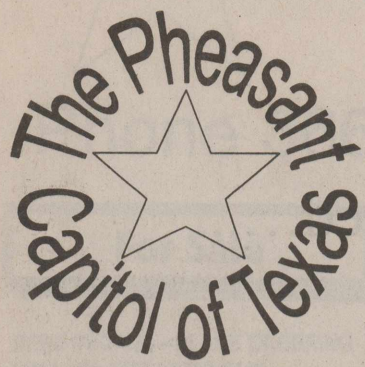

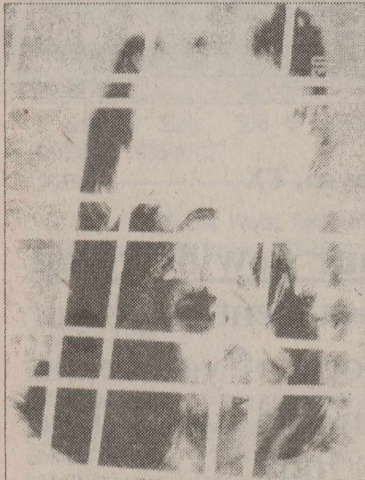

Ports-to-Plains Annual Meeting Denver Nov. 12

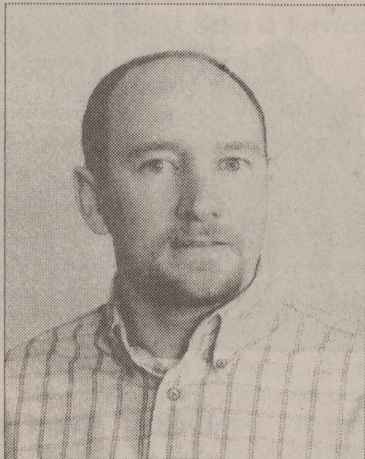

Lamb and Goat Validation

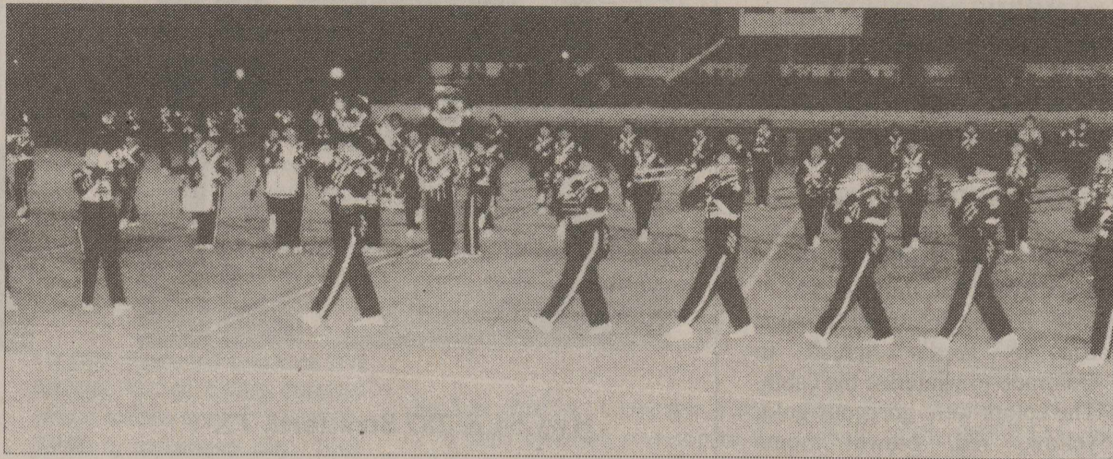

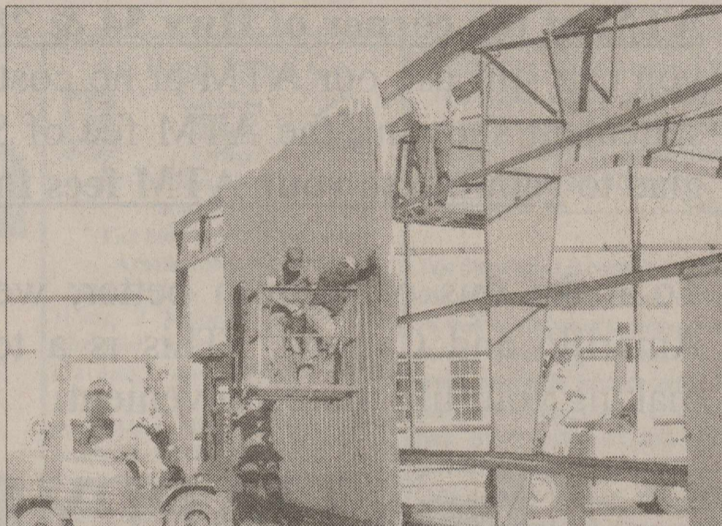

Attention: Sherman County Appraisal District Residents

Effective January 1, 2004

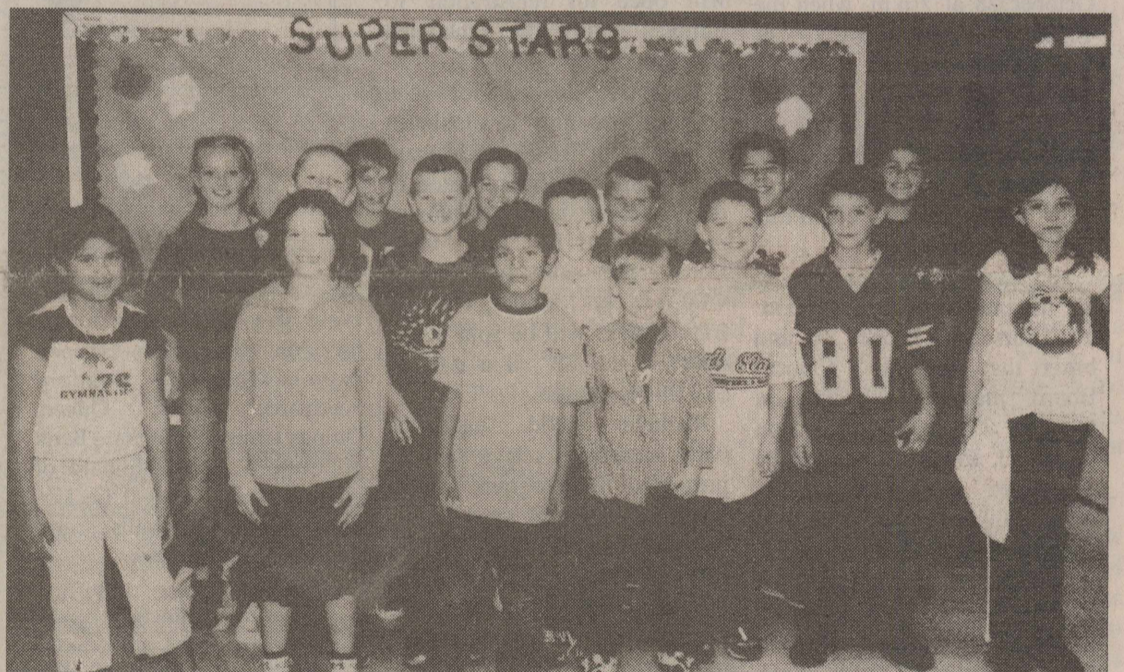
In January of 2004 the Sherman County Appraisal District will be mailing personal property renditions to persons residing in the Sherman County Appraisal District. It is to your advantage to complete the form and return it to the Appraisal District, so the tax records will be more accurate.

State law requires that you register your vehicles in your home county. The law also states that all property not rendered for taxation by the owner shall be assessed by the proper officer.

In the past the Sherman County Appraisal District was unable to obtain ownership information on vehicles registered out of state. **Starting in 2004, the Appraisal District will be assessing taxes on all vehicles located in Sherman County regardless of the State in which they are registered.**

If you live in Texas and your vehicle is not registered in Texas, when it is time to renew the registration, you may want to consider registering in Texas.

