





Free "Water Wise" **Gardening Class** to be Offered

gardening & xeriscaping class will be offered on Saturday, April 22 at the North Plains Water District office in Dumas, TX.

Contrary to what is often the common opinion, xeriscaping is not just planting cacti and succulents in a gravel lawn with no turf grass. The true definition of xeriscaping is water-efficient landscaping appropriate to the natural environment. The goal of xeriscape is to create a visually attractive landscape that uses plants selected for the water efficiency. Class participants will learn how to select and plant beautiful, long-blooming plants that are especially adapted to the Texas panhandle. They will also about installing and learn maintaining drip irrigation systems to conserve water and provide water to the landscape more efficiently. The class will be taught by the Potter County Master Gardeners.


Chamber of Commerce News By Ann Wells



IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners' Court of Sherman County that all outdoor burning, including fireworks, is prohibited in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Government Local Code §352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not outdoor prohibit burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for: (1) firelighter training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Natural Resources Code §153.048, and meet the standards of Natural Resources Code §153.047.
