month, or sooner, inspection cycle.)

Should all this dishearten us? NOT ON YOUR LIFE. I am convinced we are as good as our statistics say we are. We have maintained quality production while overcoming

weather attrition before and we'll do it once again. I WANT the IG to look at a good maintenance outfit—US—and I know he'll be impressed. So let's jump to it in '83. Let's maintain the professionalism we now possess, and I wouldn't be surprised if 1983 won't turn out to be an even better year than 1982. Once again, thanks for your fine work!

Unfortunately, at the time this patron called, the commissary was short two positions in the meat department. However, one position has been moved from the store back to the meat department, and should help alleviate the problem.

We recommend patrons shop on days other than paydays when crowds are the largest to a better selection.

"I KEEP GETTING LIGHT bulbs ripped off out of the carport area" in the housing area, said a recent caller. What can we do about it?

The security police patrol the area, but obviously they cannot monitor the entire housing area for incidents like this. For this reason, neighbors should help watch each other's property to help control theft. Remember, if

you see a crime, report it by calling Ext. 3400. You don't have to give your name and you will help everyone by getting involved.

A PATRON OF THE BASE gas station had some trouble recently when he read an AAFES advertisement that said a sale at the gas station would run through the weekend—even though our station is closed Saturdays and Sundays.

The AAFES advertisement tabloids are printed centrally for distribution nationwide. It would, therefore, be unreasonable to expect these ads to be accurate for the hours of the exchanges at all bases. In light of this, the ads carry a disclaimer which reads, "Events and times are subject to normal hours of operation." We run service station promotions during the week, but not on weekends.

It appears that the disclaimer was omitted from inserts to the regular advertising tabloids in November and December, leading the caller to misconstrue the promotion sale.

BAS can be paid even while TDY

Air Force directives allow finance units to pay all enlisted members their BAS while they are TDY. BAS is paid through the TDY member's paycheck. The BAS payments are based on the period of TDY. For example:

TDYs less than 30 days means the member gets paid after the TDY and after completion of the appropriate voucher which is processed by the Travel Pay Section of finance.

When the TDY member returns and files a travel voucher finance will make the appropriate adjustments and take care of over-payments or under-payments.

Over-payments happen easily if a member's TDY is cut short because finance has no way of knowing of the shortened TDY unless the member reports it to them.

squadron award by their peers and supervisors. The final decision however, was made by the 64th Flying Training Wing Standardization/Evaluation Section and the deputy commander for operations.

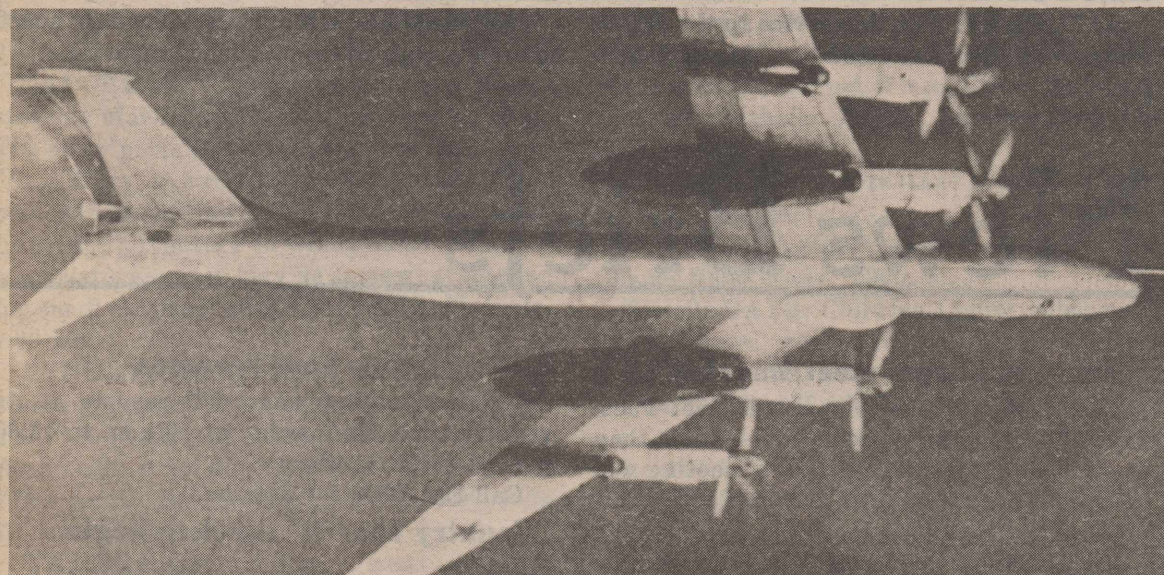