Leadership Sherman County To Be Offered

LEADERSHIP SHERMAN COUNTY, a series of educational programs and workshops designed to identify and prepare future leaders of the county will be offered again this fall. The first of the monthly classes will be held Wednesday, November 12, 2003. The Educational series will include subsequently classes conducted during the months of December through April.

LEADERSHIP SHERMAN COUNTY is a seven session training course to enhance leadership skills, community knowledge and civic networks. The sessions will be conducted by leaders in the fields of leadership skills training, group dynamics, interpersonal skills training, public policy, team building, government, education and community service. Applicants for the course are selected from persons engaged in any career who has an interest in community affairs. The class is limited to twelve persons who represent a cross-section of the county.

Tuition for LEADERSHIP SHERMAN COUNTY is \$175.00, which covers all cost of the program materials and locations, speakers, meals, and transportation when necessary.

The class will be the fourth offered by the Extension Program Council in response to the community futures forum issue of leadership development by providing training to new leaders for effective group leadership for civic and public service groups. In addition, citizens will become actively involved in the decision making process that affect their communities, organizations, professions, and lives.

Elk and Lady Elks Compete At WTAMU



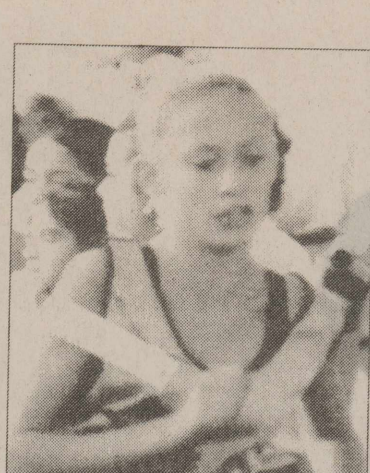

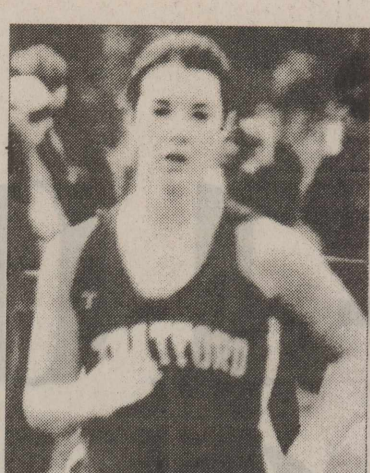

The Elk and Lady Elk Cross Country teams competed in their last big meet before district at West Texas A&M University this past weekend in Canyon. Three pack runners competed in the JV Division. Cassie Garza finished 38th running a time of 15:31. Whitney Garza ran a 17:53 and Shadley Hawkins ran an 18:32.

In the Varsity Girls' Division I race, the Lady Elks finished 14th out of 25 teams. Yadira Ortega can in 27th with a time of 14:30. Brittany Hudson ran well even though she was injured and not competing at 100%. Brittany finished in 42nd place with a time of 14:51. Haley Buckles and Erin Ashley were the 3rd and 4th scorers for the Lady Elks as they finished with times of 15:25 and 16:05 respectively. Chelsi Thiessen and Shiloh Dickenson rounded out the scoring for the Lady Elks. Bill Walker competed in the Varsity Boys' Division I race and ran a time of 21:17 which was good enough for 58th place.

