

# Top enlisted to speak here

Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force Sam E. Parish will be the key speaker at the Dec. 2, Annual Enlisted Awards Banquet at the Enlisted Open Mess.

CMSAF Parish, only the eighth to attain his position, acts as an advisor to the secretary and chief of staff of the Air Force on matters concerning the welfare, effective usage and progress of the Air Force's enlisted force.

The 46-year-old Air Force leader joined the Air Force in December 1954. The Florida native has been among the best in every course he has taken as military training.

Educationally sound in the weather field, CMSAF Parish was also first in his Senior Noncommissioned Officer Academy class at Gunter Air Force Station, Ala., in 1973.

In July 1973, he became the Air Weather Service's senior

airman advisor. In October 1975, CMSAF Parish took a job as the weather assignments advisor for Military Airlift Command's deputy chief of staff, personnel.

November 1977 through August 1980, he served as U.S. Forces in Europe senior enlisted advisor at Ramstein AB, West Germany. He became the Strategic Air Command's senior enlisted advisor in November 1981; and the chief master sergeant

of the Air Force in August 1983, succeeding CMSAF A. "Bud" Andrews.

The chief master sergeant of the Air Force will be accompanied to Reese by Air Training Command Senior Enlisted Advisor CMSgt. Robert Carter. Chief Carter will also make a short address.

## Two die in fire

Funeral services for Shawn, 2, and Joseph Bryant, 5, were conducted at the base chapel Wednesday afternoon. Afterward, they were buried at Resthaven. The two children were the victims of a fire that gutted Sgt. and Mrs. Steve Bryant's residence Sunday morning in the Pecan Grove Trailer Home park.

Looking back; "The baby didn't get outside often, but Joseph did. He was like any other 5-year-old — he wanted to be a part of everything," said Mary Cowan, Pecan Grove owner.

Almost in tears, Cowan said, "This is the first time we've had a fire like this since we bought the park three-and-a-half years ago."

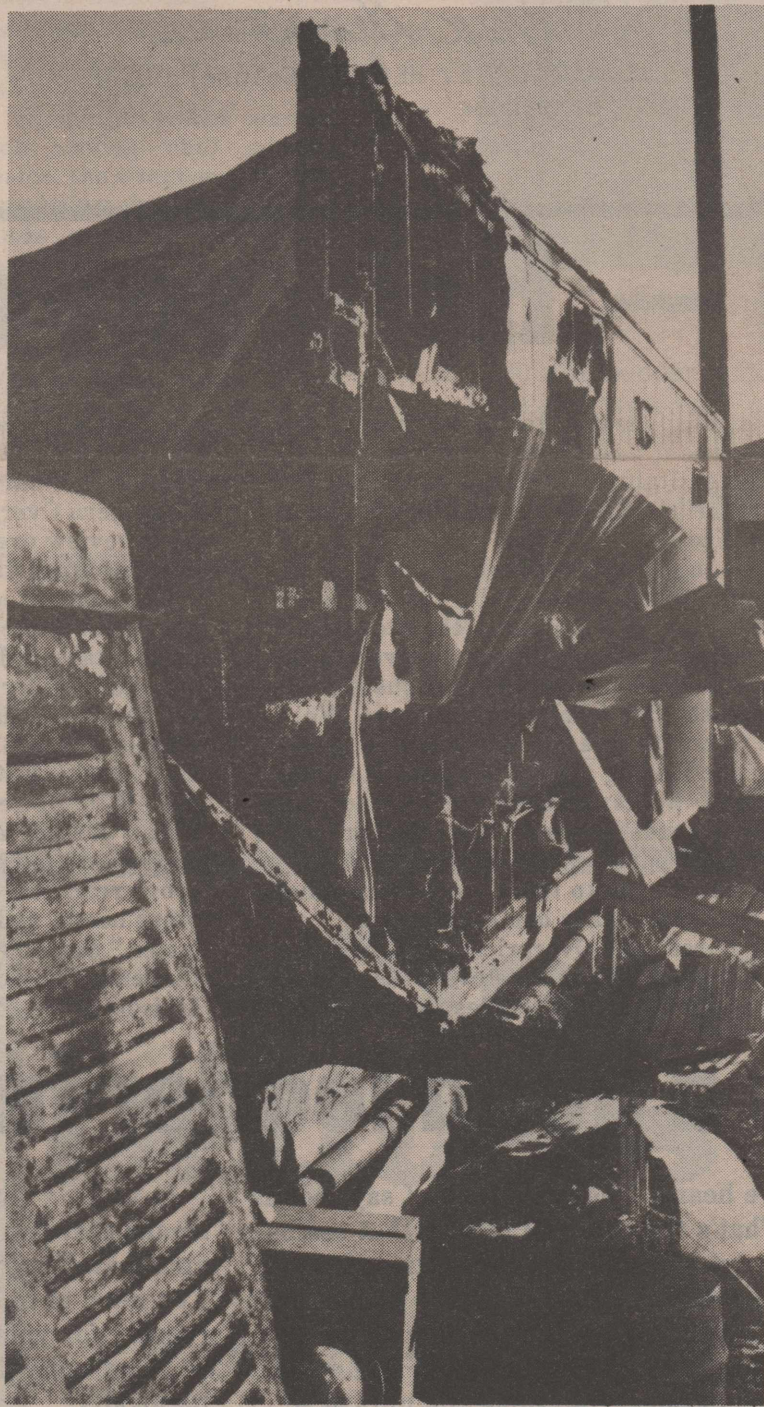
Reese Fire Chief Bob Hitch said that based on the insurance investigator's report, "the fire was probably started by a smoldering cigarette in the dining room area." Having worked with the investigator before, he seemed confident that the investigator was "highly qualified."

