*PLAN AHEAD! Designate a spot in your home and make sure the entire family knows where to go and what to bring. Have an emergency kit on hand, be sure to include batteries, a flashlight, battery-operated radio, medications and bottled water. Make sure these things are in your designated area.
*STAY INFORMED by following updates on radio or television. Our local stations do an xcellent job of relaying weather-related information on a timely basis.
*LEARN THE DIFFERENCE between a tornado watch and a tornado warning. A tomado watch means "watch the sky". A tornado warning means a tornado is likely to develop or a tornado has been indicated on radar.
