Attention Junior Parents

On Tuesday, October 17, 2000 all juniors will have a chance to participate in PSAT/NMSQT Test. This is an optional test that will measure the reading, math, and writing skills of the students. When their score reports are received, the students will be able to see how their skills compare with other high school students around the nation. For junior students, this is the first step in entering the National Merit Scholarship Competition. If students are chosen to advance in the competition based on their test scores, they will become eligible for scholarship awards. Test takers also have the option to voluntarily place their names in a pool of college-bound students interested receiving admission and financial aid information from certified colleges, universities and scholarship agencies. Finally, this test will provide excellent practice for the students to improve their test-taking skills. Please encourage your son or daughter to participate in the PSAT/NMSQT. Test. Students need to register before the test in the counselor's office before October the 6th. They will need to bring the \$9.50 fee for the test and their social security number. Looking ahead toward the End-of-the-Year, the Chamber has two more activities for the community. The annual lighted Christmas Parade has been scheduled for Wednesday, Nov. 29, 2000. It is very important to survey your land for water sources for the birds. Birds need nesting areas, food sources and water. These areas should be within a 1/2 mile radius. Groups planning to have meals during this season, should contact the Chamber office and leave the information. Pheasant Hunting is our biggest tourism resource, let us do everything possible to have more tourism dollars left in Stratford.

Plank who is a journalist and Lifestyle Editor at the Dalhart Daily Texans found that pictures were a tremendous asset to journalism so she taught her self to be a photographer. She learned to process her film and print her pictures. She has won several awards for photographs and sold them to various news media. She has had several one man shows.

In order to improve her ability Plank took a course in photography at Eastern New Mexico University. She also took a course at the University of New Mexico in Intermediate Photography and Photography-Special Effects. She also studied photography at Drake University, Des Moines, Iowa.