The problem with mobile home fires like this one, Chief Hitch said, is "they burn so intensely and they produce hot gases which can seep throughout a home and scorch a persons' lungs. They die without even getting a burn mark."

Mobile homes built before 1975 had no safety guidelines to go by and the result of a fire is often quicker and even more deadly than in trailers like the 1979 Fleetwood the Bryants lived in.

Reese personnel, like many citizens in Lubbock, have already begun a massive campaign to help Sergeant Bryant, his wife and their surviving son Christopher get a new start.

Sergeant Bryant, a member of the 64th Organizational Maintenance Squadron, will be getting help from

everywhere as Reese first sergeants and commanders work together to coordinate the aid campaign. Lt. Col. Stan Zalace, OMS commander, pointed out that the fire destroyed "everything." As a result, "we will accept donations of food, material

possessions and money, whatever the people can afford to give," he said.

Food and material donations can be taken to the chapel for storage and money can be sent or delivered to Colonel Zalace, 64th OMS, Reese AFB, Texas 79489.

## Command changes

## New trainer's name moves ahead to AF

RANDOLPH AFB, Texas (ATCNS)—Javelina is Air Training Command's choice for a name for the T-46A, scheduled to become the Air Force's basic trainer aircraft in 1987

ATC has sent the name to Air Force headquarters recommending it be adopted. Officials there will review the name for possible trademark violations before a final decision is made.

Javelina, pronounced "hav-ah-LEE-na," was among the more than 800 names submitted earlier this year during a command-wide contest to name the airplane.

ATC officials believe the javelina aptly fits the mission and characteristics of the aircraft that may someday bear its name. The javelina is a wild swine native to the

southwestern United States, where the majority of undergraduate pilot training bases are located.

Adult javelinas are known to keep their young close to home for the first year, tutoring them in basic survival techniques before turning them out into the wilderness to meet their natural enemies. In much the same way, the T-46A will be used to teach fledgling pilots the basic skills they will need to fly a fighter, bomber, or combat support aircraft.

