## Armed Forces Week

Reese and other area military units will honor Armed Forces Day both here and at the South Plains Mall this weekend.

Today, Undergraduate Pilot Training Class 83-05 will walk the stage at the base theater to accept their aviators wings and the new lives the wings bring with them. Graduation ceremonies begin at 10 a.m. and are open to the general public. Due to limited space the family and friends of the graduating pilots will get priority in seating.

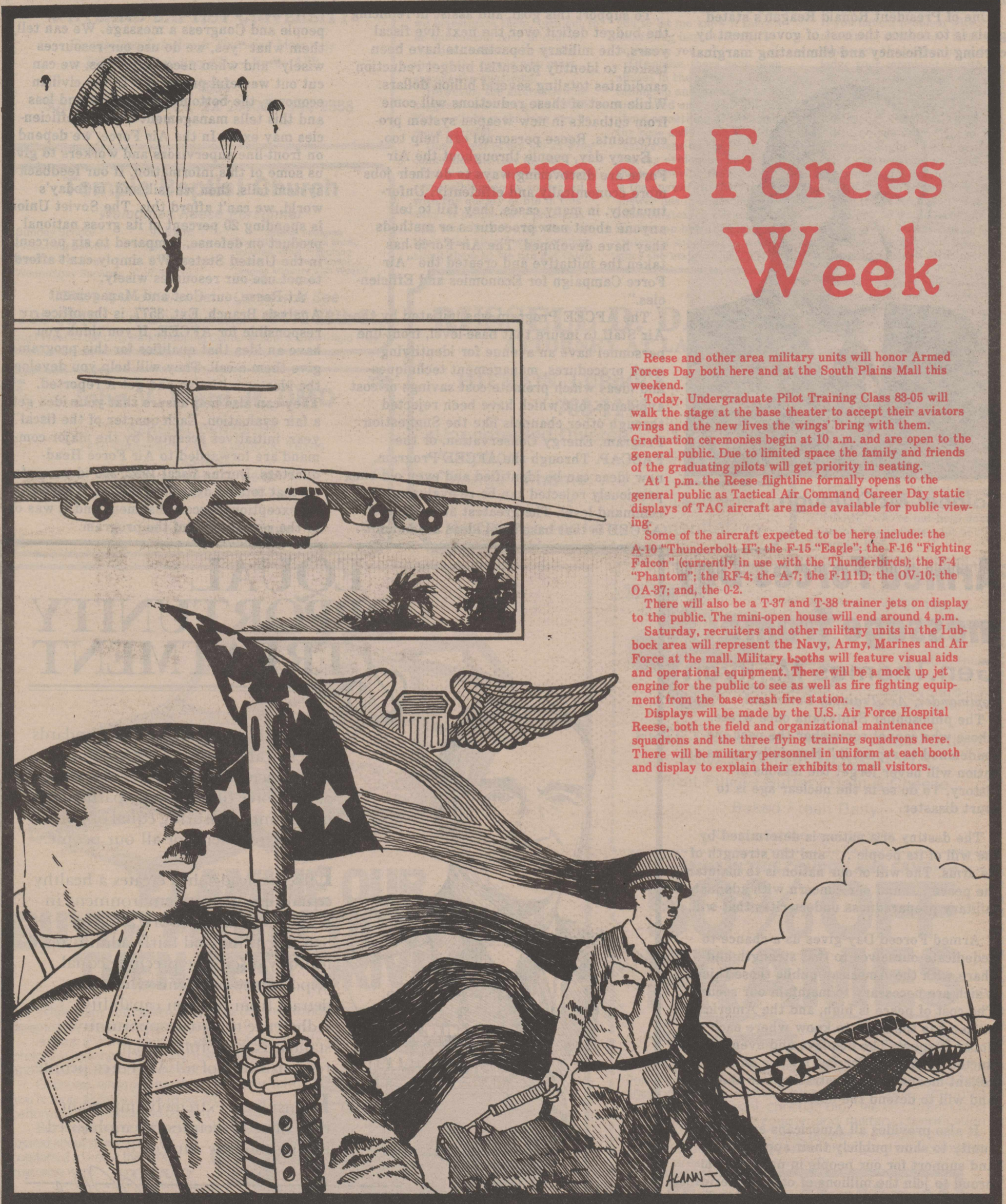
At 1 p.m. the Reese flightline formally opens to the general public as Tactical Air Command Career Day static displays of TAC aircraft are made available for public viewing.