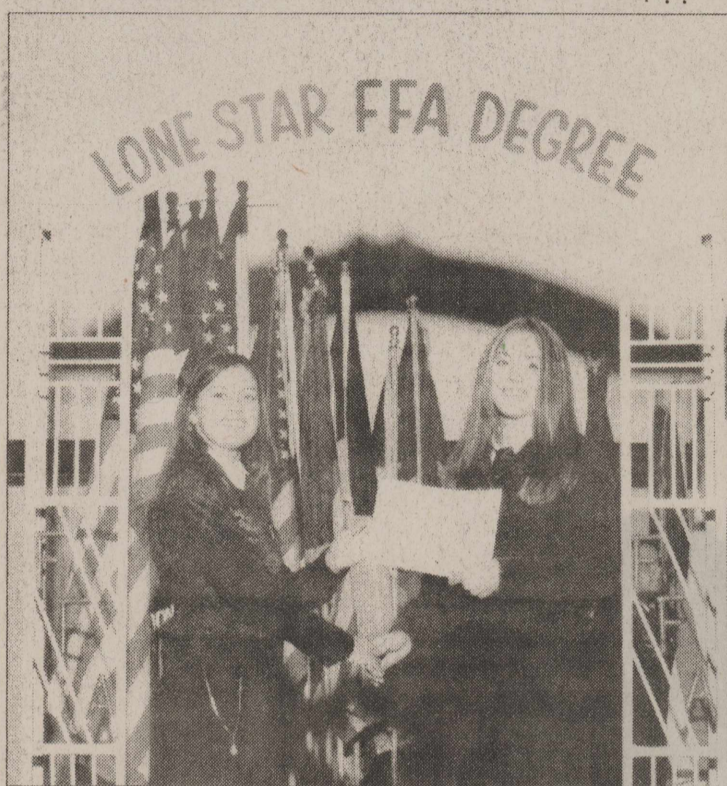
The Junior High girls made another impressive showing this Saturday, as the Blue team finished in 2nd place by scoring 51 points, just behind the Borger girls, and the White team finished in 7th place out of the 21 junior high teams competing in the junior high division. Out of 157 girls running, no junior high girl from Stratford finished worse than 56th place team wise. This is extremely impressive considering the number of girls running and the competition that was at this meet. It makes their 2nd and 7th place finishes as a team even more impressive than their 1st place finish a week ago at Sunray. Kristen Crabtree finished 7th overall with an excellent time of 15:07. Right on her heels was Lucero Ortega and Sierra Valenzuela who finished 9th and 10th respectively with times of 15:10 and 15:11. These girls have been leading our 7th and 8th grade girls all year both in practices and meets. The 4th place finisher for the Stratford Blue was Whitney Reese (15:43), which was good enough for 23rd place. Kelsey Stein was right behind her, finishing 25th and a time of 15:45. Rounding out the scoring for the Stratford Blue was (41st) Katrina Harkins and (46th) Yesinia Ibarra, who ran times of 16:31 and 16:40. The Stratford White team was led by Sinead Everett running a time of 16:42, which was good enough for 48th place. Becky Rosales finished 51st with a time of 16:48, Brenda Ibarra finished 63rd with a time of 17:20, Jordan Confer, a pack runner, finished 67th with a time of 17:34, and Ivy Valenzuela rounded out the scoring with a 17:38 finish. Congratulations to all the cross

country girls and boys, and good luck at district on Tuesday, October the 28th at Thompson Park. The cross country kids are off this next week, but we want to wish the Big Blue Band good luck at their regional marching contest. There are some tentative plans to run a dual or tri-meet out at the golf course on Tuesday, the 21st around 5:00 p.m. or 5:30 p.m.

LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT COULD WIN A TRIP TO WASHINGTON, D.C. AND A \$25,000 SCHOLARSHIP

Commander John F. Johnson of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post # 9022 announced the kick-off of this year's VFW and its Ladies Auxiliary "Voice of Democracy Scholarship Competition." High school students in this area have the opportunity to compete in the 57th annual audio essay competition and win thousands of dollars in scholarships, a trip to Washington, D.C., as well as dozens of other awards.

