An election of a soil and water conservation district director to serve in Zone 4 on the Sherman Soil & Water County Conservation District is scheduled for October 11, 2000 at the Headquarters Restaurant in Stratford announced Scott Buckles, chairman of the Board. The election will be held at 7:00 a.m.

State law decrees that to be eligible to vote in a soil and water conservation district director election, a person must own agricultural land within the district where the election is being held. The person must also live in Sherman County and be 18 years of age or older.

Legal qualifications state that a candidate for the office of a soil and water conservation district

must own land in he subdivision he or she represents, be 18 years engaged in farming or ranching. The candidate must also live in which is in the district. Soil and district office.

Zone 4 in Sherman County is bound on the north by County County lines and on the east by the Sherman/Dallam county lines. At the present time Zone 4 is represented by Scott Buckles.