Some of the aircraft expected to be here include: the A-10 "Thunderbolt II"; the F-15 "Eagle"; the F-16 "Fighting Falcon" (currently in use with the Thunderbirds); the F-4 "Phantom"; the RF-4; the A-7; the F-111D; the OV-10; the OA-37; and, the O-2.

There will also be a T-37 and T-38 trainer jets on display to the public. The mini-open house will end around 4 p.m.

Saturday, recruiters and other military units in the Lubbock area will represent the Navy, Army, Marines and Air Force at the mall. Military booths will feature visual aids and operational equipment. There will be a mock up jet engine for the public to see as well as fire fighting equipment from the base crash fire station.

Displays will be made by the U.S. Air Force Hospital Reese, both the field and organizational maintenance squadrons and the three flying training squadrons here. There will be military personnel in uniform at each booth and display to explain their exhibits to mall visitors.

# Editorials

## AFCEE gains support, saves \$\$\$

One of President Ronald Reagan's stated goals is to reduce the cost of government by curbing inefficiency and eliminating marginal

programs whenever and wherever they occur.

To support this goal, and assist in reducing the budget deficit over the next five fiscal years, the military departments have been tasked to identify potential budget reduction candidates totaling several billion dollars. While most of these reductions will come from cutbacks in new weapon system procurements, Reese personnel can help too.

Every day, people throughout the Air Force are discovering ways to do their jobs more economically and efficiently. Unfortunately, in many cases, they fail to tell anyone about new procedures or methods they have developed. The Air Force has taken the initiative and created the "Air Force Campaign for Economies and Efficiencies."

The AFCEE Program was initiated by the Air Staff to insure that base-level, front-line personnel have an avenue for identifying work procedures, management techniques and ideas which promote cost savings or cost avoidance, but which have been rejected through other channels like the Suggestion Program, Energy Conservation, or the FASCAP. Through the AFCEE Program, new ideas can be identified and even old ones previously rejected can be re-evaluated at command level. The greatest advantage of AFCEE is that base-level ideas are submit-

ted directly to command headquarters for review.

We have a chance to send the American people and Congress a message. We can tell them what "yes, we do use our resources wisely" and when necessary, "yes, we can cut out wasteful practices." In the civilian economy, the bottom line is profit and loss and this tells management where inefficiencies may exist. In the Air Force, we depend on front-line supervisors and workers to give us some of this information. If our feedback system fails, then we fail; and, in today's world, we can't afford this. The Soviet Union is spending 20 percent of its gross national product on defense, compared to six percent in the United States. We simply can't afford to not use our resources wisely.

At Reese, our Cost and Management Analysis Branch, Ext. 3577, is the office responsible for AFCEE. If you think you have an idea that qualifies for this program, give them a call. They will help you develop the idea or initiative and get it reported. They can also help insure that your idea gets a fair evaluation. Each quarter of the fiscal year, initiatives accepted by the major command are forwarded to Air Force Headquarters. During fiscal 1982, 330 ideas surfaced that totaled over \$300 million. This was an exceptional accomplishment and it was only the second year of the program.