Air Force officials say it may be early 1984 before a final decision on a name is reached.

The T-46A will replace the T-37 Tweet, which the Air Force has been using since 1959.

# Get involved — help save tax \$

Fancy new "buzz" words which will pass quickly from the forefront like "Zero Defects" and "Zero Base Budgeting?" Hardly! They are here to stay as long as we continue to spend billions of dollars for defense and will likely have some impact on every functional area during the next year.

Hopefully, we will be spared from horror stories like recent ones involving excessive payments for obviously overpriced parts such as 4 cent diodes procured for \$110 each; \$4 plastic caps for \$1,200 each; and \$1 machine screws for \$37 each. Even at Reese, we have recent examples of apparent pricing errors involving such items as floppy computer disks, cable assemblies, date plates, and many other items valued at hundreds of dollars.

Every individual involved in ordering, monitoring, or using items purchased through Air Force

supply channels is tasked to ensure that we make the most efficient possible use of funds. The Air Force Chief of Staff Gen. Charles A. Gabriel, recently described the extent to which we must be prepared to go:

"We need to get everyone who is involved in the resupply process to recognize that we're all responsible. This isn't limited to the procurement agent or the maintenance officer. It involves the secretary who types the purchase request or the mechanic on the line who orders the part. We also need to create an atmosphere where questioning or challenging the system constructively is encouraged. We can't afford the 'let's not make any waves' attitude by supervisors that promotes waste and inefficiency. We need to encourage people both to do and to think—and this applies to every area that makes our Air Force go."

The Air Force Zero Overpricing Program is a program designed to eliminate overpricing in Air Force acquisitions and it provides the means for

our people to receive recognition. Recent publication of AFR 400-17 provides the guidance for operation of our program and established the Wing Zero Overpricing Committee which is tasked to review overpricing complaints and recommend appropriate rewards.

The committee's first meeting was recently held and resulted in the confirmation of an overpricing case. SMSgt. DeRego, maintenance, was awarded \$25 for questioning the price of \$273.04 assigned to a chain assembly subsequently found valued at only \$1.83. His question resulted in saving his organization an unnecessary expense of over \$270. As recently stated by the Honorable Verne Orr, secretary of the Air Force, "We not only save money, but in many cases, we can improve readiness—we can apply that money to other needs, and get our systems and parts faster." See a price that doesn't look right, challenge it by calling the Base Supply Customer Liaison Office, Ext. 3279.

# Spartan king sets a good leader image

Centuries ago at a small Grecian mountain pass called Thermopylae, a Spartan king and a few hundred men held off thousands of invading Persians. The king, Leonidas, did not hesitate when he said, "Wherever we are posted, there we stand, come life or death, to the end."

Leonidas didn't sit on a rock in the background and tell his men to "Do as I say, not as I do!" He led them into battle. He was one of the first to die. His men fought for hours just to retake his body from the enemy. He led and died setting the example.

You've heard it before: "Do as I say, not as I do." That's the catch-all phrase that seems to come out when the troop mentions his supervisor's discrepancies. It is a phrase that knows no boundaries. It's the excuse for being late, overweight, incompetent and even out of regulations. One thing the phrase is not — it is not leading by example!

Who's responsible for leading by example? Everyone, because every service member at one time or another will be the senior person present.

It's obvious Leonidas' troops had high esteem for him; his image was one of strength. The image of strength and its end result in leadership is much more effective than disciplinary paperwork.

In today's Air Force, to lead by example means that you should be physically fit, clean and neat. The result will be a better you. You need to be competent. The result will be respect for your abilities. Finally, you need to be an individual of honor; the result will be loyalty.

Discipline is necessary to maintain a strong united force. Leadership by good example is our foundation. Without it, there can be little respect for authority and precious few good examples to follow.

The next time one of our Air Force members disappoints you, think about the example you are setting. Leonidas set the example for his men; his men set the example for history.

