Local Authorities Stop Van With Ton Of Marijuana Inside

At approximately 3:40 a.m. on Wednesday, August 20, 2003 Sherman Co. Deputy Tim Smith observed a white van run a stop sign at Co. Road 24 and Co. Road W. When Deputy Smith tried to stop the vehicle a chase ensued with speeds reaching over 100 m.p.h. Deputy Smith The Stratford Special 54 in front of Taylor's Store in

Texhoma, OK. A Texas Co. Deputy arrived and after receiving consent to search the vehicle a large amount of marijuana was discovered. A Goodwell, OK K-9 Officer arrived to assist. John Sheil, 65, of Kansas City, MO was taken into custody. When Sherman Co. Sheriff Haile arrived he contacted the Drug Enforcement Administration Agent in Amarillo to assist.

Texas Co. Jail and the van and marijuana were taken to the Sherman County Sheriff's Office in Stratford.

The D.E.A. Agents arrived in Stratford and took custody of the van and marijuana, and Deputy Smith, with transported the van and drugs to Amarillo for processing. Sheriff Haile, with Texas Ranger Todd Snyder, then went to Guymon and took custody of Sheil and brought

him back to the Sherman County Jail. Deputy Smith contacted Sheriff Haile by phone and advised him that the official count was 2070.14 pounds of marijuana with a street value of \$3,000,000.00.

On Thursday D.E.A. Agents came and took custody of Sheil on a Federal warrant for Possession of Marijuana with Intent to Distribute. Sheil will be tried in U.S. District Court in Amarillo.

SHERMAN County Sheriff has provided information on these costs, minus the state revenues received for reimbursement of such costs.