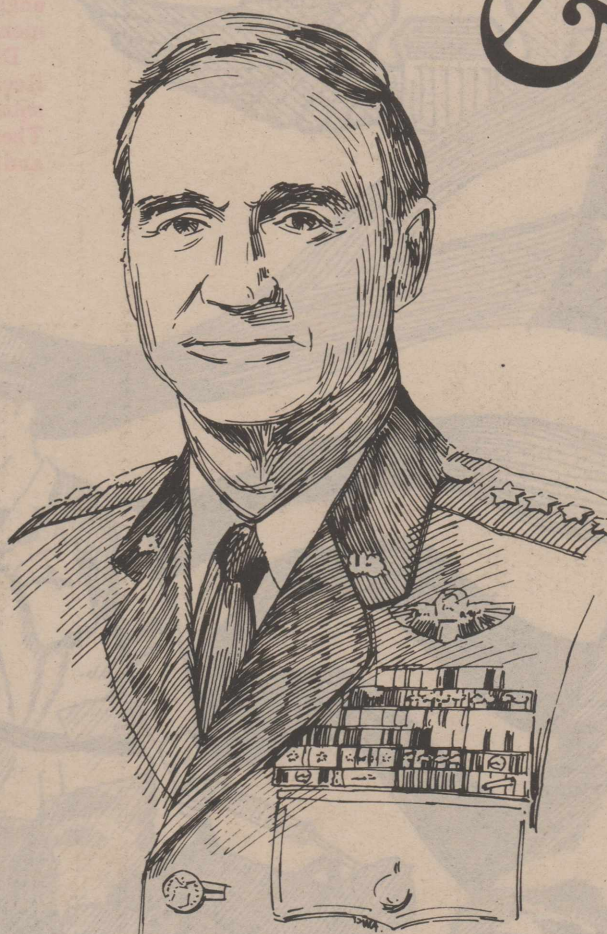

**CARE Line**

The CARE Line is prepared by Col. Richard E. Hearne, 64th Flying Training Wing commander. All information provided to the CARE Line will be held in strict confidence. Callers are urged to give their name and duty number so that a per-

sonal reply may be made; however, neither are mandatory. Callers are urged to use the CARE Line only after all possible means to air complaints through the chain of command have been exhausted. The CARE Line Ext. 3273.



**A CALLER RECENTLY SUGGESTED THAT** we do away with the CARE Line because of the large number of complaints that are "completely unfounded."

The caller is correct in that a lot of our calls concern allegations and complaints that, when we investigate them, turn out to be unfounded. And, of course, this does indeed take up the time of the people who must answer the questions.

However, the alternative he suggests—removing the CARE Line—might in the long run be more harmful.

One aspect of my job as wing commander is that my door must always be open—it's my responsibility to be concerned with the quality of life in this wing. If people have problems that can affect the way they do their jobs, then I want to know about them so we can get them

fixed. Now, this doesn't mean that I'm going to get involved in every little thing that comes down the line—I have a well-qualified staff that will handle most of the problems. And, I can't see everyone in my office at any time—that's what the CARE Line is for. It's a way for you to let me know if there's something important that's bothering you.

Of course, there have been abuses in the system—people calling up anonymously to make unfounded and unfair allegations about something or someone on the base and demanding investigations on the flimsiest of hearsay evidence—but I don't think removing the CARE Line is the answer. Rather, the answer lies in educating our subordinates, co-workers and families on how the complaint system is supposed to work, since the majority of CARE

Line complaints could have been answered at the time the complainants experienced the poor service, mistreatment, or whatever the basis for the complaint is.

The right way to solve problems and make complaints is simply the common sense way: If you have a problem with a duty section, commercial facility or whatever, the proper place to lodge your complaint is with the person in charge of that facility. When complaints about facilities or programs at Reese come to me through the CARE Line, where do you think I get my answers? Right. I go to the facility or program manager in charge. So, if a lot of these questions had been posed to those people in the first place, a lot fewer people would have had to get involved, at less cost, and the questions might've been answered sooner—often on the spot.

If you need my help to solve a problem by all means let me know. But first give the people directly responsible for your problem a chance to set things right.

