ESL Class Receives Letter From WWII Code Talker By Harletta Carthel

from one of the Navajo Code Talkers of World War II. The letter was written to
sophomore Severo Duran and his classmates, by Alfred Peaches
cher who lives on the Navajo reservation in Arizona in Shonto, a sparsely-

The two-page handwritten letter was in response to Duran's
letter he wrote after the ESL letter he wrote after the ESL class studied the vital work of the Code Talkers in WWII. Now in his eighties, Peaches told of his being drafted into the
Marines shortly after his 18th Mirthday. After completing boot camp, Peaches was sent to Camp Pendleton in Oceanside, California to communications training. "The secret code was
devised by the first group of 29 devised by the first group of 29
Navajos who were selected by the marine Corp right after the Pearl Harbor incident," Peaches said. Although the United States had used Indian codes before, the Navajo code was the only one of
its kind never deciphered by the its kind never deciphered by the
enemy due to the difficulty of the Navajo language and the Navajo language and the