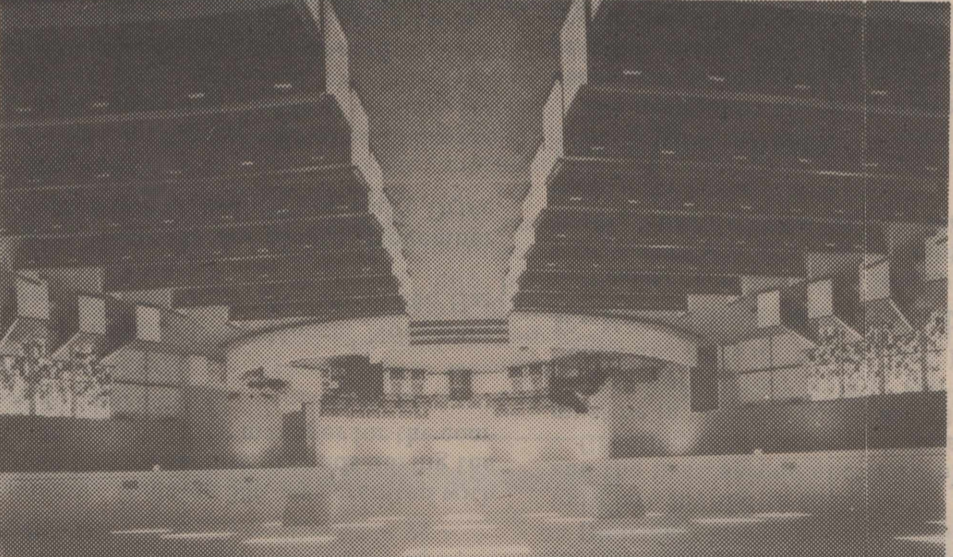

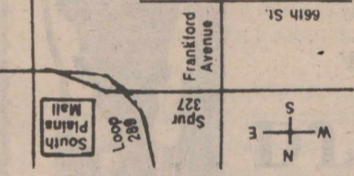

## What if . . .

What are you to do if the movers deliver your household goods, but something missing or damaged slips by? Contact the Transportation Management Office immediately; they can guide you from there.

People having just moved into the area have up to 45 days after the delivery of their household goods to contact TMO with reports of missing or damaged goods. And, although people have two years from the delivery date to file a claim against the government, it is recommended that claims be filed as soon as possible.

There are some things you must do to file a claim:

- Note all known loss and damage on all of the copies of the delivery document before signing.
- Allow the government and the carrier to inspect the damage.
- Don't throw anything away until it has been inspected by all concerned.
- Provide estimates and receipts for repairs and replacement.
- Complete all necessary documents as promptly as possible.

In what is known to some as

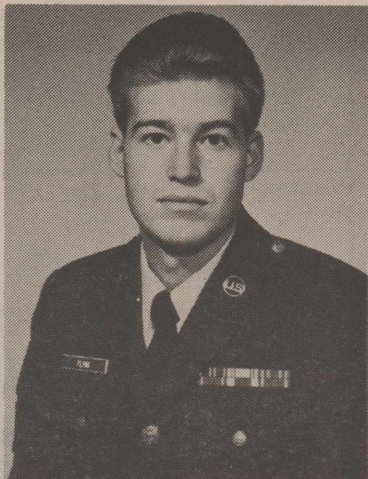
the "Hall of Fame" (the entrance hall to Building 800) the hospital has its staff members in each of the three slots.

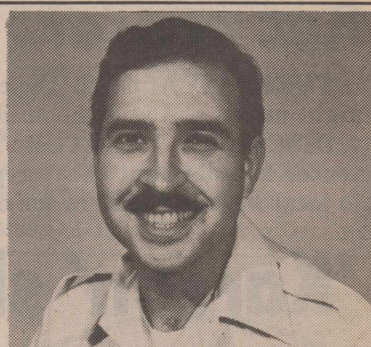