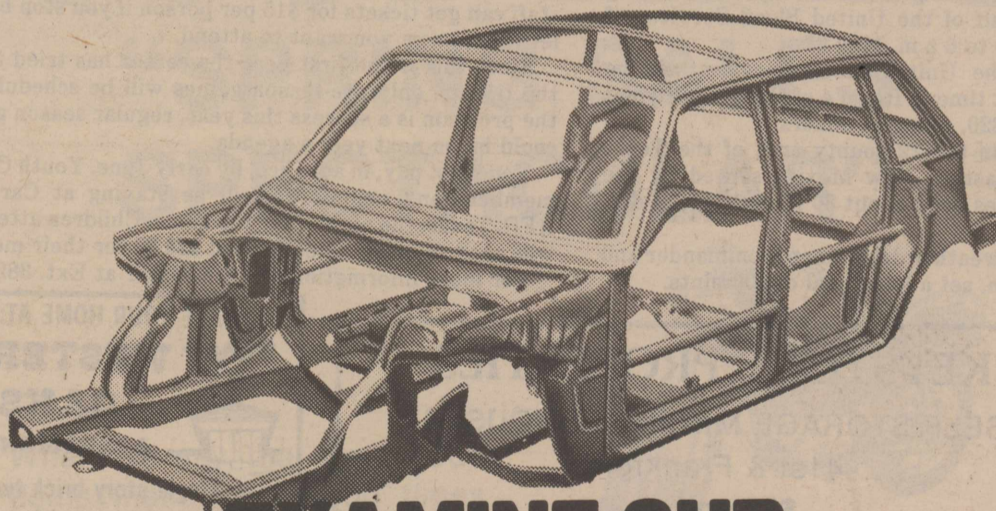

## Blood drive gets in gear May 27

The 64th Flying Training Wing will sponsor a Wing Blood Drive on behalf of the United Blood Services of Lubbock from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. May 27.

Personnel from the United Blood Services will be available during that time in Room 4 of the 64th Student Squadron, Building 820, to assist donors.

The 35 hospitals in the 22 county area of the Texas South Plains and Eastern New Mexico served by the United Blood Services need about 80 pints of blood during an average day.

Maj. Dave Meier, weather detachment commander and blood drive chairman, set a wing goal of 100 pints.

In general, anybody in good health between 17 and 65 years of age is eligible to donate. There are a few exceptions, but if you are interested in donating, check with the United Blood Services volunteers on the day of the drive to verify your eligibility as a donor.

## American Heart Association scants CPR training

It is a Reese goal to have as many base personnel as possible trained in cardio pulmonary resuscitation procedures. In line with that goal, 1st Lt. Bill Harbour and TSgt. Fred Pepper will conduct a two-day basic CPR course in the Youth Center between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. daily on June 6 and 7.

The successful completion of this course will earn the student a one year certification card from the American Heart Association, which has sanctioned the Reese program.


Since this is the first year the center has tried to get the tickets, only pre-season games will be scheduled. If the program is a success this year, regular season games could be on next year's agenda.

before signing in at their first flying assignment. Pilots from this small class will fly transport, cargo, refuel, fighter and trainer aircraft for the Air Force.

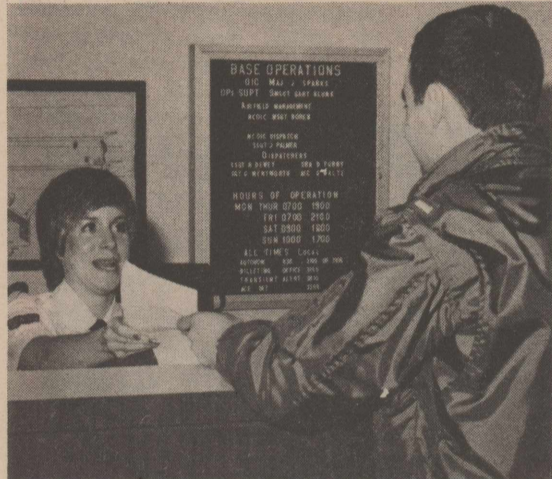