Students begin by competing at the local Post level. Post winners advance to District. District winners compete in the state competition. The state winner will enjoy a four-day tour of Washington, D.C. along with the winners from every state, the Pacific Areas, Latin America/Caribbean and Europe. During the 57 years that the

Veterans of Foreign Wars and its Ladies Auxiliary have been involved with Voice of Democracy, more than 7 million high school students have participated. Students compete by writing and then recording a three-to-five minute audio/essay expressing their views of this year's patriotic theme "MY COMMITMENT TO AMERICA'S FUTURE." All state winners receive at least a \$1,000 National Scholarship....but anyone of them could win the \$25,000 first place award. A total of \$143,500 in National Scholarships are awarded to student national finalists in addition to the scholarships and awards given at the preliminary levels of competition. The deadline date for student entry is November 1, 2003.

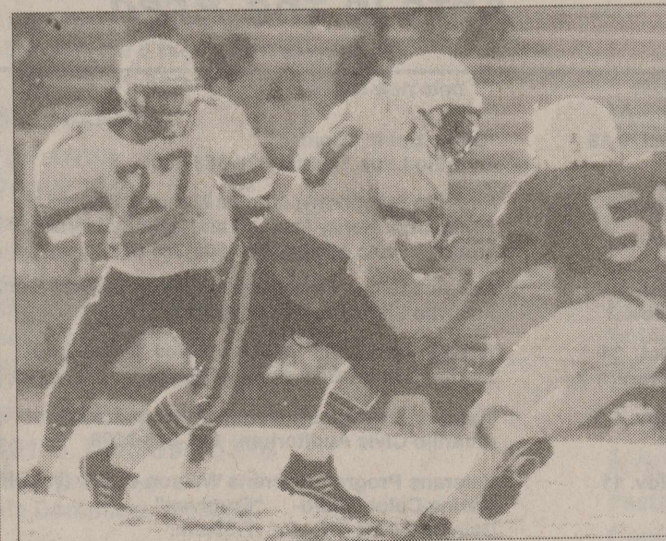

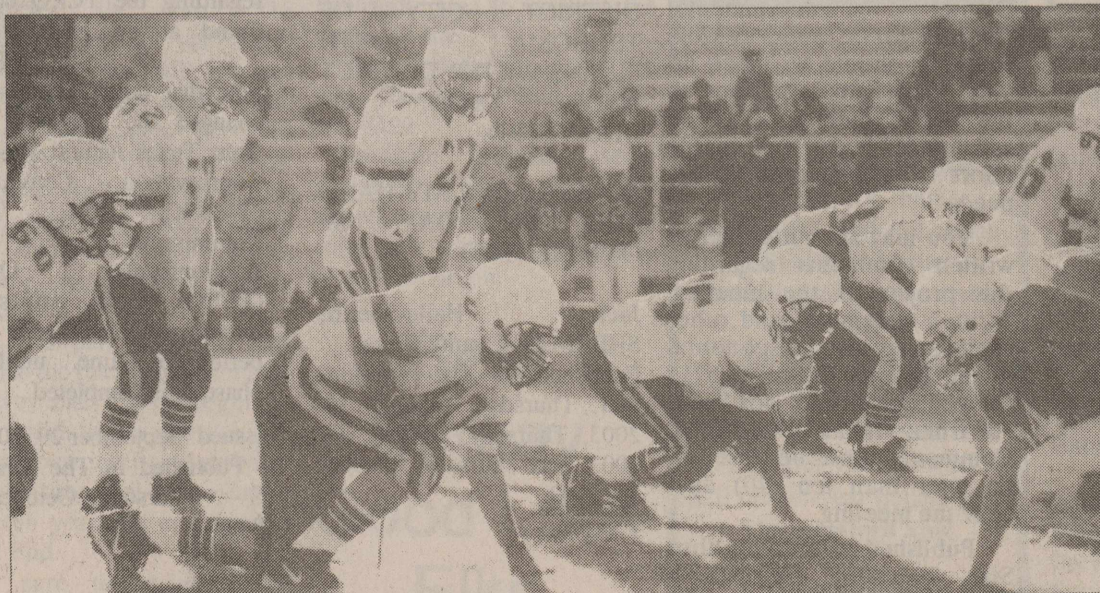
